Silver Lake Atom Splitters will get a chance to become the first three-time OceanView at Falmouth PBA League Elias Cup champions after a convincing semifinal round victory, but the twotime defending champion Shipyard Dallas Strikers will be watching from the sidelines after losing a thrilling "double overtime" battle with the Sysco Philadelphia Hitmen team.

The best-of-two-game semifinal rounds matches, which are part of the 2018 Go Bowling! PBA Tour schedule, were contested at Bayside Bowl and aired Sunday on ESPN.

PBA'S "60 MOST MEMORABLE MOMENTS" Unveiling Continues: 16 Thru 25

The countdown to unveil the complete list of the PBA''s "60 most memorable moments" in its 60-year history continues, one a day, Monday through Friday, (two weeks worth) on all PBA Network outlets. Last week, "memorable moments" 16 through 25 were unveiled. Here are those ten moments as the countdown continues:

- 16) In 1978, Mark Roth won a PBA record eight titles during the 35-event season which is still the record for most titles won in a season.
- 17) In 2009, Jason Belmonte became the first bowler using a two-handed delivery to win a PBA Tour title when he defeated Mike Fagan, 215-201, in The Bowling Foundation Long Island Classic in West Babylon, N.Y. The win kick-started a career that led to a record for the fastest player to reach \$1 million in career earnings (131st event in 2017). Wes Malott held the record, reaching the million-dollar milestone when he won the 2013 U.S. Open in his 180th event.
- 18) Billy Hardwick became the first player to complete what would later be known as the "PBA Triple Crown," winning the 1969 BPAA All-Star (later re-named as the U.S. Open), the 1963 PBA National Championship and the 1965 PBA Tournament of Champions. Hardwick is one of six players in the PBA's 60-year history to accomplish the feat.
- **19)** The PBA Tour's 48th season started with a bang when Walter Ray Williams Jr. broke the Tour's all-time titles record, earning win No. 42 over Pete Weber, 289-236, in the 2006 Dydo Japan Cup in Tokyo.
- 20) In 1993, Mike Aulby rolled a 300 game in the title match of the PBA Wichita Open to defeat David Ozio, 300-279. The 579 pinfall total remains a PBA record for highest combined score in a PBA title match.
- 21) In 1997, the PBA St. Clair Classic was the last Pro Bowlers Tour event televised by ABC Sports, ending a 36-year run. The title match between Walter Ray Williams Jr. and Pete Weber was won by Williams, 206-195, and included an emotional farewell video tribute to ABC announcers Nelson "Bo" Burton Jr. and Chris Schenkel who broke down in tears at the end of the telecast.
- **22)** By winning a PBA Senior Regional event in Taylorville, Ill. in 2002, Dick Weber became the first player to win PBA titles at any level in six consecutive decades. Weber won his first PBA title in the 1959 Paramus Eastern Open, the second PBA event ever held. It was the first of 23 consecutive top 24 finishes extending into 1962 a record that has never been broken.
- **23)** In the 1994 PBA National Championship at Ducat's Imperial Lanes in Toledo, Ohio, Johnny Petraglia threw the seventh televised 300 game in PBA history, defeating Walter Ray Williams Jr. in the second match and earning a \$100,000 bonus.
- 24) In the last Firestone-sponsored PBA Tournament of Champions, George Branham III became the first African-American to win a PBA Tour major championship, defeating Parker Bohn III, 227-214, at Riviera Lanes in 1993.
- 25) With a 266-224 win over Ryan Shafer, Jason Couch became the only bowler in PBA Tour history to win three consecutive PBA Tournament of Champions and joined Mike Durbin as the second player to win the event three times. Couch's wins came in 1999, 2000 and 2002 (event was not held in 2001) and they took place in three different centers Incred-A-Bowl in Overland Park, Kan.; Brunswick Zone-Deer Park in Lake Zurich, Ill., and Mohegan Sun Arena in Uncasville, Conn., respectively.





Splitters manager Mark Baker." There wasn't much for me to do other than keep giving them high fives."

In the second semifinal match, the Dallas Strikers looked like they were going to make the finale a match between the PBA League's only two-time winners, romping to a 278-248 win over the Hitmen in game one. After Bill O'Neill and player-manager Norm Duke converted single-pin spares in the first two frames, Kyle Sherman, Rhino Page and Tommy Jones began a run of nine consecutive strikes to run away with the first game.

But Philadelphia pulled off a stunning upset. In game two, the Hitmen took a two-pin advantage into the 10th frame where anchor bowler Dom Barrett left the 2-8 on his first shot. After converting the spare, he needed nine pins to clinch the win by a pin, but left a pocket 7-10 split, ending the game in a 213-213 tie and forcing a one-ball sudden death roll-off.

Philadelphia manager Jason Couch sent in rookie lefthander Matt Sanders, who struck. Dallas countered with its leftie, veteran Rhino Page, who left a 6 pin.

With the match then tied at one game each, another roll-off was needed to decide who advanced to the Elias Cup finals. Sanders struck and Duke matched him. Couch then called on Tom Smallwood, who got help from a messenger to take out the 10 pin for another strike. Page again got the call for Dallas, but again misfired, leaving a 2 pin and sending the Hitmen into the Elias Cup title match for the first time in the series' seven-year history.

"My heart was definitely pumping," Couch said. "That's what we hope will happen in this kind of format. I got lucky; I made the right moves and put guys in the right spot, and it worked out well.

"We've been here enough times. We know the environment," Couch added. "Nothing seems to rattle (Sanders). He's really good under pressure. We explained to him after we drafted him what he could expect when he came to Portland. We told him to just have a good time.

"I have no problem sending 'Smalls' in when we need something. He's come of age; he bloomed a little later than normal, but I'd take him in that position any time. He did it in Columbus (where he won the Barbasol PBA Players Championship), and he did it for us last year. I have no problem with him anywhere in our lineup."

The Elias Cup and the Mark Roth PBA League MVP will be decided on ESPN on Sunday, March 13, at 1 p.m. ET. The new Elias Cup format will involve two best-of-two-game Baker format matches with a one-ball sudden death roll-off being used to decide any ties. The new format could see up to seven one-ball roll-offs.

OK! OK! We're back with Part Two. Is the "old stuff" really better than the "new stuff"? Is there any new stuff besides the Pro Tour?

- CANOGA PARK BOWL was bragging again. They had given away 506,000,000 Blue Chip Stamps. Only \$6.00 a squad. 300 stamps for signing in.
- ANDY MESSINA's FIVE POINTS BOWL in El Monte got a "re-do" inside and "out". It was an oldie but goodie.
- Over 500 attended the annual Bowling Writers Banquet at the Sportsmen's Lodge. ROY FIRESTONE, a local sportscaster was Master of Ceremonies. DICK WEBER presented the trophies. The dinner was THE bowling event of the year. All former Hall of Famers were introducted and welcomed. The new inductees and Juniors were honored. (Some are now on tour!) Bowlers had a chance to dress-up, be honored or applauded.
- Junior bowlers could hone their skills in great tournaments like JAT (Girls Division), JAT (Farm Club), CANOGA PARK JR. Masters, the Pacific Coast Championship, plus local, state and national association events. California was loaded wth young talent. Even had their own Junior page in the paper.
- 39 Centers signed up for the very successful program "Kids Bowling For Kids". Another great event that bit the dust.
- The "High Roller" at the SHOWBOAT was limited to 2048 entries! Oh, the good 'ole days.
- BILL TAYLOR flew to LONDON where bowling was not considered a competitive sport. He ran two tournaments to test the interest of bowlers.
- Ground was broken for the "Hall of Fame" in St. Louis. 'Twas across the street from Busch Stadium. 1983 was hopefully the "opening" date.
- TOM CRISTI, SPORTS CENTER manager, gave away a Toyota to JACK FLADELL.
- Actor JOHN AGAR was the Senior Advisor for Brunswick, He provided lessons and seminars for senior groups.
- P.J. CARROLL was named "Sponsor of the Year". Question of the Decade. "When bowlers roll a bad game, why do they blame it on the lanes"? If they roll a good game, the chest blows up, the eyes check to see who's watching, slap a few hands and punch in a message on their phone. (Notice how I didn't say "he or she"!)
 More, more, more coming soon to your newest computer.
- The big argument at the A.B.C. Convention was whether or not to publish a summer average book.
- The A.B.T.A. hosted two divisions: Classic Division and Premiere Division. Plus King/ Queen of the Hill. The weekly finals was televised! BOB SMITH was the P.T. Barnam of bowling. BOB offered a new car to anyone that shot 300 on T.V,
- MARY HINMAN was elected to Calif. State President. On her board: ELAINE HAGIN, MILDRED LOWE, BLANCHE CULLIN, ADDY AZEVEDO, BOBBI WALT-MAN and LINDA JOHNSON. One amendment that did not pass at the State Convention was allowing beverages and food to be consumed while bowling State Tournament.
- RICHARD SIMMONS dedicated two of his daytime exercise T.V. shows to bowling reaching over 4 million householders weekly.
- VILLAGE BOWL was located in YORBA LINDA. VIL-

- LAGE LANES in EL MONTE was not related.
 VIRGINIA NORTON and KYLE SHEDD gave lessons to league members at WONDER-BOWL-DOWNEY.
- **CANOGA PARK** was bragging again about their Blue Chip give-away count. As of July 4, 1982 510,000,000.
- AL UTTECHT, the fabulous wheelchair bowler won (again) the American Wheelchair title.
- July 1st, 1982 the whole front page screamed "ABC Hall of Famer GLENN ALLISON is Perfect: 300-300-300/900". The same question as to whether the score would be sanctioned has been asked a thousand times. The answer was passed from the A.B.C. to the U.S.B.C. who wanted no part of it! GLENN's story has been told many times by many people. To quote GLENN: "I've gotten more publicity by NOT being sanctioned!" How many YELLOW DOTS did you sell?
- Week after week DONNA ADAMEK was making headlines. Can't list 'em all! But she won 'em all. Where are you now DONNA???
- HELEN DUVAL, at age 66, became the oldest W.I.B.C. member to shoot 300.
- DON JOHNSON had 22 consecutive strikes but didn't roll a 300. Lots of those streaks on the "easy oil pattern"!
- Open bowling's new bargain price was 65 cents a game. Blue Chip squads were going for \$6.50 at most centers.
- Murrey International installed four lanes in the jungle near Balikpapan, Indonesia for Union Oil workers.
- Officials (ABC, State and Local) were all trying to find the solution to "slow bowling".
 6 o'clock leagues not getting off the lanes for the 9 o'clock leagues was the big complaint. 30 years later the puzzle was anwered. JUST DON'T HAVE ANY LEAGUES! (Sorry folks, we old-timers can't hardly find a place to play.)





back into the match. Voss' clutch double in the 10th forced Boresch - the only non-PBA Hall of Famer among the five finalists - to also double for the win, but the Wisconsin pro shop operator left a 4 pin on his first shot.

"I love to bowl. I live to win," Voss said. "My sons were with me tonight. It was fabulous.

"There are days I wonder why I'm still doing this," he added, "but when you experience this, it keeps you coming back. I love to entertain, to show my emotions. I live just to feel the adrenalin, not only when you win, but the path along the way. It's addictive, overcoming the fear. It's a great feeling." Voss, who will turn 60 later in the summer, said he moved to nearby Cornelius, N.C., from Colorado about three months ago because he had an opportunity to teach bowling, "so why not? I love being around the bowling world. I love to teach, so I moved."

Boresch, fresh off winning his fourth PBA50 Tour title in the PBA50 National Championship at Spanish Springs Lanes in The Villages, Fla., a week earlier, eliminated Norm Duke of Clermont, Fla., in the semifinal match, 232-222. Boresch, who also defeated Duke in the PBA50 National Championship title match, used a late string of four strikes to overcome a pocket 7-10 split of his own while Duke lost his strike pocket early in the game and dug a hole he couldn't escape. Duke started the stepladder finals with a 279-214 win over Parker Bohn III of Jackson, N.J., with only a 10 pin in the fifth frame preventing a perfect game. In the second match, Duke took advantage of Pete Weber's only mistake – leaving and failing to convert the 3-10 split in the 10th frame – to win a classic battle with the St. Ann, Mo., hall of famer, 257-245.

The PBA50 Tour's next event is the PBA50 Johnny Petraglia BVL Open, presented by Brunswick, at Farmingdale Lanes in Farmingdale, N.Y., beginning with eight-game qualifying rounds Sunday and Monday at 6 p.m. ET. The tournament concludes Tuesday with a cashers' round, two modified match play rounds and the stepladder finals at 7 p.m. Brian LeClair is defending champion.

"And I told him, 'You have to make a ball change. Just make a damn ball change!' And he said 'it's just going to do the same damn thing.'"

Craig, who sports a 157 average and has little tournament experience, finally relented, taking the other ball out of his bag - the one that "I hadn't touched for a whole year."

Somehow, the ball came with some pixie dust on it and it responded magically.

"He closes his [second] game with strikes and spares," Siena said. "Then in the last game, after he had four strikes in a row, I asked him, 'Aren't you glad you made the ball change?' And he said, 'Yeah.' "

Craig went on to blister a 225, not far off his career best.

Siena chipped in with a powerful 201 in the same game - and that finishing kick gave the Caweltis the high score of all the doubles entries.

"I'm so elated for him when he does well," Siena said. "He was having his best game ever and he didn't even know how well he was doing.

"When he finished, he didn't know he had a 225. He was just making strikes and spares and it was amazing. If he didn't have that 225, we wouldn't have won."

Craig and Siena finished 15 pins ahead of the secondplace team of Richard Samson and Zarcoff Boutell, who won \$300.

There were three squads - or sessions - during the April 29 event, which was sponsored by Competitive Bowling Tournaments.

Siena bowled in all three sessions (Craig bowled in just one.) Siena also finished third in the doubles tournament with teammate Johnny Rojas - the two of them bowling in the first session and scoring 1,245 to win \$150.

Siena said winning the title with her husband provided her with one of the most memorable bowling experiences of her eight-year career.

"The fact that we did it together, it will be a memory that I'll never forget and will always treasure," said Siena, who has been married to Craig for 18 years and has been together with him for 26.


Craig said the tournament title represented his most memorable bowling experience. "Most definitely," he said. "By far."

Gary Duran led Herzog Insurance to a four to one victory over Century 21—My Real Estate on the second pair of lanes. Gary bowled a 300 game in the middle of his 654 series that topped the pair. Danny Wilson helped out with 204/588. Brandon Kraye was subbing for Century 21, and led their squad with 226/594. Century 21 was able to win game one, but lost game two by over 150 pins and were never able to come back from it. With the four wins, Herzog Insurance will move up to the first pair of lanes to take on Forest Lanes. Forest now holds a three game lead for the fifth round.

Tito's Handmade Vodka was able to sweep DV8, improving their record to 16-9 for the round. The sweep keeps the dreams of playoffs alive for Tito's, and all but eliminates any hope for DV8 with only three weeks to go. Jason Buenviaje, of Tito's Handmade Vodka, led the pair with a 200/579 set. His teammate, Raul "Spanky" Rosales, was right behind with 572. Ashkan Tahvildaran recovered from a tough first game to lead DV8 with 235/555. Bowlium took four out of five from Threadoworks in the next match.

Threadworks got the first game, and then Bowlium took over. John Vallin of Bowlium found the condition to his liking, posting 213-232/613.

Keystone Lanes met Three Olives Vodka on the next pair. Three Olives got off to a great start with a 757-674 victory in game one, behind a 222 game from Bobby Campagnale. The rest of the match belonged to Keystone Lanes

though, as they won the next two games and total pins, for a 4-1 victory. Jonathan Huff, subbing for Keystone, led the way with 203/571

Kevin Jones shot a 200-228/601 set to lead Bowling Guys to a 3-2 victory over the Professional Approach. Clinton Meche helped in the win with a 207 game. The Professional Approach team took games one and three, but a 90 pin win for Bowling Guys in the middle game was enough to earn them the two points for total pins.

Los Altos Trophy swept past Don Julio Tequila on the final pair. Nick Rodriguez had a great night, shooting a 267 in the middle game on his way to 621. Michael Lindsey helped with 226/605.

Cal Bowl took four out of five games from Sysco last Monday night, getting them within one game of first place, and setting up a rematch on this night. Cal Bowl continued on the momentum they had built, this time with a sweep over the Sysco team. Only game two was close, as Cal Bowl won totals by over 220 pins. Leonard Ruiz Jr. had a huge set for Cal Bowl, leading the league with 254-252-235/741

J.A.T. took on Buddy's Bowling Supply in the other match between round winners. The fifth round has not been good at all for Buddy's, and Monday was no different. J.A.T. did not win the first two games by much, but they still took them both and held a 47 pin lead heading into game three. Game three had a much bigger margin of victory for J.A.T., giving them a five game sweep. Kurt Arakaki topped the pair with 213/593. Larry Campbell added a 213 to help out in the final game. Ray Minter led Buddy's with 233/584. The sweep moves J.A.T. up to second place, and earns them the right to take on Cal Bowl next Monday night. Sysco, after falling from first to third, will take on Buddy's Bowling Supply

Leonard Ruiz Jr. had a good night, taking the first and third sidepots. The first ame was won with a 254 game. The third game earned him \$171 for his 235 score. Nick Rodriguez took the middle game with 267.

The 267 by Nick Rodriguez paid off in the Financial Advisors pot as well, as he made another \$190. Leonard Ruiz Jr. added \$100 to his total, taking second place with 252.
