# **Forest Donkeys Claim Fab 5 Title**

NORWALK - The Forest Donkeys ran away from the pack en route to claiming the championship of the Fab 5 finals Sunday at Keystone Lanes in Norwalk.

The Donkeys, Jessica Diso, Virgil Dunziellas, Robert Leahy, Brent Ilagan and Jon Diso were one of two teams that had qualified for the event out of Forest Lanes in the Orange County city of Lake Forest.

The Donkeys dominated from the outset. Averaging 191 entering the event, the Donkeys averaged over 200 in the preliminary round to secure the No. 1 seeding in the five-team stepladder finals.

The Donkeys, one of 16 teams entered in the tournament, breezed to a 207-146 victory in the championship game, earning the \$1,000 top prize.

Leahy provided one of the key shots of the championship game by rolling a strike in the eighth frame, which gave the Donkeys a double. "When he struck," said Jon Diso, "I knew it was over."

Although the Donkeys appeared to be a finely tuned by Fred Eisenhammer

machine, Diso said Sunday's event marked "the first time we had done anything together." Nor were the Donkeys veterans of the tournament circuit. "It was cool that our two 160 bowlers [Dunziellas and Leahy] were not tournament guys," he said.

A Baker format was used in the tournament by which each of the team's five players bowled two frames. The team's anchor, for instance,

bowled in frames five and 10. "Our goal in a format like that was not so much to strike

but to not open," Diso said. The Donkeys followed that plan to precision. The longest string of strikes during the day for the Donkeys was a mere four. But the team showed its ability to record a barrage of strikes and spares by blasting a 257 in its seventh game of the preliminary round.

The Donkeys had stated

And when the tournament was over, two members said they planned to follow that plan. "Sure, why not?" said a smiling Leahy. "I've got my [season] pass," Diso said.

The second-place team from Bowlium received \$700 and the third-place team from Pinz earned \$400.



# **LANCE POUND'S Ton of Strikes Carries Team to Championship**

MURRIETA — Every season bowlers come from everywhere within the Citrus Belt to compete in the top scratch league in our Association. Bowlers from Corona, Hemet, Moreno Valley, Norco, Riverside, San Bernardino, Temecula and all points in between trip to the southern Citrus Belt every Thursday night to compete against our best bowlers. Names like Barnes, Bowman, Freeman, Gagnon, Gulley, Hatmaker, Hawkins, Jenkins, LaRiviere, Lewen, Moser, Mojado, Peters, Murtishaw, Nilsen, Warning and West among others are there. Our best against our best.

After 34 exciting weeks of high scores, memorable match games and surprising outcomes everything came to a head last week on championship night. With a crowd of fifty spectators on hand the night got off to a rousing start when the TOP SEVEN teams participated in a playoff parade to the practice lanes. League Secretary SCOTT FILIPI briefed the bowlers on the league playoff rules and the competition began.

The championship would be decided by a step ladder format with each match decided by a teams total pins. The opening match featured the sixth and seventh seeded teams facing off with the winner moving on to bowl against the next highest seed. Each succeeding winner would do the same.

While most of the bowlers struggled throughout the first match RAY WINKOWSKI found a way to roll a big 245 and lead his H & E Equipment Services Team to a 606 - 598 victory over the trio of DeWaine West, Ski Szczawinski and Matt Murtishaw.

In the second step ladder match of the night Winkowski rolled his second big game of the night (247) and with the support of teammates Brandon and Steve Jenkins edged Jim Murtishaw's Fast Lane Pro Shop team by just eleven pins. Murtishaw's team lead going into the tenth frame but an undeserved 4-10 split open in the last frame led to a H & E victory.

The seventh seeded H & E team then moved on to face the fourth seeded Mad Meals team. Rowdy Houston led the Mad Meals trio to a comeback win after trailing by fifty pins in the fifth frame. Winkowski rolled a solid 248 but it wasn't enough. Mad Meals won the game 609 - 603. Winkowski's 740 (245 - 247 - 248) set was impressive on the dry condition. "POLISH POW-ER".

Mad Meals then faced the third seeded Temecula Chiropractic trio in the fourth match of the night. The Temecula team is arguably the best trio assembled in the southern Citrus Belt in years. With a lineup of Allen Freeman, Kelly Jones and Jim Barnes the "chiropractors" are lean, limber and flexible. They have no weaknesses. Most of the spectators I spoke to considered them the favorites to take home the first place \$6,000 payday. The favorites didn't disappoint. With games of 266 (Freeman) 268 (Jones) and 215 (Barnes) they cruised to a 158 pin win over Mad Meals, 749 - 591.


The semi-final pitted the "chiropractors" against the defending champion GULLEY brothers (Dave and Ken) and Bob Warning. The game was close to start but the Temecula trio finished with a flurry of strikes for a 678 - 606 win. Allen Freeman rolled a solid 247 to lead all bowlers.

The championship match was the best of the night and probably the best match in years. The match was decided by one pin on the last shot of the game by the "chiropractors" anchorman Jim Barnes. Barnes, the last bowler of the night, was up in the tenth frame needing a strike on his fill ball to tie the match. A tie score would have forced a full game roll-off. Jim rolled a great ball but left a an four pin. His teams 667 was one pin less than Team Lewen's (Jon's Movers) winning 668.



The top seeded and champion Jon's Movers team was lead by Lance Pound's 267 and Scott Everson's 205. Captain Jeff Lewen was a steadying influence throughout. Kelly Jones of the runner-up "chiropractors" was the high scorer of the night with games of 268 - 225 - 265 = 758.

Congratulations to our best southern tier bowlers for a great season and thanks to SCOTT and SHERRY FILIPI for being the best league secretaries in the area.







# The Perfect Game by Steve Felege

### THE STATE OF BOWLING

Part 6 of 6

A DISCUSSION WITH EDITOR/PUBLISHER CAROL MANCINI

Editor's note: Last week we discussed what can be done at the local level to increase bowling league membership. This week we'll discuss things that can be done at the national level.

Carol: There it is, Steve. What are your thoughts?

Steve: Bowling has been allowed to drop off the nation's radar screen. If you want more people to become interested in this sport, you must market it to them. The general population gets very little exposure to bowling on major media these days. A couple commercials featuring bowlers with high cholesterol or leaky bladders doesn't exactly get the job done.

Carol: I've seen those ads. They don't make me want to lace up my shoes and hit the lanes again.

Steve: Me neither. People in charge at the national level should address that. They should put some ads together showing bowling in a more positive light & run them when leagues are forming. Carol: That's expensive.

Steve: You have to spend money to make money.

Carol: That's true. What other ideas do you have?

Steve: Those in charge of such matters should reconnect with a major network to showcase the pros.

Carol: What's wrong with ESPN?

Steve: Two things. First, it's an audience limited to those who can afford it. Second, people who watch pro bowlers on ESPN already bowl. That's not an effective recruiting strategy. A major network would reach more people, even if it was only a once-a-month broadcast.

Carol: But the ratings don't justify coverage by a major network.

Steve: That's because bowling has become boring to watch. The new professional teams can fix that by changing their format.

Carol: How?

each pro rolls one frame on each alley until five pros have rolled one complete game......zzzzzzzzz. Competitively, that makes no sense. Bowling at the professional level is about mental acuity and toughness. Today's TV format doesn't take advantage of that. Don't get me wrong, it's good, but it can be much better.

Carol: How would you fix it?

Steve: By adding more action and drama. I would have five bowlers from each team competing simultaneously across ten lanes.

Carol: That would mean five head-to-head matches going on at the same time.

Steve: Right, A shot clock would be used to keep things moving. Each bowler would have 30 seconds to get a shot off once his lane becomes available; 20 seconds from the moment his ball returns to roll for a spare. There would be no waiting for a lane to be open on each side. That would test the pro's mental fortitude, and provide non-stop action for the viewers.

Carol: You could watch a single match....or several. I like that!

Steve: If a certain match becomes more interesting, it could be highlighted in a separate window. Those visuals, along with informed commentary, would keep the viewers riveted.

Carol: How would this format work?

Steve: Every match begins with a coin toss. The winning coach decides whether the team's players begin on the odd or even numbered lanes. Both coaches submit their initial lineup prior to the start of Game #1, so neither one will know who will be bowling against whom. At the end of game one, the players on the team which won the coin toss will shift to the next pair of lanes. If they began on odd numbered lanes, they will move to even numbered lanes. The coach for the other team can rearrange the lineup to one he/she feels is more advantageous, but none of the players would remain on the same pair of lanes. Also for Game #2, both coaches must replace at least one player with one from "the bench." For Game #3, the players on the team which lost the coin toss must shift to the next pair of lanes. If they were on odd numbered lanes, they will move to even numbered lanes. The coach for the other team can now rearrange the lineup to one he/she feels is more advantageous. Any players who have not competed must now be inserted into the lineup. Doing so ensures that the talent of an entire team is used. Again, no players would remain on the same pair of lanes. I also believe each team should be required to have at least one female on its roster.

Carol: That's a phenomenal suggestion! What about scoring?

Steve: Teams would be awarded two points for each individual victory and one point for a tie. Obviously, the team with the most points wins. In case of a tie, the total pin-fall for each team will determine the winner. It's pretty straight forward.

Carol: It sounds like organized chaos.

Steve: That's what football is and folks can't get enough of it. The way I see it, this format utilizes luck, strategy, skill, stamina, team depth and mental toughness to determine the final outcome of an event that is compelling to watch because league bowlers can relate to it. It is much more intense and emotions could flare up. Hopefully, that would attract viewers and excite them enough to want to connect with this game if they don't already.

Carol: Good point. Do you have any other suggestions for increasing memberships.

Steve: Just one, but it'll require cooperation between proprietor, local and national bowling associations.

Carol: Let me guess. They should finally establish a true National Championship.

Steve:-) Bingo! Last year, if you recall, I took responsibility for that and proclaimed Team Erie, PA to be the first National Champions of Bowling. Apparently, it stuck! There were no challenges or protests. This year, because the USBC has taken no action against my proclamation, I assume they were in full agreement and trust my judgment to do likewise this year. While I appreciate their non-vote of confidence, their lack of action on this matter means that I'm again burdened with the responsibility to proclaim the greatest bowling city in this country. As of now, Erie's way ahead of the competition again!

Carol: You're prejudiced!!! Why don't you just put the name of every city in a hat and draw one?

Steve: You must be kidding! That would prove nothing......and Erie might not win;-)




