# But, there's a light at the end of the tunnel

RENO—"I have to compliment you, you have done your homework," said Thor Lundgren, USBC Attorney who handled the legislative session, adding, "Congress could take a lesson from you." The delegates at the 5th Annual Meeting of the United State Bowling Congress did indeed do their homework approving 14 amendments and rejecting 16. The dialogue at the microphones was thoughtful but firm and the 1049 voting delegates let it be known that they were not receptive to amendments that "shoved things down their throat."

Most contentious among them was forcing associations to merge by 2011 and allowing amendments to general playing rules, adult league rules and adult tournaments every other year. State Associations long to do things for their members but with \$1 per year dues for State associations it is difficult and attempts to raise it were rejected. Approved was an amendment to send bank statements to the league president. When was this removed and why? Also, soundly rejected was a bylaws proposal allowing USBC to alter, amend or repeal bylaws (except with respect to membership dues) and general playing rules, league rules and tournament rules at times other than at the annual meeting.

Things got a little heated when Gary Beck of Killer "B" Promotions and owner of the Teen Masters brought up the subject of SMART not being fully funded. Beck has been on the hot seat about not giving SMART some scholarship monies because USBC/ SMART refused to show him a current SMART financial report. The only financial report available was from August of 2008. There had been some heated dialogue concerning this issue and the USBC Auditor spoke on their behalf which unwittingly brought out the fact that SMART was, indeed, 3 million under funded - apparently due to stock market loss. The Chief Financial Officer was in the room, would you not think she would address the subject?

Of interest, at the end of the convention an announcement was made that, as of March 10th, the SMART Scholarship Fund monies would now be managed by an independent board of directors with knowledge of bowling and financial matters. Seems logical that Beck's inquiries and that of others prompted the move.

We knew Andrew Cain of Phoenix, Arizona as the Team USA stand out and now PBA tour bowler, but who knew he was that bright and articulate young man who sat as part of the panel during the legislative session? He was excellent in responding to the delegation.

Once again the bowlers presented a large check to the Susan B. Komen Bowl for the Cure fund. The \$1,161,707 check brought the total raised by bowlers for SBK to nearly nine million dollars. Although this is a worthy effort, what

began as a one time donation has catapulted into an annual event and my question is what has this effort done for bowling? Have we seen any recognition for bowling? I wonder how many organizations give nearly one million to a charity annually.

Keith Hamilton, Vice Chair of the Bowling Hall of Fame and Museum, gave us some exciting news in that a new exhibit in the hall will be a tribute to the Professional Women's Bowling Association. The new goal for the Hall is Two million. Storm, Tri-Properties Hotel Casinos (Eldorado, Silver Legacy and Circus Circus and Pat Cinello were recognized as \$50,000 Diamond contributors.

"You can't expect to get what you want in life if you don't work for it" said The Alberta E. Crowe Star of Tomorrow Heather D'Errico of Rochester, NY. Andrew Koff of Miami, Fla was the recipient of the Chuck Hall Star of Tomorrow award. Both were outstanding as athletes, academic achievement, extra curricular activities and community involvement. Blair Blumenscheid of Columbus, Ohio and Kevin Russell of Markham. Ill were named Youth Ambassadors of the Year.

Recognition awards went to Harry Stewart, Coon Rapids, MN - Helen Baker Outstanding Association Volunteer Award; Jamie Brooks, Wylie, TX - Proprietor of the continued on page 8



They expressed their desire to have information on all candidates so they could make informed decisions. Ask and ye shall receive. Bios on all candidates running from the floor were on the chair of each delegate prior to elections. The final tally saw the following elected: (in order of votes received) Carolyn Doran Ballard - Keller TX, Michael Italia - Warrington, PA, Mark Martin - Waterford, MI and Deanna Rose - Fairport, NY.

Regional Managers will once again come on the scene. Doing away with the Field Reps was something felt by all association officers. Those knowledgeable people you could have a one on one with to help with problems were considered too expensive. Apparently the powers that be realize the importance of these people and it was announced that this service will be restored. Four Regional Managers will serve the 3100 associations: Barbara Armstead. David Bartlett, Jim Zebehazy and Mike Larson.

Women's Open and PBA Women's Series. Upson said they felt they had been placing too much emphasis on the elite bowler and would be getting back to their core membership and work on a more "unified look" with their logos. They will work on creating products their bowlers want and changes will be made by input from constituents. Also in the works being proposed for consideration is Associate Membership.

Upson asked that we start now to work with our centers on National Bowling Week which will be held in August. He says he has a great passion for our sport and a sense of our history but believes we can also be burdened by our history. He spoke of the importance of honoring our contributors.

BVL, Inc. is part of the combined federal campaign. ReCreation, who has entertained us many times, gave a stirring presentation for the audience. BVL helps support the ReCreation entertainment troupe. Unfortunately, National BVL is now requesting ALL funds raised in associations be donated to the National fund or they will not be recognized. As you know, California has always given a certain amount to National and disbursed the remainder in our state which has the most VA and Military hospitals and Outreach Centers. Too bad, as I believe we will continue to do our thing - National BVL's loss.

President Jeff Boje bowed to new president Darlene Baker who assisted in various presentations. Boje was emotional in his farewell saying, "I have enjoyed being your president." He then forgot to adjourn the meeting but Baker brought him back to the dais and assisted in the adjournment.


From this reporter's vantage point, it appears that Stu Upson "gets it" and his relaxed demeanor and good humor are good for what ails USBC.
