## Pete Weber Wins in Mooresville for Back-to-Back PBA50 Tour Titles

### Ties Late Father for Career Titles

MOORESVILLE, N.C. – Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer Pete Weber won the PBA50 Tour’s Mooresville Ford Open presented by Columbia 300 and Miller High Life Wednesday night at George Pappas’ Victory Lanes, notching back-to-back titles and his sixth career PBA50 title to tie his late father, Dick Weber, on the all-time “senior tour” titles list.

In winning the title, the reigning PBA50 Player of the Year spoiled Jack Jurek’s bid to defend his 2015 Mooresville title after the Lackawanna, N.Y., veteran won all six matches in the final match play round to run away with the top berth for the stepladder finals.

Unconverted splits in the first two frames put Jurek in a hole, which he almost escaped, but back-to-back strikes by Weber in the ninth and 10th frames locked up his 212-198 victory.

“I had my first 500-over (a 200 average) round here two years ago and finished third,” Weber said. “Last year I was second, and now I’m first. This is now my favorite place to bowl.”

Weber, who ended the 2015 season battling chronic back and knee problems, has bowled virtually pain free in 2016, including his romp to victory in the PBA50 UnitedHealthcare Sun Bowl In The Villages Open a week earlier.

“I’m feeling really good,” Weber said. “I’ve



had no pain at all this spring, and now I’m looking forward to bowling in New York because I led there last year, too.”

Weber advanced to the title match with a 266-205 victory over 61-year-old Tom Baker of King, N.C., ending Baker’s bid for a 13th PBA50 Tour title. Baker started the stepladder finals with a 227-203 win over Robert Brown of Cody, Wyo., followed by

a 279-257 slugfest with Sam Maccarone of Blackwood, N.J., in match two. A global audience watched the Mooresville finals on PBA’s Xtra Frame online video-streaming service. The PBA50 Tour and Xtra Frame’s next event will be the PBA50 Johnny Petraglia BVL Open presented by Brunswick at Farmingdale Lanes in Farmingdale, N.Y., starting Sunday.

## “Right” Choice Helps Dallas Strikers Win PBA League Elias Cup

### Hall of Famers Duke, Weber lead teams into PBA League championship match

PORTLAND, Maine – Making the “right” lane choice throughout the Professional Bowlers Association League Elias Cup elimination rounds proved to be the correct strategic move as the GoBowling.com Dallas Strikers ended four years of frustration in capturing the elusive team

championship at Bayside Bowl.

The 2016 Elias Cup finals aired on Sunday on ESPN.

PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke, the only player-manager in the PBA League program, made a series of eyebrow-raising decisions – going all the way back to

December when he traded two proven stars for a pair of untested young power players – but in the end, after pulling off a 204-180 victory over the GEICO New York City WTT King-Pins in the decisive Baker team finale, Duke led his team to its first Elias Cup.

“Look at the smile on

my face,” Duke grinned. “It was just an amazing experience. When you’ve got this many years under your belt, and this many appearances on television, and this many narrow misses...to explain the feeling on the approach after this one doesn’t even compute.

“This is a different environment, a different event,” he continued, adding very deliberately, “We are the Elias Cup champions.”

The Elias Cup finale involved a singles match (Duke defeated NYC’s Marshall Kent, 203-168); an alternative ball doubles match (the KingPins” John Szczerbinski and Mike Fagan overwhelmed Duke and Bill O’Neill, 224-178), and a Baker trios match, won

## Justin Pluchino, 20, Turns In 'Awesome' Effort

WINNETKA – Justin Pluchino admitted that he was speechless after he pulled off his spectacular feat.

"I never thought this would happen," Justin said.

What Justin did was crush a 900 series – or three perfect games – during the Sweepers tournament of his Junior Royals league on May 23, 2017. It actually was a no-tap 900, meaning a shot that knocks down nine pins counts as a strike.

Nevertheless, it was a breathtaking performance that demonstrated consistency and excellence over three games. Of Justin's 36 strikes, 29 were legitimate. He left a single pin seven times: twice in the first game; three times in the second game; and twice in the third game.

Justin, 20, called the 900 his biggest thrill.

He's already compiled a strikingly impressive resume. Justin, a powerful right-hander, bowled a sanctioned perfect game in May 2014 at Winnetka Bowl and has won numerous tournament titles. He has a high series of 796 and averages 233.

"I never thought I'd have a 900 on my sheets – regular or no-tap," Justin said. "It's too much to dream about. But it happened. Every bowler's dream is to have a 300, 800, 900, or win some kind of PBA title or tournament."

Interestingly, Justin returned to bowl the following day and racked up an 800 series in practice. And it wasn't no-tap. Justin hopes a sanctioned 800 is around the corner. "I know it's coming," he said, "I just have to be patient."

Justin would like to get the 800 out of the way and then take his best shot at a legitimate 900 – which no L.A.-area bowler has rolled. He says the 900 remains a goal "until I can't throw a bowling ball anymore."

Elite bowler Johnnie Englehart has bowled with Justin and he didn't seem surprised about Justin's feat. "Justin has a lot of potential," Englehart said. "He's like the kingpin of the juniors – the top player there. He handles it well and is just a good kid – not one of those entitlement guys. And I know he loves to bowl."

Englehart called Justin's 900 "awesome." Englehart, incidentally, has rolled two 900 no-tap series and twice has bowled two perfect games in a three-game series.

Ron Eisenberg, Winnetka Bowl's junior director for the past 30 years, said it was the first time that a bowler in his program has scored a 900. "I've had people shoot two 300s in no-tap [in a series], but never three," Eisenberg said. "Every ball was in the pocket. It was pretty remarkable."

Justin said he hopes to turn professional one day and join the Professional Bowlers Assn. tour. "I've come this far," Justin said. "Why stop?"

# Love on the Lanes Fresno-Style

FRESNO – It’s happened again.

Another California bowling couple is tying the knot and they’re in the same top-echelon mold as last-year newly-weds Michelle Silver and Jim Harvey of Los Angeles.

This time it’s Danielle Davis and Steve Johnson of Fresno, who announced their engagement in early April and plan to marry in September in Las Vegas.

One week before they got engaged, Davis, 34, and Johnson, 46, teamed up to claim the first-place prize of \$540 in a handicap doubles tournament at Valley Bowl in Madera. That shouldn’t come as a huge surprise because Davis averages 219 and Johnson 224. Johnson also holds the Valley Bowl series record with a blockbuster 858 (290, 299, 269).

The two met three years ago on the day that Valley Bowl presented Johnson with his commemorative 800 series ring.

“I was new to the area and he was bowling next to me [in a tournament] and I asked if that was a 300 ring,” Davis recalled.

That apparently was the wrong thing to ask.

Johnson said that he informed Davis that his ring wasn’t

based on a run-of-the-mill 300, but it was a reward for his elite-level 858. “She got her head kind of ripped off,” Johnson said with a laugh. “I can be kind of gruff.”

They can now laugh at that incident because they’ve become each other’s best friend. Both express considerable admiration for the other.

“What Danielle gets from me is immediate respect as a bowler,” said Johnson, who serves as Davis’ coach. “I know what it takes to be at that level. You don’t get to be a 220 bowler in a year. It takes a long-term commitment. You don’t average 220 by accepting failure.

“The biggest thing that attracted me to her is when she missed a 10 pin, she would get mad. I do the same thing. She doesn’t accept failure. You’re supposed to get upset at failure. I think we have a tremendous respect for each other.”

Davis, who competed twice on last year’s Professional Women’s Bowlers Assn. Tour, freely gives credit to her fiancée when she ticks off the three guidelines she follows when she bowls: “Live in the pocket, pick up your spares, make good shots.”

The two say it’s natural that bowlers make good part-

ners because the sport provides an interest – or in Johnson’s and Davis’ case – a passion that makes for an extremely tight bond.

This connection is so special that they admitted their first inclination was to have their wedding at Valley Bowl.

“But once we started talking Vegas,” Johnson said, “we liked that idea.”

Don’t be surprised if they go bowling on their honeymoon, though.

this Mecca of bowling would be around for 100 years. Well, Del Rosa won’t make it to 100 but can celebrate about sixty years of glory.

When word began to circulate last week that Del Rosa would be closing in mid June everyone in the area was in shock. How could this be happening when the “NEW DEL ROSA LANES” was doing so well under the superb management of RON SANDUSKY? The answer is the land. The lanes are sitting on land not owned by the bowling operators. The existence of the lanes was always precarious because of the land situation. So the word on the street is that San Bernardino County bought the land to build a larger Employment Office in the area.

Over the years Del Rosa has hosted numerous tournaments and colorful characters. The house was a regular stop for the PBA, ABT, Citrus Belt, JBT, NABI, SST and WCST to name the most notable organizations who came in the doors through the years. I will never forget seeing PATRICK ALLEN win tight matches over TONY REYES, DAVE D’ENTREMONT and DAVE WODKA for a PBA Regional title a few years ago. Some of my other Del Rosa “moments” would include watching VINCE WOOD winning his fourth Citrus Belt Masters, a young WESLEY LOW rolling 300 and DOROTHY INGRAM celebrating her 100th birthday on the lanes.

Some of the most colorful characters who ever bowled walked through Del Rosa’s doors. Corky, Goldie, Nails, Bobby, Mary, Lee and Phosie are all part of that colorful history. I will never forget Goldie’s gold knee socks or how Bobby (Campagnale) bowled 879 one week and Dave (Wodka) re-wrote the house record book the next week with a 890! I still wonder how “Nails” could bowl with her four inch fingernails? Local bowling will never be the same without Del Rosa Lanes.

by the KingPins’ Scott Norton, Pete Weber and Kent, 256-178, over Dallas’ Tommy Jones, Shawn Maldonado and BJ Moore. With a 2-1 edge in the one-point preliminary matches, all signs pointed to the KingPins regaining the Cup they won in the PBA League’s first season in 2013.

With the three-point Baker team match yet to come, Duke took himself out of the anchor position, inserted Jones in that role, and made the call for his team to finish the contest on the right lane that had served the team well in its previous matches. But things didn’t go as expected. Duke started the game on the left lane with a 4-10 split and an open frame, and then the team moved to the right lane, Duke left a 7-10 split and opened again.

In the meantime, O’Neill, Maldonado and Moore put together a string of three strikes on the elusive left lane while NYC struggled on the right, falling into a 19-pin hole. Duke’s second split brought the KingPins back to within 10 pins, but New York City didn’t get a double until the 10th frame. Maldonado and Moore – two young power players Duke landed in a trade with the Shipyard Brewing Portland Lumberjacks for proven stars Liz Johnson and Ryan Ciminelli – both made key shots to help Dallas secure its lead. Jones locked up the Elias Cup with three strikes in the 10th frame for a 204-180 team win.

“I’m glad we put it back in Tommy’s hands because I was the weakest link that last game,” Duke said. “I put the rock in the right person’s hand at the right time, and he delivered every single time.”

Winning the Cup, however, was the result of key contributions by each team member at a critical juncture, Duke added.

“Sometimes it was me, sometimes it was Bill O’Neill. Maldonado was stellar. And BJ Moore?” Duke asked. “People don’t realize what he just did. He’d never bowled on television, and he just walked up there, every single time, like it was nothing. He reminded me of me when I was a kid.

“Whatever we needed to do, we did it as a team,” he continued. “It was so good.”

There was little question, however, that Jones was the correct choice as the Mark Roth Most Valuable Player in the Elias Cup competition.

“Anytime you win something with Mark Roth’s name on it, is special,” Jones said after Roth presented him with the trophy. “I grew up idolizing Mark, and having the chance to get to know him a bit over the years has been amazing. To have a trophy I can put in my trophy case with his name on it – there’s nothing like it.”

At the conclusion of the PBA League competition, PBA CEO and Commissioner Tom Clark, along with Bayside Bowl proprietor Charlie Mitchell, announced the PBA League will return to Portland and an expanded, re-designed Bayside Bowl for the fifth annual PBA League Elias Cup competition in 2017.

Los Altos Trophy Take The Round In A Rolloff, Tahvildaran Is Perfect

DOWNEY — The Brunswick Invitational finished out the 7th and final week of the Wild Round on the high-scoring house shot with two teams still alive for a chance at the round. Los Altos will be the 5th seed in the rolloffs while Linder’s Insurance has a 3-point lead for the wildcard spot with one week to go.

The other match that had implications in the wild-card race was 5th place J.A.T. taking on 6th place Ketel One Vodka. Ketel One trailed wild-card leaders Linder’s by 3 points and 2nd place wild-card team Los Altos Trophy by 2.5 points. J.A.T. had the chance to put a damper on Ketel One chance in the wild-card hunt if they could beat the high-powered team on the house condition. Ketel One came out strong but J.A.T. put together a big 969 effort in Game 2 which was enough to take three leaving Ketel One with two points in the wildcard race. Katrina Fujikami led the pair for J.A.T. with a big 740 set while Eddie VanDaniker led Ketel with a 720 set followed close by Sol Cericos 712. After the “A” match rolloff Ketel One sits 3 points back in the wildcard race which will be decided next week in a match with Linder’s Insurance.

Other scoring highlights included Sysco taking 4 led by Paul Barraco 733 over Pino’s Pizza led by Chris Equilos 710. Threadworks taking 4 over Wowo’s with Eric Snow’s 690 and Brandon Kraye’s 688 high for their teams. Erickson Foods swept past Relax-Repeat-Release with Raul Rosales pacing Erickson with a 710 and Triple-R led by Brian Gonzales 651. Forest Lanes took 4 from Herzog with Jon Diso’s 685 high for Forest and Kevin Gagnon pacing Herzog at 648. Alhambra Coin Center went huge at 2870 to take 4 from Keystone led by Doug Kempt 772 and Mike Mellick 740 while sub Andrew Delgado paced Keystone with a nice 697 set. Cremation Centers finished up the round nice with a sweep over GJC Janitorial. Nacho Vega paced CCC with 677 while Ryan Hinchliffe’s 666 was high for GJC.

In the roll-off bound team matched, Professional Approach has already locked up the top seed so it was DV8 at 97 points looking to lock up the second seed by taking one point from Cook’s Bowling Supply who were trying to close the five-point gap. Don Julio Tequila would be bowling against Cook’s scores also (due to league rules taking a locked team out) trying to make up ground and move up to the 3rd spot trailing Cook’s only by ½ point. At the end of the night, DV8 locks up the 3rd seed with a sweep led by Ashkan Tahvildaran’s 300-765 set. Don Julio Tequila jumped over Cook’s with a sweep over their scores to move to 96.5 points and a 4.5 point cushion with 5 up for grabs next week. The battle for the 3rd and 4th seeds will be fierce next week on the long oil.

Sidepots went to Mike Mellick 269 and Ashkan Tahvildaran 300 for \$72 each. Second game Financial Advisor’s pot went to Ashkan Tahvildaran 300 for \$220 and second to Doug Kempt 279 for \$100. Third game SuperPot went to Jon Diso 275 for \$216.

One week to go as teams battle next week on the long 47’ pattern for the last wildcard spot in the rolloffs. Come on down to Del Rio at 8:30 Monday and see Southern California’s best scratch league in action!
