The new agreement also extends the PBA-USBC partnership related to promoting and operating PBA Experience leagues through the USBC Sport Bowling program.

the USBC Masters in place as part of the future PBA Tour schedule, and PBA Experience leagues are a great engagement program," PBA Commissioner Tom Clark said. 'A solid partnership between PBA and USBC benefits all of bowling."

Colorful pennants are reserved for those won win PBA titles

SHAWNEE, OK – For decades, colorful banners recognizing the players in Professional Bowlers Association tournaments who have won titles have been displayed above the lanes at all PBA events, PBA Tour, Regional and/or PBA50 events.

The banners are a unique benefit reserved only for champions, and the players who win titles are given the opportunity to select the colors used on those banners. For many players, the colors they select are special tributes to an important aspect of their lives. For others, colors are a tribute to a favorite team, their home country or some other special moment. But not always.

There are 40 championship banners on display at FireLake Bowling Center in Shawnee, Okla., site of all preliminary rounds of Oklahoma's Grand Casino Resort PBA Summer Swing, and here's the story behind each of them (to view the banners, visit "Photo Gallery" under the Bowlers tab on the pba.com home page):

Dick Allen (lavender lettering on black background): colors of my favorite bowling shirt at the time I won

Brad Angelo (magenta on blue): at the time he won his first title, I had two kids; my son got to pick the background color (blue) and my daughter picked the color for the lettering (magenta). She liked the sound of magenta.

Chris Barnes (gold on black): high school and Wichita State colors.

Dom Barrett (red on white): St. George's flag colors.

Jason Belmonte (black on white): colors have no significance; I should probably request a new banner.

Parker Bohn III (purple on yellow): combines color of ball I used for my first title with color of shirt (yellow) I was wearing.

Ryan Ciminelli (black on turquoise): two of the three colors of my favorite team, the Jacksonville Jaguars.

Tom Daugherty (red on silver): Tampa Bay Buccaneers colors.

Mike DeVaney (black on orange): when I won, my three-year-old nephew's favorite color was orange, and at that time there were no other orange banners. The black lettering has no meaning other than it looks nice on orange.

Norm Duke (green on black): colors for Hex Grip, the grip company I owned back in 1986

Mike Edwards (cream on red): Oklahoma Sooners, baby!

Mike Fagan (orange on blue): New York Mets colors.

Andres Gomez (red on blue with yellow border): Colombia national colors.

Michael Haugen Jr. (green on black): my favorite colors.

Tom Hess (white on orange): my favorite colors.

Tommy Jones (red on black): high school colors.

Mika Koivuniemi (white on blue): Finland national colors.

Brian Kretzer (red on silver): Ohio State colors.

Kelly Kulick (white on blue): Indianapolis Colts colors.

Anthony LaCaze (white on turquoise): our wedding colors.

Thomas Larsen (black on red with white cross): Denmark flag.

Chris Loschetter (red lettering trimmed by Cubby blue on white): I'm a hopeless Chicago Cubs fan.

Michael Machuga (red lettering on white): Normally only players who are entered in an event have their banners displayed, but Machuga was a late scratch so his banner remained on display.

Wes Malott (black on white): I knew someone was going to ask about that one day; come back later and I'll come up with a good answer...

Eugene McCune (Cubby blue on red): Chicago Cubs colors.

Scott Newell (silver on checkered black & white flag): Oakland Raiders' silver on NASCAR checkered flag.

Scott Norton (white on red): Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim colors.

Bill O'Neill (white on orange): our wedding colors.

Rhino Page (black on orange): orange is my favorite color, black has no meaning.

Osku Palermaa (blue on white): Finland national colors.

Jake Peters (gold on black): Wichita State colors.

Sean Rash (gold on black): Wichita State colors.

Ronnie Russell (gold with purple trim on white): high school colors.

Ryan Shafer (white on purple): purple is tribute to Del Ballard Jr. because I never would have won without his help.

Tom Smallwood (black on orange): first two colors that popped into my head.

Jason Sterner (white with red trim on black): Atlanta Falcons colors.

Pete Weber (yellow on blue): I have no idea. They may have been my dad's colors. They certainly aren't because of the St. Louis Blues.

Walter Ray Williams Jr. (black on white): colors of the shoes I wore when I first came out on Tour.


Stuart Williams (red on white): St. George's flag colors.

Fisser also had Jim Mohr's help in their team Anaheim's winning the team sweepstakes with 2144. Mohr who missed the first game, helped with his (198) 519. The league champion Jones' Eagle Rock placed 2nd with 2100. Also in addition to top in singles, Fisser won handicap doubles with MacMonagle and scratch with Jones. In short, Fisser got the lion's share of the Sweeper money.

That did not stop there, as in the distribution of the league team prize money, Fisser in addition to his winning the league's Masters, also got most of the league's special prizes. 




