ZEKE VEITENHEIMER Competes on Road and Lanes

REDLANDS — Zeke Veitenheimer is an all around athlete with a reputation as a competitive bicycle racer and bowler. On his two wheeler, Zeke looks like a FORTY YEAR OLD KID though he is a seventy-one year old man. The first time I saw him peddle by I thought it was LANCE ARMSTRONG. Those spandex shirts and shorts are deceiving. They make bicycle riders look malnourished. Oh yes, I'm still trying to digest the look of those shaved legs.

Since taking up bowling Zeke has steadily improved and now averages over 220. Better yet he has successfully taken his talent on the road. His results in the latest Military Tournament, in Las Vegas, were impressive. He showed he can bowl well anywhere.

When in Vegas Zeke averaged 226 for the twelve game competition and cashed. His scores were 949 (208 - 239 - 247 - 259) singles, 927 (236 - 202 - 246 - 243) doubles and 831 (169 - 205 - 211 - 246) team. In the two most recent military tournaments he has a second place finish and a third place finish in doubles.

Can Zeke move up to 230? I think so. The sky is the limit. Though he is a super senior he is fit and healthy. His bicycle training has made him younger than his years.

Parker Bohn III Wins PBA50 Miller High Life Classic For First PBA50 Tour Title

Another Battle of PBA Greats, Bohn Defeats Pete Weber 232-229 in Championship Match

MOORESVILLE, N.C. — Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer Parker Bohn III of Jackson, N.J., finished the championship match of the PBA50 Miller High Life Classic presented by Columbia 300 with six consecutive strikes to win his first PBA50 Tour title Wednesday at George Pappas' Victory Lanes. Overcoming a 4-6-7-8-10 split and open in the third frame, Bohn defeated fellow Hall of Famer Pete Weber of St. Ann, Mo., 232-229 in the championship match. With Weber finishing the match first, Bohn needed a double and eight pins in the 10th frame to win but threw three solid strikes to pull out the victory.

"It was a good example of never giving up," said Bohn, who ranks sixth on the PBA Tour career titles list with 33 wins. "I trailed the whole game until the last ball. All you can ask for is an opportunity and I was able to take advantage of it. "For the fans, that's what they come to see," the two-time PBA Player of the Year continued. "In a match that comes down to the last shot for the title, you can't ask for much more than that."

Early in the match, Bohn was wrestling with two issues, struggling with the shot on the left lane and getting a clean release from the ball he was



using.

"I was going back and forth between the two balls I had but finally I just had to go with the one that would release off my hand the best," he said.

Bohn's win came after fifth and fourth-place finishes in the first two tournaments of the season. He is also the third consecutive Hall of Famer to win a PBA50 Tour tournament with Amleto Monacelli winning the season-opening Pasco County (Fla.) Open and Norm Duke winning last week's UnitedHealthcare Sun Bowl In The Villages.

In the semifinals, Bohn defeated three-time PBA50 Tour winner Harry Sullins, 247-224, to advance to the title match. Weber, who dominated qualifying and was trying for his third PBA50 Tour title, beat Hall of Famer and four-time PBA50 Player of the Year Tom Baker, 189-161.

"With the competition out here the way it is, I didn't imagine it would happen this early," Bohn said. "Whenever you bowl another Hall of Famer you have to bring it all to the table and that's what I had to do tonight."

The PBA50 Tour takes a four-week break before return-

ing for the tour's two majors in Las Vegas.

The Suncoast PBA Senior U.S. Open presented by Dexter will be conducted June 1-6 at the Suncoast Bowling Center to be followed by the USBC Senior Masters June 8-13 at the South Point Bowling Center.

PBA Champion Mike Edwards Looks Forward to PBA's Return to Oklahoma

Home state native among 120 PBA stars set to compete in Grand Casino Resort Summer Swing May 17-25

SHAWNEE, OK — After bowling on the PBA Tour for more than 12 years without a title, Mike Edwards of Tulsa held a record he didn't especially want: most prize money won without a PBA Tour title.

After several runner-up finishes during that span, the native Oklahoman put an end to that record on April 16, 1994 when he won the IOF Foresters Bowling for Miracles Open at Club 300 Bowl in Markham, Ontario, for his first PBA Tour title.

Edwards, who was top qualifier for the ABC-TV Pro Bowlers Tour-televised finals 20 years ago, turned back fifth-seeded Pete Weber, the tournament's defending champion, 203-192, in the championship match for the \$43,000 first prize.

"It was one of those 'strike-to-win' moments I dreamed of as a kid," Edwards recalled. "I just made up my mind to be aggressive and leave it all out on the table which helped me get over the nerves."

That championship match 20 years ago wasn't easy, but Edwards remembers it as if it happened last week. He and Weber were neck and neck through the first seven frames before Weber, who would eventually become a member of the PBA Hall of Fame, gave Edwards an opening by leaving the 4-6-7-10 split in the eighth frame. Knowing victory was within reach, Edwards clinched the match with a strike on his first shot in the 10th frame.

"I had an idea that the scoring would be lower by the time we bowled the championship match so my game plan was to keep the ball in play," the now-52-year-old Edwards recalled. "Any mistakes you make would be exaggerated so staying focused and not getting caught up in the moment was important."

Edwards, who now splits his time between the PBA50 Tour – for players 50 and older – and the so-called "kids' tour," will be among the 120 top PBA players when the Grand Casino Resort and FireLake Bowling Center in Shawnee hosts Oklahoma's Grand Casino Resort PBA Summer Swing May 17-25. The Summer Swing will mark the PBA's first visit to Oklahoma since the 2005 Tulsa Championship at The Lanes at Coffee Creek, which was won by Tommy Jones.

The Summer Swing will include four PBA Tour title events – the Wolf, Bear and Badger Opens, and the PBA Oklahoma Open – plus Oklahoma's Grand Casino Resort Summer King of the Swing special event which will include the four tour event winners plus a "wild card" player. The finals of each event will be taped over the May 24-25 weekend on a special lane installation in the Grand Casino Resort Events Center for airing on CBS Sports Network beginning in early June.

One of Edwards' most cherished accomplishments is his induction into the American Indian Athletic Hall of Fame in 1997. He is the only bowler to be inducted into the Hall.

"It was a feeling of pride for not only myself but also for the sport," Edwards said. "To be recognized with the other great athletes in the Hall was a great honor."

Edwards is still a highly-competitive player. He demonstrated he can still play the game at a high level when he finished third in the 2012 PBA Senior U.S. Open – the first tournament he entered as a "senior" competitor – and won the United States Bowling Congress Senior Masters a week later.

Beyond his participation on the lanes, he has increasingly turned his eyes toward helping the PBA off the lanes. He and his wife Samantha Mulligan, who is a member of the PBA staff, were instrumental in bringing the Summer Swing to the FireLake Bowling Center and the Grand Casino Resort.

"The Grand Casino people have really embraced the sport and competitive bowlers," Edwards said. "They started by hosting successful regionals including last year's RPI and they want more tournaments. We approached them about the idea of hosting the Summer Swing and they were immediately very interested. We're just happy to be able to bring the sport back to Oklahoma."

All qualifying and match play rounds in the Summer Swing will be held at FireLake before the finals move to the specially-constructed lanes in Grand Casino's Center. The eight-day program also will include a PBA Southwest Region tournament at FireLake over Memorial Day weekend.

CARTER AND WATTS TO BE INDUCTED INTO CALIFORNIA USBC HALL OF FAME

SACRAMENTO — It is with pride we prepare for two very deserving members of our bowling family to be inducted into our prestigious Hall of Fame. The event will take place during our Annual Convention the weekend of June 7th & 8th at the Crowne Plaza Hotel (formerly the Holiday Inn) in Sacramento. Honoree for Superior Performance is to be **Tori Romeo Carter** of Laguna Hills and in the Meritorious Service category (posthumously) **Diddy Watts** of Pacoima.

Carter hails from the well-known Romeo family, with her mother Joan and sister Robin icons in the bowling arena. She has been bowling since nine years old and won the New York State Junior Championship title when she was 15 years old. She lettered in High School in her sophomore year for bowling and has been an “All Star” since the 1980’s. She started bowling in the California State Tournaments in 1982, continued to excel and never looked back. She was a member of the winning CWBA Team in 1988, 1989 and 2001. She won the Doubles with her sister Robin in 1992 in Modesto and All Events in 2001. Carter owns two (2) WWPB Merle Matthews Doubles titles; three (3) Singles titles; Mixed Doubles title in 2008 with Vince Wood; two (2) Professional Women Bowlers Association (PWBA) Singles title; and the Regional Players Championship in 1998. Carter was WWPB Bowler of the Year in 2001 and holds a Singles title in the Women’s All-Star Association where she was on the Southern California All-Star Team three (3) times. Prior to the merger with USBC, Carter was a member of the Los Angeles WBA and was on three (3) winning teams; won a Doubles title with Virginia Norton and one All Events title. In the Orange County USBC, Carter was once again on the winning Team in 2002 and held the High Average in the San Fernando Valley WBA .in 1981, 1988, and 1998. Carter and her husband Jeff moved to Las Vegas where while bowling the Nevada USBC State Tournament in 2010 she won Scratch All-Events posting a new state record of 2217 and was on the wining (4 women) team setting another record with a 2790 score along with Wendy McPherson, Robin Romeo, and Keli Callahan. They also set a record team game of 979. Carter rolled two (2) 700 series’ 795 and 742 with five games over 150 – 279,279,258,258,257. She claims ten (10) 300 games and in 1999 shot her first 800 series. Carter has been a member of the California WBA/USBC for over 20 years and has been a Personal Trainer for the last 15 years. She is married to Jeff Carter and has one son, Dave, who is a Paramedic. Tosh Kinjo was her coach when she first decided to get serious about bowling and since has been fortunate to be coached by the best: John Fantini, Bill Hall, John Jowdy and Danny Wiseman. Tori Romeo Carter, we welcome you into our 2014 Hall of Famer.

Watts began her bowling career in the mid 70’s when she showed up at to bowl at Starlite Lanes on Lankiershim Blvd. in North Hollywood. Watts became a very well known bowler at the center and eventually, with the urging of Starlite’s Manager Ernie Wargo and Pat Shatt, Director with the local Women’s Bowling Association, she not only agreed to become the center’s Youth Coach but a Delegate for the local WBA. It was a sad day when Starlite Lanes closed their doors, however, Watts was offered the position of Youth Director by Bill Mossontte, proprietor of Mission Hills Bowl in Mission Hills.

Not only did she join a league and enjoy a 154 average but immediately went to work and over the 29 years she served Mission Hills Bowl’s Youth Program it proved to be a prime example of what a dedicated center could do for youth bowling. Both her sons, Dean and Randy grew up in the program and she could see the wonderful value that bowling was offering the youngsters. Watts proved to be a leading force wherever she offered her services. While a member of the San Fernando Valley YABA, she was a Director 18 years; President 12 years; AJBC and YABA Certified Coach 29 years; Special Tournament Director six (6) years; Co-Chaired Youth City Tournament/Awards Banquet 11 years; Delegate to CSYABA Convention 10 years; Youth Leader four (4) years. Watts was also a sanctioned 31 year member with the San Fernando Valley WBA. where she served as a league secretary 25 of those years.

She served as SFVWBA Director four (4) years, and was elected as a WIBC Delegate one (1) year. During her service, she participated in the SFVWBA Tournament 10 years, the WIBC Tournament five (5) years and the California WBA Tournament four (4) years. Prior to the merging of ABC/WIBC/YABA, Watts was a member of the all important CSYABA/USBC Merger Committee and immediately following the merger in 2006, she became a certified member and Director on the North Los Angeles County USBC Association board serving (six) 6 years on the Youth Committee, City Tournament Committee, and Awards Committee. Watts was elected to the USBC California Association Board of Directors and California Youth Committee where she served for six (6) years. During that time she served on almost all of the USBC committees i.e. Marketing, Tournament, Ancillary Tournament, Product Fair, Convention, Legislative, and Youth State Scratch Tournament (as Director). As CYC Director of District #6, Watts worked the Coca-Cola District Tournament three (3) years and Director of that for District #6 seven (7) years; State Coca-cola Tournament and Pepsi Tournament six (6) years; State Scratch Tournament three (3) years. Watts worked nearly all the committees: Scholarship, Meritorious Service, Nominating, Special Studies, Site Selection and was CSYABA Youth Leader Advisor five (5) years. Regretfully, Diddy Watts fell ill in 2011 and although she never lost her spirit, she lost her battle to regain her health on November 16, 2012. She will always be remembered for her dedicated service and special passion for the betterment of the Youth Programs. Indeed, a true Hall of Famer.

Sign The Petition To Make Allison's 900 Official

LA HABRA — Glenn Allison shot the first ever 900 series in sanctioned play in 1982 right here at La Habra 300 Bowl, however the ABC failed to recognize it due to lane conditions. There has been a recent resurgence on getting the USBC to overturn this decision, and reconsider it. — Andrea Gage-Werren

On July 1, 1982, Glenn Allison rolled the first perfect (900) series in sanctioned competition in the history of bowling. However, the series was turned down by the then-American Bowling Congress (ABC) due to non-compliant lane conditions, allegedly discovered during a post-series inspection of the lanes.

In the years since Allison's feat, two dozen 900s have been approved by what is now the US Bowling Congress (USBC). Even though the rules at the time disallowed Allison's 900, consider the following:

- Allison's 900 was a highly difficult feat due to the low-scoring environment at La Habra 300 Bowl that night;
- The 900 was bowled with a Columbia Yellow Dot, long before the advent of high-friction bowling ball technology and a generally higher scoring environment;
- Allison has had a hall-of-fame bowling career, and racked up PBA titles and ABC eagles long before his perfect series. He is a highly skilled player whose bowling ability earned him the sport's ultimate achievement. His 900 was not a "fluke";
- USBC rules have since been changed so that lanes no longer need to be inspected immediately following each score eligible for an award;
- The USBC has approved two 900 series bowled in pre-bowling (unopposed) situations with no witnesses, yet has refused to recognize Allison's series bowled under the pressure of a packed house of spectators; Allison turns 84 this year. He deserves official recognition of his accomplishment during his lifetime.

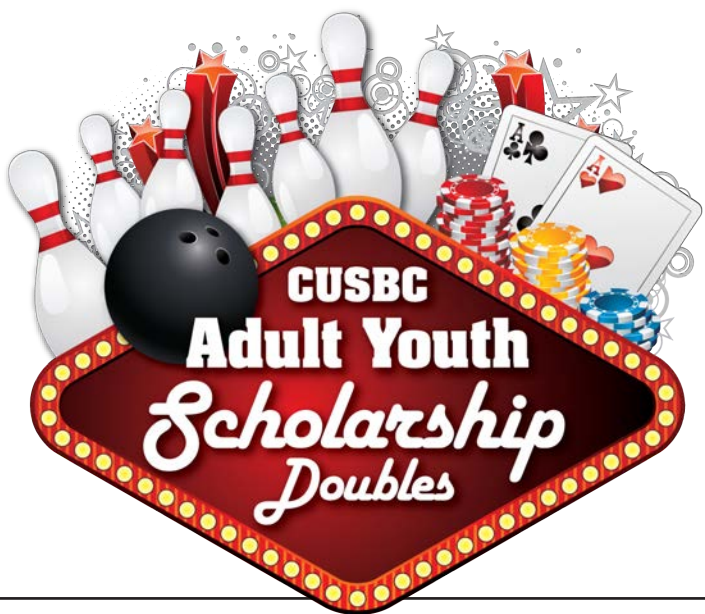

It was quite an affair with lots of food, held in the meeting room/play room. Yes, the centers all had play rooms and provided babysitting. But that’s another story. Anyway, all the awards were given at the banquet with much pomp and circumstance and it was a very civilized and dignified event. There was much merry making and thanking of the league officers and the bowling center manager. Everyone was happy they were finished “chasing” scores for all their sweeper tickets. In those days, you purchased a ticket for yourself in singles and a ticket for each set of doubles you were involved in, such as ladies doubles, men’s doubles or mixed doubles. Yikes! A serious sweeper bowler might have two dozen or more tickets to track and that could be a major task. It did make interesting outcomes though and not always were the highest bowlers the winners. As a youngster, I was the designated score chaser for my father who was definitely a serious sweeper gambler! That is probably the reason I can so easily add bowling scores and not so easily balance my checkbook! We all had fun and felt appreciated by our bowling center because in those days, league bowlers were the bread and butter for their business. Leagues were full house, 5 bowlers on a team and usually had a waiting list to join. I am reminded of these times since it is the “dead zone” time at Pickwick. Leagues have finished and everyone is taking a week off before starting the next session. There were no weeks off in those days so the lack of league play this week took me right back to those glorious days of non stop league play. Back to banquets and complicated sweepers. Back to the symbiotic relationship between bowlers and bowling centers. 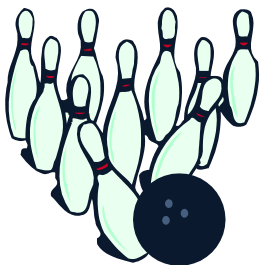

THE WAY IT WAS

Lanes, balls, gutters, pits and everything else was anything goes. For an early ball you went to a carpenter or machinist because they were made of wood, though no metal was allowed. But the wooden ball wore out of a round and had to be evened around from time to time. Thus a ball return in the late 1800s and early 1900s had balls from the current size to some as small as a large softball.

What may surprise many of today's bowlers is that the better bowlers fought almost every advance. They were against going from two-fingered balls to three or more.

They were against the installation of dots and arrows on the approaches and lanes as targets and the use of darker colored boards on lanes that led to the pocket area. They fought for modifying the fat bellied pins and any pin that seemed to fall too easily. And rather than have a foul calling person sit at either end of the line of lanes they positioned many foul judges in a coop like structure erected into the wall at either side to give a great view of the feet if they inched over the foul line.

Most of today's bowlers never bowled with a wooden ball, had human beings setting up pins by hand and scoring and calling fouls. But they have had the benefit of rule books that were developed over long years and now are universally administered.

And yes, women were allowed to bowl in most centers.

THE WAY IT IS

... In the rush for entries some senior tournaments are lowering the minimum age to 45 or lower from the usual 50. There are super senior divisions for bowlers 60 and over and super senior divisions for 70 and up. Is bowling going to get like boxing? Boxing once had eight divisions — period. Now there are junior and super groupings added to the original, making 24. And there are at least three sanctioning groups and that's why there are so many boxing champions, 72 and counting, as other newly created weight divisions and boxing associations pop up. In bowling, in most cases, youngsters and oldsters, what counts is average, not age.

... Whenever a so-called unknown wins a bowling event just remember that many a nobody who isn't known by anybody becomes a somebody and is known by everybody, and everybody tells him they knew him when he was a nobody and they knew he would be a somebody someday. Huh?

... Pure fiction is the story of a head to head bowling match — as told by the participants two weeks later.

... In the more than 50 years pro bowling has been on TV, the event that caused the most comment and excitement and got the most exposure was not a specific thrilling match or perfect game or a big money purse — it was Mark Roth's conversion of the 7-10 split.

... All bowlers have their bad outings. It has been said that those bad times will be matched by an equal number of good times. Most bowlers I know have a lot of good days coming. In the meantime have a good bowling day — or at least a good day — everyday.
