### Sandelin Wins Battle Over Hall of Famer Virginia Norton to Claim **USBC Senior Queens Title**

HUNTERSVILLE, N.C. -Lucy Sandelin of Tampa, Fla., charged out of the contenders bracket Wednesday to race away with the United States Bowling Congress Senior Queens title at Northcross Lanes.

In a showdown between USBC Hall of Famers, the oncebeaten Sandelin overwhelmed previously undefeated Virginia Norton of Cypress, Calif.,

680-563 and 645-546, to win the double-elimination title con-

Sandelin, a Senior Queens "rookie" at age 50, earned \$4,500 while Norton took home \$2,800 as runner-up.

Sandelin was in control from the start, rolling a 257 out of the gate while Norton struggled with her line to the pocket all day.

"I needed a 'get out of jail free' card, but never got one," Norton said. "Not that it would have mattered. Lucy bowled great."

"As long as I kept my balance, I felt like I could make a good shot,"

Sandelin said. "If it carried, great. If not, I made my spares. It was just me against the lane. I had key words I kept saying to myself. It was part of our training when I was on Team USA, and it worked. I could easily have started looking ahead, but stayed in the here-and-now, and it kept me focused."

For Sandelin, the Senior Queens tiara was a monumental triumph in more ways than one.

"I stopped bowling completely for two years," she said. I got burned out after the 2003 WTBA World Championships in Malaysia. I was just physically and mentally drained. And then, in January 2005, I was diagnosed with fallopian tube cancer, so I took another year going through chemotherapy and getting well."

With her 50th birthday on the horizon, she decided it was time to get involved again.

"I kept coaching my high school bowling group during that time, which kept me involved in the sport, but I decided I had an opportunity to be a rookie in Senior Queens - you only turn 50 once - and I thought it would be fun," Sandelin said. "Last November I started getting getting ready. I joined a handicap league and I started doing private lessons, and I started bowling better. I think it was because when you're coaching, you focus on fundamentals and I started listening to myself.

"The key in coming to the Senior Queens was I just wanted to have fun. I didn't need to do it. I didn't need to win. Whatever happened today was OK."

"Virginia is awesome, such a class bowler,".

# **Kulick Claims USBC** Queens Title

MATTHEWS, N.C. - Kelly Kulick describes the past year as the most grueling of her life. All of her frustration, hard work and patience paid off Wednesday as she won the 2007 United States Bowling Congress

Kulick of Union, N.J., who a year ago made history by becoming the first woman to earn a fulltime exemption on the Denny's Professional Bowlers Association Tour, defeated Diandra Asbaty of Chicago 192-143 at AMF Carolina Lanes to win the biggest and most prestigious title in women's bowling.

"I've worked very hard at my game for a long time," Kulick said. "I've had a full year of practice and that was a big time advantage. After the year that I've had, this is the icing on the cake. This is the big blowout of the

Kulick vaulted into the lead in the championship match after Asbaty left a 3-4-6-7-10 split in the eighth frame. Asbaty then left another split in the ninth frame, allowing Kulick to step up and seal the victory with two strikes.

"I didn't even look at the scoreboard, but after she left those splits I knew I just needed to step up and nail a couple shots," Kulick said.

"That strike on the left lane in the eighth frame really put it awav."

Asbaty, a two-time U.S. Amateur champion and ninetime Team USA member, said she never got comfortable in the championship match.

"I just didn't line up right and I didn't make good decisions," Asbaty said. "I just didn't get comfortable and with only one

game for a title it's very important to get comfortable."

On the way to the title, Kulick defeated three-time Queens champion Wendy Macpherson of Henderson, Nev., and then knocked off Kristal Scott of Lawrence, Kan., in the semifinal. In the opening match, Macpherson advanced by defeating Team USA's Shannon O'Keefe of Rochester, N.Y.

Kulick took home \$30,000 for first place in addition to the Queens tiara, pendant and crystal trophy. Asbaty earned \$18,000 for second.

The USBC Queens, which is presented by Eldorado, Silver Legacy and Circus Circus, featured a field of 344 of the top female bowlers in the world competing for a total prize fund of \$200,000. ### Corky De Maio San Bernardino's Greatest Bowler Nears 50th Anniversary

Next season will mark 50 years as a kegler for Citrus Belt Hall of Famer Corky De Maio. He never bowled as a youth, and only tried the sport after taking a part time job at Citrus Belt Lanes in the late 1950s. It was the best thing he ever did, meeting Shirley, his wife, the love of his life while working the desk.

As a result of his bowling job Corky started practicing, sometimes bowling ten or more games after league play. Within two years he rolled his first 300 with an ACE rubber ball. Since that 1960 perfecto he has rolled over 30 certified (formerly sanctioned) perfect games and over 50 counting those in non-league play. He has ten 800's (three certified), with a 847 being his high. The 847 was bowled with a NU-LINE Extreme ball. Being an original stockholder in the NU-LINE company, DeMaio used their equipment for several years. His all-time favorite ball is the NU-LINE Excalibur.

One of the highlights of De Maio's career was winning two of three games from Billy Welu in a 1960's match. He averaged about 220 to defeat Welu, after "shooting" over 800 in three practice games before the match. It was Billy Welu who changed De Maio from a full roller to a three quarter roller, to his advantage.

In addition to beating Welu, De Maio has won over twenty Super Senior Tour or West Coast Senior Tour titles, a Citrus Belt Senior Masters title, four Citrus Belt Senior Scratch All-Events titles (three consecutive), and close to twenty Citrus Belt regular and senior titles. He holds the record for Citrus Belt senior titles with 13. There have been dozens of other titles including a win in a 1990 PBA qualifying event. Did I mention 46 years of averaging 200 or better! Now you know why De Maio is San Bernardino's greatest bowler of

Everyone who has ever bowled against Corky in match play knows there is no one better in the clutch. He doesn't make any mistakes, is a master at reading lanes and making adjustments.

De Maio became a ball driller in 1972 at Del Rosa Lanes. He worked in the pro-shop there until 1979. In 1980 he opened a pro-shop in his garage and has been there ever since. He is the premier ball driller in the inland empire, with a reputation for knowing more about bowling balls, surfaces and layouts than anyone. Scratch bowlers from throughout southern California drive a hundred or more miles to his pro-shop to have a ball drilled.

With all that he has accomplished, Corky feels the best bowler in the De Maio family will ultimately be his grand-daughter Demi. As a twelve year old, she recently won the Del Rosa Lanes junior bowler of the year tourney.

Corky would like to thank his children (Kenny, Chris, and Darren) and lovely wife Shirley for supporting him through the years. Thank you California Bowling News for supporting our Citrus Belt bowlers.
