Las Vegas Rolls a Strike with 12-Year Deal to Host USBC Championship Events at South Point Hotel and Casino

LAS VEGAS — South Point Hotel and Casino, the United States Bowling Congress (USBC), Las Vegas Events (LVE), and the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority (LVCVA) announced a 12-year deal to host several annual USBC events, including the USBC Open Championships and USBC Women's Championships, both citywide and inside a new, \$30 million bowling tournament facility at South Point starting in 2013.

Over the course of the 12-year agreement, USBC will host seven Championship events inside South Point's new bowling tournament facility, including the USBC Women's Championships in 2016, 2020 and 2022 and the USBC Open Championships in 2017, 2019, 2021 and 2023. There will also be more than 40 additional tournaments, conventions and short duration events held throughout Las Vegas during the agreement, including events such as the USBC Masters, USBC Queens, USBC Senior Masters and USBC Team USA trials.

"Las Vegas is excited to continue a partnership with the United States Bowling Congress that began four decades ago when we hosted the USBC Women's Championships," said Rossi Ralenkotter, president/CEO for the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority. "We look forward to strengthening the partnership over the next decade and becoming the premier destination for USBC events."

The USBC, LVE, and the LVCVA are partnering with South Point to enhance this new agreement by building a permanent, world-class bowling tournament facility at one of Las Vegas' premier bowling destinations. Construction of the new arena at South Point will commence in May 2013. South Point's current bowling center, which will still continue operations, is already a world-renowned facility that annually hosts top professional and amateur events, including the Professional Bowlers Association's World Series of Bowling. The new tournament facility will include more than

RENO — Voting delegates at the 8th USBC National Convention numbered 864 and USBC President Andrew Cain opened the meeting urging delegates to "reconnect and commit." BVL was awarded the Great Non-Profit Award as one of America's Best Charities and the BVL update told us there were 22 million Vets needing VA healthcare. Speaking on behalf of supporting America's troops, Major Oscar "Sean" Friendly was an example of The Power of One and spoke of setting up the carpet and bowling pins in the halls of the Pentagon (not exactly with permission) showing the special affect these can have for our troops and what One Person can do to make a difference.

California continues to shine in fundraising for BVL with top total state donations of \$142,187.02 and top local

associations noted for their contributions were Citrus Belt - \$21,321.30, San Diego and Orange County as well as King's County with a donation of \$6.04 per member.

Delegates and guests cracked the traditional Glo Sticks as Cancer Survivors marched into the room. Bowlers have donated nearly Ten Million dollars to the Susan B. Komen Cancer Fund over the last 13 years. Their representative addressed the crowd and picked up the \$844,924.70 check. She said that USBC was honored with the 2012 Reach Award for our efforts. Too bad we don't see the recognition anywhere. Bowlers are so dedicated to anything we do the sport deserves more wide spread recognition.

Bowling is now forging an association with the American Heart Association which is a

ABAKUMOFF'S 813 LEADS DEAF TRAVEL SEASON END AT CHAPARRAL LANES

SAN DIMAS — So. Calif. Deaf Traveling League did better on its second stop of the season at Chaparral Lanes with its President Ed Abakumoff leading an honor roll of 11 bowlers. On that day which was also the league’s season ending position round, Abakumoff rolled steady games of 192-211-196-214 for 813, the only 800 of the day.

Following Abakumoff were Gorman Low and Paul Taffolla with 781 and 762 respectively. Low started with 203-222 before closing with 170-186 while teammate Taffolla began with day’s high 231 and ended with 197-176-158 for his season best 762. Also Andy Lorenzo did his season best 756 with 174-209-189-184 and average leader Leroy MacMonagle struggled with 148-193-183before ended with 214 for 738.

The rest of the list were Robert Audette finishing with a 200 for 718, Bob Jones (199) 718, Anita Lorenzo (Andy’s wife) with roller coaster 192-162-198-161 for 713, Randy Salazar (203) 709, Bob Bergan 226 and William Golyer a neat 200.

Although MacMonagle’s league leading Orange County already won the title in the last session, 2nd place Whittier with its trio Salazar, Andy Lorenzo and Audette won the match 16-4 to snatch 2nd place. Third place Abakumoff’s Riverside claimed its position by beating Bergan’s LA County 16-4. L A County fell to 5th place when 6th place Low and Taffolla’s Mid City beat former 5th place Golyer’s Anaheim 16-4 to move Mid City up to 4th place one pin ahead of L A County. Anaheim fell to 6th place. In its battle to get out of the cellar Jones and Anita Lorenzo’s S F Valley finally got out of 8th place by beating 7th place Covina 13-7 and the teams exchanged places.

Low’s Mid City made a run for the season high team series but fell short by 23 pins and Whittier is safe with its season high of 2202. None came close to Covina’s season team game of 631, which has Francisco Navarro’s 300 game in it. Navarro claims the season high series of 879 and Bob Jones has the men’s high game 278. Anita Lorenzo’s day high of 713 was one pin short of her own women’s season high series 714 and Pat Morford’s women’s season high game 205 is safe.

The league’s prize monies and other awards will be given in the league’s season closing sweepstakes on May 19 at Yorba Linda Bowl in city of Yorba Linda. Bowling time is 12 noon.

The league thanks Chaparral Lanes management and staff for letting its bowlers bowl in its center.

We saw Girls bowling with tremendous potential that we have never seen at any of the Tournament Club competition. good thing as more women die of heart attacks than any other ailment.

Keith Hamilton, President of the National Bowling Hall of Fame and Museum and of Luby Publishing who publishes Bowlers Journal International addressed the delegation. He told of BJ honoring 100 years of bowling and a video of covers of the BJI of the past were shown. He invited all to view the outstanding Satellite Hall of Fame at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno where the portraits of the women's and men's Hall of Famers are displayed. He told of the current efforts to integrate a system so all records of the Hometown Heroes are together and can be accessed. He talked of the expense of putting this system together and the donations flowed! Elaine Hagin started the ball rolling with a \$500 donation and pledges. Donations totaled \$4,100 and Jeff Richgels pledged 10% of his tournament winnings for the year!

USBC Star's of Tomorrow were Joey Kopera of Orland Park, Illinois and Melanie Hannon from Cheektowaga, New York. The accomplished winners will each receive a \$6,000 scholarship.

President Cain addressed the delegates with a solemn reminder that membership had now dipped under two million for the eight-year old USBC. He said, "The National Bowling Stadium was built in 1985 and is now evolving to meet the needs of today's bowling. Real change puts us on a collision course with the unknown. He noted we live in a demand world trying to build for the future and what we do today affects tomorrow. He said, "Together" is missing."

Libby Fletcher spoke about USBC Strategic Planning, why it exists and what it does to achieve its mission which is "To be the Leading Authority of the sport servicing the needs of our bowlers – who are the stake holders and be the National Governing Body of the sport."

Chad Murphy, Managing Director of Youth Development, told us of: CBS televising our youth event; 2102 spots sold in the Olympic Gold Tournament (1928 actual bowlers); 507 bowling centers conducting qualifying events; and the value of Live Streaming allowing computer savvy members to view events while they are happening. He said that 6,000 schools now have youth bowling programs and that we are creating a new generation of bowlers but the payoff will be in the future when your kid's kids are bowling. Murphy said "It's no longer about memberships and bowlers. Awards are in transition – hang in. Awards were not being used so there needs to be a change."

USBC Executive Director Stu Upson addressed what is on everyone's mind – "Why aren't we in the Olympics?" When a sport is dropped (as Wrestling just was) there is a possibility for a replacement but you have to be on the "short List." Bowling is not on it. We are still trying and Kevin Dornbrger, President of the International Ten Pin Federation is working on our behalf. This is how the process works.

The International training and research Center in Arlington, Texas is sharing technology with the world. The Global scene is growing. Our women's Tournament is down; some due to people not wanting to return to Reno so much and a group started a Mid West Women's Tournament. The USBC Women's Tournament will go to four women teams, no handicap and expanded divisions. Seems like we are returning to the "way we used to do it." Upson used the phrase "It's the Right Thing to do" all through his presentation telling us that tough decisions needed to be made and they will do it because, "It's the Right Thing to do."

Re-elected to the USBC Board of Directors were Michael Italia of Warrington, Pa., and Mark Martin of Waterford, Mich., and they will be joined on the board by newcomers Anthony Colangelo of Helmetta, N.J., and Jan Schmidt of Hales Corners, Wis. They will begin their three-year terms on Aug. 1.

Andrew Cain of Phoenix, the current USBC president, recently was re-elected by the Athletes Advisory Council to continue to serve on the board. The athletes also elected three-time Team USA member Mike Fagan of Dallas to replace Wendy Macpherson, who did not seek re-election. When Fagan was elected he said how pleased he was and that "there is more to bowling than the pros and Team USA." Yea!

The Legislative session saw six amendments approved, four rejected and one withdrawn. For more info, you can go to bowl.com. Apparently the associations are allowed to ask for more dues money and being encouraged to have their own awards program. Isn't this what we used to do?

The Hall of Fame dinner saw eight entered into the Hall: Lynda Barnes and Jason Couch for Superior Performance; Rick Steelsmith, Shirley Levens, Sandra Postma and Frank Santore (posthumously) for Outstanding USBC Performance. Don McCune was inducted in the Veterans' category and Tamoria Adams for Meritorious Service.

USBC Recognition Awards went to: Vicki Bowman – USBC Proprietor of the Year; Madeline Dotta – Helen Baker Outstanding Association Service Award, and Michael Nytry received the Joyce Deitch Unity Award.

USBC Youth Award Winners were: LaVonne (Mitch) Mitchell – Kerm Helmer Horizon Award; Carol Gardner – Youth Volunteer of the Year; John Dill – David Dahms Coach of the Year.

The Youth Ambassadors of the Year were Samantha Schnur and Conner Sarich.

The convention was short and sweet and almost completely youth oriented. All focus was youth. I wonder if the powers that be will ever focus on the people who pay the bill out here, find a way to take their youth bowlers to all of the events that are being held, and, in my case, pay my way to bowling and convention year after year in support of our parent organization.

I guess "It's the Right Thing to do."

RENO — Proving that his passion for bowling extends beyond being one of the first celebrity stars to become a team owner in the PBA League, NFL all-star wide receiver Terrell Owens made his competitive bowling debut in the United States Bowling Congress Open Championships in Reno, Nev., Tuesday and Wednesday.

Bowling on the Bowlers Journal International team with PBA Commissioner Tom Clark, Xtra Frame announcers Mike (Mike J. Laneside) Jakubowski and Jason (The Bowling Guy) Thomas, and former USBC employee Ed Baur, Owens posted a 475 series in his USBC Open Championships debut in team event.

“The first game (185) went pretty well,” said Owens, the owner of the PBA League’s Dallas Strikers. “I’m still new to this, so when I saw some of the guys switching balls, I felt I should switch, too. (He bowled 129 and 161 in his second and third games). I probably should have stayed with the same ball. I ended up going back to the first ball I used and made some other minor adjustments with my feet and eyes.”

Owens then added 503 in doubles (with Clark as his partner) and 530 in singles for a 1,508 all-events total (167.5 average).

“Terrell’s a great teammate,” Clark said. “He was totally engaged in the competition and bowled great for it being his first real bowling tournament. He learned a lot, strung some strikes and broke 1,500 in all events, which is a respectable score. He even straightened me out during doubles, telling me to stay down at the line and it helped.


“He’s been great to work with the past year in building the PBA League,” Clark added, “and I asked him as a friend if he’d like to bowl with our team and experience the National Bowling Stadium. He jumped at the opportunity. Terrell has a great passion for the game and it will be fun to watch him progress. Everyone who has watched him bowl knows he has a natural talent for the sport.”

Tom Baker Defeats
Bryan Goebel by One Pin
To Win PBA50 Greater
Birmingham Open

*Baker defeats Goebel 227-226 in title match
for his 10th career PBA50 Tour title*

TRUSSVILLE, AL – Four-time PBA50 Player of the Year Tom Baker converted a spare and then bowled a nine-count on his fill ball in the 10th frame of the championship match to win the PBA50 Greater Birmingham Open presented by Ebonite by one pin Wednesday at Lightning Strikes Lanes.

The PBA Hall of Famer defeated 10-time PBA Tour titlist Bryan Goebel of Shawnee, Kan., 227-226, in the title match for his 10th career PBA50 Tour title and his first since winning the PBA Senior Pepsi Open in Decatur, Ill. in August of 2010. His 10 PBA50 titles now matches his 10 PBA Tour titles.

“I knew it was just a matter of time before I’d win again, I just didn’t think it would take this much time,” said the 58-year-old Baker. “Over the past few years I was always qualifying well, but couldn’t seal the deal in match play. I finally got it done today.”

Goebel, trying for his first PBA50 Tour win, finished the match first with three strikes in the 10th frame forcing Baker to at least get a spare and nine-count in the 10th for the win which is just what he did. It would have been slightly easier for Baker had he struck on his first ball in the 10th but he left a solid nine-pin.

“That took the wind out of my sails a little,” said Baker, who is the only player to win four consecutive PBA50 Player of the Year crowns, “but I was confident that if I made the spare I could make the shot I needed on the last ball to win.”

Both Baker and Goebel advanced to the title match by being the top two scorers in the fifth eliminator round. Baker had a 525 two-game total and Goebel, 504, eliminating three-time PBA50 Tour titlist Hugh Miller (488) and PBA50 Player of the Year Walter Ray Williams Jr. (427) who won last week’s Sun Bowl In the Villages.

“This is the first time we’ve used this eliminator format and I enjoyed it,” Baker said. “Your mindset is a little different because you’re bowling for score more than you are an opponent.”

The next stop for the PBA50 Tour will be Mooresville, N.C., for the PBA50 Miller High Life Classic presented by Columbia 300 May 5-8. PBA’s online bowling channel Xtra Frame will provide start-to-finish coverage of the tournament beginning with qualifying on May 6. For subscription and schedule information visit the pba.com homepage and click on the Xtra Frame logo.


Throughout the 2013 PBA50 Tour season, players will be competing for the opportunity to advance to the nationally-televised PBA50 Tour Finals which will be conducted as part of the World Series of Bowling V in Las Vegas in November. The top three players in points at the conclusion of the season will advance to the PBA50 Tour Finals.

60 lanes featuring the latest bowling technology, tournament registration area, bowler's squad room, modern locker facilities and more.

"South Point already runs a premier bowling center where casual fans, amateurs and professionals from all over the world come to play the game they love," said Michael Gaughan , owner of South Point. "This new bowling tournament facility we're building with USBC will provide an unrivaled destination for bowling enthusiasts and add another dynamic element to attract visitors to South Point and Las Vegas."

With participation estimates for the seven Championship events taken into account, event organizers estimate that 27 percent of attendees will have the ability to stay at the South Point, while the remaining 73 percent will occupy rooms throughout the city during event s held for the duration of this agreement.

"We are extremely excited about our partnership with the USBC and South Point Hotel and Casino," said Pat Christenson , president of Las Vegas Events. "This would not have been possible without the commitment from Michael Gaughan to build a state-of-the-art bowling venue and the USBC's commitment to host an unprecedented number of its events in Las Vegas."

In 2009, the USBC Open Championships, held at Cashman Center in Las Vegas, ran for a record 154 consecutive days with a capacity total of 17,200 teams competing from Feb. 21 to July 24, 2009. Las Vegas was also host city for the USBC Open Championships in 1986. PBA Unveils Badger, Wolf, Bear “Animal Patterns” for GEICO Summer Swing Milwaukee area tournaments to feature first new “animal” lane conditioning patterns in eight years

MILWAUKEE – The Professional Bowlers Association has unveiled three distinct new lane conditioning patterns that will debut during the GEICO PBA Summer Swing in the Milwaukee area May 20-June 2, expanding the PBA’s current library of “animal pattern” lane conditions.

The new lane conditioning patterns, named the Badger, Wolf and Bear, are a continuation of the animal pattern theme the PBA introduced in 2005 to not only test the versatility of the players and demonstrate the variety of scoring challenges PBA players face, but to give PBA members, grassroots league bowlers and fans an easier way to identify specific types of conditions.

The Badger will be the longest animal pattern ever (52 feet). Conversely, the Wolf will be the shortest animal pattern ever (32 feet). The Bear will be a flat pattern of medium length (40 feet), similar to what has been used at the U.S. Open in recent years and characterized as the most difficult test in professional bowling.

The way lane oil is applied (in shape and volume) to the 60-foot playing surface of a lane is a strong factor in the scoring pace of a professional bowling tournament, testing the skills necessary for success and the strategic approach the players must take.

“We listened to players and fans looking for more diversity in our lane maintenance program and have developed patterns that will give everyone fresh looks,” said PBA Commissioner Tom Clark. “These new animal patterns have dramatically different, uniquely challenging characteristics.”

The original animal pattern system, featuring the Chameleon, Cheetah, Scorpion, Shark and Viper patterns, eventually became the foundation for the PBA Experience League program which allows grassroots United States Bowling Congress league bowlers across America a chance to bowl on the same lane conditions PBA players compete on in national and regional tournaments. The original animal patterns will be used again at this fall’s PBA World Series of Bowling V in Las Vegas.

All eight animal patterns, in addition to PBA major tournament patterns, will be used and available for future PBA national, PBA50 and PBA regional tournaments plus PBA Experience league play. All of the new patterns are USBC Sport Bowling-compliant, which generally means flatter ratios of oil across the lane and demanding more precision by players than on more typical “house” conditions found in bowling.

Clark said there was a lot of synergy in debuting the new PBA patterns at the upcoming GEICO Summer Swing in Milwaukee. The Swing features four events in three different bowling centers and will be the first time the PBA airs on the CBS Sports Network.

“The best players in the world will develop fresh strategies to attack the lanes and fans will be entertained by the results,” Clark said.

The Badger condition will be applied on the wood-based lane surfaces at AMF Waukesha in Waukesha for the qualifying and match play rounds for the PBA Badger Open, May 20-21. The Wolf condition will be applied to the synthetic lanes at AMF West in Milwaukee for the PBA Wolf Open, May 23-24. The Bear condition will be used on synthetic lanes at AMF Bowlero in Wauwatosa for the PBA Bear Open May 27-28.

A combination of the three patterns will be used for the culminating PBA Milwaukee Open. The “cashers” round, featuring the top qualifiers based on total pins from the three previous events, will employ the Bear pattern. The three subsequent match play rounds will feature the Bear, Wolf and Badger patterns, respectively. Whoever is high qualifier for the PBA Milwaukee Open stepladder finals will select the pattern for the TV finals. Five TV shows (including the special GEICO King of The Swing event) will be taped June 1-2 at Bowlero for airing on consecutive Tuesdays at 7 p.m. ET beginning June 11 on the CBS Sports Network.

The PBA’s online bowling channel Xtra Frame will have live coverage of every GEICO Summer Swing event’s qualifying and match play portions.

A complete description of the new animal patterns, along with graphs illustrating how oil is applied for each pattern for PBA members, will be available on pba.com under the “resources” tab. Along with the new patterns, the PBA has created a new series of animal pattern logos which will be used in conjunction with each pattern.

Are Pro Bowlers Athletes?
You have heard that question before, and you will hear it again and again.

The PBA Official Yearbook tells us that within a 42-game tournament, players will lift more than five tons, carrying it for a total of two miles while projecting the ball more than 700 times at an average speed of 17 m.p.h. at a target 60 feet away.

Dictionaries tell us that an athlete is one who contends for a prize. The word books also define an athlete as anyone trained or fit to contend in exercises requiring physical agility, stamina, and often strength.

The pro bowler fits. Though strength is helpful and even necessary at times, the type needed in pro bowling is not the brute strength so needed in the heavy contact sports.

In pro bowling, timing, coordination, and a delicate touch at times add up to a high degree of finesse to go along with measured force to score consistently. However, pro bowling takes rhythm, balance, and skilled muscular effort. The muscles must be supple and toned, always in shape, but not necessarily rock hard.

A pro bowler must be highly competitive. He pays to play, unlike baseball, football, basketball and other players who are paid to play. The bowler's pay is what he wins, and he cashes well only with superior performances.

Dedication is a must for any successful athlete. A pro bowler must spend long hours for many years perfecting, maintaining and adjusting his skills. Too many times a pro bowler is classed with the average fun bowler.

That's akin to equating a touch football game at a picnic with the Super Bowl and a company softball game with the World Series. A pro bowler rolls more games in a week than the average bowler rolls in a year. He probably spends more time in actual competition than any other sports performer. A pro bowler is firing away on the lanes more than seven hours a day. The total time involved, back and forth between squads, preparation (checking equipment and studying lane conditions) can more often than not add up to 12 hour day.

There's no relaxing at any stage. Each and every roll of the ball counts since the total score takes in every game. There must be the utmost ability to concentrate under constant pressure, on TV, and in a sport where you're always in a crowd, yet always all alone.

Spectators are only a few feet away from the competing bowlers. You sit next to other bowlers, yet it's you against the conditions and the pins. No teammate to help, nobody to coach or instruct once you're on that approach. You roll your way out of trouble or wait until the next time.

Pro bowling has become a sophisticated and scientific sport. You must adjust practically every game to every lane. You must learn about equipment, lane surfaces, lane finishes, lane dressings, and other variables, each in themselves worthy of deep study and plenty of homework. The sport looks simple. It is, simple to play, difficult to master, impossible to conquer. Each higher average plateau is a new challenge, tougher in every way, and the pro side is the highest peak.

There are millions upon millions of bowlers. Only a few thousand average really high while those good enough to make a living at the sport can be counted in the hundreds.

Is a pro bowler an athlete? If you rate physical contact and brute strength at the top of the list, the answer is an emphatic no. But if you add up the definite skills and knowledge, physical and mental, necessary to success, there is little doubt that a pro bowler must be ranked as an outstanding athlete.

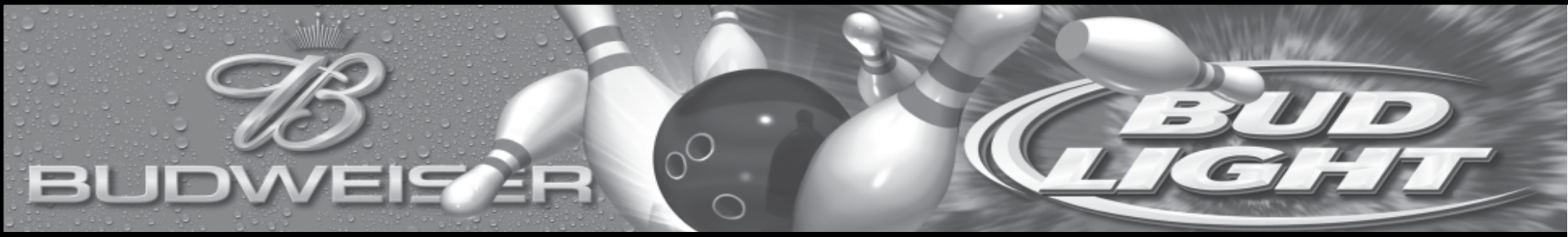
