## **Johnny Petraglia Wins PBA Senior Dayton Classic** Achieving Milestone of Winning PBA Titles in Six Decades

fessional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer Johnny Petraglia became the first player in PBA history to win a national tour or senior tour title in six decades by winning the PBA Senior Dayton Classic presented by Roto Grip Thursday at Capri Lanes.

Petraglia, who won his eighth career Senior Tour title, also ended a three-year drought without a win by defeating reigning Senior Player of the Year Ron Mohr of Eagle River, Alaska, 220-204, in the title match.

Petraglia, who was the top seed for the finals, started strong with the first three strikes but then ran into trouble in the fourth frame throwing a 4-6-7-10 split. He threw another split (3-7) in the seventh frame but was able to close out the match with four strikes and a nine-count which was enough to beat Mohr who was also struggling.

"When I threw that first split it surprised me because I thought it was going to be a strike," said the 65-year-old Petraglia, whose last Senior Tour title came in the 2009 Sun Bowl In The Villages. "Frankly, I was a little lost at that point. I really didn't make


an adjustment until after that second split when I moved right on the approach, threw it a little farther left on the lane and trusted that it would come back and it did.

"I guess some things are meant to happen," he added. "Ron was having trouble on the left lane leaving three 10pins which meant if I could get back to striking I could still win the match.'

Overall, Petraglia and fellow PBA legend Dick Weber both have PBA titles in six decades, however, Weber's longevity mark includes a PBA regional title. Petraglia also owns 14 PBA Tour titles, winning his first at a national tour stop in Ft. Smith, Ark., in 1966 at the age of 19.

"I guess it shows how old I am," Petraglia said jokingly after achieving the milestone. "But this is very special to me because it's part of history and makes it all worth it.

"You know at my age, I was wondering if it was going to happen," he said. "There are so many great Senior Tour players and there are more great bowlers from the regular Tour who are becoming eligible so it doesn't get any easier. Another thing that makes it special is that there are some

guys that might be able to tie this record in the coming years but probably not going to break it."

In the semi-final match, Mohr, trying for his first title of the season and eighth of his career, defeated Ron Profitt of Brookville, Ohio, 238-222, to advance to the title match. In the opening match, Profitt defeated last week's Senior

Bob Learn Jr. of Erie, Pa., 243-217. Learn beat Profitt in the championship match of that tournament, 203-196, for his first Senior Tour title.

#### TOURNAMENTS, TOURNAMENTS, TOURNAMENTS

Bowling wouldn't be the same without them. They're the icing on the bowling cake. Each year there are some 10,000 tournaments, give or take a few hundred. They offer prizes ranging from tiny trophies to more than \$200,000 if you shoot the right game in the right place at the right

They go in distance from a single ball to as many games as you can roll in days. They're conducted at any and all hours and there probably isn't any time of the year, any year, when a bowling tournament isn't being conducted somewhere in this rapidly shrinkng world.

Why should you bowl in tournament? If you enjoy bowling, you're competitive to a degree. League bowling is more competitive than open bowling and tournaments are just another extension into another field of competition.

If you look at tournament bowling as a way to quick riches, forget it. Sure there are winners, big winners. But look at the prize ratios, one winner for every so many entries, meaning for every winner there must be multiple los-

But that's talking money. There's plenty of experience, satisfaction and competitive fun in tournaments, rewards not as obvious as many. Only your check book can tell you what you can afford in the way of tournament play. Once it tells you how far you can go or how near you must stay, the next step is to check out what is available. That information is usually as close as your nearest bowling center or bowling paper, and often your mailbox brings you news of the tournament goodies available.

There is a tournament for you, no matter what your age, size, sex, average or what. The good tournament promoters verge on genius. You can win money, cars, trips, merchandise goodies of all sorts and notice. A word of caution. Most tournaments are conducted well, and a United States Bowling Congress sanction and guidance that the sanction gives is a big boost up for any event.

But there are many grabbers, interested in themsleves first, and one of their chief delights is to con people. And bowlers sure are people, and they can be conned, simply because they don't take the time to read or count or add.

Check the entry blanks. See the breakdown of the entry fee. Part of the fee pays for the bowling, some goes for scoring, and it's necessary that a fair amout be deducted to pay for the many other expenses. This is all fine, within reason. Be wary of too much being taken from the entry fee, or too little. Always remember, with the exception of some specialized commercially sponsored tournaments, you're not going to get something for nothing.

So if you're paying, get the most for your money. It's not as difficult as you might think. The same way a hep housewife shops for groceries and other needs, a bowler should shop for tournaments.

A bowler who doesn't compete in tournaments is missing a good part of the sport. Every bowler should go out of his way to support his local and state association events.

If you haven't been bowling in tournaments, toss away all the excuses and give a couple a try. If you have been rolling in tournaments, you don't have to be sold the benefits, only the cautions. As they say at most events, good luck and good bowling.

## **EXERCISING AND STRETCHING**

by Robert Ellison

NORWALK — Todays tip is what bowlers should do prior bowling. It's always a good idea to arrive early at lanes - give yourself time to stretch and do warm up exercises before bowling. stretching exercises helps loosen up the muscles and get ready for league or tournament play. Stretching helps warm up, and allows free flow, increases blood flow to the muscles. Bowling is like any other sport - by exercising and stretching the muscles - this prevents injuries that may come up while bowling. Pro bowlers always stretches and warms up prior in tournaments. By streching and excercising these muscles; this will help you have smoother and better balance on approach. Some of the stretching exercises are: calves; arms; shoulders; hands and wrist.

Some of the exercises are:

**Hamstring:** Stretch by reaching for your toes. Hold this stretch for about 10 to 15 seconds, and be sure not to stretch past a certain point

**Groin:** Sit on the floor with the bottoms of your feet together, knees out. Gently use your elbows to push the inside of your folded knees to the floor. Hold the stretch for about 10 to 15 seconds, and repeat the stretch about five times

**Thigh Muscles:** To stretch the front thigh, step back with one foot and lean back into the stretch. Hold this for 10 to 15 seconds and repeat about five times. Be sure to alternate sides to get balanced conditioning. This is also a great stretch for the calf as well. To stretch the back of the thigh, bring your thigh up to your chest and place your hands under the back of your thigh. Pull the thigh toward your chest just until you feel a slight pull, not pain. Hold this again for 10 to 15 seconds and repeat about five times.

**Bowling Arm:** To stretch that bowling arm, fold your elbow behind your head. Take your opposite hand and place it on the outside of your elbow. Now gently pull that elbow behind your back and across your body. This stretches your upper arm, shoulder and side all at the same time. Hold this stretch for about 5 to 10 seconds and repeat about 5 to 10 times. Place your other hand on the back of your elbow and place slight pressure, pulling it toward your body. Again, hold this stretch for about 5 to 10 seconds and repeat 5 to 10 times. Be sure to alternate sides so your conditioning is balanced.

FONTANA — We returned to Foothill Lanes where we saw 209 entries come out on Saturday and bowled on a fairly easy shot. The cut scores on Saturday night were + 95 for the men and +63 for the women. The Semis were bowled

The Semis were bowled and the leader was Tim (Vien) Tran with a +190. Finishing in second was Arvhin Garcia at a +165. He will have a bye in the first round of the single elims. Tran had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$2,990. He drew a 268. 

### Blanchard and Larsen Win Top PBA Honors Belmonte, Fagan, Rash are PBA Player of the Year finalists

SEATTLE (May 16, 2012) - Arizona's Josh Blanchard, a former Wichita State University All-American, is the 2011-12 PBA Harry Golden Rookie of the Year and Sweden's Martin Larsen the Steve Nagy Sportsmanship Award winner, the Professional Bowlers Association announced Wednesday.

PBA Commissioner Tom Clark also announced that Australia's Jason Belmonte, Mike Fagan of Dallas and Sean Rash of Montgomery, Ill., are the finalists for the 2011-12 Chris Schenkel PBA Player of the Year award. One of the most hotly contested Player of the Year races will come to an end at noon ET on Monday, May 28, when this year's winner will be announced in a special ceremony webcast live on PBA's Xtra Frame online bowling channel from 10pin bowling lounge

The 24-year-old Blanchard from Gilbert, Ariz., got his PBA career off to a fast start when he won a PBA West Region Non-Champions tournament for his first title in the first event he entered as a member. In his first year as a PBA Tour player, he dominated rookie stats, cashing in 10 of 13 events (the next closest rookie cashed in only two events) while leading all rookies in average, points and earnings. His best finish was third in the PBA Cheetah Open presented by Ebonite.

"The successes and failures I learned this season have taught me what I need to know not to just be competitive but to compete for wins," said Blanchard, who made one other championship round appearance and gained some unexpected notoriety when he fell during the ESPN telecast of the PBA World Championship Mike Aulby Division finals. "This year my mindset was to bowl well enough to make cuts and match play rounds. After my experience this season I believe I have the

confidence where now my mindset will be bowl to win.

"I achieved way more than I expected," said Blanchard, who was a runaway winner of the Rookie of the Year award. "I mainly joined (the PBA) to see how good my skills were and if I could compete. Rookie of the Year really didn't enter into my mind until I had some good finishes.'

Larsen, a veteran member of Team Sweden at age 32, earned the right to bowl as an "exempt" PBA player during the 2011-12 season after two quality seasons as a part-time international player. The six-time European Bowling Tour titlist finished third in the Dick Weber PBA Playoffs presented by Hammer and fifth in the PBA Cheetah Open presented by Ebonite.

Wow, it's an honor to be included in the list of some very worthy bowlers," Larsen said. "Some guys back home will say they're not surprised I got the award, but I am. This year I'm the "nice" bowler of the year, maybe next year I can be Bowler of the Year.

Larsen joins 2009-10 winner George Lambert IV of Canada as the only two international players ever to win the Nagy Award.

Other players who received Nagy Award votes were Tom Hess, Urbandale, Iowa; Kelly Kulick, Union, N.J., two-time Nagy winner Jack Jurek, Lackawanna, N.Y., and Scott Norton, Costa Mesa,

The Harry Golden Rookie of the Year award, named after the late PBA Tour Tournament Director, is voted on by the PBA membership and the Steve Nagy Award is determined by a vote of PBA Exempt players. Established in 1966, the Steve Nagy Sportsmanship Award is named after the late PBA Hall of Famer who was one of 33 founding members of the PBA.

In the Player of the Year voting among the PBA membership and select veteran bowling writers, Belmonte, Fagan and Rash are the top three vote-getters.

Belmonte won three titles including the Elite Players Championship, had seven top-five finishes, finished third in average and second in both points and earnings. Belmonte also finished third in the U.S. Open and Tournament of Champions, fourth in the PBA World Championship and ninth

Fagan qualified for TV shows in all four PBA Tour majors. He won the USBC Masters, finished second in the U.S. Open, fourth in the Tournament of Champions and 12th in the PBA World Championship. He also won an international PBA Tour title, the Brunswick Euro Challenge in Paris, France. Statistically, he was second in average and third in points and earnings.

Rash won PBA's signature event, the Tournament of Champions. He led the Tour with eight top-five finishes, including third place in the PBA World Championship, and finished first in average, points and earnings. He also qualified for a record five consecutive TV finals during the World Series of Bowling.

## FRESNO'S CEDAR LANES FINAL FRAME

FRESNO-Several weekends ago my team traveled to Fresno to bowl the CUSBC (California United States Bowling Congress) Women's State tournament. Returning home with teammate, Sheilah Bomar, we talked about how much the Team house, Cedar Lanes, felt like Regency Lanes here in Bakersfield. Sheilah even remarked, "They have a Marge AND an Al (referring to the late Marge Langdon, manager, and the late Al Cichy, head lane mechanic of Regency)!" Cedar's "Marge and Al" are manager Joanne Christian (24 years) and lane mechanic Al Bartz (22 years).

A few days later on Facebook local bowler Carlie Medina III posted that he heard Cedar Lanes would be closing in early June that sent a shockwave across the state. For a day or two we hoped it was not true but releases soon appeared to confirm it really was going to happen as soon as Women's State is over (June 3). How sad, now Fresno will only have two bowling centers-AMF Sierra Lanes and AMF Rodeo Lanes in Clovis. Cedar Lanes, located in the Cedar Lanes Shopping Center, was sold to a new developer. Work will begin this summer to tear it down although it is not clear yet what will replace it.

Cedar Lanes opened in August 23, 1959, and at that time was one of the most elaborate bowling centers in California at a cost of \$1.35 million. The center's architecture is emblematic of mid-century 1960s modern design and many feel the building is historic to the Fresno area. At the time, the center's location at the corner of Cedar and Shields avenues was built at the hub of Fresno's newest growth area influenced by Fresno State being close by. And through the years,



has been a part of this center. The late Fresno State Bowling Coach Glenn Carlson bowled there and, according to Fresno bowling association (Central California USBC) manager and Cedar Lanes regular Jack Waters, "Some of the Fresno State team bowled in leagues at Cedar and the team was always welcome to come and practice whenever they wanted." From 1966 to 1993, Cedar Lanes was a frequent stop of the PBA (Professional Bowlers Association) tour, the Fresno Open that was telecast on ABC in the later years. Bowlers who have emerged from this center include PJ Haggerty, Rhino Paige, Jason McElroy, Warren Nelson and regional players Joel Laster, Sam Carter, Darris Ruffner, David Street, June Shimoda and Fresno State Bowling team coach Chris Preble. Even 2012 Star of Tomorrow, Ryan Peden bowled for a couple of years in a junior league at Cedar Lanes. Waters, who has bowled at this center for 45 years, added, "about 1,100 bowlers and 15 bowling leagues will be affected by the closure." He also stressed that what will be missed most is "we are losing an icon in the bowling family

here in Fresno which hosted the PBA Summer tour for many years. This is a family-owned business, built and operated by the Wathen family and being an independent-owned center, it always seemed like home to a lot of us bowlers, being family oriented, the staff was always friendly and helpful, it just won't seem the same.

Visalia's Brian Cooper reflected his first memory of Cedar Lanes. "My first memory was 1977ish, no 1978, when they hosted the North-South State Scratch youth tournament where 12 boys & 12 girls from the north bowled against 12 boys and girls from the south that I was bowling in and I walked into the center and remember seeing the bowling lanes painted on the walls. It was like a mural and made it look like the lanes went on forever!" His career was also enhanced at this center as he won several tournaments there including San Joaquin Bowling Club titles and the annual Fresno Championships which was a four-month long tournament. Cooper added, "The impact of losing this center is as great as the loss of losing the PBA Summer tour stop and the late Glenn Carlson.'

#### 50-YEAR-OLD BRIAN **COOPER TAKES ON THE PBA SENIOR TOUR**

by Bette Addington FRESNO — "It's a dream I've had for the past two or three years," said Brian Cooper of taking his bowling career to the next level and bowling the PBA Senior Tour. And, with the urging of friend and fellow Visalian, Fred Cole, the two decided they would travel together and conquer the tour. But, due to Cole's recent health setback, Cooper took the trip alone. So he loaded up about a dozen of his bowling balls in his girlfriend's Honda CRV and off to Florida he drove the middle of April for the start of his adventure.

And, wow, what enlightening adventure! His first round at The Villages senior tournament in Florida he shot 30 over. Not bad, but others had 200 over in that block. Second block he shot 200 over. Not bad, but it took 370 over to make the cut! Cooper adjusted and by his second week of the tour he got satisfaction by reaching seventh place on the first day; eighth place the next day and ended up fourteenth place on the third day (was defeated by Florida's Dave Sill three games to two). In his third tour tournament, he missed cashing by just 20 pins. And, his last tour tournament, in Dayton Ohio, qualified and ended up 17th (just missing the Top 16 by a few pins). As for his first experience, Cooper said, "I'm not ecstatic. I went out there to win. But, it was a great experience!"

Cooper, known as "Super Coop" to many of his bowling buddies, has been bowling for "a good 35 years". Recently, while he was on the PBA Senior Tour, he was inducted into the Tulare County USBC Hall of Fame on May 5. Cooper said, "I wanted to be there so bad but I was committed to bowling well (on tour)." Good friend and doubles partner, Carlie Medina III of Bakersfield, graciously accepted his award for him. Medina reflected that Cooper has been bowling now for five decades! Besides that he has won multiple State doubles titles, PCB mixed doubles titles with friend, USBC and Women's PBA Hall of Famer Wendy McPhearson as well as winning the CUSBC State Doubles in 2011 and the Nevada State Doubles and also seven San Joaquin titles. He has (30) 300 games and (10) 800 series so far in his career. In 2007 he received the Pat Patterson Award. But besides that, Medina spoke of how much Cooper has contributed to other fellow bowlers by being their friend and helping them by sponsoring them like Jason Hurd and Medina. And, it goes beyond that, as Cooper has hosted regional tournaments over the years and now he's participating on the PBA Senior Tour as a Senior Tour Rookie.

So what's in the future for Super Coop? He's headed down south this Friday to bowl in the CUSBC Open State tournament and from there heads to Sun City and Flagstaff Arizona for two regional tournaments and then to Las Vegas to bowl in the US Senior Open and Masters. Whew!

He never slows down! Added Mike Hefley, "As a friend and competitive bowler, I can say as many would Visalia's Brian (Super) Cooper is probably one of the most competitive bowlers we have ever had the pleasure to bowl against. In fact, we had even bowled in each other's leagues in Visalia and Bakersfield in past years making the trip weekly for up to 35 weeks in a row. Now that's competitive and fun that will surely last a lifetime as we turn into senior bowlers and bowl senior tournaments.
