





On Saturday morning there are men's and women's team events at respective centers and each follows in the afternoon with men's Masters qualifying round and women's Queen's and Senior Queens qualifying rounds. In the evening there will be Banquet Dinner at :30 at the hotel and a deaf female comedian show at 9 PM.

On Sunday morning and all day both men's and women's Masters and Queens and each Senior Masters and Senior Queens match plays and finals at respective centers.


