## Bowling With The Stars

TARZANA, CA—The line-ups and format are set for the first United States Bowling Congress presentation of "Bowling With the Stars" on Monday, May 8 at 7 p.m. (PDT) near Los Angeles.

The event is similar to the popular television series "Dancing With the Stars" in that it will feature experts paired with celebrities for coaching and competition. The first "Bowling With the Stars" isn't a TV series - yet. Rather, the May 8 show will be one night of fun and charity at Corbin Bowl in Tarzana, Calif.

All proceeds from ticket sales will benefit Bowl for the Cure®, a year-round fundraising and breast cancer awareness initiative by USBC in partnership with the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation.

Nine celebrities, including some of the fastest rising young actors in Hollywood, will bowl alongside three of the greatest women's bowlers active today - Carolyn Dorin-Ballard, Kim Terrell and Diandra Asbaty. All three bowlers are preparing for June's \$200,000 USBC Queens tournament, the pinnacle event in women's professional and amateur bowling.

There will be three teams, each made up of four bowlers (one women pro and three stars per team), named after three major USBC bowling programs:

- 1) Youth Captain: Diandra Asbaty. Asbaty is the official spokesperson for USBC Youth bowling. She is the reigning U.S. Amateur champion and an 8-time member of Team USA.
- 2) High School Captain: Carolyn Dorin-Ballard. Dorin-Ballard is the official spokesperson for USBC High School bowling. She is a 20-time PWBA titlist and won the 2001 Queens tournament.
- 3) Collegiate Captain: Kim Terrell. Terrell is the official spokesperson for USBC Collegiate bowling. She is a nine-time PWBA champion and won the 2002 Queens tournament.

# National Deaf Bowling News

## Cleveland Deaf Club Team 3165 Wins Great Lakes Deaf Tournament

CHICAGO—The unofficial posted team event scores in the 70th annual Great Lakes Deaf Bowling Association tournament at Stardust Lanes in Addison showed Cleveland Association of the Deaf at the top with handicap score of 3165. Albany Elites from Albany, NY rets in 2nd place with 3095 and Old Timers of Akron, OH in third place with 3072. There were 76 teams entered.

Surprisingly the team winning score is the lowest in this high scoring tournament in past 11 years and only 2nd time since 1986. In fact for the last 19 years the average team winning handicap score was 3379. The all-time handicap score was 3545 (3144 scratch) made by 5 “Pro” Bowlers of Detroit.

Last year’s winner, Fast N’ Furious from Detroit set an all-time deaf team scratch record 3334 series and 3406 with handicap at Merrillville, IN. Also there were 5 other records set in other events last year at Merrillville

The winning Cleveland team consists of 4 middle-aged men and a 19 years old anchor Josh Phelps who uses two hands in releasing his ball. Right-handed Phelps who carries a 203 average led the team with a 731 series. It was not a fluke, Phelps went on next day to post a 2009 scratch all-events score (first time this writer ever knew of a 19 years old hearing impaired youngster rolled a 2000 all-events score.

Two teams from West Coast participated in this 70th annual tournament and one, So. Calif. Deaf Bowlers placed 5th with 3040. The Los Angeles team entered with one bowler short and was filled with a pick-up Tim Estes from Tacoma, WA. Estes and the team anchor Pablo Yoma sparked the team with 660 and 650 respectively. Yoma continued his fine scoring with 619 in singles and 661 doubles for 1930 all-events total.

All scores are unofficial and the official results and prize lists will be issued within 30 days after the tournament. We will report all the events when we get them.

**PATTYBROTHAY’S 760 SERIES HAD GAMES OF 245-258-257**

CHICAGO...In the last article I wrote of Stacey Thompson’s three 700 series in a month. Her 748 series was not the highest this season. I recall writing about Patty Brothag of Matuna, OH who rolled a 760 in the Central States Deaf Queens tournament last November.

Well, I bumped into her in Chicago and got the proof of her scores. Her games were 245-258-257. She continued with two more, 169-219 for 1145 for five games and ended up with a 228 in her 6th games for a total of 1373 and an average of 228.8 that day.

**ABAKUMOFF THREE IN ROW AS LEADER IN DEAF TRAVEL**

ARCADIA—Ed Abakumoff led the So. Calif. Deaf Traveling League for third time in row in its stop at AMF Bowling Square Lanes. There were no 800 as Abakumoff failed by only 7 pins for a 793. Five of 6 teams hit 2000 plus team series and the 6th team failed by only 23 pins.

In his 793, Abakumoff had 168-183-198-244 as his Riverside

team won 13.5 points from Darrell Stogryn’s El Camino Village. Stogryn had 205/712 and teammate Paul Taffolla 204-203/752.

Pablo Yoma, fresh from his fine showing in Chicago last week-end, placed 2nd on the honor roll with his 219/755 as South Bay extended its top position with 11-9 win over Los Angeles. Gardy Rodgers rolled 222/747 for Los Angeles. Rick Pennington and Dan Flores combined 241/754 and 224-232/739 respectively in Hollywood’s 16-4 victory over S. F. Valley. Bob Jones with 214/730 and Jim Mohr with 209/721 were high for Valley.

The league thanks AMF Bowling Square General Manager Art Ouzenian and his staff for hosting and getting things running smoothly. On Sunday May 7 the league travels to Canoga Park Lanes for its final position round. Leader South Bay is so far ahead in first place and 2nd place S. F. 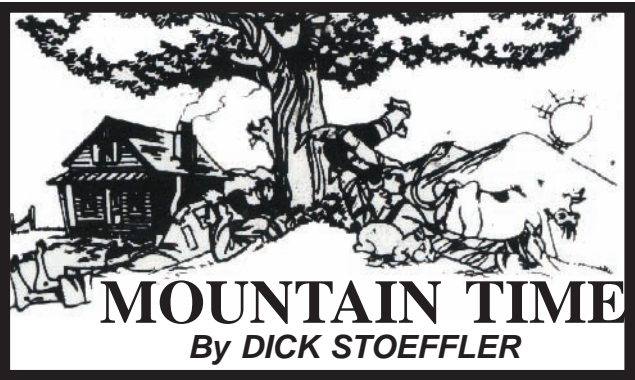

LAS VEGAS, NV — O.K. So this is about our third column of the year. Think how many folks we’ve made happy: The USBC crew, the 900-series clan, the PBA and the PBA TV show wonderkind, and the idiots who think everybody should average 250 or somesuch.

We have a good excuse. A bunch of medical procedures and just plain feeling crappy. A major operation to clear up the problems is slated for May 10, but then it has been postponed four times already. We are going into the ninth month of this festive mess. If I’d just been pregnant, it would be done by now, but we are looking at over a week in the hospital and who knows how long to recuperate at home. Thank God for my wife Susie.

As much as I love the game, it hurts to say it, but it becomes boring on way too many Sunday telecasts, especially now when they “cram” 3-games into 1 1/2 hours.

In Sports Illustrated, they have a “Faces in the Crowd” page, which each week pictures six players and a short blurb about outstanding achievement in any sport. (Hey, I even made it once! For league attendance.) But the only time bowling gets a mention anymore is for a 300-game...bowled by someone 10-years-old or under. 900’s don’t rate. Our best stuff just falls short, anymore. We’ve made it too easy. We’ve succumbed to the “X” game. Then when we get a 300 on a sport condition, by a gal, no less, the dimwits at the USBC turn it down because of slow paperwork, or somesuch. Frankly, sport conditions should become standard for every center. The tougher the better. Make it a challenge.

It is too great a game to be ruined by nincompoops who feel every shot should be a strike, no matter the degree of skill. For starters, we’d love to see heavier pins, and bowlers limited to one-ball per series...the ball they select in shadow practice.

By the way, we should be taking big advantage of the publicity Jerome Bettis and a host of sport’s stars are giving bowling with their acknowledgement that they love to bowl. Bettis has a 300 and averages around 200, and is in the celebrity section of our Hall of Fame! Great. Add that to the great job our youths are doing and getting very active in bowling...it is a rare bright light for our side. By the way, the kids seem to be pushing harder for tougher conditions than any other group! Yeah! Way to go gang!

With the music of one of my most prized music albums playing in the background...(The Clara Ward Gospel Singers backed by Dukes of Dixieland) we’d like to wish one and all, good bowling and good health...hopefully we will be back to a semi-normal schedule in a couple of months. Take care!
