And cooperation among the integers of bowling abounds. As an example, Jeff Boje, a proprietor, has been elected president of the United States Bowling Congress. Cross my heart and hope to die!

Instead of bowling centers closing, new ones are going up around the country. Also, it's great to see that the professional women bowlers are back in action.

Kelly Kulick, arguably the best of the best, won the recent USBC Queens. And Liz Johnson captured the revitalized Ladies & Legends, a popular tournament featuring contestants from the PBA Senior Tour and the PWBA (Professional Women's Bowling Assn.).

Meanwhile, the USBC has been doing a fine job with its Ambassador Program, which features the likes of Kim Terrell, Carolyn Dorin-Ballard, Diandra Asbaty and Chris Barnes. Terrell is also involved with boosting collegiate bowling, while Dorin-Ballard is doing the same with high school bowling.

It's all good. I'm telling you, the signs are everywhere.

It's happy birthday (June 5) for Robin Romeo. That's when the USBC Hall of Famer from Newhall, Calif., becomes eligible to join AARP. Yep, Robin is about to hit the Big Five-Oh.

But don't get me wrong. Robin is in great physical shape as she loves to work out. She's still an excellent bowler, too, which she proved recently by making the cut in both the USBC Queens and the Ladies & Legends

There's one nice thing about turning 50. Robin will be eligible to enter Jeanette Robinson's annual National Golden Ladies Classic next March 3-6 at The Orleans in Las Vegas.

More good news: It was announced recently that Robin was elected to the National Italian American Sports Hall of Fame. She will be inducted on the weekend of Nov. 2 in Chicago.

Joan Romeo, Robin's mother, says she's proud of her daughter because "I think Robin is the first woman bowler—and the fourth bowler overall—to be chosen for this honor. At the present time, the other three bowlers are Andy Varipapa, Carmen Salvino and Johnny Petraglia.

"I'm also really proud of Robin for being recognized by an organization outside of the bowling world," Joan said.

Joan added that Robin is now a member of seven Halls of Fame. In addition to the USBC and the National Italian American Sports HoF, the others are the PWBA, CWBA (California Women's Bowling Assn.), WASA (Women's All-Star Assn.), San Fernando Valley, and the SoCal Bowling Writers.

Speaking of Hall of Famers, did you see where Virginia Norton placed second in the 2007 USBC Senior Queens tournament? The Cypress (Calif.) right-hander was the top seed in the finals, only to see Florida's Lucy Sandelin come out of the consolation bracket and defeat Norton twice to claim the title.

Norton said, "Lucy bowled very well all tournament and certainly out-bowled me in the finals. The lane conditions were challenging and making spares was critical. I never bowled a (3-game) set over 600 during the match play, and there were very few by anyone else, either.

"Lucy had at least two 700 sets, so she definitely had the best shot on those lane conditions," said Norton, who made it clear she was not blaming the conditions for her loss.



BOWLING HOLDS ITS OWN IN 2006 PARTICIPATION

Once-a-year numbers up, twice or more down slightly in surveys

GREENDALE, Wis. - The number of people who went bowling at least once in 2006 increased while participation at least twice last year dropped very slightly according to the results of two annual

The Simmons Market Research Bureau's National Consumer Study showed there to be 66,279,000 people age 6 and older who bowled in 2006. That's up 3.4 percent from the 64,048,000 in 2005.

The National Sporting Goods Association's annual Sports Participation survey found that 44.8 million people age 7 and older bowled more than once last year. That's down only 1.3 percent from the all-time record 45.3 million of 2005. The 44.8 million ties with 1997 for the second highest total since NSGA began charting sports in 1984. In the five-year period beginning in 2001, bowling participation rose 6.9 percent.

Bowling remained the No. 5 most popular sport in the latest NSGA survey. Exercise walking, which led for the 17th straight year, had 87.5 million participants. Swimming was second at 56.6 million, exercising with equipment was third with 52.4 million and vacation/overnite camping was fourth with 48.6 million.

The NSGA survey included 41 sports, only 10 of which had increased participation. Cross country had the biggest increase at 36.7 percent while ice hockey had the biggest drop of 20.8 percent.
