Liz Johnson Claims USBC Queens Title

RENO, Nev. - At the start of the week, Liz Johnson of Cheektowaga, N.Y., had virtually written off her chances of capturing the 2009 United States Bowling Congress Queens, the one title that had always eluded her.

Fast forward a few days and Johnson found herself standing on the lanes wearing the Queens tiara, holding the trophy and savoring a moment she had only dreamed about up until that point.

Johnson defeated 2007 Queens champion Kelly Kulick of Union, N.J., 247-204, to earn the title before a crowd of nearly 1,500 at the Reno Events Center. The victory earned her \$30,000 and a place among bowling's biggest names as Queens champion.

"This is the most prestigious women's event, and to be in the company of some of the women who have won this is amazing," said Johnson, who finished second to Shannon Pluhowsky at the 2006 Queens. "I was so close to winning the title in 2006, and it took me a couple of months to get over that loss, but this

feels absolutely amazing."

Johnson, the top seed, never thought she would have a shot at the title this week after getting off to a rocky start and landing in 71st place after the opening round of qualifying at the National Bowling Stadium. She slowly moved up the standings and fought through the double-elimination match-play bracket undefeated to claim the title.

"This week I bowled OK but my reaction wasn't that good, and I barely won some matches," said Johnson, who now has 13 professional women's titles including the 2007 U.S. Women's Open. "I'm a fighter, though. When it comes to anything, especially bowling, I'm going to fight my way through."

Johnson and Kulick both got off to hot starts in the championship match. After Johnson left a 7 pin on a solid pocket shot, she rattled off four consecutive strikes.

Kulick, however, started the game with five strikes before disaster struck. In the sixth frame, Kulick left the Greek Church, the 4-6-7-9-10 split, and fell into a deficit from which she would never recover.

After converting the 2 pin in the sixth frame, Johnson strung together three more strikes to easily claim the championship.

"This is the one title that has eluded her, and she earned it today," Kulick said. "If there is any bowler I want to finish second to, it's Liz. She's hav-

ing a great career. She just keeps fighting and seems to overcome everything."

In reaching the title match, Kulick took out Michelle Feldman of Auburn, N.Y., 221-170, in the semifinal. Feldman started with an open and Kulick never trailed in the match.

Kulick defeated Lisa Bishop of Belleville, Mich., the match before by starting with nine consecutive strikes in a 262-224 win. Stepping up in the final frame in her bid for a televised perfect game, Kulick threw the ball a tad slow and it hooked through the head pin and left the 3-4-6-7 split.

To open the championship round, Bishop defeated Brenda Edwards of Mansfield, Texas, 221-199. After leaving the 3-4-6-7-9-10 split in the final frame, Bishop converted the spare to keep her hopes alive. Edwards could have advanced with three consecutive strikes in the 10th frame, but left the 6-10 on her first shot.

The Queens championship round was conducted on lanes specially constructed inside the Reno Events Center, which will host the USBC Convention this weekend. The same lanes will be used to tape Bowling's Clash of Champions, a USBC event, which will air on CBS Sports on May 9 from 4-6 p.m. Eastern.

The Queens, which is presented by Eldorado, Silver Legacy and Circus Circus, featured a field of 251 of the top female bowlers in the world competing for a total prize fund of \$200,000.

Australian Belmonte Earns 2008-09 PBA Rookie of the Year Honors

SEATTLE—Australian two-handed bowling sensation Jason Belmonte has been named the Professional Bowlers Association's 2008-09 Harry Golden Rookie of the Year.

Belmonte, whose revolutionary bowling style will be featured on ESPN's E:60 program Tuesday at 7 p.m. Eastern, won The Bowling Foundation Long Island Classic, earning him an exemption to compete on the 2009-10 Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour.

The 25-year old from Orange, Australia made the match play field six times and cashed in eight of the nine events he entered during the 2008-09 Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour season. Belmonte averaged

219.2 and earned \$44,380. His other top finishes during the season were 10th place in the season-opening PBA World Championship, 11th in the Etonic Marathon Open, 12th in the GEICO Plastic Ball championship and 15th in the Denny's Dick Weber Open.

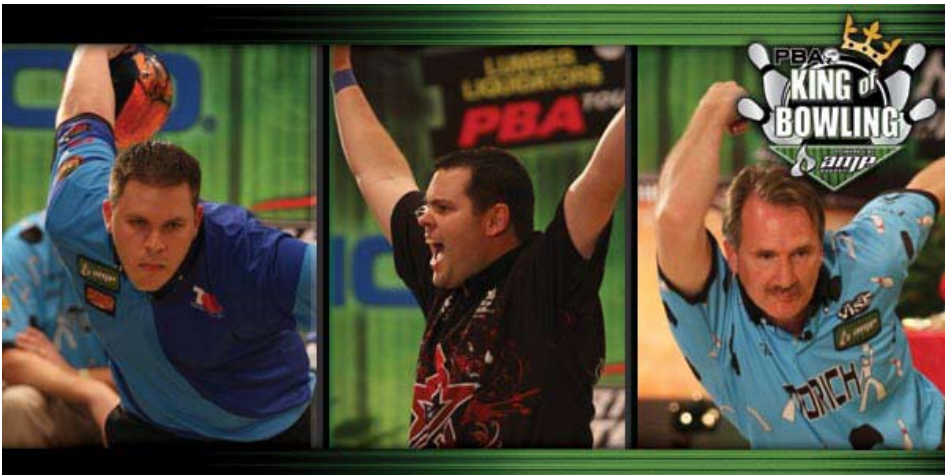
"To have won the same award as guys who I look up to as bowlers like Chris Barnes, Tommy Jones, Ryan Shafer and the legend Pete Weber is extremely cool and rewarding," said Belmonte. "I hope that my career as a full-time player on the Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour is just as successful as my first season. I am excited and very thankful to the all of those who voted for me."

Belmonte and his unique method of bowling garnered a great deal of media attention throughout the 2008-09 season including appearances on ABC's Good Morning America, NBC's Today Show and The Fox Network's Fox & Friends.

He was also featured in the Wall Street Journal, Los Angeles Times, ESPN The Magazine, Denver Post, Boston Globe and ESPN.com among many other media outlets.

The Rookie of the Year honor is named after the late hall of fame PBA Tour tournament director Harry Golden and is voted on by the PBA membership and a select group of bowling writers.

No news about the new center being added to the Vegas travel league schedule yet, and it's still up in the air regarding the league being 14 or 16 teams. Abakumoff 280/992, Stogryn 910, Yoma 289 In Deaf Travel At Del Rio

DOWNEY — So. Calif. Deaf Traveling League closed its regular season with exciting high scores at Del Rio Lanes. League President Ed Abakumoff anchoring for his first place Riverside went on a striking spree in the first game with Pablo Yamo of 2nd place S.F. Valley in the final position round. After matching Yoma with strikes, Abakumoff hit a bump in 7th frame and Yoma continued with 10 in a row only to be tapped with 10-pin standing on his 11th ball. Yoma spared for his season best 289 while Big Ed in 8th and 9th spared in 10th for a 255. Bob Jones has the league's season high game, 298.

In 2nd game, Yoma lost his carry and finished with a 171 while Big Ed kept on striking until an open in 8th frame and spare in 9th and struck out for another 255. In the 3rd game, it was all Big Ed with strike, spare and 10 in a row for a neat 280 for the league's season high 790 series, 10 pins short of a much pursued 800. Then Big Ed struggled to finish with a 202 for the league's season high 992 series replacing Darrell Stogryn's 896. Meanwhile, Yoma continued his struggle with 186 and 176 for a 822.

Stogryn, himself did well that afternoon with games of 222-211-219 and finished with a much needed 258 for a remarkable 910, his 6th 900 in this league raising his average to league leading 217. Abakumoff's 992 raised his average to 205. Bob Jones had a miserable start with 135 and closed with 226-198-234 for a 792, eight pins short of an 800 and dropping his average to 204. Yoma finished with 198 average.

Also on the honor roll were Paul Taffolla with 204/723, Gardy Rodgers 721, Andy Lorenzo 702 and Don Millwee 203-216. Millwee had a miserable start but finished strong for a 694 series. Jim Mohr and Robert Taylor both had 692, 8 pins short of being placed on the Roll.

Abakumoff's 280 with Taffolla's 204 helped their Riverside to a 609 3rd game, Stogryn's 258 and Millwee's 216 gave their El Camino Village a 606 game and Jones' 234 pushed his Los Angeles to a 612 game. Riverside had a prior 628 as the league's high team game but it's 2363 season high team series takes precedence and S.F. Valley's 623 takes the season high team game.

Riverside wrapped up the league title with the 5th point from Taffolla's 204 in 3rd game on way to a 13-7 victory over S.F. Valley. Valley took 3 points in first game but could not continue the same course in other games and placed 2nd. 4th place Los Angeles over took Glendale and moved up to third with 13-7 win over Glendale. While Glendale dropped to 4th, El Camino Village stayed in 5th with a 12.5-7.5 win over 6th place Tri-Cities.

The league thanks Del Rio's G.M. Mike Cammarata and his staff for being good host. The league will hold its season ending sweepstakes at Bryan Alpert's Pickwick Bowl.

DECLINING ENTRIES IN DEAF TOURNAMENTS

Also there are only 21 teams in Pacific Coast Deaf Bowling Association Tournament in Dublin, CA this Memorial Day weekend.

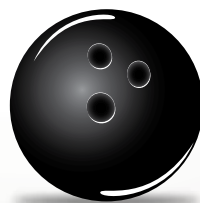
