Until I hear otherwise, Earline will be considered our record holder. This was Earline’s first perfect game and led to a solid 671 series.

Her previous high game was 289. She has three 700s with a high somewhere north of 720. To make Citrus Belt history, Earline used a Rogue Cell.

As usual, PAUL GOMEZ was there cheering her on. Paul is Earline’s significant other and biggest supporter. They are teammates at Canyon Lanes and Empire Bowl in Redlands. They are always

together and enjoy bowling, traveling, and dining out with each other. Earline loves competing in tournaments. She bowls in most Citrus Belt tournaments and is a regular at the USBC Open and Women’s tournaments. In fact, as I write, she is in Reno bowling.

For a good part of this season our record setter was averaging above 190. Quite an accomplishment for any woman. Her current average is 187 but would be higher if it weren’t for that darn 10 pin. Earline hates the 10 pin. In fact, the name of the team she captains at Empire Bowl is named “I HATE 10 PINS.” She named the team because of the hard time the 10 pin gives her. By the way, I am on Earline’s team and I hate the 10 pin.

While Earline is a super senior (she gave me permission to tell you), I believe she has the talent to average 200. However, she will do so only “IF” she comes to love the 10 pin.

CALIFORNIA YOUTH COMMITTEE AWARDS \$500 SCHOLARSHIPS

NORWALK — The California USBC Association has the CALIFORNIA YOUTH COMMITTEE (CYC) run the youth event portions of the state. The committee consists of 18 members, 8 of whom serve on the USBC California Association.

This committee continues to service the youth bowlers of California by organizing the youth state championships, state scratch tournament and the Pepsi Youth Championships as well as many youth awards and scholarships. Applicants must be youth members of the California USBC Association.

Scholarships may be awarded each year, but not necessarily every year and will be awarded only once to a recipient in a division. Points are graded for both academic and

bowling participation. Award is newable up to four years.

After much review of the applicants for our 2014 \$500 Scholarships, the committee

has selected two youth bowlers who met our expectations in their qualifications for this award. In the female category, **Morgan E. Cunneen** of Vista, is a 17-year old certified youth league member at AMF Eagle Lanes, in San Marcos.

Over a four year span, Cunneen has maintained a 100% participation in league attendance. She has participated in Local and State Championship Tournaments, is a Local Association Officer/Director; a member of her Local Association Youth Leader/Youth Committee; and during the six years of league play, an Officer/Director; as well as a Youth Leader at the League Level. Over the past three years Cunneen has managed to increase her skills to average 148; recording high games/series 201/507, 203/515, and 213/520.

Cunneen who lived in Germany and speaks fluent German is in her senior year at Mission Vista High School in Oceanside. She is considered by her Instructors as a model student in that she is self-disciplined, articulate, has strong character and shows great maturity in being polite, and treats classmates with respect.

She in turn, is afforded respect. To date, she earns straight A’s, in all her classes; maintains a GPA of 4.40; and is ranked 4th in her class of 260 students. Cunneen has been a member of the California Scholarship Federation

since 2012, a member of the Mission Vista High School Key Club and Interact Club and off campus activities include Aegs Living/Dance at Shadowridge, Vista Library Service Learner and Rotary Club/YMCA Annual Holiday Dinner. Cunneen is currently taking Advanced Placement Environmental Science classes to familiarize herself with the content of that area of study in two of the two universities she has her eye on... UC Berkeley and UC Davis.

In the male category, **Charles J. Sandfer**, age 19 of Twentynine Palms is a graduate from Twentynine Palms High School where he was highly regarded by his teachers. Sandfer was one of the original students in the school’s AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) program, where he was training to become a Tutor.

He expressed his willingness to work in groups and did it with a good predisposition making sure to take care of his responsibilities within the group at all times. During his four years at T.P.H.S., Sandfer participated as a member of the Interact Club, a community-based club. In his Senior Year, because of his high intellectual ability and responsible attitude, Sandfer began working as a Tutor for the Avid Class, where he always excelled by being firm and patient with the AVID students, showing his

Hero Noda Named 2014 Luby Hall of Fame Recipient

NORWALK — The International Bowling Media Association (IBMA) announced Hero Noda, Ibaraki, Japan, as their 2014 recipient of the Luby Hall of Fame Award.

The award is presented annually by the IBMA “to an individual who has made a distinguished contribution to print, broadcast, telecast or photographic coverage of bowling over an extended period of years.”

Mr. Noda is best known as a “volunteer fixture” at International Bowl Expo and the mid-winter Bowling Summit where he takes thousands of photographs of the events as well as of many international tournaments. A proprietor himself, Mr. Noda’s photo journalistic work has been seen in publications and on websites all over the world as well as on display on many walls and desks in homes and offices of industry partners. He generously shares his photos with a number of international publications and is a great ambassador not only for bowling, but also in chronicling bowling’s continuing history.

“I can think of no better individual who fits the criteria for this award than Mr. Noda”,



said Joan Romeo, president of the IBMA. “For many, many years he has given hundreds of hours of his time to record the history of bowling on an international scale. He is certainly most deserving of this honor.”

In 2013, Noda was recognized by the Bowling Proprietors’ Association of America (BPAA) with its V.A. Wapensky award “presented to an individual who has made a major contribution to the advancement of the bowling industry. The award is named after long-time BPAA Executive Director, V.A. ‘Chief’ Wapensky.”

Noda will be recognized during the special awards luncheon at International Bowl Expo, Tuesday, June 24, at the Rosen Shingle Creek Resort in Orlando, Florida.

NATIONAL DEAF BOWLING NEWS

FLORES' 267-856 TOPS DEAF TRAVEL AT AMF CERRITOS LANES EAGLE ROCK DEFEATS ANAHEIM IN SEASON FINALE FOR LEAGUE TITLE

CERRITOS — In Southern California Deaf Traveling League’s 54th season final position round Sunday at AMF Cerritos Lanes, much attention was focused on the title match between top two teams, Mark Fisser’s leading Anaheim and Bob Jones’ 2nd place Eagle Rock. Previously Eagle Rock had been leading most of the season while Anaheim began slowly creeping up and took over first place by 4 points last week.

In this trio league’s 20 match points system, one point for each match won, one point for each series won, one point for each team game won and one point for team series won, Anaheim had to win 9 points to shut Eagle Rock out. But Eagle Rock fought hard with Bob Taylor’s 211 help taking first game 3-1 while Fisser’s 215 beat Jones’ 196 for Anaheim’s lone point. Then Eagle Rock swept 2nd game 4-0 for 7-1 lead with Jones’ 209 beating Fisser’s 201.

The 3rd game went to Eagle Rock 2.5-1.5 when Fisser and Jones were tied with 191splitting their point and Jim Mohr helping Anaheim with his point while Connie Marchione’s winning 172 gave Eagle Rock the team game point. But Anaheim rallied in 4th game for 3-1 with both Fisser’s and Mohr’s winning 200 and 176 respectively for Anaheim’s team game point while Marchione’s 188 was the lone Eagle Rock’s point. At the end of 4 games Eagle Rock is the League Champion by one point. With the series points counted Eagle Rock 3-1, Fisser’s 807 as Anaheim’s lone point, the total is Eagle Rock 13.5 to Anaheim 6.5.

While all attention was on the team title finals, Dan Flores led the final season honor roll with a closing 267 for 856. His other games were 215-187-187. Flores’ opponent was Leroy MacMonagle who hit 812 with 199-236-182-194. Fisser’s 807 (215-201-191-200) was the third 800. Others on the list were Jeff Stansell 149-223-187-208/772, Bob Jones 196-209-191-163/759, Gorman Low 170-195-188-192/745 and Bob Taylor 211.

The only change in the league standings was Eagle Rock back in first as the league champion and Anaheim in 2nd place three points behind. Third place Low’s Riverside beat 4th place Stansell’s Mid City 14-6 and remained in their positions. Finally last place MacMonagle’s Orange County burst out 15-5 over Flores’ S F Valley but that was not enough to change positions.

The league thanks AMF Cerritos Lanes management and staff for hosting. The league’s season ending Sweepstakes will be at Riverside Lanes in Riverside on May 18 at 1 PM. Riverside Lanes is chosen because it is the venue of the coming 76th annual Pacific Coast Deaf Bowling Association Memorial Day week-end tournament.

BOB JONES ROLLED 652 IN SINGLES AT USBC OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP IN RENO

RENO — Bob Jones missed bowling in So. Calif. Deaf Traveling league last April 27 at Canoga Park Bowl because he was asked to sub for a team in USBC Open Championship at Reno. He always wanted to bowl in that tournament and when an opportunity like that came he grabbed it.

There at Reno’s showplace National Bowling Stadium Jones did not do well in the team event with 174-182-197 for 553. On the next day in the Doubles and Singles events, he did better with 182-194-211 for 587 in doubles and 223-226-203 for 652 in singles. (I am sorry I did not ask him who was his doubles partner because Jones received a printed Certificate of Achievement for high doubles game in 450-475 games class.)

This was Jones’ second debut in USBC Open Championship. His first one was during ABC’s 100th anniversary with a squad of deaf bowlers I assisted Don Warnick of Denver in organizing.

More about Bob Jones, a week before he left for Reno, Jones rolled a 300 and a 788 series in his Monday night league at Harley’s Simi Valley Bowl. That was this third 300 there in less than a year and his career 5th perfect.

The Perfect Game

It is based on a true story and is titled:

THE LEGEND OF “NO-STRIKES” WALDO

Bowlers have a simple method for storing fond memories. Some call it, “cluttering up the attic.” At my wife’s sincere urging, I was in the process of rearranging my memories when I came across an old bowling bag. Now dusty and cracked, it appeared to be worthy of nothing more than taking up space in a landfill. I opened it for one last time.

Appearances are deceiving. Old bowling bags are not garbage; they are precious time capsules. As I looked inside, I noticed dog-ears of yellow paper jutting from one of the storage pockets. For decades they had waited patiently to be rediscovered. I pulled them free. They were carbon-copies of the score sheets from my first state tournament. The year was 1973 and the handwritten names were still clearly visible: Bob, Larry, John, Joe, Steve.

For college-aged kids, state tournaments are fun and exciting adventures..... unless you’re John! He was large, uncoordinated, and spoke with a lisp. He was just naturally funny, like Jay Leno. His personality was summed up by his nick-name, “Waldo”. His greatest strength as a teammate was attitude. No matter how bad a night he was having, he never got angry. He would just smile, shrug his shoulders and say, “Oh well, that thucked.” Bowling was just more fun when Waldo was around. Waldo’s bowling skills were mediocre but reliable (he averaged 173). His gait to the foul line was a waddle and his shot was a slight back-up ball aimed at the second arrow. What he lacked in power he made up for with accuracy. He rarely missed the head pin and generally made his spares. As a team we all felt that if any one of us was going to get hot, it would be Waldo.

Those yellow papers made the memories come flooding back like they had happened just yesterday. We began bowling “Singles” at 9 AM on Saturday morning. Conditions were slick. John’s first ball hit the pocket but resulted in a 5-7 split. “That thuckth.” was all he said. The rest of his game consisted of two more splits, five spares, and two open frames. He had missed the pocket only once and hadn’t registered a strike. Game = 134. “Don’t worry. You’re just getting warmed up.” I said to him. The second game was worse. Four splits, three spares, three opens and again, no strikes. Score = 118. He hadn’t missed the pocket! His smile was beginning to fade. “Shake it off, Waldo.” team captain Bob said.

Game three was better. One split, seven spares, two opens (one in the tenth frame) = 149. He missed the pocket twice. I remember Bob stating, “Man! That’s the worst case of snake-bite* I’ve ever seen!” Larry tried to cheer him up, proclaiming, “We’ll kill ‘em in doubles!” Poor Larry! At 3 PM he was paired with his long-time friend as “Doubles” began. He “shot the lights out.” A 175 average bowler, he tallied games of 198, 254 and 238. They would have “cashed” had Waldo merely hit his average, but instead, sharks had joined forces with the snakes and he didn’t even break 400. In six games, despite rocking the pocket repeatedly, he still had not registered a single “X”! He was beginning to look like a whipped puppy.

At dinner that night, Waldo hung his head and apologized for letting his buddy down. Then he announced that we should find a replacement for him in tomorrow’s team event. “We’re a team! If you’re not bowling, neither am I!” declared Joe. We all agreed! “But I thuck!” Waldo protested. “I feel like I’m gonna ruin thith for all of you.” Larry broke the silence saying, “Dude, if any one of us is due to get hot, it’s you!” With that, the issue was settled. His smile returned!

Because we had a long drive home, Bob had again scheduled us to bowl the team event early. On any planet, that’s a bad idea. Kids aren’t at their best early in the morning. We were up at 6 AM to check out of the hotel by 7:30. We rushed to have a quick breakfast and get registered by 8:30.

At 9 AM the first practice shots were rolled. Larry started getting silly before the first game even began. He joked, “Hey Waldo, don’t you dare throw a strike here!” Unintentionally, Waldo obliged. His first four frames were splits! His trademark smile disappeared immediately. By the end of the first game, Waldo was walking like he was carrying a 50 lb. bag of cement on his back.

By the end of game two, his walk had deteriorated into a slow shuffle with his arms hanging at his sides. He was obviously out of gas. He had thrown a lot of shots and still had a game to go. “Thith thuckth.....” was all he could say. Who could blame him? Eight games, zero strikes! “Just one more game and you’ll be “NO-STRIKES WALDO!” Larry announced with an impish grin. Sometimes we all just wanted to kick Larry in the pants. This was one of those times!

There were a lot of ways to describe Waldo, but “quitter” wasn’t one of them. In the last game he continued his relentless assault on the pocket: 9/, 8/, 9-, 9/, 8 (split)-1, 7-2, 8/, 9/, X..... WHAT!

Nobody on our team saw it happen, but there it was! The old yellow sheet of paper still bore the evidence that the curse had been broken! It hadn’t been pretty. The ball had barely touched the head pin when the law-of-averages finally worked for Waldo! We had all looked away thinking his shot had left a ten pin standing with several more pins lying on the deck. The sweep came down, obstructing the view of one that was still rolling. That slow-roller made contact with the ten pin, causing it to fall just an instant before the pinsetter would have touched it.

Only the scorekeeper witnessed the event, but Waldo didn’t care! When he turned and saw that all ten pins were missing, he grinned from ear-to-ear, lifted both arms and shouted, “YEAH!!! TAKE THAT!!!” You would have thought he’d just won the tournament! He finished the game with 8/, 9. Defiantly pointing at the pins, Waldo yelled, “You just wait until next year!”

AFTER WORD

“Next year” never came. Bob moved to Chicago and Joe moved to Pittsburg. Larry lost a finger to a punch-press and Waldo joined the Merchant Marine (we suspect it was to get as far away from bowling alleys as possible). As for me, I was never heard from again. Rumors continue to circulate that I may be living in a broom closet somewhere in California:)

willingness to help them in any way possible. Following his graduation from T.P.H.S. in 2012, Sandfer enrolled in Copper Mountain College in Joshua Tree and seeks his degree in General Education. Although he continued to tutor for the AVID program, on a paid basis, Sandfer has maintained excellent grades. He reached the highest academic honor at C.M.C. making the President’s List in (Fall) 2012; (Spring) 2013 and Honor’s List (Fall) 2013.

Sandfer is a certified USBC youth member of the Citrus Belt USBC Association and has for 12 years participated in the youth program at Bowlum Lanes in Montclair. He is a 167 average bowler, recording a 610 high series; has bowled three State Championship Tournaments and twelve Local Association Championship Tournaments and from 2009 through 2012 maintained a 100% attendance record at league play.

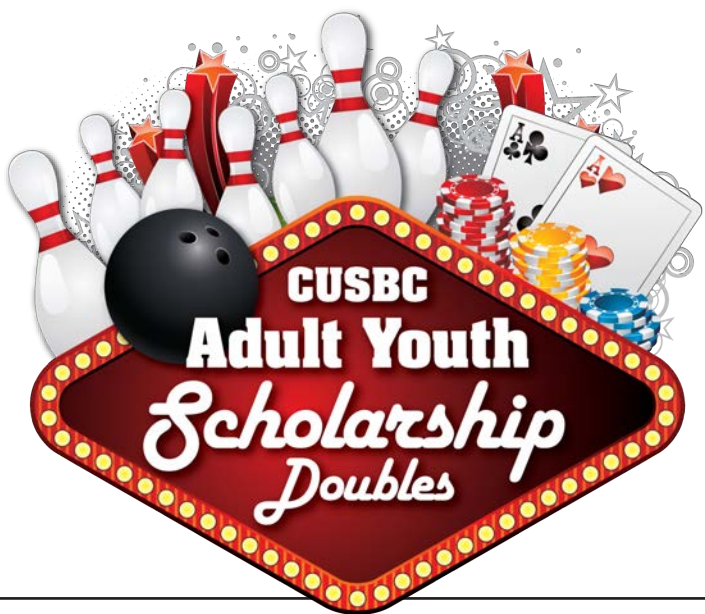

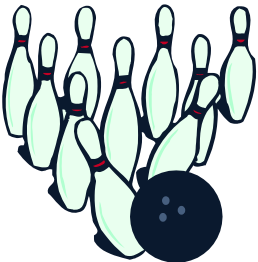

Bowling instructors have been around as long as bowling, at least in one form or another.

In the early days the coach was the bowler who started the day before or the desk man or woman who was on duty when a casual bowler was looking for all the help they could get.

For too many years bowling advertised itself as the game to play because everyone could do it. So bowling lost many possible lifetime keggers because when they started to bowl they were not very successful.

Over the many years of the books I have written, instruction was the subject starting with Guide To Better Bowling, featuring tips from bowling's best pros. I then penned or co-wrote tomes involving coaching of men, women or children. Every magazine in bowling made coaching a constant feature because the demand was always there.

I have witnessed most of the great bowling coaches in action with individuals, with teams, at tournaments, so I will mention only a few names.

One was a gentleman named Angelo Vicari. He specialized in beginners, and he would bring a look of satisfaction to a student even when the learner tossed the ball into the gutter, channel if you prefer.

"See that, before you were rolling the ball into the gutter only a few feet from the foul line. Now you are keeping the ball on the lane more than half way down the lane before it goes out of play."

The late John Jowdy was an icon in coaching the pros, including many of the world's greatest. After a pro tournament session ended, usually after 11 p.m. there would be a line to receive a coaching look see from Jowdy.

One of my coaching favorites with a unique approach was Chief Haftown, a native American who hosted his own TV show, and also a top bowler, but was a marvel in coaching youngsters. Dressed in his full color regalia, beautiful feathered head dress, he would then relate some interesting Indian lore before and throughout his lessons to the youngsters.

Coaches not only must know bowling, today an in depth know how in lane conditioning and equipment are essential. Bowling balls are weapons in the battle of scoring but only a good coach can bring out the best.

And what about those dots and arrows and different colored lane markings and how best they can be utilized. A coach can see a lot of the little things, including such as bowling accessory items.

Some bowling centers don't have the space for bowling pro shops, but should have a coach their bowlers could reach if requested — and they need not be top bowlers themselves.

With the rise in international bowling and no finger styles in vogue and the general rise in high scores coaches become more and more important in the sport.

All groups in bowling see the value good coaching can have in creating and keeping bowlers.

Every golf course has playing and teaching pros. Every bowling center may some day have an association with a coach. It is good for both — and the sport.

PIN POINTS TO PONDER

High average trends make sandbaggers, those who keep their averages down purposely to gain advantage in handicap pins, even more dangerous. Legitimate bowlers have higher averages, the cheaters keep low, thus gaining an even larger spread in handicap events, often too loose in rules and in checking every prize winner.

What did Dick Agee, Luke Barlow, Charles Farmer, Jackie Hall, Bob Kwolek, Milt Molhusen, John Powell Jr. and Lewis Ray, all fine bowlers, have in common?
