THE VILLAGES, Fla. -PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. defeated reigning PBA50 Player of the Year Michael Haugen Jr. 278-243 in the title match to win the PBA50 National Championship presented by Spanish Springs Lanes and Radical Friday for his second consecutive PBA50 Tour title of the season and third career PBA50 Tour major title.

"We both play a similar angle to the pocket, so I was watching him pretty closely in the first three matches. We both got off to a good start. but he ran into trouble in the middle of the match and fortunately I was able to keep striking."

Williams dominated Friday's match play rounds to earn the top seed for the finals posting a 12-4 record and 8,479 34-game pinfall total (including bonus pins) outdistancing fellow hall of famer No. 2 qualifier Norm Duke by 337 pins.

Australia's Jason Belmonte Wins DHC PBA Japan Invitational

Two-handed star wins fourth title of 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour season

TOKYO, Japan - Australia's two-handed star, Jason Belmonte, defeated top qualifier Jakob Butturff of Tempe, Arizona, 224-213. to win the DHC PBA Japan Invitational at Tokyo Port Bowl on Sunday for his fourth title of the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour season and the 22nd of his career.

With the win, the 35-year-old Belmonte moved into a tie for 10th place on the PBA all-time titles list with PBA Hall of Famer Marshall Holman.

After qualifying third for the stepladder finals, Belmonte eliminated Chris Barnes of Double Oak, Texas, 245-220, and Japan's Takuva Miyazawa. 227-189, to advance to the title match. Barnes defeated defending DHC champion Dom Barrett of England, 253-222, in the first match.

"I've traveled to Japan to bowl for fifteen years and I've never won," Belmonte said. "Winning in front of the Japanese crowd means a lot; I'm very hon-

"Jakob bowled incredible all week. I feel for the leaders," he continued. "It's unfortunate to dominate a tournament and then lose it all in one game. It took me fifteen years but I feel quite certain Jakob will do it much sooner than that."

The difference in the tightly-contested championship match was Butturff's failure to convert the 3-5-6-9 "bucket" in the second frame. The loss prevented Butturff from claiming his third title of the year, which would have put him in a title-tie with Belmonte. Instead, Belmonte further enhanced his bid for 2019 PBA Player of the Year honors.

"At 2:30 this morning, Tim Mack (his bowling ball rep) called me and said he had an idea to drill me a different ball and I bowled amazing with it today," Belmonte said.



EVERY TOURNAMENT MEANS A NEW PBA RECORD FOR WALTER RAY WILLIAMS JR.

It's not a secret, but every time Walter Ray Williams Jr. picks up a bowling ball and steps onto the approach at a PBA tournament – no matter what level of tournament it may be – he sets another record.

The "GOAT" – Greatest Of All Time – as many of his peers refer to him is approaching his 60th birthday (on October 6). He has been a PBA member since 1980 (39 years). His most recent record of note was winning the 110th PBA title of his lengthy and colorful career. His victory in the PBA50 Tour's season-opening Johnny Petraglia BVL Open last week was his 12th in PBA50 Tour competition to go along with his record 47 PBA Tour titles, 33 standard PBA Regional wins and 18 PBA50 Regional titles.



His portfolio of PBA records would take pages to summarize, but here are some astonishing statistics that put Williams' career in PBA competition into perspective compared to an "average" league bowler:

- As of last Sunday, Williams had bowled 24,135 games in PBA Tour competition, 2,328 in PBA Regionals, 2,625 in PBA50 Tour events and another 694 in PBA50 Regionals for a combined total of 29,782 games in PBA tournaments at all levels.
- That total doesn't include games bowled in practice, pro-ams or exhibitions.
- If an average league bowler rolls three games a week over a typical 32-week league season, he or she will bowl 96 games in a year.
- At the average league bowler rate, it would take that bowler 310.2 years to bowl as many games as Williams has bowled in PBA competition.
- If you were able to live 310.2 years and match Williams' games bowled total, take note that he also has knocked down 6,558,110 pins over that span. That converts to a 220.20 average for all PBA games bowled.
- Keep in mind, Walter Ray is still actively competing at all levels of PBA competition.

PBA50 continued from page 1 the tour for players 50 and over which moved him into sole possession of second on the all-time list behind John Handegard who tops the list with 14 wins.

"After this win I feel like the record is definitely in sight," said Williams, who won the 2014 and 2017 USBC Senior Masters for his other PBA50 major titles. "Over the past year I've been feeling like I'm bowling decent but just not getting the results. Now I feel like I'm at the top of my game and can get the job done when I need to, but you never know when you'll win again."

Williams' first win of the season came in last week's season-opening Johnny Petraglia BVL Open presented by Lucas Magazine and Brunswick where he beat finals top qualifier Sammy Ventura of Syracuse, New York, 288-205, in the title match.

As the No. 4 qualifier for the finals, Haugen, trying for his second major and fourth career PBA50 Tour win, came out of the gate strong with a 287-251 win over No. 5 qualifier, 2017 PBA50 Player of the Year Brian LeClair of Albany, New York, and then beat hall of famer and eight-time PBA50 Tour winner Amleto Monacelli, who qualified third for the finals, 277-237, to advance to the semifinal match against Duke.

Haugen then managed to beat Duke, who was trying for his third major and sixth career title, in a hard-fought semifinal match, 214-206, to advance to the title match.

Watching Landri bowl in this year's Long Beach City Championships was a thrill. Her steely demeanor was that of a pro in the making. Her tunnel vision was on display, with big game after big game.

Landri English is truly a star in the making, with a fan base that is growing every day. She has the instincts of a shark, but also comes across as a friendly competitor. Maybe that is why she is so popular with the crowds who come to watch her.

Her style is unique (push, drop, swing, roll) but her straight up delivery at the line gives her power and accuracy that will serve her well in her long career ahead. Her number one supporter is her fiance' Russ Hixson, who popped the question at a league outing at Keystone Lanes.

Landri began her bowling career at the age of six with her ball weighing in at six pounds. Today she sports a 181 average. You've come a long way baby.

Good luck Landri English. You will be a star who shines brightly for years to come. Great Grandmother Betty is watching from Heaven and saying, "I will be there for every frame you bowl and every tournament you win."



BVL TEAMS UP WITH WINTER SPORTS CLINIC TO 'SHRED LIMITATIONS' FOR DISABLED VETERANS

FAIRFAX, Va. – If you need a little motivation to take on a challenge, look no further than the recent 33rd National Disabled Veterans Winter Sports Clinic.

That's the advice from Fort Collins (Colo.) USBC President and longtime BVL advocate Sandy Eckert, who represented BVL at the annual event in Snowmass, Colo.

The Winter Sports Clinic (WSC), which is hosted annually by the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) and Disabled American Veterans (DAV), provides nearly 400 profoundly disabled veterans with training and rehabilitation through a series of challenging winter sports. BVL was once again a sponsor of the WSC, which promotes sports therapy and rehabilitation through adaptive Alpine and Nordic skiing, cross country skiing, rock climbing, sled hockey, scuba diving, curling, snowmobiling, archery, and other adaptive sports and activities.

Since its' inaugural event in 1987 with only 90 participants, the Winter Sports Clinic has continued to grow and empower more veterans to challenge their perceived limitations. Over the years, dozens of participants have even gone on to become Paralympic athletes.

'Shred Limitations' was the theme of the 2019 WSC, a fitting message that Eckert said came to life on the Colorado mountainside during the five-day long clinic. "To see what it means firsthand for a veteran to be on the slopes on their adaptive ski devices or ride a snowmobile despite their physical disability or visual impairment is life changing," said Eckert, who has represented BVL at the Winter Sports Clinic since 2008. "In conquering their sport, and in some cases their fears, everyday challenges seem more manageable. I believe our veterans gain strength from this experience and hopefully use it to overcome other challenges they may face when they return home."

The Winter Sports Clinic was an opportunity to see BVL funds at work, and it was also an inspiring personal experience for Eckert. "These veterans motivate me and many of the other volunteers to have the courage to challenge ourselves, go after our own dreams and to remember that nothing is impossible."

the house. By the end, people were watching, and there was a huge crowd. It was dead quiet, they unplugged the games, no announcements – it was really quiet. It was a really awesome environment."

Milito's achievement is pending approval from the United States Bowling Congress and would be the second perfect series of the 2018-2019 season and 36th USBC-approved 900 overall. Jonathan Wilbur of North Clarendon, Vermont, rolled a 900 series on Jan. 14, 2019.

Milito's 900 came on the first pair of the center, and he had recently shot 640 on that pair. He explained that Lane 1 was a lot tighter, and Lane 2 hooks early, so he used a stronger ball on Lane 1 and a weaker ball on Lane 2. He stuck with the same two balls the entire series.

Milito, who is a financial analyst, also had to clear a mental hurdle he had not encountered during an 878 series, his previous best series, shot two years ago.

"My longest run from the start had been the front 18, so after the first game and a half, it was unchartered territory," Milito said. "Even with the 878, I shot 278 the first game, then went 300-300. So, I was little nervous in the 10th frame of Game 2, because I felt if I got the first two (300 games), then I have a chance at something really big."

He said in Game 3, it was just all about taking it slow.

"Everyone was kind of staying away from me, like a pitcher with a perfect game, and the pace was really good, everyone going when it was their turn," Milito said.

The first USBC-approved 900 occurred Feb. 2, 1997 when Jeremy Sonnenfeld rolled three consecutive perfect games in Lincoln, Nebraska.

"NEVER GIVE UP!"

A few years ago, Carol Mancini prompted me to take a good look at the Glenn Allison story. What I found was a heroic saga that bothers me to this day. It is about the man who overcame the harshest of bowling conditions and accomplished what was thought to be impossible. On July 1st, 1982, Glenn Richard Allison bowled the first legitimate 900 series in sanctioned league play.

What's bothersome is the governing body of that time, the ABC, failed to sanction it because of "non-compliant" lane conditions. This was the flimsiest of excuses because "compliant" conditioning was not well-defined back then; it was purely a judgment call.

Why was this excuse used? Carol, publisher of this gazette, dealt with many of the people involved with this event. She explains it this way: "My husband, Nick Mancini, was a good friend of a man named Bob Ramirez. Bob was the Secretary of the ABC for Orange County, California. After Glenn shot his 900 series, Nick told me something Bob Ramirez had said to him years ago. "Bob told me he would never sanction a 900 because he thought it was impossible!"

That's particularly troubling in view of what happened to Mr. Allison. CAROL MANCINI DOES NOT MAKE THINGS UP! The fact is, the ABC never sanctioned a single 900 series; it rejected six. That's a 100% rejection rate at a time the USBC claims only 8% of honor scores were rejected*!

Since that time, numerous efforts have been made to have Allison's name placed prominently at the top of the (now numerous) list of people to achieve this perfecto. Petitions have been circulated, articles have been written, phone calls have been made. All efforts have been fruitless. Why? Because the governing body of our sport, the USBC, has "closed the book" on this issue. In

other words, they are willing to allow this controversy to stain our sport forever. That's shameful!

The people in charge of the USBC have the power, authority and obligation to make right this terrible injustice. They are Mr. Chad Murphy, USBC Executive Director, and Mr. Jason Overstreet, USBC Deputy Executive Director. I have spoken to these gentleman several times about this issue. While both are amiable and knowledgeable, their response is that the position of the USBC* is to uphold the decision of the ABC for historical reasons.

When I asked what evidence was involved in that decision, they said it was public record. It could be obtained from The U.S. District Court, Central District of California, which resolved that case in favor of the ABC. They were kind enough to provide the very case number for Glenn Allison VS The ABC. Contacting that institution, I was told those files had been destroyed because the statute of limitations had expired. Strike one.

The search for those records led to Glenn Allison himself; surely he would have copies. He told me the records were in the possession of his attorney.

Me: GREAT! How do I contact him?

Glenn: You can't. He passed away years ago and I don't know what happened to his records. Me: Strike two.

I like a challenge, and endless pondering about this "David VS Goliath" epic resulted in the following epiphany: Through the back-door, the ABC DID sanction Glenn Allison's 900. That score was entered onto his "League Sheet" and included as part of his SANCTIONED AVERAGE. Phone calls to both Glenn Allison and La Habra 300 Bowl confirmed this. If an average is sanctioned, by default, every part of that average is sanctioned!!! This includes that legendary 900 series.

I've spoken to numerous affiliates of the local USBC, owners of different bowling centers, and a plethora of our local elite bowlers. Agreement was unanimous! The next step was to send that advisory to Mr. Murphy and Mr. Overstreet. That communication occurred via snail-mail on February 11, 2019. To date, I have heard nothing but crickets. Strike three.

As I've written many times, "The USBC seems to wish this controversy would just go away." But, If they think we will just quit, I have news for them. THIS AIN'T BASEBALL!!!

You see, Glenn Allison is more than just a bowling Hall-of-Famer. He is a gentleman, a legend, and a true ambassador of our sport. He deserves better from the USBC. He is more than a historical

Dear Mr. Murphy,

By now, I hope you have received and read the latest article* written for *The California Bowling News* regarding Glenn Allison. The bowlers of America implore you to reverse your decision about continuing to deny his rightful legacy of being placed in the #1 position on the list of those who achieved a 900 series. The reasons for this request are as follows:

- The only reason given for the denial of sanction for his 900 was, "non-compliant lane conditions." Evidence of this was tainted, hence irrelevant. Meaningful evidence (scores that night) indicated a tougher-than-normal pattern. Do you really believe tougher conditions are an ethical reason to deny immortality to this man?

- Regarding those conditions, La Habra 300 Bowl was not issued a citation for non-compliance that night, as required by the ABC. In fact, no record exists that La Habra 300 Bowl has EVER been issued a citation for rule violations of any kind, by either the ABC, USBC or the BPAA.**

- Bob Ramirez, Secretary for the ABC in Orange County at that time, made a comment to Nick Mancini that he would never sanction a 900 series. He believed it was impossible to achieve without cheating. This sheds light on suspicions about ABC policy regarding any 900 series. The fact is, at a time you claim only 8% of honor scores were rejected, the ABC denied sanction to six 900s. That's a 100% denial rate. That's unsportsmanlike conduct justifying reversal of the ABC's decision!

- Courts often get it wrong; their decisions are overturned all the time. It's unfortunate that Mr. Allison lacked funding to appeal. Only the USBC can now act on his behalf. Please do so.

- No one is asking you to rewrite history; we only ask you to set it right. Allison's 900 was sanctioned as part of his league average. That's history, too. You do have the authority to say, "Wait a minute.......... WE CAN PUT GLENN ALLISON ON TOP OF OUR LIST!"


- The bottom line is this: On July 1, 1982 Glenn Richard Allison, bowling in a center with an impeccable history, competed on sanctioned lanes, against sanctioned pins. He used a sanctioned bowling ball, in a sanctioned league, to roll the first legitimate 900 series in the history of our sport.

- "Closing the book" on this controversy does not make it go away. Rather, it casts suspicion on the USBC itself. Are you hiding something? Why do you not want to do what is obviously the right thing? Was some deal made when the USBC took over for the ABC? Does the USBC want their list topped by a USBC sanctioned bowler? The existence of this controversy just doesn't make sense.

To those of us lacking the historical records surrounding this event, your lack of action is a mystery. The statement you issued on November 22, 2014 was devoid of any meaningful data. What historical documents did you review? What was in them that lead to your decision to do nothing?

Glenn Allison got the shaft and everybody knows it! Only two things can end this controversy; his placement atop "The List," or an in-depth explanation as to why he doesn't belong there. This column challenges you to do either. Your membership deserves it. Please write that explanation and submit it to *The Bowlers Journal International* and *The California Bowling News*. Thank you for your reconsideration of this matter.

JOSIE BARNES WINS NATIONWIDE PWBA GREATER CLEVELAND OPEN

PARMA HEIGHTS, Ohio - The 2019 Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour season kicked off in dramatic fashion Saturday as Josie Barnes of Nashville, Tennessee, captured the Nationwide PWBA Greater Cleveland Open title.

Barnes, who now owns three career PWBA Tour titles, defeated Singapore's Cherie Tan in a thrilling finish at Yorktown Lanes, 223-213, to claim the title and \$10,000 top prize. The stepladder finals were streamed live at BowlTV. com.

The title match came down to the final frame with Tan leading by a single pin. Barnes, finishing the match first, delivered three strikes in the 10th frame to force Tan to do the same to claim her second career title.

Tan, a left-hander who was the top seed at the PWBA Greater Cleveland Open, stepped up and made one of her best shots of the week to start her final frame but was denied by a 9 pin on her first delivery.

"I knew if I didn't strike out, I probably wasn't going to win the match," said Barnes, a 30-year-old right-hander. "I knew Cherie was going to go up and make some great shots, since she's been making them all week. I made sure I stuck to my process, and after I got the third strike I sat down and told myself if it's meant to be, it'll happen.

"As soon as she let it go, I knew it was a great shot. As soon as I saw the 9 pin stand, I just started to cry. I guess it was supposed to be my day, and I'm going to enjoy this one."

The championship match saw Barnes face some transition on the right lane after leaving the 3-6-9-10 and 3-6-8-10 combinations in the third and fifth frames, respectively. She was unable to convert the split in the fifth frame, letting Tan move into the lead.

She made the correct adjustment to strike in the seventh

frame and delivered another strong shot in the ninth frame, leaving and converting a 10 pin, to set the stage for the exciting finish.

"I thought I threw it a little slow in the third, so I made a small move off it," said Barnes, who is a seven-time Team USA member. "I thought I threw it really well in the fifth and knew at about 30 feet it wasn't going to hold. At that point, I had to make a gutsy move to give myself a chance. After talking with my ball reps, we decided to make a 3 and 2. Even though I left the 10 pin in the ninth frame, I controlled the pocket and knew that was all I could do."

Tan led each round this week, and bested the field by more than 220 pins to earn the top seed. She started the title match using a urethane bowling ball, but switched back to a ball with a reactive coverstock in the sixth frame after three consecutive spares.

"Shannon (Pluhowsky of Dayton, Ohio) was using ure-thane, so I thought I'd give mine a shot," said Tan, who won the 2016 PWBA Storm Sacramento Open. "It was reading really nicely, and my reactive ball was struggling a little in the mids, so I decided to start with urethane. I threw the first shot in the 10th really well, and that's the only thing you can do. I can only control how well I throw it, and the rest is up to the pins, not me. But, it feels really great to bowl well since I was struggling during the second half of last year. I made some changes to my game, so I'm glad they're holding up."

Barnes advanced to the title match after delivering in the 10th frame against Singapore's Jazreel Tan, 234-232.

Jazreel Tan finished the semifinal first, rolling three strikes to force Barnes to fill 26 pins to win. Barnes delivered a double and toppled seven pins on her fill ball to advance. Jazreel Tan started Saturday's stepladder finals by rolling nine strikes on her way to a 266-225 victory over Pluhowsky.

Competition this week at the Nationwide PWBA Greater Cleveland Open included two eight-game qualifying blocks on Friday to determine the 32 players for Saturday's Round of 32. An additional eight-game block Saturday morning narrowed the field to 12 players, who bowled six additional games to determine the stepladder finalists.

The 2019 PWBA Tour season will continue May 2 at the PWBA Twin Cities Open. The event will be held at Cedarvale Lanes in Eagan, Minnesota, with wire-to-wire coverage on BowlTV.



As for her future, Taya knows she's not going anywhere

"I want to make it to the six-year mark [as owner]," Taya said. "No owner has made it more than five years. I want to get to six and obviously, I want to get more than

But then there's that "ultimate dream." The glitter and glamour of Hollywood has lured so many potential actors from throughout the country to move to Southern Califor-

Not so fast, Taya says.

"I never want to close this place for that," said Taya, adding that she's "definitely committed" to Bole-Mor

And that's good news for Pipestone and Bole-Mor, which was built in the 1960s.

Taya often works seven days a week – some days from 8 a.m. to midnight. She acknowledges that she's fought

that "burn-out" feeling, but she's pleased the town has shown its appreciation to the center's reopening.

That's a common theme that Taya has espoused – the great reception from the community, which lacks a movie theater. She seems genuinely touched when she tells a story about how the bowling center's kitchen was forced to close "for a while" after a big storm.

"I thought people would throw a fit, but people were so understanding," she said.

Taya also expresses delight that Bole-Mor is running "in the black," and that she repaid a loan for startup costs

Still, it hasn't been easy. Taya suffered a great personal loss a year ago when her mother, Cindy, died. Additionally, Cindy was a dedicated worker in the bowling center. "She definitely was a big help," Taya said.

Several people, including Taya's boyfriend, have stepped in to help her keep the bowling center running and in good working order. But there's no doubt that Taya, in the words of Stahl, a property investor, is the "driving force" behind the success of the bowling center.

"When the snow melted [earlier this month] and all the garbage was there, she was the one picking up every cigarette butt and getting the lot cleaned up and all straight," Stahl said. "She was looking around for the smallest, littlest things on the lot to pick up. She has a lot of pride in her business.

"You don't usually see that kind of commitment from such a young person. I think she'll have a real good long run at it." Grueling hours aside, things are going well for Taya and her bowling center.

'We have 4,500 people in our town and to have that [bowling center] is great," said Stahl, a Pipestone resident who doesn't consider himself much of a bowler. "I have kids and I take them bowling. And I'm bowling more than



1989 - PART 6

In 1989 most weekly issues of Bowling News were 40 pages! Each center was trying to fill their lanes, re-model, keep their bowlers happy, brag or stay in touch. Tournament clubs filled half the pages. One ad for the Grab Bag listed 91 pro shops where you could buy the bag. (Another Nick Mancini invention.)

- November 10, 1989 issue, Frank Kietz had a story and pictures of VERY early bowlers. How about Sir Frances Drake (not real photos) and Abraham Lincoln? The game was called "bowles". In 1895 the A.B.C. was formed, rules were made and anti-gaming was enforced.
- Local wheel chair champion AI Ulttecht appeared on ABC's ESPN "Bowling World". Al
 was competing in the Nationals-he came in second. (AI, if you are still around, call Carol
 any Monday at the Bowling News.)
- Glenn Allison was off to Helsinke, Finland to bowl in Tali Bowl's Santa Claus Open.
- J.A.T. hotshots at La Habra had photo shots in November. For the girls: Amber Smith, Kelly Estrada, Tina Padilla, and Pam Reidburger. Guys: Frank Flores, Larry Licherman, Mike Hornacek and Andy Neeman. Too bad we have to "grow-up", get a job, fall in love and raise more bowlers!
- Allen Shaw, Corbin Bowl owner, could never be caught smiling at the camera. But Kevin Kikuchi smiled when he received the check for his 300!
- For Sale: 40 foot Trawler. Parked in a slip in Oceanside. (Probably used a bowling ball for an anchor.)
- In a short span of 8 days, three deaf bowlers rolled perfect games; Billy Spears, Carl Malucci and Michael Olivera.
- Tish Johnson went wire to wire before going to the bank! She deposited \$25,000 for her LPBT win at Sam's Town.
- P.J. Carroll constructed the 24 lane center in Bullhead City. Should open in April of 1990.
 Will find out soon. (Opening Day I was there, so was Frank Kietz and Art Goddard.)
- The manager at Rancho Bowl was Fred Money. Doesn't that bring a thousand pictures to mind? Would you change your name?
- Marv Sargent of La Mesa won his 2nd PCB title. Note: Marvin Sargent will be inducted into the California USBC Hall of Fame, June of 2019. Congrats Marv!
- Bill Mossontte owned Mission Hills Bowl 18 years before an 800 was bowled. Ed Lubrin broke the barrier by one (801). 6 million games had been bowled before the eight. (Somebody figured it out.)
- Hall of Famer Buddy Bomar died at age 74. Andy Marzich was in line for ABC Hall of Fame. Randy Pederson was 8th on the PBA money list.
- Joe Russin was G.M. at Garden Grove.
- Olympic Committee says "NO BOWLING" again!
- Legend Frank Catalano died. Age 68.
- West Hills Lanes in Vegas was begging for sweepers, clubs, meetings, etc. Was hard to compete with Gold Coast.
- Reg Pearson ruled the roost at BALLY's in Vegas. A real card!
- Questions? How many boards wide is a lane? How many arrows on a lane? The center dot is on what board? How many dots at the foul line? What are lanes made of? (No fair checking your phone!)
- Gold Stamps. You could get your own, complete with your signature and bowling accomplishment. No charge! 26 centers had Gold Stamp programs and books could be exchanged at Sears and Vons for merchandise.
- Nelson Burton Jr gave his advice on a one hour video cassette. Sit at home and learn to bowl?? Improve?
- Words a bowler doesn't want to hear "League fees are going up, the lane machine is broke, your anchorman has to work late, you pulled it, your ball is dripping oil, has your thumb hole always been cracked, somebody spilled a beer on the approach, your wife is calling, that pin cost us the championship, your car has a flat tire, its snowing and the roads are closed".
- In 1989, the A.B.C. was studying the "coefficient of friction specifications for ball and lane surfaces." Their findings might be voted on at 1990 convention.

- Sherry Streit was a desk lady at **Del Rio Lanes** Her husband went lobster diving every weekend and had a freezer full. So, Sherry ran a tournament. 1st Place was 2 five pound lobsters. 2nd Place was 2 three pound lobsters. High game male and female a one pound lobster each. One night he brought a 32 pounder into the bowl for bowlers to see!
- Amleto Monocelli and Tish Johsnon won the BALLY's Doubles and \$20,000 each. Tish also got a pie in the face from Tori Romeo.
- Braasch opened a new Pro Shop inside Tustin Lanes. The other one was a Braasch Bowling Supply in Westminster.
- New! Flash Bowling Cards. Instant info; coaching, confidence, skill sets, spare combos, courtesy, safety, lanes...the works! You could "carry a coach in your pocket."
- Fred Riccilli, owner of **Champion Lanes**, welcomed the Western Senior Bowling Tour. John Handegard shot a 300 and snagged first place.
- The JAT finals of 1989 was televised on Channel 18. The finals winner wasn't revealed until the 1st of 1990. So we'll find out next week.
- The YABA reported their "In School Bowling Program" was a great success. Junior bowlers were storming their local centers. Then, the _____ hit the fan! School systems discovered they were being "used" by money making businesses! The program disappeared. Of course there is more to the story, but a loss to the kids.
- Bowlium and Thunderbird Lanes in the Citrus Belt were selected to host the 1990
- Men's State Tournament. Over 3000 teams were expected.
- Pete Porter was Secretary of the San Gabriel Valley Men's Assn.
 He loved to give away 300/800 rings!
- Dave Eisenhower's mustache framed his big smile when he received his 300 ring. Leon Kelly,
 Friendly Hills sales manager smiled for the picture too.

The final issue of the year had 28 pages. 22 pages were filled with ads for New Years Eve events. Colored pins, Blue Chips, 5 gamers, marathons, midnite celebrations, noise makers, all-nighters, champagne, balloons, pajama parties, etc. The Bowling was just an excuse!!! So long 1989. Next time I'll open the big black book for 1990 and we'll find out what happened and who did it!


