RENO-Despite an injured bicep that kept him off the lanes for nearly two weeks before his trip to the USBC Open Championships, David Wilk of Up land, Calif., battled through the discomfort and rolled the fourth 800 series of this year's event at the National Bowling Stadium.

The 54-year-old right-hander posted games 280, 245 and 279 on the way to an 804 series and second place in Regular Singles Wilk struck on 32 of 36 opportunities, with his only blemish along the way being a 4-9 split in the eighth frame of the second game. Chip Aki of Nicholasville, Ky., leads with 814
"Coming out here, I wasn' sure if I was going to have a good shot, and until the singles set, didn't," said Wilk, who made his 24th Open Championships ap pearance and had 653 in team and 579 in doubles for a 2,036 all-events total. "I went through all six of my balls trying to find something during team and shot a lucky 650, but never got a fee for what I was going to do to day. I had no ball reaction during doubles, but toward the end of the set I really started to feel nice and comfortable. Then I went to the next pair for singles and it was just there."

Once-a-year numbers up, twice or more down slightly in surveys

GREENDALE, Wis. - The number of people who went bowling at least once in 2006 increased while participation at least twice last year dropped very slightly according to the results of two annual urveys.
The Simmons Market Research Bureau's National Consumer Study showed there to be $66,279,000$ people age 6 and older who bowled in 2006. That's up 3.4 percent from the 64,048,000 in 2005. The National Sporting Goods Association's annual Sports Participation survey found that 44.8 million people age 7 and older bowled more than once last year. That's down only 1.3 percent from the all-time record 45.3 million of 2005. The 44.8 million ties with 1997 for the second highest total since NSGA began charting sports in 1984. In the five-year period beginning in 2001, bowling participation rose 6.9 percent.

Bowling remained the No. 5 most popular sport in the latest NSGA survey. Exercise walking, which led for the 17th straight year, had 87.5 million participants. Swimming was second at 56.6 million, exercising with equipment was third with 52.4 million and vacation/overnite camping was fourth with 48.6 million.

The NSGA survey included 41 sports, only 10 of which had increased participation. Cross country had the biggest increase at 36.7 percent while ice hockey had the biggest drop of 20.8 percent.
