ROCKWALL, Texas – Jim Goodwin says that publishing the Stars & Strikes Bowling Newsmagazine has been a "labor of love" and "we're doing our best to keep it afloat."

Goodwin concedes the final edition of the venerable publication may be down the road. "It's not official," he says. "We don't know yet. We are going to Bowl Expo where we might get some new ideas."

The Stars & Strikes, billed as "America's Bowling Newsmagazine, the only national bowling tabloid in the U.S.A.," is published monthly by Goodwin and his wife, C.J., who are the magazine's co-owners and publishers.

Goodwin says that his wife will make the final call on the magazine's fate. C.J. currently "lays out the sections and puts it together," he says. Jim writes a monthly column for Stars & Strikes, now in its 26th year.

The magazine, based in Rockwall, Texas, started as a regional paper serving Texas and a few neighboring states and became a national paper in 1995.

It is one of only about a dozen bowling newspapers left in the U.S. "I think it's like any bowling publication these days," Goodwin says. "If you don't find new ways to find business, it's not going to be around anymore."

Bryan Goebel Wins PBA50 Miller Lite Players Championship For First PBA50 Tour Title

Goebel beats fellow PBA Hall of Famer Parker Bohn III 264-230 in title match

INDIANAPOLIS - Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer Bryan Goebel of Shawnee, Kan., a 10-time winner on the PBA Tour, won the PBA50 Miller Lite Players Championship Tuesday for his first title on PBA's tour for players 50 and over.



June edition. The magazine prints up to 5,000 paper editions a month and also emails a few thousand digital versions of the publication to bowling centers and pro shops around the U.S. and abroad.

Most bowling publications have seen better days. The Stars & Strikes is just another on a long list.

"In the old days, we had a lot of pages, anywhere between 40 and 50," Goodwin says. "It's dwindled to 12 and 16 in recent years."

Goodwin has more than a lifetime experience in the bowling industry. For four years, he and C.J. owned a 26-lane bowling center in Dallas called Circle Bowl, and he has managed several centers.

He also has been an accomplished bowler, starting at age 8, a Professional Bowlers Assn. member for many years "averaging over 200 for more than 30 years," which he says is "no big deal" these days.

Goodwin, with C.J. at his side, also spent 20 years working with the Professional Women's Bowling Assn., mostly overseeing its regional program, and they were media directors for Pinnacle Events, owners of the Las Vegas-based Mini Eliminator Tournaments and The Generations Pro Bowlers Tour.

In 2011, he received the Mike Hennessy Bowling Writers Assn. of America Award of Merit. The award honors "sportswriters who have contributed to the betterment of bowling by educating the public both general and sports specific of the accomplishments of those involved in the game as well as offering thoughtful and provocative commentary on issues that affect the direction and future of bowling."

He wrote for the Bowlers Journal magazine for more than a decade and is currently one of the featured writers for the monthly International Bowling Industry magazine, which is based in Southern California.

Goodwin was a longtime member of the board of directors of the BWAA (now International Bowling Media Assn.) in addition to serving as the group's president. He is now an IBMA life member and was inducted into its Hall of Fame in 2016.


Through it all, he and his wife have kept the Stars & Strikes going – he credits C.J. with doing the hard work that has made it last so long. He concedes that they would be open to selling the paper to the right person.

"If some young person wanted to buy it, they could get it for a song," he said. "But I don't know if there is anyone who would want to operate it as a labor of love the way we and many other papers have. We would love to find someone that could keep it going and find a way to take advantage of the new media tools available to make it a viable business again."

Whatever happens with Stars & Strikes, the Goodwin's say they have enjoyed the ride. "We're just going to take it wherever it goes. No matter what happens, it's been a lot of fun doing it," he says.







end of the match to seal the win.

Goebel's win came in his 51st PBA50 Tour tournament. His previous best finishes in five full seasons were two runner-up finishes which came in 2013 and 2015.

"What makes it special is you want to beat the best and Parker is one of the best," said the 55-year-old Goebel. "It's a huge relief to finally get that first win and to beat a great player like Parker in a major, that makes it that much more satisfying."

For Goebel, the Miller Lite Players Championship win was his second major title on the national stage. He won the PBA Tour's PBA Tournament of Champions in 1998.

As the No. 2 qualifier for the finals, Goebel advanced to the title match by beating PBA50 Tour rookie Michael Haugen Jr. of Phoenix, 200-181, in the semifinal match. Haugen, a five-time PBA Tour winner who qualified fourth for the finals, was making his third championship round appearance of the season and tied his best finish of third.

In the opening match Haugen beat No. 5 qualifier Scott Greiner of Platte City, Mo., 238-159, and then defeated No. 3 qualifier Bob Learn Jr. of Erie, Pa., 222-190, to advance to the semi-final match against Goebel.

Learn, who dominated qualifying by averaging 245, was trying for his fourth career PBA50 Tour title while Greiner was trying for his first win.

The next stop for the PBA50 Tour is Harvest Park Bowl in Brentwood, Calif. for the PBA50 Northern California Classic presented by MOTIV May 28-31.


