



TULSA, Okla.–The nerves finally came back Tuesday for Tennelle Milligan, Yorba Linda, Calif. — and she welcomed them with open arms.

"If you don't have those nerves, something is wrong," said Milligan, who won the Professional Women's Bowling Association Players Championship and U.S. Open in 2000. "I haven't had that feeling in a long time. Getting those nerves back helps you bowl better."

Milligan is in prime position to claim the third jewel of the Triple Crown — and in her eyes the most prestigious — as she claimed the No. 1 position for the stepladder finals at the 2005 Women's International Bowling Congress Queens Tournament, presented by Reno Tri-Properties and participating sponsor Miller Lite, a United States Bowling Congress Event, at Riverlanes.

Milligan, who was a Team USA member in 1999, went 6-0 in the three-game, double-elimination format — including victories over Brenda Norman, Stroudsburg, Pa., and Jenni Ferguson, Anderson, Ind., to secure a spot in the stepladder finals. Milligan's 632-611 triumph over recent WIBC Hall of Fame inductee and 1994 WIBC Queens champion Anne Marie Duggan, Edmond, Okla., clinched the top seed.

The tournament concludes Wednesday with the top five bowlers (four from the winners bracket and the contenders bracket champion) facing off in the stepladder finals at 7 p.m. CDT. The championship round will air June 6 at 11 p.m. EDT on ESPN2. Check your local listings to confirm date and time.

"Thankfully this was the latest I ever went into the contenders bracket of the Queens," Swanson said. "I was thankful that I met Michelle late instead of earlier. It was all or nothing after that."

From there, Swanson battled back to eliminate five-time Team USA member Lisa Noor, Mound, Minn., and defending WIBC Queens champion Marianne DiRupo, Succasunna, N.Y., before ousting Mitskavich.

The 253-player Queens field rolled five qualifying games Saturday and Sunday, after which the field was reduced to the top 63 players plus defending champion Marianne DiRupo, Succasunna, N.J. Starting Monday and continuing Tuesday, the remaining 64 athletes competed in three-game, double-elimination match play. The 2005 WIBC Queens, presented by Reno Tri-Properties and participating sponsor Miller Lite, features a prize fund of \$167,775. The winner will take home \$25,000 plus the Queens tiara, pendant and crystal trophy.

She was accepted on the ASU Boy's Bowling Team and looks forward to the school having a girl's team this coming season. She is averaging a 205 league average and striving to be All-American & Team USA during her collegiate career. She has recorded this past season two 279 games and a 708 and 717 series. She has an unsanctioned 300 game to her credit.

Her bowling accomplishments include 1st Place All Events Arizona State Tournament (2000); 1st Place in Singles A.S. Tournament (2001); 1st place All Events A.S. Tournament (2003); 1st Place All Events East Valley City Tournament & Singles Pepsi Cola Tournament (2005).

It is interesting to note here that although Savahna was able to attend our Dinner/Meeting to receive her award, she was to fly out the next morning at 6 AM to return to Mesa where she was scheduled to bowl a tournament. 

Rene bested a decent turnout of 184 bowlers (3 squads only) in the Special Event, which featured Dodie Sajonas, and Marty Nakunz sharing a \$2,480 Match game and newcomer Donald Thon got a \$234 Match Series pot

We weren't lacking excitement at Cal as Ronnie Lemons who is a Young 58:-) lit up the lanes with a 226-276-300/802 set. His highest to date. Ronnie will receive Awards from the ABTA for his fine bowling and this is the first 800 this year

They got checks of \$105 in 10-16th places. In round two, being eliminated were Ray Varela, Vic Hilvano, Ely Cruz, and Ronnie "300" Lemons. They cashed in 6-9th places and \$110 each.

Round three had Rene Vasquez finish strongly to edge Valinda Kelly 238-199. Greg Barron edged Fernando Alatorre 213-199. Valinda (my ABTA League team mate) and Fernando were 4th and 5th with great bowling at Cal. Greg and Rene to meet for the right to bowl Art Jones for the title.





The inaugural Kingpin Million Dollar Challenge. Sounds pretty impress sive. But what exactly is it?

It's a tournament guaranteeing \$1 million to the winner...who could be an amateur. Or a woman. The Kingpin Challenge, according to press releases, will be held Oct. 22-30 in Reno¹s newly-renovated National Bowling Stadium.

There are six divisions: 30 & Under, 31-40, 41-59, 60 & Older, one women's division, and an open division (for those who have bowled professionally in the past three years, excluding anyone winning a national title).

The entry fee is pretty stiff-\$695-however, you don't have to pay it all at once as a \$195 deposit will hold your spot. A lot of potential entrants will likely attempt to land a sponsor or sell personal shares to friends and relatives.

For more details, and the official tournament rules, you can log on to the following website: www.kingpinchallenge.com.

It wasn't long after news of the Kingpin Million Dollar Challenge was first announced that a question of vital interest was raised by inquisitive scribes, including this veteran ink-stained wretch: Will the Kingpin Challenge tournament actually be held, as advertised?

So Tenpin Slants decided to conduct an unscientific poll by asking the opinions of 10 prominent bowling personalities. Of those polled, all but two responded. Readers may be interested in the results. Those responding to the poll were (in alphabetical order):

Dick Evans (ABC and PBA Hall of Fame writer): I hope so. But I'm a doubting Thomas because of the guaranteed money (seven places in all). That's an awesome amount of money for any sporting event to guarantee, especially without a guaranteed great gate and big-time TV revenue. Hope I'm wrong

Frank Kietz (Bowling Writers Assn. of America Hall of Fame writer):No! I'd like to see the green first because I've been fooled too often. That's why I'm a skeptic. I'd feel better if the tournament was sanctioned. (Note: The United States Bowling Congress has since officially certified the Kingpin Million Dollar Challenge.)

John Jowdy (ABC and PBA Hall of Fame writer): I'm hoping the tournament is successful because Dave Husted (who's involved in conducting the event) is such a good friend of mine. Everyone in bowling should be supporting this tournament.

Frenchy Letourneau (Publisher of the Las Vegas *TenPin Alley*): I can't get excited about this one (the Kingpin Challenge). If it goes at all, no amateur will have any chance to make the first cut. As long as they (the tournament promoters) are allowing seasoned PBA regional and megabuck hotshots in the Open Division, the other divisions are the fodder to feed the prize fund, donate to the brackets, and fill rooms. Also, the totally obnoxious entry fee will attract only bowlers who routinely have success in big-money events. I'll be rooting for Terry Leong. And Missy Bellinder.

Andy Marzich (ABC and PBA Hall of Fame bowler): This (tournament) appears to be a win/win event for bowling. How can it not be? They (the promoters) are prepared to do it and I hope they succeed. Lest this be a scam, I hope the (prize) money is put in escrow. I think the naysayers will be

surprised. Put me down! I'll go! Virginia Norton (WIBC Hall of Fame bowler): I have my doubts, unless the people behind it are looking for a tax write-off! It would be great for the sport, and the time of year should work. I'll be interested to see how it develops

Chuck Pezzano (ABC and PBA Hall of Fame writer): Yes! The promoters have enough backing and sponsorship. They put on a nice presenta-tion at the BWAA Convention (in March at Baton Rouge). The tournament, however, needs better promoting. Look for late entries, as usual.

Dick Stoeffler (Controversial bowling columnist and a past recipient of the national Flowers for the Living Award): No! Because of the lack of publicity and the fact that there are no entry blanks in local bowling centers or in the bowling papers. Also, there's been a couple of so-called Million Dollar events in the past that wound up being cancelled—the Kegel Team Tournament in Florida and the Strike It Rich! Tournament some years ago in Southern California. I'll be interested to see what happens and, personally, I hope the tournament is a monster success.

After the ballots were counted-there were no hanging chads-the results showed a total of three nays, two yeas, two doubtfuls and one maybe. But that doesn't include the opinion of Tenpin Slants (even though no one asked me). I say that the Kingpin Million Dollar Challenge definitely

will be held. There are several reasons why: 1) Although the four promoters have never been involved in bowling,

they have a successful track record of having conducted successful majo attractions in the past.

2) The promoters, having invested heavily, are in too deep to pull out now. As an example, they've hired a first-class PR firm, The Larose Group (of San Mateo, Calif.). They've hired Joan Romeo, owner and president of The Marketing Team in Van Nuys, as a consultant. (Joan, of course, is the mother of WIBC Hall of Famer Robin Romeo.) And the promoters have hired Hall of Famer Dave Husted as Tournament Commissioner and popular Frank Ellenburg as Director of Operations. No one in bowling is respected more than Husted and Ellenburg, in this writer's opinion.

3) The Kingpin Challenge has been endorsed, not only by the USBC, but by the Reno-Sparks Convention & Visitors Bureau and Reno Tri-Properties Inc. (comprised of the Eldorado, Silver Legacy and Circus Circus). And I'd imagine that the proprietors and ball manufacturers will soon jump on the bandwagon.

4) The tournament finals will be shown by NBC-TV on Sunday, Nov. 13 at 2 p.m., EST. It would be a disaster for the world of bowling if this commitment were not kept.

5) And finally, the promoters undoubtedly welcome the challenge of staging a successful major bowling event. I'm sure they're dying to see how everything turns out...and if there will be a second Kingpin Million Dollar Challenge. And many more.

President Bill Huntington added, "This is an important meeting we will be taking final action to merge and become part fo the new United States Bowling Congress."

Then, in the last three tournaments of the year, Jaros appeared on two TV shows and earned more than \$110,000, most of it by winning the Dexter Tournament of Champions

Jaros, understandably, was elated by his first major victory and, on the TV show, he thanked everyone except the person who was responsible for his remarkable turnaround...John Jowdy

I'm pretty happy for Jaros, said Jowdy, widely recognized as one of the best coaches in the universe. He had been bowling pretty badly and was not on the exempt list when he got to the U.S. Open (in February). We had a great practice session together while we were in Connecticut and he started to bowl real well after that.

He certainly did...thanks to the generous help he received from Jowdy. Whereas Jowdy receives a hefty fee for private lessons and conducting bowling clinics, he never charges the professionals seeking his help. Jowdy has an uncanny ability to detect a bowler's fault in his delivery...and, just as important, how to correct it.

Addendum: Rowdy Jowdy, as he was known in San Antonio, celebrated his 85th birthday on April 21.

FINAL ITEM: Canoga Park Bowl, located in the heart of the San Fernando Valley, recently announced that its new Bowling Center Manager is Barry Gurney, a native Californian.

Gurney, a 15-year member of the PBA, has five Senior titles to his credit. The affable southpaw, voted the Southern California Bowler of the Year in 1995 and 1997, is a member of both the Los Angeles and SoCal Halls of Fame.


