



In round two we had Crowder Jr. enter the field and he downed Chris Ragunton 220-199. Stan Por edged Donnie Johnson in a good one 214-209. Sun Sundara struck late to down Vickie Flanders 223-194. Billy Hambly got to Kevin Collier 192-169. The losers got \$107.50 in 6-9th places.

Round three had Por come from behind and pull away from Crowder in a 231-201 win. Sundara had to pick up a 10 pin on the final ball to edge Hambly 200-192. Marvin Jr. and Bill were 4th and 5th with fine bowling and Por and Sundara to meet for the right to bowl Puleston for the title. They got \$115.

This game was also a nail biter and tense to say the least. In fact it went to the final frame

and Por needing a mark and 8 to win. After a key spare in the 10th went high and got a six count. Sundara, knowing that he at least had some luck on this day advanced to bowl Puleston for the title after the 223-222 handicap win. Por was third with a great showing although I am sure he'd like to throw that count ball again! Stanley got a check for \$200.

The Title game was set and 27-28 was the pair. We would have a two time champion, both Ken and Sun have won and in fact in the past year. Ken elected to have Sun begin and he split in frame one and opened. Ken then answered with a double. Not to be denied, Sun then had a three bagger and held a nice lead as Ken guttered on a strike in frame 5 due to a noise at the ball return. After 6 frames Sun led by 15 with handicap. Kenny then came right back with a four bagger and finished 233/245 so Sun would need a double and 8 for the win. He got a break with a brooklyn for the first one and then carried a high pocket hit under pressure and now needing 8 pins for the win he went a bit high but got the 8 count and a 215/246 score. Good for the title by one pin and a nice \$2,200. Great bowling Sun. You performed well under pressure winning three close matches. We are proud to have you as a two time champion!



LAS VEGAS, NV. Mickey Curley. La Habra "300" Bowl. The PBA \$200,000 TV showdown. Dick Weber. Mega Buck tournaments soon, in L.V. Good grief! Where do I start? This every-otherweek-gig is catchin' up to me. (And...I need some room to 'splain to Mother Mancini that Brunswick and me can't compare. It's tough when yer publisher is as goofy as the wierd author.)

Each of the subjects would fill a column. We'll squeeze in what we can and go into detail down the road:

\* Some rumors have been makin' the rounds that La Habra "300" Bowl will be closing. Fact: THAT is a crock! Simple enough?

\* La Habra "300" part "B" concerns Mickey Curley. She will be stepping down as the General Manager of the famed center at the end of the month. Like, Mickey has been the GM there since forever. She must own all the longevity records for a GM in one center. Naturally, there is a reason. She has done a brilliant job, not only for the owners, but for bowlers and bowling. A remarkable lady...a Hall of Famer...will remain at the center in an advisory capacity a couple days a week. During her tenure, a home for the Orange County H of F was established at La Habra, and she handled with dignity the wrongful refusal of the ABC to honor bowling's first and probably only legitimate 900-the one by Glenn Allison in 1980. I probably would have blown up the ABC headquarters, but the steady hand of Mickey Curley proved to be bigger than the dunderhead decision of the "leadership" of our sport. Mickey has been one of the brightest lights, ever, in bowling center operation. Quite a gal!

\* Kudos to the media, everywhere, for the tremendous coverage of the passing of Dick Weber. Bowling got it right-the greatest ambassador the sport has known. Will anyone ever come close? I suggested to Jim Goodwim, publisher of the Stars & Strikes, that Norm Duke might well become our next caretaker. Jim mentioned Jeanette Robinson has also made that comment.

The PBA's "Roll to Riches" was a super battle of six PBA stars in a two-day, two-hour scramble that was every bit as exciting as golf's Masters the week before. It was a \$200,000 winner-take-all showdown rolled on lane conditions far too easy for these stars... it did away with spares for most of the show, but the pressure of that much money was an equalizer throughout, with the final segment for the loot going to the first player of the two remaining, to get six strikes. Chris Barnes amazingly did it in six frames, a pace Tommy

Jones could not equal. While the show had the regular announcing team and other short comings, the biggest was the miniscule audience... but few knew about the event due to lack of pre-event promotion. Maybe ESPN will re-run it. This thing was fabulous, almost in spite of itself. With a little spit and polish, it could become a raging success as a season finale... featuring the top six point earners for the year. Skip the fan vote, let the players earn a spot ... and count the cash "towards the PBA's season totals.

\* The Big Buck tournaments roll into Vegas soon, but, for some reason, they will not all be here at the same time. Usually, the trio of the High Roller (Sam's Town), TAT (Texas Station) and the Mini Eliminator (The Orleans) coincide their visits over the July 4th week, giving bowlers a big-time selection of events. This year, for some inexplicable reason, TAT and High Roller folks decided to come in around June 26 thru July 4...the same dates that Bowl Expo will be running in Orlando Florida. That means all the "A Team" experts for the ball companies will be in the South, not available for those two tourneys until possibly the last day. The ball giveaways and especially the drilling expertise and advice are MAJOR components of the Big Buck events. This year, ONLY the Mini Eliminator will have the Brunswick All-Star technical staff for the duration of their spectacular. This seems to me to be an odd move by the pair. Perhaps they just don't want to knock heads with the Mini's Steve Sanders, in my book, one of bowling's top promoters and innovaters.

If it comes to picking one tourney to enter, I'd have to go with the July 2nd to 12th Mini Eliminator. Not only is it at the "usual" time for these events, but I noted the prize fund from top to bottom is guaranteed, plus other goodies such as the MoRich Match Play 20-grand battle on July 2 & 3 and a new Mixed Doubles event, loads of Sweepers and Brackets ... plus the famed Kegel Co. will take care of the lanes!

I always look forward to the three events in town at the same time. The change a surprise ... and I hope the odd choice by TAT and High Roller doesn't end up hurting all three tournaments. Besides, that Mini 150th place \$1,000 guarantee would surely make up my mind. I know ... what mind? All three events are outstanding, it will be a load of fun for me, just watching.

P.S.: Mother Mancini, I checked with Brunswick ... they have a much bigger inventory than ol' Steffi (This pertains to M.M.'s comment in this spot, 4/14.)



# Tenpin Slants

NORWALK-Glenn Davis, a native of Southern California, was an extraordinary individual. He was an athlete of superstar stature, a graduate of West Point, and handsome enough to date Hollywood's most glamorous stars.

I say was, because Davis, a resident of La Quinta, near Palm Springs, died on March 9 of complications from prostate cancer. He

Davis gained national prominence as a running back for Army in the mid-40s. Known as Mr. Outside—because of his blazing speed in circling the ends—Davis teamed with Felix (Doc) Blanchard, a hardrunning fullback who was dubbed Mr. Inside. They were also known as The Touchdown Twins.

Davis and Blanchard were an unbeatable combination. In their three years with Army, the unbeaten Cadets posted a remarkable 27-0-1 record. A scoreless tie against powerhouse Notre Dame in 1944 was Army1s only blemish.

In 1945, Blanchard was voted the Heisman Trophy, while Davis was the recipient of the coveted award in 1946, the same year he was named Associated Press male athlete of the year.

At West Point, Davis, who was 5-9 and 170, earned a total of 10 letters in four sports—football, baseball, basketball and track. The speedy Davis ran the 100-yard dash in 9.7 and set a West Point record of 20.7 in the 220.

When Davis was on furlough in 1948, he met and dated Elizabeth Taylor. But the affair cooled and later Davis married actress Terry Moore, the first of his three wives.

After completing his Army commitment, Davis signed a pro football contract with the Los Angeles Rams. His gridiron career, however, was cut short after two years because of a serious knee injury.

In 1954, Davis was employed by the Los Angeles Times as assistant director of special events. He became the director in 1960, heading *The Times* numerous charity sporting events until 1987, when he retired. He settled in La Quinta with his third wife, Yvonne Ameche, the widow of 1954 Heisman winner Alan (The Horse) Ameche.

Before West Point, Davis starred at Bonita High in La Verne, just northeast of Los Angeles. Winning 13 letters in four sports at Bonita, Davis even today is often hailed as the most versatile athlete in the history of California prep sports.

There is no doubt that Glenn Davis was a superior athlete, who excelled in any sport he tried. That is, in all except one—bowling.

I knew Davis when he was with The Times and I was a member of the sports staff at The Mirror. Both papers were owned by the giant Times-Mirror Company.

Although we weren ton the same team, both Davis and I bowled in the Times-Mirror League, which often boasted of more than 50 five-man teams. Davis, a friendly chap, was very popular with every-

On the lanes, Davis was so uncoordinated that he had a difficult time averaging 135. He still had a good time bowling, though, and enjoyed the challenge of trying to knock down the pins

At the end of each league session, Times publisher Norman Chandler would host a grand awards banquet, noted for its lively entertainment and robust good fellowship. In other words, plenty of dancing girls and lots of beer.

Memorial services for Davis, who donated his Heisman Trophy to Bonita High, were held on March 14. Burial was four days later at the U.S. Military Academy in West Point, N.Y.

I will always remember Glenn Davis as being one of the good

Hall of Famer Andy Marzich said something recently that caught my attention. He stated: <sup>3</sup>Bowling on the pro level requires more skill

than golf at the pro level. I asked him why, and here show he replied:
Basically, the difference comes down to this—golf is not played on a surface. You can play golf while it's raining or a terrible wind blowing. All reasons why you should, maybe, be in a bowling center.

In bowling, you can be on lanes that all look alike, but each one is different. Hobby bowlers don't even know that no two lanes are alike. In golf, they wear shoes so they don't slip. In bowling, we're sub-

ject to some approaches that are impossible to play on...too sticky or too slippery.

In golf, you have a different club of every shot. What's tough about that? Only when golfers get on the greens do they play on a surface.

That's as clear as I can make my argument. The public has been

led to believe that golf is such a tough game. For the weekender, golf may be tough, but no tougher than bowling. People will say, Well, anyone cn bowl. I say, Anyone can play golf.

To reach the levels of pros in any sport takes an awful lot, and only a few reach that level. And you can quote me!

Marzich, who was inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame in 1990 and the ABC Hall in 93, won six PBA titles during the 60s. He also won three ABC Tournament championships and had three other top-10 finishes.

After his pro bowling days, Marzich, who was a member of Billy Welu's famed Falstaff team, bought a bowling center in the L.A. Harbor city of San Pedro. He named it Andy Marzich's Pro Bowl-Where Good Friends Gather.

When Marzich sold the center, he retired and settled down in Torrance, where today he lives in a deluxe senior apartment complex. He says he is still irked by the absurdity of the PGA (Professional Golf

Assn.) prize payoffs, which has always troubled me as a bowler.

ADDENDUM: While bowling continues to decline, golf is more popular than ever. Bowling centers are closing all over the country, but nearly 500 new courses were built in 2003. Bowling has lost almost 5 million members in the last two decades; meanwhile, more than 3 million have taken up golf since 1999.

The growing popularity of golf is attributed to the personal magnetism of Tiger Woods. It's called the Tiger Effect. And it doesn't hurt that former Presidents George H. Bush and Bill Clinton are playing golf all around the globe, garnering tons of worldwide publicity for

FINAL ITEM: Danny Wiseman is one of my favorite bowlers. Why? Because bowling's Baltimore Belter doesn't hesitate to let you know when something's on his mind. And he always tells it like it is.

A widely-read publication recently handicapped the PBA Player of the Year race. It stated that Patrick Allen was the one to catch, and only four other pros were given a chance to overtake him-Walter Ray Williams Jr., Chris Barnes, Mika Koivuniemi and Tommy Jones.

That prompted Wiseman to exclaim: What am I? Am I that invisible? Don¹t forget, I have more top-10¹s than anyone, and I¹ve been up there (in the PBA tournament statistics) all year long.

What do I have to do—something stupid—to be Œnot forgotten¹? What gives? It¹s just like the PBA omitting me from their (recent) surveys. I guess we'll just have to wait until the end of the year and see what happens, huh?

Wiseman gof off to a fast start this season when he captured the Miller High Life Masters Presented by the American Bowling Congress . He needs to bag just one of the remaining two majors, as of this writing, to thrust himself into the heart of the PBA Player of the

Funny thing...no sooner did Wiseman let his feelings be known when the PBA announced that he was one of six pros who will compete in the new Motel 6 Roll to Riches promotion on April 14. It<sup>1</sup>ll be a winner-take-all competition, with the last man standing collecting \$200,000. Sounds like fun.

#### **National Deaf Bowling News** Jerilyn Keller Wins GLDWBA Queens & Scores 1911 In All Events

by Connie Marchione MERRILLVILLE, IN—The three time Deaf Team USA member Jerilyn Keller was mad and disappointed at herself for her poor showing in the Deaflympics last January in Australia. Albeit she shared in winning bronze medal in women's trios and silver medal in women's team. she was embarrassed with her overall average which was twenty pins below her normal average.

Back home in San Antonio her new ball, Dyne Thane was nit working for her, so she went back to her Icon 300. The results were good as last February Jerilyn had a 728 series in her league and also she won the Austin Deaf Women's Classic.

Last weekend in the prestigious Great Lakes Deaf Women's Bowling Association Tournament at Merrillville, IN, Jerilyn atoned for her poor Deaflympics performance. In the Friday's GLDWBA's 15th annual Lillian Kernz handicap Queens Championship with 45 women entrants, she qualified near the top in her first 3 games. In the next round, she stayed near the top going into the top 16 match

In the afternoon's one game double-elimination match plays Jerilyn went through 4 rounds without a loss. While she waited in the championship finals, her friend, a former Deaf Team USA member Stacey Thompson, Olathe, KS with one loss, fought her way up to the title finals.

In the one game finals, Stacey beat Jerilyn and since each had one loss, another one game match was required. In that one Jerilyn came back to defeat Stacey 198 to 178 for the coveted GLDWBA Queens title.

On Saturday in the GLDWBA team event, Jerilyn rolled 190-192-225 for 607 in her team Fire 'n Ice's 2779 scratch total and 2884 with handicap. Her team mates were Stacey Thompson, Deaf Team USA member Cheyenne Rogers, LA, Jessica Carrizales, TX and former Deaf Team USA member Kim Wroldsen, KS. At this time it is not known if their 2779 is the high scratch score. Also with their small 105 handicap, their 2884 is too low in handicap standings.

On Sunday's singles and doubles events, Jerilyn scored 205-244-212 for singles scratch total of 661 plus 24 handicap for a 685 total. Then she added 222-216-205 for 643 and her doubles partner Cheyenne 617 for a 1260 scratch total plus 30 handicap 1290 total.

Still we do not know where these scores stands but their 1260 is a new GLDWBA doubles actual record and the first over 1200 actual score in its 58 years history. Th highest it ever had was 1197 made in 2002. In singles Jerilyn herself holds the GLDWBA record singles event score of 703 made in 2001 in which at that time she won both actual and handicap (738) prizes,

For all events, combining her team 607 series, singles 661 and doubles 643, Jerilyn has her personal best 1911 total. Impressive total but it is not a GLDWBA record. It is 15 pins short of the record 1926 total made by Stacey Thompson in 1999.

Again, counting Jerilyn's handicap of 24 for each event, she has a 1986 handicap total, which is a mere one pin short. GLDWBA's record handicap all-events score of 1987 was made by Sheila McClish in 2002. That McClish must have a large handicap because that year Jerilyn notched the high actual all events score with

Anyway, Jerilyn is happy with her efforts and looks forward to know what places her team, doubles, singles and all-events are in when the results are officially counted. Also we will wait for that and inform of any corrections to this story.
