New PBA Console Video Game To Debut In The Fall

The PBA and FarSight Studios have partnered to create an official PBA-licensed console video game. The game will feature dozens of venues and playing environments, quickplay and local multi-player modes, online leaderboards, E-Sports style online tournaments and more.

More than 20 PBA pros will be included in the

launch of the game and PBA Hall of Famer Randy Pedersen will provide in-game commentary during all the action.

Due out in late Fall 2019, the game will be available for PC (Steam), Nintendo Switch, PS4, Xbox One and Oculus.

Walter Ray Williams Jr. Wins Third Consecutive Title

Williams defeats fellow hall of famer Danny Wiseman 229-227

MOORESVILLE, N.C. – Walter Ray Williams Jr., the Professional Bowlers Association's all-time PBA Tour career titles leader, won the PBA50 Mooresville Open presented by the Mooresville Convention & Visitors Bureau and Storm Wednesday to start the 2019 season with three consecutive wins and record his 14th career title, tying him for the all-time career titles record in PBA's tour for players 50 and over.

Williams, the Go Bowling! PBA Tour's all-time career titles leader with 47 wins, tied John Handegard for most career PBA50

In a dramatic comeback effort in the title match, the 59-year-old Williams, who was the top qualifier for the finals, threw the last five strikes of the match to beat fellow hall of famer Danny Wiseman 229-227. Wiseman, a 12-time PBA Tour

winner bowling in his second PBA50 Tour tournament, had an opportunity to win the match with a strike on the first ball in the 10th frame but left a 10 pin.

"I came out of practice all lined up on both lanes, but things got a little tricky in the middle of the game,"

said Williams, who left the 3-6-10 in the fifth frame and 3-6 in the seventh frame. "The right lane was a little tighter for me, so I thought I needed to hit the ball a little more at release but the reaction I got was totally unexpected.

"In the ninth frame I moved one board left and that was the right move," Williams added, after being down as much as 28 pins in the match. "You've got to bowl well and get the breaks to win. I was able to finish strong and caught a break when Danny left the 10 pin in the 10th frame." continued on page 11

Joel Carlson Wins First PBA50 Tour Title

After a 279-279 tie in title match, Carlson wins one-ball roll-off 10-8

TRENTON, N.J. – After a 279-279 title match tie, PBA50 Tour veteran Joel Carlson of Omaha, Nebraska, defeated PBA Hall of Famer Ron Mohr of Las Vegas, in a one-ball roll-off 10-8 to win the PBA50 Hamilton Lanes & Entertainment Center Open presented by Columbia 300 Sunday for his first title on PBA's tour for players 50 and over.

Carlson and Mohr went strike for strike through the first seven frames of the title match until Carlson left a 7 pin in the eighth. After making the spare, he finished the match with four strikes to force the roll-off. Finishing the match first, Mohr, the stepladder finals top qualifier, threw the first nine strikes before leaving a 10 pin on his first ball in the 10th, made the spare, and then struck on his final ball of the 10th frame.

Mohr, trying for his 11th PBA50 Tour title, started the roll-off with an eight-count when his ball went high leaving the 4-7. Carlson took advantage of the opportunity by throwing a strike for the win.

"I didn't watch," said Carlson, when Mohr threw his shot in the roll-off. "When it was my turn, I

just concentrated on keeping the ball on line and throw the best shot I possibly could. I could never have imagined winning my first title this way."

Carlson's previous high PBA50 Tour finishes were third in the 2016 Sun Bowl In The Villages and fourth in the 2018 PBA50 Lucas continued on page 6

Shannon O'Keefe Claims Title at 2019 PWBA Twin Cities Open

EAGAN, Minn. - Reigning Professional Women's Bowling Association Player of the Year Shannon O'Keefe of Shiloh, Illinois, collected her first title of 2019 and ninth career victory Saturday at the PWBA Twin Cities Open.

O'Keefe relied on her spare game throughout the week at Cedarvale Lanes to earn the top seed for Saturday's stepladder finals, and she converted a 4 pin and delivered a strike in her final frame to secure a 189-182 win over England's Verity Crawley.

The 40-year-old righthander claimed the \$10,000 top prize live on BowITV.com.

"It's incredible," said O'Keefe, a 15-time Team USA member. "When the tour started again, my dream was to win one title. Now, here I am sitting at nine and one step closer to reaching my next goal - 10 titles. It just feels so good

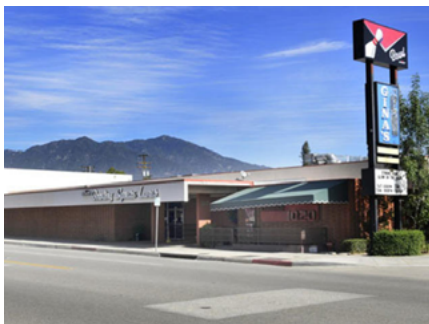
with all of the hard work I've put in."

Although O'Keefe's spare shooting was strong throughout competition, it nearly derailed her in the title match. She missed a pair of 3-6-10 combinations on the left lane through the first seven frames, but still maintained a slight advantage in the match.

She had built the lead after Crawley left back-to-

back 2-8-10 splits on the left lane earlier in title tilt.

"I just missed them right off my hand," said O'Keefe, who also defeated Crawley in the title match of the 2018 PWBA Sonoma County Open. "I knew it the second it left my hand. As the games progressed through each block, I was quickly moving left and balling down, so I knew I continued on page 5

PBA Set to Launch Nine Event Summer Tour in June

Incentives, schedule, FloBowling coverage figure to attract big names, offer unique opportunities for PBA players and fans

CHICAGO – Much will be at stake when the 2019 Go Bowling! Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) Summer Tour begins at the end of June.

Entry into an historic PBA event in China, a new FloBowling PBA ATX Invite special event and the inaugural United States Bowling Congress (USBC) Cup all rest in the balance when the seven-city, nine-event PBA Summer Tour begins June 28-30, in Lubbock, Texas.

The Summer Tour then moves to Houston for the Storm Striking Against Breast Cancer Mixed Doubles in July before the heart of the schedule in August with seven more title events, punctuated by the FloBowling PBA Summer Swing presented by the brands of Ebonite, in Aurora, Illinois, Aug. 24-31.

All nine events will be streamed live from first ball to last by FloBowling. For subscription and schedule information visit www.flobowling.com.

"We're excited about the 2019 PBA Summer Tour because it gives more PBA fans around the country a chance to see our top players compete up close," PBA Tour CEO and Commissioner Tom Clark said. "The PBA Player Services Truck and lane maintenance team will be at all of the stops. The geography involved and the calendar are strategic, and the bonus incentives for top performers are big."

The 2019 PBA Summer Tour will have its own points list, with enticing and historic bonus incentives involving three inaugural competitions serving as top story lines throughout the Tour.

1) The inaugural USBC Cup will reward the top five players in PBA Summer Tour points with bonus cash prizes, including \$20,000 to the points leader.

2) The inaugural FloBowling PBA ATX Invite will award berths into a special event for the top eight PBA Summer Tour points leaders at Dart Bowl in the hometown of FloSports, Austin, Texas, on Sept. 21. First prize in the FloBowling Invite will be \$25,000 and all participants in the event will cash.

3) The inaugural PBA China Tiger Cup will award the top eight PBA Summer Tour points leaders with expenses-paid trips to Shanghai, Nov. 19-21, for a 16-player singles event including eight Chinese bowlers, and a separate USA vs. China team match. All players will cash in the PBA Tiger Cup singles event which offers a \$20,000 first prize, and in the team event the winning five-player team will divide \$15,000.

The 2019 PBA Summer Tour events will be open to non-PBA members as well as members, but non-members will not be eligible for any of the special events or bonus prizes.

Points earned during the PBA Summer Tour will also count toward 2020 DHC PBA Japan Invitational and 2020 PBA Tour Finals eligibility, as well as figuring into consideration for the end-of-season Player and Rookie of the Year awards.

All Summer Tour tournaments except the Aurora Open will be Tier 3 events under the PBA's Tier 1-2-3 points system (the Aurora Open will be a Tier 2 event).

Where Have All The Pro Bowlers Gone?

As I continued my search for that Leanne Barrette-Hulsenberg thank you letter, I ran across another bit of memorabilia... a 1960's era autographed 8" x 10" photograph of professional bowler Don Glover of Bakersfield, California, who in his career won five Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) national titles and the ABC Masters at Knoxville in 1970.

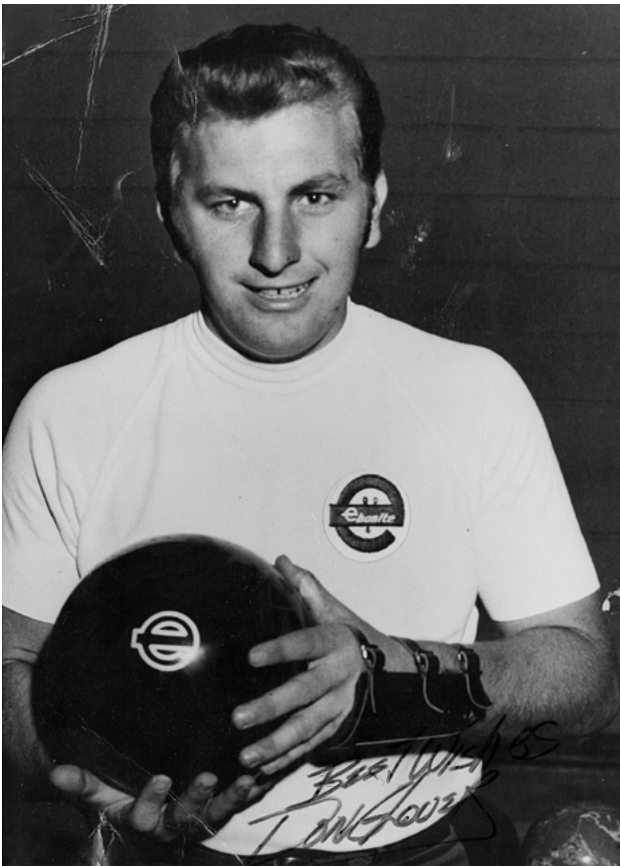
I remember Don coming to our small bowling center in Sebastopol, California, as a representative of Ebonite International, makers of bowling balls, bags and accessories. He spent the day autographing photos, conducting clinics, bowling an exhibition against the top "lefties" in our area, and wrapping up the day with some trick shots.

One of the trick shots that made Glover famous was a spinning ball top. Now I don't know if it was because the lanes had just been resurfaced, or if there were specific weights that he had placed in the bowling ball, or just what the reason... but he set the ball on the lane and spun it very fast, like a top, and gave it a slight nudge.

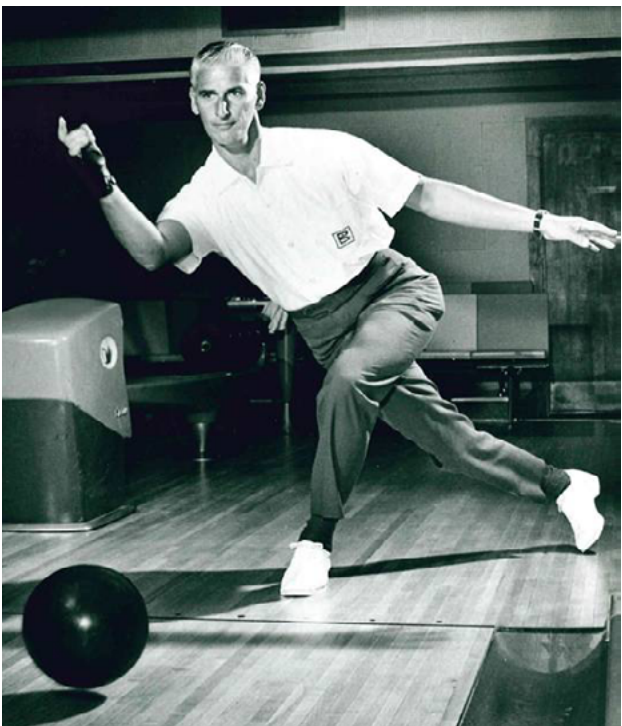
Next, he went to the lounge and ordered a draft beer, as the ball continued its journey on the lane. Back and forth the ball would go, edging closer and closer to the pins, but never going into the gutters. About halfway through his beer, Glover came out to inspect the progress of the bowling ball as it had reached the pins.

He returned to the lounge, and the ball began a journey back to the foul line! Once he had finished his beer, Glover returned to the lanes and the ball had almost returned to its original location at the foul line. I tried for years to duplicate this trick, and was able to match the spinning ball maneuver which prevented the ball from entering the gutter most of the time, but was never able to conquer the "approach-to-pins-and-back-again" activity.

Whatever happened to Don Glover? As I began to research his whereabouts today, I learned that Don had passed away in 1998, at the tender age of 52. His memory has been immortalized in Bakersfield with the formation of the Don Glover Masters Tournament at AMF Southwest Lanes. Last year's event was postponed after a ten year run, but officials stated that the 11th annual edition will be contested in 2019.

As a youngster I remember pro bowlers like Glover visiting our local community quite often. There were AMF representatives Helen Duval, Bill Bunetta, and the husband and wife team of Jack and Jill Edler; Brunswick's "Silver Fox," Jim St. John; and even Tom Hennessey of the famous Budweiser team, who appeared at the local J.C. Penney for bowling ball promotions in the Sporting Goods Department.

Helen Duval was one of my favorites. She owned a bowling center in nearby Berkeley, California, and would bring bowlers every month to compete in Primo Liberatore's 6 Game Sweeper at L & L Lanes in Sebastopol. Primo had a unique way of securing entries in the tournament. With every entry, you received a three-piece chicken dinner, complete with a scoop of salad, roll and a drink of your choice. Helen would often remark, "Even if I don't bowl that well, at least I get a free dinner!"

One of the things that's missing in bowling today are all of those personal appearances. When I was working for AMF we paid staff professionals a retainer, plus an additional fee from the sponsor for their formal appearance at a prearranged venue. The conversation that came from those exhibits was more than enough to pay for the festivities, as evidenced by my autographed photo of Don Glover that I've kept for over 50 years.

Anthony Simonsen, Andres Gomez Advance to PBA Playoffs Round of 8

PORTLAND, Maine – Anthony Simonsen of Little Elm, Texas and Colombia’s Andres Gomez filled two more spots in the PBA Playoffs Round of 8 after winning their Round of 16 Race to 2 Points matches that aired April 29th on FS1 from Bayside Bowl.

Simonsen and Gomez joined Jason Belmonte of Australia, who leads the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour season with four wins, and 2019 PBA Scorpion Championship winner Kris Prather of Plainfield, Illinois, who advanced by winning their Round of 16 matches that aired April 22 on FS1 and will meet in the Round of 8 on May 20.

Simonsen, who became the youngest to win two majors at 22 with his win in the PBA Players Championship in February, beat Page in the first game of their Race to 2 Points match, 237-214, but Page, a six-time tour winner with four top-five finishes this season, came back to win the second game, 226-214, to send the match to a ninth and 10th frame roll-off. Simonsen won the roll-off, 49-39, to advance to the Round of 8.

“The adrenaline was really flowing after the first game and I was a little too pumped up heading into the second game,” said Simonsen of dealing with the energy from the boisterous Bayside Bowl crowd. “When we got to the second game the crowd got a little quiet for some reason and that actually threw me off a little bit.

“Rhino got off to a good start in the second game, but I knew with one game in the bank I still had an opportunity in the roll-off,” Simonsen added. “I looked at the roll-off as another game – just make the best shots I can.”

In the second Round of 16 match, Gomez, a three-time tour winner, beat 2016 PBA Player of the Year EJ Tackett of Bluffton, Indiana in both games – 231-228 and 245-193 – to advance.

Gomez put together a string of five strikes heading into the 10th frame of the first game to overtake Tackett after being down 37 pins in the fifth frame.

“In the first half of the first game I was still trying to figure it out,” said Gomez. “I needed to do what I do best and that was slow down. I don’t have the power that these guys have out here on tour so having the right hand position and ball speed are critical for me to get a good ball reaction.”

Gomez found the right combination in the second game, striking in seven of the first nine frames to breeze past a struggling Tackett.

O’Neill and Malott Survive Roll-offs Matches to Advance in PBA Playoffs

PORTLAND, Maine (May 6, 2019) – No. 7 seed Bill O’Neill of Langhorne, Pennsylvania and No. 15 seed Wes Malott of Pflugerville, Texas, survived PBA Playoffs Round of 16 Race to 2 Points matches that both required a ninth and 10th frame roll-off, to advance to the Round of 8 after FS1’s telecast Monday from Bayside Bowl.

O’Neill and Malott join No. 4 seed Anthony Simonsen, No. 21 Andres Gomez, No. 1 Jason Belmonte and No. 9 Kris Prather who have already advanced to the Round of 8 after winning Round of 16 matches.

In the first match, No. 2 seed Jakob Butturff of Mesa, Arizona, defeated Malott in the first game, 268-210, but the USBC Masters champion couldn’t keep the momentum going in the second game, losing to Malott, 226-193, to send their match into a roll-off.

With both players starting with a strike and spare, Malott, a 10-time tour winner, struck on his final ball and advanced when Butturff left a solid 7 pin on his fill ball, handing Malott a 40-39 win. It was the second time that Malott won a Playoffs match sitting on the bench. He also won his Round of 24 match-up against Josh Blanchard when Blanchard left the 1-2-4 on his final ball of the 10th frame.

“I felt like I was running out of lives when I was watching Jakob,” said Malott, the 2009 PBA Player of the Year. “I didn’t think either one of us had a really good look to start the second game. Jakob was struggling and I was still trying to get comfortable. It looked like it was going to be one of those matches where filling frames any way you can was going to get the job done.

“In the middle of the second game I was finally getting comfortable enough where I was getting the ball reaction I wanted so I could repeat good shots.”

No. 23 seed Sweden’s Jesper Svensson, a seven-time tour winner, jumped out to an early lead with a 222-211 win in the first game of the second match, but O’Neill capitalized on the struggling Svensson in the second game coming back to win, 247-164, to send the match into the roll-off. O’Neill, who won his 10th PBA Tour title in the season-opening PBA Hall of Fame Classic, struck in the ninth and the first two shots in the 10th to eliminate Svensson, 57-39.

“To start the first game, I really didn’t feel like I knew what I was doing,” said O’Neill. “In practice everything felt good but I think I started to rush because the adrenaline was pumping. I felt lucky to get 211.

“Fortunately, I was able to settle down and I made really good shots down the stretch,” O’Neill continued. “With Jesper struggling I felt like the ball was in my court and was pretty confident going into the roll-off. I made a ball change and threw three really good shots when I needed them.”

The Round of 16 concludes on May 13 at 6 p.m. on FS1 with two matches to determine the last two positions for the Round of 8 matches which will air on May 20 and May 27. The four Round of 8 winners will return to Portland for the semifinal and final rounds live on FOX on Saturday and Sunday, June 1-2.

The winner of the Playoffs, which features the top 24 players in competition points after the first 13 Go Bowling! PBA Tour tournaments of the 2019 season, will earn a \$100,000 first prize.

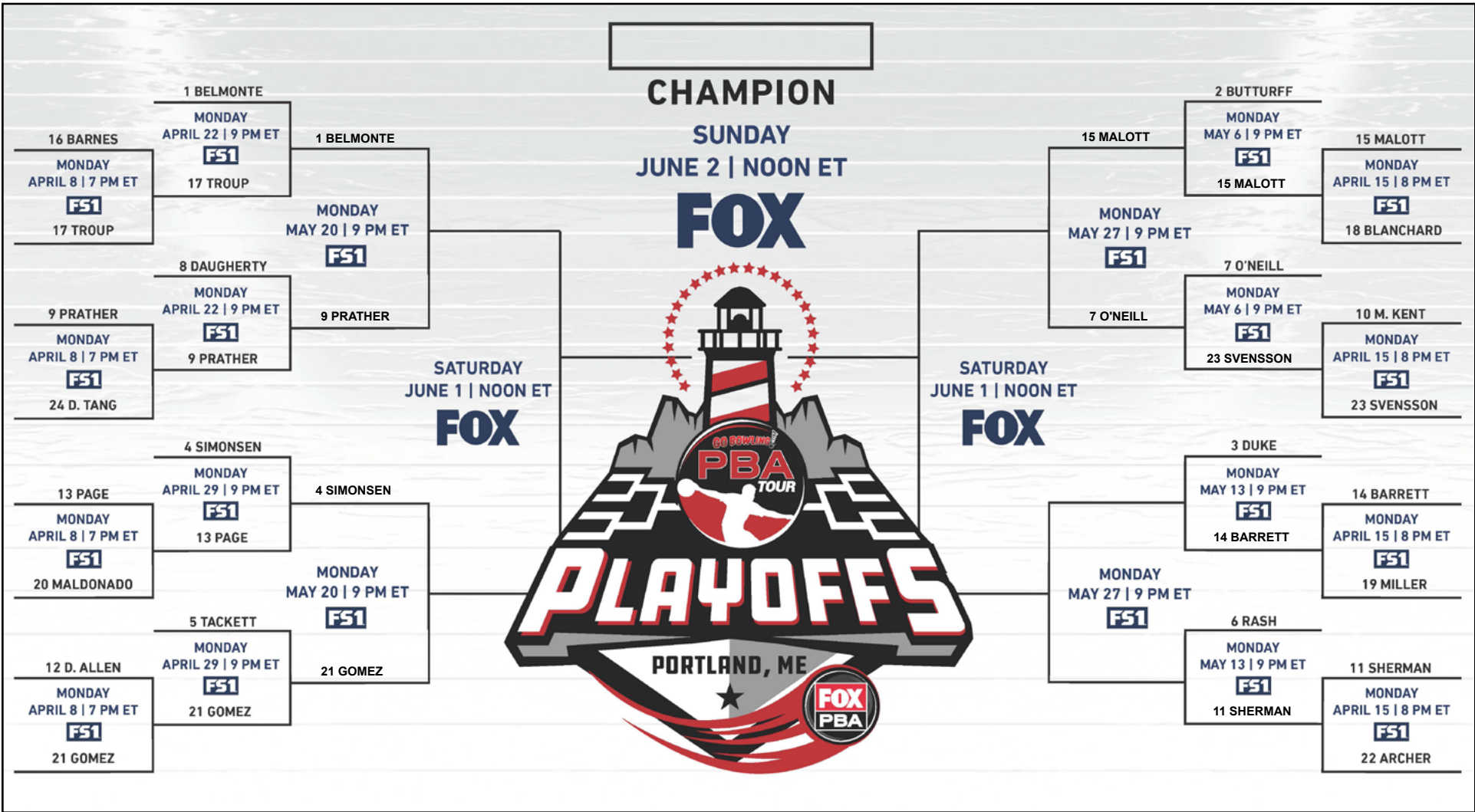

was going to stay committed to what got me here. Every shot I executed well in the title match was really, really good, but each of those 3-6-10s were poorly executed. I just made some bad shots."

O'Keefe stayed clean in the eighth and ninth frames, which gave Crawley, who rolled a strike in the ninth frame, the opportunity to deliver a pair of strikes in the 10th frame for the chance to claim her first career PWBA Tour title.

Crawley got to the pocket on her first shot but was unable to get the 10 pin to fall, putting O'Keefe in the position to mark for victory. "I was so, so worried that those two spares I missed earlier in the match were going to cost me," O'Keefe said. "When I was looking at the 4 pin in the 10th, I just told myself to make it. I was very happy when I saw my spare shot was on line and there was no doubt I was making it. It definitely was a relief."

Crawley finished as the runner-up for the fourth time in her career, but she's walking away knowing the extra work she's put into preparing for this season is starting to pay off. "Honestly, I threw both 2-8-10s really well and was happy with them in the moment," Crawley said. "Obviously, the lane said otherwise. If anything, they were a pinch fast, which isn't my tendency, but lately I've been trying to stay a bit more aggressive. I made the decision to move left and actually get around it a little bit more after the second 2-8-10, which looked better but wasn't able to get out the 10 in the 10th frame."

"I'm very positive coming away from this right now, though. I've worked very hard, and right now, I feel like my game is in a very good place. I think this just gives me an extra boost of confidence going into the next couple of weeks." Crawley advanced to the title match after rolling a double in the final frame to shut out Bryanna Coté of Red Rock, Arizona, 210-196.

In the opening round of Saturday's stepladder, Crawley delivered 11 strikes on the way to victory against Colombia's Maria José Rodriguez, 266-201.

Competition this week at the PWBA Twin Cities Open included two eight-game qualifying blocks on Friday to determine the 32 players for Saturday's Round of 32. An additional eight-game block Saturday morning narrowed the field to 12 players, who bowled six additional games to determine the stepladder finalists. The 2019 PWBA Tour season will continue May 9 at the PWBA Lincoln Open. The event will be held at Sun Valley Lanes in Lincoln, Nebraska, with wire-to-wire coverage on BowlTV.

Magazine Classic.

“I always felt that I could win out here but winning like this was beyond expectations,” the 57-year-old Carlson added. “It’s awesome to win with the ball in your hand and then coming through with a strike to do it. It’s how you dream of winning, but right now I’m having a hard time believing my good fortune.”

Carlson, who entered the position round match in sixth, beat non-member Chris Viale of Westfield, Massachusetts 288-245 to make the finals and earn the No. 3 qualifying position for the finals. Ironically, earlier in the week, Carlson seemed to have a spot in the finals locked up for the PBA50 Mooresville Open, but dropped from second to sixth when he lost in the position round to eventual winner Walter Ray Williams Jr. after bowling a 185 game.

To get to the title match, Carlson beat PBA Hall of Famer and four-time PBA50 Tour winner Parker Bohn III, who qualified fifth for the finals, 227-182, in the second stepladder match and then beat No. 2 qualifier reigning PBA50 Player of the Year Michael Haugen Jr., 268-248, in the semifinal to advance to the title match against Mohr.

In the opening stepladder match, Bohn defeated Viale, who qualified fourth for the finals, 268-173.

PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr.’s bid for a record-tying fourth consecutive PBA50 Tour title to also become the sole all-time PBA50 Tour titles leader with 15 wins, ended with an eight-place finish. He remains tied with John Handegard at 14.

The PBA50 Tour takes a three-week break before it heads west to Brentwood, California for the PBA50 Northern California Classic presented by MOTIV May 25-28.

Why Bowl in Leagues? Here’s Why!

WINNETKA – So you’ve never bowled in a league? Or you’ve taken a break from a bowling league but want to get back in?

This is a good time to start considering joining a league for the popular three-month summer season. Bowling coordinators will start mapping plans within the next few weeks to patch together the requisite number of teams for their leagues.

And space is tight!

With many bowling centers closing or abandoning leagues, bowlers need to inquire early or they may find themselves squeezed out of a spot. Sami Rice, the co-coordinator of the “Guys and Dolls” league at Winnetka Bowl with husband Mike, says that her league is saturated with would-be entrants.

So why bowl in leagues?

Here is a list of 10 reasons to join a bowling league, courtesy of About.com, along with my comments:

1 – The Characters

About.com: League bowling brings out some of the most colorful, interesting, baffling personalities in the world. You have no idea these people are in your community until you join a bowling league. From unbelievably talented bowlers to inexplicably strange humans, you get a cross-section of society you didn’t realize existed.

Fred Eisenhammer: Because there are so many characters, there is absolutely no shortage of individuals to write about. You never know when you encounter a bowling league icon like Ken Borshell among the mix of players. Borshell is someone who for 30 years traveled round-trip more than 200 miles just so he could bowl in Los Angeles on the same team as his good friends. Borshell hit the road from Bakersfield for seven years and then drove from Palm Desert for 23 years.

2 – Camaraderie

About.com: Bowling leagues, especially with your friends (or strangers who will become your friends), are great ways to spend a few hours a week.

Fred Eisenhammer: It’s a great way to make friends, especially for widows and widowers.

3 – Fun

About.com: Whether league bowling or not, it’s fun to bowl.

Fred Eisenhammer: Not only is it fun, but it’s exciting. Recently, anchor man Greg Kolski prepared to bowl in the 10th frame of a league game knowing that the match was on the line. Kolski needed a mark to seal the victory for his team. Considering his average was a robust 186, Kolski’s teammates were feeling pretty confident. Then Kolski drilled a pocket shot that inexplicably left the imposing 6-7 split and it was apparent that the bowling gods had intervened to upset the norm. There were no groans from Kolski’s team. It was more like shock. Then Kolski threw his big hook for his second shot, and again it was another huge surprise. He clipped the 6 pin gently on the right side and the pin slid over and barreled into the 7 – an improbable shot that snatched victory from the jaws of defeat.

4 – Gambling

About.com: Small-time gambling is acceptable in most bowling leagues. Often, half your league fees go toward your bowling and the other half goes toward the prize fund. At the end of the season, you and your team will receive prize money based on where you finish. Individual prizes are usually up for grabs, too. Other ways to win a pittance during league bowling involve card games and strike pots.

Fred Eisenhammer: It’s not usually a tremendous sum of money that is up for grabs, but bowlers are a competitive group – and even a little money means a lot.

5 – Fitness

About.com: Repeatedly hurling a heavy sphere requires strength and endurance, and you can burn a significant number of calories bowling.

Fred Eisenhammer: Bowling may not be the exercise program prescribed by your doctor, but even a little exercise is better than none.

6 – Pizza

About.com: Never mind you’re counteracting the exercise portion while cutting into your prize fund – it’s delicious.

Fred Eisenhammer: Don’t forget beer for those with an appreciation of that beverage.

7 – Television

About.com: If bowling isn’t enough for you, many bowling centers have TVs playing whatever most of you want to watch (typically sports). Depending on the time of your league, you can watch entire hockey and baseball games while bowling.

Fred Eisenhammer: Hockey? No thanks. Thumbs-up on football and basketball – and any game involving the Los Angeles Dodgers or the Los Angeles Rams or Chargers.

8 – United States Bowling Congress Membership

About.com: You’ll be a part of the USBC, which costs about \$20 a year (and is often hidden in your league fees, so you don’t even have to think about it if you don’t want to). Membership qualifies you for awards and gives you discounts with various merchants, including hotels and rental cars.

Fred Eisenhammer: As a USBC member, a bowler is eligible to participate in many tournaments, such as the West Coast Senior Tour, which often has events in the Southland.

9 – Relaxation

About.com: Except on the nights during which you’re bowling so poorly you find yourself doing anything but relaxing, the sport can give you a nice respite from the workday or workweek. Show up, relax, throw a few frames and have fun.

Fred Eisenhammer: Relaxation is nice in theory. Fact is, even a small pot of money at the end of the rainbow creates a competitive environment. And many bowlers feel the tension during the ninth and 10th frames. But competitiveness is a good thing. It’s fun to show that one can come through when the chips are down. A bad thing is when some bowlers resort to gamesmanship – deliberately distracting the other team’s bowlers or “disappearing” so the other team’s players bowl ahead of them in the 10th frame.

10 – Status

About.com: You’ll be amazed by how many people are impressed when they find out you bowl in a league.

Fred Eisenhammer: Perhaps more importantly, bowling in a league could provide a boost to your self-esteem. Your first 200 game, your first 500, 600 or 700 series – it shows that you can accomplish things in your 30s, 40s, 50s, 60s, 70s, 80s and older. It’s no coincidence that some of the most successful people are avid bowlers.

Not only will I be sending our local congress folks a letter demanding that they get involved with righting this wrong, our President will also be getting snail mail as well as emails from me to encourage his hand in acknowledging Mr. Allison for his accomplishment. Mr. Murphy and Mr. Overstreet will certainly hear from me and whoever else I can garner to apply pressure to overturn this bogus "non-compliant" decision.

Meanwhile, after reading this article again- you bring up a good point- we ought to withhold our Sanction Fees and with the summer leagues underway- this would send a message to USBC that bowlers can ban together for a cause, when that cause will make our sport more appealing and accurate for the history books.

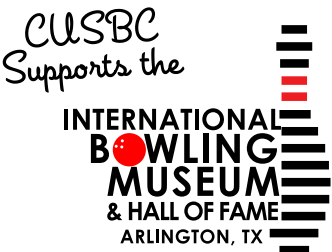

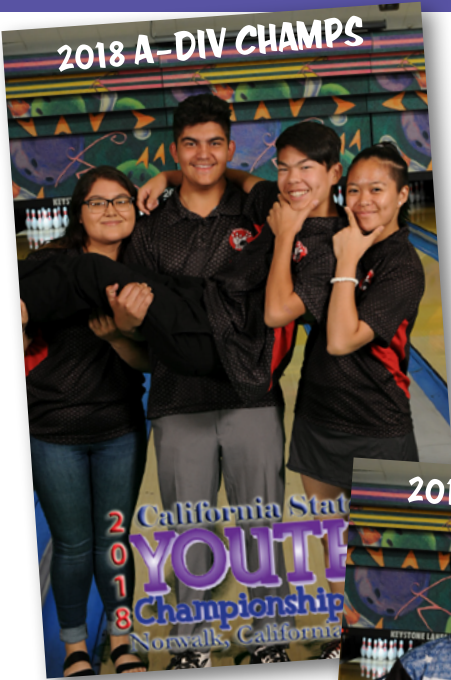

The win also marked the second time this season that Williams advanced all the way from the cashers round to reach the finals. He won the season-opening PBA50 Johnny Petraglia BVL Open by advancing from the cashers round.

“Even though I’m bowling pretty well, I’ve been a little frustrated in qualifying,” Williams admitted. “In general, it seems like I’m not getting good pin carry until I get to match play for whatever reason.”

Williams, who won the 2010 Senior Miller High Life Classic at Victory Lanes for his first PBA50 Tour title, was especially fortunate to advance to match play earlier Wednesday bowling a 256 in the final game of the cashers round to earn a spot in the first match play round.

“All I can say is it’s crazy,” Williams said about his journey to the Mooresville Open title. “I didn’t expect to win the first three titles of the season, but it feels awesome.”

Williams’ second win of the season came in last week’s PBA50 National Championship for his third career major title.

The stepladder final, streamed live on FloBowling, began with No. 5 qualifier hall of famer Parker Bohn III of Jackson, New Jersey beating No. 4 qualifier Todd Kjell of Roscoe, Illinois, 196-181.

Bohn, trying for his fifth PBA50 Tour title, then beat No. 3 qualifier Scott Greiner of Sunrise Beach, Missouri, 258-229, to advance to the semifinal match against Wiseman.

Wiseman, who finished 10th in last week’s PBA50 National Championship, then beat Bohn 258-223 to advance to the title match against Williams. Greiner and Kjell were both trying for their first PBA50 Tour titles.

The PBA50 Tour heads to Hamilton Lanes in Trenton, New Jersey for the PBA50 Hamilton Lanes & Entertainment Center Open presented by Columbia 300 May 3-5. VAN DANIKER SHOOTS 804, BUT SYSCO GETS FOUR WINS
3 OLIVES VODKA CONTINUES TO LEAD ROUND. J.A.T. IS NEXT UP FOR THEM

DOWNEY – Heading into the final four weeks of play in the Brunswick Invitational, four teams had clinched spots in the playoffs, and (by my count) ten others still had hopes for a spot. Eight teams were within three games of the lead for the round going into the night. This would be a huge night, where you could either remain in contention or see your final hopes for the roll offs get killed as there are no rounds left to play. And, for the next two weeks the league will bowl on the house shot, so strings of strikes will be critical for a team's chances.

On the top pair, **3 Olives Vodka** took on **Captain Morgan**. 3 Olives held a one game lead going into the night, with three teams only one game behind them. In the opener, Mikey Villarreal had a 259 game for 3 Olives and Eric Snow added a 238. Captain Morgan just didn't have an answer in the early part of the match, and 3 Olives opened up a 147 pin lead, 922-775. The second game was much closer, as Captain Morgan started to score. Sam Jimenez led Captain Morgan with a 253 game, but the outcome was still the same. 3 Olives won the game, 908-868, again led by Villarreal with 268. Curt Soares helped out with 232. Captain Morgan kept plugging, and finally got on the board with a win in the finale, 935-879, but it wasn't enough to get back in it for total, and 3 Olives Vodka took the match, 4-1. For series, Villarreal was the top scorer with a 741. Soares was next with 725. With the four wins, 3 Olives improves to 18-7 and will stay on the top pair next week.

On the second pair of lanes, **J.A.T.** took on the **Professional Approach**. Both teams went into the night with records of 13-7, a game out of first place for the round. In the opener, Vernon Adams led the way for the Professional Approach with a 268 game. His teammate, Arnold Cheesman, was right behind with 255. The two of them led Pro Approach to a 932 total, winning the game by 61 pins. In the opener, J.A.T. had a big 277 game from Kurt Arakaki. Kevin Valmonte of J.A.T. struggled in game one, but rebounded with 251-258 for a 669 set. Those two final games, along with a 258 from Arakaki, paced J.A.T. to a comeback win, as they took the next two games and totals. For the match, J.A.T. came out on top, 4-1. Vernon Adams led the pair with 763, but would gladly trade that score for some wins. Arakaki stayed hot for J.A.T., finishing with a 760 series of his own. J.A.T. improves to 17-8 for the round and will move up to the top pair of lanes next Monday.

Forest Lanes battled **DV8** on the third pair. Both would need a big night to keep up with 3 Olives and J.A.T. Neither would get it. Forest Lanes took only the middle game, but won it by enough that they took total pins as well, giving them a 3-2 win for the match. In doing so, both teams lost ground to the leaders. Forest improves to 15-10 for the round but are now three games behind 3 Olives. Lots of good scores in this close match. For Forest, Jonathan Gale led the team with 256/692. Ray Minter added a 684 and Scott Hong had a 258/674. DV8 was led with a 252/702 series from Brian Main. Lee Liu was solid with a 235/674 as well.

Juan Zavala got off to a quick start on the next pair, although he'd like to have his final shot back. Zavala led **Tito's Handmade Vodka** to an early 92 pin lead with a 296 game in the opener. **Keystone Lanes** came back strong afterwards though, taking the final two games. And, they took the games by more than enough pins to overcome the total pins deficit, as they took series by just over 100 pins. Mike Calvillo led the way for Keystone with a 266/699 series. Stephanie Zavala helped out with 225-233-224/682. With the four wins, Keystone Lanes improves to 15-10 and moves all the way up to the second pair, only three games behind the leaders.

Bowling Guys may have ended all hopes that **Bowlum** had going into the final weeks, as they beat them 4-1. Bowlum only has 10 wins for the round and is pretty much out of wild card contention. For the Bowling Guys, they improve to 12 wins, but are still six back of the lead with only three weeks to go. Kevin Jones topped Bowling Guys with a 269/663 set. Bryan Osborne had a very steady 657 series.

Shannon Santos shot a 232/655 to lead **Threadworks** to a 4-1 win over **Linder's Insurance** on the next pair. Chris and Eric Hefner both helped out with 631 and 626 respectively. Linder's had trouble getting going, as only Michael Barnett broke 600 for the team, shooting 241/615.

On the final pair, **Herzog Insurance** had their biggest night of the season as they swept past **Don Julio Tequila**. Matt Mosley led Herzog Insurance, with a huge set of 760 in spite of a 192 in the final game. Matt had 289 and 279 to start his night. Also for Herzog, Nacho Vega added 279-23-225/736. Jamie Ferry was a distant third with a solid 651 of her own. Mike Cimba posted 259/688 for Don Julio, but it wasn't enough to get his team any wins.

The top pair of round winners had **Sysco** going up against **Century 21—PEAK**. Sysco held a four-point lead heading into the night as they look to lock up the top seed in the playoffs. Century 21 was looking to make up the difference, and hold off Cal Bowl who is only 2 ½ points behind them in third place. In the opening game, Eddie Van Daniker left a seven pin on his twelfth shot for a 299 game. Jon Huff, also of Century 21, added a 278 game. In spite of those big numbers, SYSCO took the opener by 22 pins, 979-957. For Sysco, Gabriel Martinez shot a 277 and JT Diso added a 268. Paul Barraco hardly gets a mention with 247. In the second game, the scores came down quite a bit. In this one, Century 21 got the win and cut the lead for total pins down to eight. Van Daniker again led the way with 247 and Jeff Carr added a 234. The final game was essentially worth three points, as total pins were so close. In the finale, SYSCO came out on winning end of a 911-886 game, behind a strong finish from Paul Barraco with a 258 game. Van Daniker continued striking, as he shot a 258 game to complete an 804 series. For SYSCO though, it was three steady players all breaking 700. Paul Barraco had a 722, Gabriel Martinez a 713, and JT Diso a 711.

Cal Bowl moved up to 2nd place for the overall standings after beating **Buddy's Bowling Supply** again, 4-1. The four wins improves Cal Bowl to 99 for the season, half a game ahead of Century 21. Being in second place, they'll bowl against Sysco next week. Cal trails Sysco by 6 ½ points and need a big week next Monday to close the gap. Ramon Torres led Cal Bowl tonight with a 232/659 set. Dave Kost was subbing for Buddy's and matched that set with a 236/659 of his own.

Eddie Van Daniker took the first sidepot of the night with his 299 game. Matt Mosley had to settle for 2nd with 289. In the second game, 279 was enough for Matt Mosely to get the win, while Vernon Adams got second place money for 269. The third game super pot went to Van Daniker with a 258. That earned him \$149. Bobby Campagnale gets \$40 for 2nd place with a 247.

Matt Mosley earned an additional \$185 for winning the Financial Advisors Pot. His 279 game was enough to win on the high scoring night. Vernon Adams' 269 won him an additional \$100 in this pot.

It's another night of house shot next Monday night. The final house shot night of the season. Three weeks to go. Cal Bowl looking to close the gap on Sysco. Century 21 looking to get back to the top pair. 3 Olives looking to increase their lead. J.A.T. Forest Lanes and Keystone Lanes trying to run them down. Who's going to be clutch when the season is on the line? Come on down to Del Rio Lanes next Monday to see for yourself. We'll look forward to seeing you here.
