Milligan Crowned 2005 WIBC Queens Champion

TULSA, Okla. - Tennelle Milligan, Yorba Linda, Calif., knew what she had to do strike and spare in the 10th frame to clinch the title at 2005 Women's International Bowling Congress Queens Tournament, presented by Reno Tri-Properties, a United States Bowling Congress Event.

Standing in her way was Riverlanes' lane 35 — the left lane that had been giving her fits during Wednesday's stepladder finals.

Milligan earned her strike and spare to defeat WIBC Hall of Famer Anne Marie Duggan, Edmond, Okla., in the second championship game 202-177 but not without adversity — to claim her third major title.

"I didn't want to end on the left lane," said Milligan, who won the Professional Women's Bowling Association Players Championship and U.S. Open in 2000. "That's why I picked to end on the right lane in the first game because I wanted to get it over with. Anne Marie had a better reaction on the left lane than I did."

Milligan struck on her first ball in the 10th of the second game, a rare shot of hers that went flush into the pocket on lane 35. Her next shot, however, went light — getting five pins and leaving the 2-4-5-7-8 combination.

"I was so happy I made a great shot on the first ball," Milligan said. "I thought I threw the next one pretty well, too and I got five. So I might as well get the other half while I'm at it."

She converted the spare to shut out Duggan, a 15-time PWBA winner who won the WIBC Queens title in 1994.

"I'm just overwhelmed right now. It's all so unreal," Milligan said. "Being the last WIBC

Bowling's Top Players To Serve As Interscholastic Coaching Certification Program Trainers

GREENDALE, Wis. - The United States Bowling Congress has announced an all-star lineup of the sport's top athletes who will serve as certified trainers for its new Interscholastic Coaching Certification Program slated to begin this summer.

With the rapid expansion of interscholastic bowling programs, USBC High School, USBC Collegiate and USBC Coaching have joined together to create the coaching certification program to address the need for coaches.

The elite lineup of trainers include the following USBCcertified coaches: Professional Bowlers Association pros Lonnie Waliczek, Rick Steelsmith, Jeff Lizzi and Del Ballard; Professional Women's Bowling Association players Carolyn Dorin-Ballard, Kim Terrell, Cathy Dorin-Lizzi and Kendra Gaines; Team USA member and amateur standout Diandra Asbaty and noted instructor Ron Hatfield. Each trainer will conduct clinics in the region where they are based to help reduce the cost for attendees.

"We really have a dream team of trainers," said Director of USBC High School Christine E. Zahn. "Those who register for the program will get training from some of the best. It would be like getting instruction from Davis Love III or Karrie Webb in golf."

The program was initially created to meet the goal of having a trained bowling coach for every high school that has a varsity or club program. Designed for those who have coaching experience and those who have limited or no bowling background, the program has been expanded to include anyone who would like to be

involved in coaching and leading an interscholastic bowling program at the college, high school and middle school levels.

"We are kind of a victim of our success," Zahn said. "Currently many programs' coaching needs are being filled by teachers or other educational personnel who don't necessarily have a background in bowling but are committed to high school bowling programs."

For those who do not have any USBC coaching certification, the Interscholastic Coaching Certification Program is a four-part process which consists of the following:

*Part 1: One day of training which consists of four hours of classroom instruction and four hours of on-lane drills.

*Part 2: Successful completion of USBC's Level 1 coaching certification program.

*Part 3: Successful

completion of USBC's Bronze Level coaching certification program.

*Part 4: Successful completion of the National Federation of State High School Associations Coaching Principles course, the American Sport Education Program (ASEP) first aid and CPR courses and any interscholastic association required courses.

The first three parts must be completed in order but part 4 may be completed at any time. Those already certified as USBC Level 1 or Bronze Level coaches may apply their certifications to the new program.

"We believe that coaching is so critical not only for making a bowler better but also to nurture interest in the sport for the long term," said Director of USBC Collegiate Jeanne Klescewski. "At the collegiate level coaching is extremely important not just for the ob-

 vious competitive reasons but
 it also plays a key role in fostering the bowler's experience
 for future adult competition."

"Any successful sports program begins with coaching," said Director of USBC Coaching Bob Maki. "We want to provide coaches with the education and tools so their athletes can grow their skills as well."

Interscholastic Coaching intro workshops will be conducted upon the request of schools or bowling centers that guarantee a minimum of 16 attendees. Registration for the one-day introduction workshop is \$99 per person. In the coming weeks schedule and registration information will be available on the high school and coaching pages of bowl.com. In the meantime, information may be obtained by calling (800) 514-BOWL, ext. 3398.

Fresno State's Haggerty Wins At 2005 Collegiate **Singles Championships**

MILWAUKEE-Last month, Fresno State sophomore P.J. Haggerty was named the Most Valuable Player in the 2004-05 men's collegiate bowling season. He proved why Tuesday.

Top-seeded Haggerty, the 2004-05 National Collegiate Bowling Coaches Association MVP, defeated San Jose State sophomore Jason Andersen 3-1 in the best-of-5 men's title match of the 2005 Collegiate Singles Championships, a United States Bowling Congress Event, at Olympic Lanes.

Andersen, a Fremont, Calif., native, was the third left-hander to fall 3-1 to the right-handed Haggerty, who earned the top seed and a bye to the quarterfinals by being the high qualifier. He also defeated Erie Community College freshman Ryan Ciminelli, Cheektowaga, N.Y., in the quarterfinals and William Paterson junior Tom Scherrer, Holtsville, N.Y., in the semifinals.

"I had a great look at the lanes all week," the Weimar, Calif., native said. "Taking down three lefties today was hard. Luckily, I got the breaks."

Once of those breaks came in the eighth frame of Game 4 when a messenger pin kicked out the 10-pin - keeping Haggerty's string of strikes in tact. It helped him stave off Andersen's late run to hold on for the 233-209 championship clinching victory.

Haggerty started the championship match strong, striking on 8 of 11 attempts - including seven consecutive - to pull out a 244-213 victory in Game 1. Andersen evened the match with a 207-193 triumph in Game 2 before Haggerty pulled back ahead in Game 3 with a 207-206 victory.

The 2003 American Bowling Congress Chuck Hall Star of Tomorrow traded strikes in a fierce match with Ciminelli, the 2004-05 NCBCA Rookie of the Year. Once he advanced, Haggerty knew he was in control of his fate.

"I knew once I beat him I had a good chance of taking down the next two, no matter who it was," said Haggerty, a Junior Team USA member in 2004 and 2005. "That gave me a lot of momentum. I got a lot of confidence out of that match."

BUYING A PIN IN A POKE?

GARDEN GROVE — The OCBA held its annual meeting Sunday, May 22, 2005, adopted their portion of "Articles of Merger" for Orange County Bowling Association of the United States Bowling Congress by a near unanimous vote. The line officer's presentation was convincing.

League representatives asked lots of questions, were convinced it was safe to be protected by a non-profit California corporation.

There were 11 (eleven) legalese articles, two (five and six) were bothersome to this writer. Not really fine print but questionable. **ARTICLES 5 & 6:**

5. The Surviving Corporation once incorporated shall possess all of the rights, Privileges, and immunities of a public and private nature of the Merging Corporations. All Property, real, personal, and intangle, and all debts and obligations due on whatever Account, and every other interest, of or belonging to or due to the Merging Corporations shall be taken and deemed to be transferred and assigned to or vested in the Surviving Corporation without further action or deed required.

6. The Surviving Corporation shall be responsible and liable for all liabilities and Obligations of the Merging Corporations. Any claim existing or action or proceeding pending By or against any of the Merging Corporations may be prosecuted to judgment as if theMerger had not taken place, or the Surviving Corporation may be substituted in the place of Such Merging Corporation as a successor in interest. Neither the rights nor any liens upon The property of any Merging Corporation shall be impaired by reason of the merger.

Do they mean the richer entity (corporation) must pay the debts of the other merging corporations?

The principal corporation being the ABC (local association) could be responsible for the "poor" one's liabilities?

No wonder the transition has been slow. The Fort Hood, TX of the USBC local was the first to complete their merger application in April?

Along the way the ABC/WIBC merged locals are encouraged to take-in groups such as the proprietors, youth, bowling equipment manufactures, consultants, and public relations companies to form one big happy family.

This writer thinks the ABC/WIBC families would be happier without their relative's burdens.

The bottom line: The success of tenpin bowling in Orange County or any other county depends mostly on what the local associations and proprietor group's managers and volunteers accomplish.

They need help from players, sponsors, fans, sporting public, medical/fitness industry, city, county and state officials — for starters, some dirt about 10 acres, enough equipment to fill a modern center, an ample amount of promotion money — no pins in a poke!



TAT

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA DEAF BOWLING NEWS by Connie Marchione

LOS ANGELES TEAM OF PENNINGTON & AUDETTE WINS DEAF TRAVEL SWEEPER ANAHEIM

So. Calif. Deaf Traveling League concluded its 45th year with a sweeper and a banquet at Linbrook Bowl. This league is recognized as the oldest deaf traveling league in existence since it was formed in 1960 with 6 teams of trios.

Since its formation over 300 deaf and hearing impaired bowlers had joined and bowled for one year or more. It had grown to 16 teams in the mid-1970 and seen many of its favorite centers closed. This season was completed with 10 teams of doubles.

In the team sweepstakes at Linbrook Bowl, the Los Angeles team of Richard Pennington and Robert Audette was matched against Darrell Stogryn's El Camino Village and took advantage of Darrell's jet lag. Stogryn had bowl in the ABC tournament at Baton Rouge just arrived home very tired from a three hours delay at the airport and bowled poorly in this match.

L.A. team scored 407-338-413-369 for 1527 to top all teams with Pennington's top series of 773 from234-160-211-168 and Audette's 173-178-202-201/754.In Indistant 2nd place was the league champion Riverside's with1397 with Ed Abakumoff's opening 255 game and 769 series and Sharon Caldwell's 628. La Verne with Connie Marchione's 691 and David Ramirez's (205) 684 scored 1375 for 3rd.

In the handicap sweepstakes, Pennington's 82 handicap put him at the top of all with 855, thusly sweeping in most of the handicap prizes. With teammate Audette's 826, they placed 1st and 2nd in singles and won 1st in doubles. Then Pennington also took 2nd with Marchione's 787, 3rd with Mirna Aranki's 782, 4th with Pete Koukoutsakis' 781, 5th with Abakumoff's 778, 6th with Ramirez;s 768 and 8th with Caldwell's 756 before letting Audette have 7th with Marchione and 9th with Mirna.

In mixed doubles Pennington placed first with Mirna and second with Caldwell while Audette claimed 3rd with Mirna, In all, Pennington reaped \$175.00 and Audette about \$80.00.

At the Banquet in Linbrook's banquet room the bowlers and limited fans were treated with a delicious choice of baked chicken and roast beef dinner complete with salad, beverage and pie with ice cream for desert. At the dinner's end, President EdAbakumoff took over with the league awards and sweepstakes payoffs.

Abakumoff gave out the sweepstakes money, then Vice-president Bill Fry gave out the league's Masters prizes starting at the bottom up to Bob Jones for 2nd place and the champion prize to Darrell Stogryn. Stogryn also got the high qualifier (909) and high match series (1002) prizes while Jones took the High match game (268) prize.

It was Abakumoff's turn again to present the league's special prizes, presenting his own team Riverside the league championship prize along with pins from ABC/WIBC to teammate Sharon Caldwell. Last year's champion El Camino Village took the league runner-up prize.

The league's high team series prize went to Stogryn and Mirna Aranki's El Camino Village;s 1631. Although Village had the high Team game (459) the league's team high game went to Emad Aranki and Francisco Navarro's West Covina's 439. Stogryn got the league high series award and a pin from ABC for his league record 1002 series. Caldwell received the women's high series award and a pin from WIBC for her 694.

Although Stogryn's 278 was the league high game, the rules gave the high game award to Dan Flores' 276. The same goes for Caldwell's 199 high game as Mirna got the women's high game for her 191. Jim Mohr's 7 pins improvement got him the most improved bowler award along with a keychain from ABC. Mirna got the women's most improved award and a keychain from WIBC.

Stogryn also got the league awards for most match points won, most 200 games and most 800 series. Bib Jones received two awards, one for most times on honor roll list and other for most 700 plus series. Caldwell also got three, the women's high average award, most match points won by a lady and most 500 series. Pennington received the runner-up most points won award.

The last league award, the Charles R. Hart high average trophy award was presented by Abakumoff to Stogryn for the 4th straight year. While the Hart trophy was in his possession, Stogryn did a kind acknowledgement to the league by having a trophy shop redo all the 44 name plates and arranged to have room on the trophy for 20-25 more.

Abakumoff asked the bowlers not to leave as there is one more surprise award. Then he presented the surprised league's founder, Marchione with a beautiful plaque with apprectation for his 45 years as secretary-treasurer. Marchione thanked Abakumoff and all the bowlers but said he already got one in the league's 25th anniversary and this is too early as he might expect one on the 50th anniern California, moved to North Hollywood, then to Van Nuys, and retired to a retirement home in Newhall and finally to another retirement home in Murrieta to be near his daughter, Debbie. His son lives in northern California.

When Stu was hooked on bowling, he met Katherine Oshiro, an avid bowler who moved to mainland from Hawaii and asked her to move in with him. Both Stu and Kay loved tournament and competitive bowling and also bowled in deaf leagues together. When So. Calif, Deaf Traveling League was formed, as Stu averaged in the high 160's, he was persuaded to join this scratch league in the following year.

So as we lived in the same city Van Nuys, we started a long friendship traveling together on almost every travel league sessions and deaf and state tournament years, taking turns in our cars. When the Travel League started admitting women, Kay who averages in the 160's joined with us. In most of the years we bowled on a team together. When they moved to Newhall, they stopped at my home to pick me up or go with me in my car. When Debbie's job got her transferred to San Diego, Stu and Kay felt it necessary to move to Murrieta to be near her. Both could not make the long trips to bowl in the travel league and were bowling in a senior league near their home.

Stu loved to attend the yearly So. Calif. Bowling Writers Banquets with Kay to watch deaf bowlers get honored and missed only a couple. In bowling, Stu had attained a high average of 185 and won many trophies, such as Being on two team champions, winning both the 1970 Singles (670) and All-events with 1979, and setting a 1395 then record in 1976 Doubles in Pacific Coast Deaf tournaments. He was inducted in the Pacific Coast Deaf Bowling Hall of Fame. In the Southern Nevada-California deaf tournament, he was also on two team champions, won 1985 Doubles with 1264 and All-events with 1924.

There is one which Stu was proud of, his 25 years participation plaque he received from California State Men's Tournament and should have received his 30 years too.

Steward is to be buried in a private family funeral in his hometown in Tennessee. Our condolences go to Katherine Oshiro, Debbie and her husband and brother and his family. Rest in peace, good friend.


