Milligan Take Top Spot For 2005 WIBC Queens Stepladder Finals Oklahoma Native, WIBC Hall of Famer Duggan Earns No. 2 Seed

TULSA, Okla.-The nerves finally came back Tuesday for Tennelle Milligan, Yorba Linda Calif. - and she welcomed them with open arms.
"If you don't have those nerves, something is wrong," said Milligan, who won the ProAssociation Players Championship and U.S. Open in 2000' 'I haven't had that feeling in a long time Getting those nerves back helps you bowl better.'
Milligan is in prime position to claim the third jewel of the Triple Crown - and in her eyes the most prestigious - as sh claimed the No. 1 position for he stepladder finals at the 200 Women's International Bowling Congress Queens Tournament presented by Reno Tri-Proper ties and participating sponsor Miller Lite, a United States Bowling Congress Event, a Riverlanes.
Milligan, who was a Team USA member in 1999, went 6-0 in the three-game, double-elimi nation format - including vic tories over Brenda Norman Stroudsburg, Pa and Jenn Ferguson, Anderson, Ind to se cure a spot in the stepladder finals. Milligan's 632-611 tri umph over recent WIBC Hall of Fame inductee and 1994 WIBC Queens shampion Anne Mar Queens champion Anne Marie Duggan, Edmond,

Kevin Gannon Rolls WCST Record Score and Wins the WCST Ebonite Singles Tournament at AMF Bowling Square in Arcadia. Lee Taylor Wins the Step-Ladder Finals For The Super Senior Division

ARCADIA-Kevin Gannon (Lakewood) from the very first game in the finals which was a 299 game, and a blistering WCST Record sore of 2579 score for the 10 games in the finals easily won his $19^{\text {in }}$ WCST Title to pass ABC-PBA Hall of Famer, Barry Ashe who now drops to $3^{\text {rid }}$ with 18 WCST Titles. Kevin is now only 4 Titles behind, Ross Packard, who has 23 Titles to lead the WCST in all time wins. Kevin qualified $7^{\text {th }}$ and started the finals 160 pins behind qualifying leader Jim Starks, who rolled 2432. Kevin won 9 matches and lost one. The only loss was to Gerry Chinn, who beat him 278 to 268 . Kevin's lowest game of the finals was 237 He averaged 242 for the qualifying and the finals. Jim Starks, who finished $2^{\text {nd }}$ rolled a 235 average for the tournament, and wasn't even close as Kevin won this tournament by 194 pins. The little giant is one tough customer. There were two other left handers in the finals besides Kevin, Gerry Chinn and the ageless wonder Doug ohnson. They finished $9^{\text {th }}$ and $10^{\text {th }}$. Doug led the first block of qualifying on Saturday, with plus 249 for the 10 games, and started out in $4^{\text {th }}$ place for the finals. 50 bowlers entered, with 37 Regular Division, and 13 super seniors.
