ABTA Visits Foothill Lanes Saturday May 19th

Bob Learn Jr. Wins PBA Senior Mooresville Classic For First Senior Tour Title

Five-Time PBA Tour winner defeats Ron Profitt, 203-196, in championship match

MOORESVILLE, N.C. (May 9, 2012) – In only his third tournament on the Professional Bowlers Association Senior Tour, Bob Learn Jr. of Erie, Pa., won the PBA Senior Mooresville Classic presented by Columbia Wednesday for his first Senior Tour title.

Learn, who won five PBA Tour titles including the 1999 U.S. Open in a 15-year PBA Tour career, defeated Ron Profitt of Brookville, Ohio, 203-196, in the championship match at George Pappas Victory Lanes.

After starting the match with two strikes, Profitt ran into trouble early with a split and a washout in the third and fourth frames, respectively, which he failed to convert and was not able to recover from later in the match.

"When he threw the split and the washout it definitely changed the tone of the match," said the 50-year-old Learn. "Even though I didn't have a good look on the pair either, from that point on I was able to bowl just good enough to stay ahead of him."

In his two previous Senior Tour tournaments this season Learn finished ninth in both the Senior Sun Bowl In The Villages and Senior Don Carter Memorial Open.

"Third time's the charm I guess," said Learn. "I'm qualifying well but you have to get some breaks in the match play rounds and it kind of made up for some bad breaks I had in the first two tournaments."

Profitt was trying for his first win in seven seasons on the Senior Tour. He had a

long road to the championship match winning three best-of-five matches, a best-of-three match and the semifinal. His runnerup finish was a career best with fourth being his best previous finish.

In the semifinal matches, Learn defeated Mike Henry of Brunswick, Ohio, 201-189 and Profitt defeated last week's Senior Don Carter Memorial winner Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr., 248-206.

The next stop for the PBA Senior Tour will be the Senior Dayton Classic presented by Roto Grip May 14-17 at Capri Lanes in Kettering, Ohio. The tournament will be streamed live in its entirety on pba.com's online bowling channel Xtra Frame. For Xtra Frame subscription information visit

Las Vegas To Host Senior Masters

ARLINGTON, — The 2012 United States Bowling Congress Senior Masters, one of the sport's premier events for senior bowlers, will take place June 10-15 at South Point Bowling Center in Las Vegas.

The Senior Masters, which is part of the Professional Bowlers Association Senior Tour, will showcase about 300 of the top senior bowlers in the world competing for an estimated overall prize fund of \$125,000.

"It's great to be getting back to South Point," USBC Managing Director of Media and Events Pete Tredwell said. "Mike Monyak and his staff treated the bowlers very well in 2009 and 2010, and we look forward to another great event in 2012."

The 2012 event, which will be broadcast live on BowlTV, will have an increased first-place prize of \$16,000 and the winner also will receive a paid entry into the 2013 USBC Masters.

For bowlers age 60 and over competing in the event, there are special prize opportunities. The top 10 Super Seniors outside of the event's prize fund each will earn a special prize of \$500.

LAHABRA— We returned to La Habra “300” Lanes where we saw 167 entries come and bowl on a fairly easy shot. The cut scores on Saturday night were + 117 for the men and + 34 for the women. The Super Seniors added to the board (2 men and 1 female) were Bud Zagorski (104), Tom Dahl (103). For the women it was Barbara Bradley (1). Super Seniors are men 63 and over. For the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 44 bowlers making it to the semi-finals.

Our Top Qualifiers: for the Men was Allen Espino with a +201 and for the women it was Deborah Sanders with a +106. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Espino, our top seed drew for the Match Series. This time it was worth \$818. Allen drew a 405. We had no bowlers that bowled this score, so we will estimate the Match Series at \$1,300 at Foothill Lanes. The last bowlers for the 3-6-9 roll-off were Mark Andrews and Jiradej Harnpatanakitpanich, each will get \$25. The pot will be worth \$1,400 at Foothill Lanes.

Optional doubles; finishing in first were Jiradej Harnpatanakitpanich and William Garrett with a 1525 for \$130. Finishing in second was Jimmy Wong and Vuong Do with a 1518 for \$110. There was a total of \$1,370 paid out in doubles and 24 paid spots with low to cash of 1445.

The semifinals took the floor and the leader was “Fast Freddie” Catamisan with a +153. Finishing in 2nd during the semi-finals was Allen Espino at a +151. He sat out the first round of the top 16 Sin-

gle elim finals. Our top seed in semi-finals had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$1,920. Freddie drew a 299. Again, we had no bowlers who shot that score. We will estimate the pot at \$3,500 Saturday at Foothill Lanes.

This would bring us to our top 16 Match Play finals. In the first round, the seven losers were Bud Zagorski, Samson Kong, Yen Lach, Jiradej Harnpatanakitpanich, Aileen Cheung, James Alarcio, and Carlos Umana. They received checks of \$100 each. In the second round, the losers were Deborah Sanders, Javier Avilia, Vuong Do, and John Phan. They received checks of \$107.50 each. This would get us to down to the final four bowlers. Our weekly horses were paying a low of \$40 (Allen Espino or Victor Fabian) to a high of \$49 (D.A. Wright). In this round we saw Victor Fabian (9th seed) bowling D.A. Wright (4th seed). We would see a match where the scoring would be close. We saw D.A. pull out this match with a 213 to 202 final to send him onto the semi-final match. In the other match we saw Andrew Lung (14th seed) bowling Allen Espino (2nd seed). In this match, it would be Andrew who would continue his good bowling with a 238 to 228 finish to advance to the next round. Both Allen and Victor finished in 4th and 5th getting checks for \$115 each.

Our semi-final match was all set, and pit the 4th and 14th seeds from the semis against each other. In the weekly “horses” we would see Andrew paying \$45 and D.A. paying \$49 if they would win their match. In this match we

saw another very close match where the scoring was back and forth between the two bowlers. Andrew would start and jump to a big lead with an opening turkey, then opens in the 4th and 6th frames. The lead disappeared with D.A. coming thru with a 4 bagger between the 4th and 7th frames. But an open by D.A. in the 8th frame and another turkey by Andrew from the 7th thru 9th frames would be enough to send Andrew onto the title match with a 207/248 to 211/226 and advance to the title match. Finishing in 3rd place was D.A. Wright this week for \$200. For those lucky “investors” that had Andrew as a horse, he paid \$45.

The title game was set and it would be Andrew Lung against the top seed Freddie Catamisan. Freddie elected to start the match first. It would be Freddie who would start out hot with a double, while Andrew would start out with a strike but open in the 2nd and 3rd frames, missing the 7 pin on both shots. Freddie would struggle in the 3rd thru 6th frames with splits in the 3rd, 4th, and 5th frames. Andrew was able to come thru with a double in the 4th and 5th frames, and take a 27 pin lead. Andrew would get another double in the 7th and 8th frames, and not look back as he had a huge lead of 48 pins. He would go on to finish with a 193/234 to 168/196 and take home his 5th ABTA championship. He would take home \$1,000 for 1st place, \$850 in Cash and Carry, and \$100 for wearing an ABTA shirt for a total of \$1,950. Runner up and \$500 was Freddie Catamisan. Champion Andrew Lung is

Freddie Catamisan (2nd Place) is from Long Beach and used a Roto Grip drilled by ABTA Member Ben Mach at Westminster Lanes. He is married to Theresa and they have four children. He would like to thank Tres, Danny Eguilos, Kmel Cunanan, Marife, Faye, Rey, the ABTA and its staff. Freddie is a great Bowler and a greater guy!!

D.A. Wright (3rd Place) is from Palm Desert and used a Roto Star / Orizon drilled by Tim Albin. He is married to Gail and they have a son David who attends UCSB (Santa Barbara). He would like to thank his wife and son for their support, Bob Smith (his brother-in-law), and the ABTA and its staff.


