IASHA KOVALOVA WINS 2019 USBC QUEENS

WICHITA, Kan. - Ukraine's Dasha Kovalova won her first career Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour title and major championship May 21st by delivering a double in her final frame at the 2019 United States Bowling Congress Queens.

The 24-year-old right-hander defeated Malaysia's Sin Li Jane, 226-216, at Northrock Lanes to claim the tiara and \$20,000 top prize, which was broadcast live on CBS Sports Network.

Kovalova, who garnered the support of the crowd as a former collegiate standout at Wichita State University, grabbed the lead at the halfway point of the match after Sin left and was unable to convert a 6-7 split in the fifth frame.

Kovalova followed Sin's open frame with her first double of the title match to push the lead to more than 20 pins, and she maintained the advantage by staying clean through the ninth frame.

Working on a strike and finishing the match first, Kovalova needed a strike and nine pins on her first two shots to shut out Sin and rolled a pair of strikes to secure the victory.

In that pressure-packed moment, Kovalova kept everything quick and simple.

"I kept noticing the shot clock," Kovalova said. "When I get really nervous, I tend to slow everything down, but the clock helped me. When it got to 10 seconds, I knew I had to go. I just focused on that and went to throw the best

Heading into the title match, Kovalova also admitted to being nervous, but her plan to play the lanes farther left than her opponent allowed her to settle in after seeing a similar look during qualifying and match play throughout the week at Northrock Lanes.

"I was freaking out," said Kovalova, who's previous best finish in her PWBA career was eighth at the 2018 PWBA Louisville Open. "I wondered what would happen if I wasn't able to make good shots. But once I stepped up on the approach, I saw a really clear picture and was able to stay focused.

"We talked about keeping everything farther left than everybody else, but to be honest, I felt like I was playing this line during some of qualifying and match play, so I was familiar with it. We also drilled a new bowling ball, so that helped, too."

Kovalova was a four-time National Collegiate Bowling Coaches Association All-American while competing for Wichita State, and she now resides just minutes away from Northrock Lanes.

She helped lead the Shockers to the finals of the Intercollegiate Team Championships at the 48-lane venue in 2016, but the team was unable to win the Helmer Cup, falling to Webber International.

Tuesday's win serves as some redemption for Kovalo-

"We weren't able to deliver the title to Wichita State in 2016," said Kovalova, the 2014-2015 NCBCA Player of the Year. "So, I hope this counts. I wanted to give something back to my coaches, teammates and friends. It feels great. It's kind of surreal."

Sin, who was looking for her second career PWBA Tour title, was happy to see her persistence pay off after almost missing the cut into the match play earlier in the week.

The 27-year-old right-hander was out of the number heading into the final round of qualifying but quickly turned things around in match play, posting the highest match-play average in USBC Queens history on the way continued on page 5

WILLIAMS LEADS POINTS BY MORE THAN 10,000

With three wins and an eighth-place finish so far this season. Williams has been dominating the PBA50 Tour in 2019, and the updated PBA50 points list reflects that.

Williams leads the tour by more than 10,000 points with a four-event total of

237-218 victory, though it 18,930. Haugen is second with 8,660, Joel Carlson Mohr, the top seed, is third with 7,200, Brian LeClair is fourth with 6,770 and Mohr rounds out the top five with 6,025.

It's important to note, however, that the PBA50 Player of the Year race is determined based on point totals and not a vote like the PBA Tour.

So, while Williams has a commanding lead and will likely not come anywhere close to being caught, he still has some work to do the rest of the season. Last year, Haugen won the PBA50 Player of the Year race with 30,123 points, however, there is one less major this season.

New Deal May Make PBA Merchandise More Affordable For Fans

Since 2013, H5G Brands have been the official jersey provider of the PBA Tour, meaning players can only wear H5G jerseys while competing in PBA events. That agreement will continue through July 1, 2022, the PBA announced this week.


The extension of the agreement also included some news that will affect fans as well. In addition to being the exclusive jersey, H5G Brands will also take over merchandise sales both on-site at events and online for the PBA

FloBowling asked PBA CEO and Commissioner Tom Clark for his thoughts on the deal, and he said this is an important agreement for PBA fans.

"Having a one-stop shop as official jersey and merchandise for the PBA, partnering with a company devoted and passionate about bowling, for one, will mean a wider selection of products to choose from on the merchandise side," Clark said. "On the dye-sub jersey side everyone, including our membership and players, know H5G is the official jersey of the PBA for another three years, meaning confidence and consistency."

Clark said plans are in the early stages for a re-launch of PBA merchandise available, which would likely happen in a few months. He also said the prices would likely be more competitive.

"We believe there will be evidence of lower prices because it is more direct to consumer," Clark said. "H5G is producing and selling the merchandise; it is not third party, so the mark up in many cases will be less." The PBA's two-year deal with H5G Brands to take over merchandise sales begins July 1.

He served as a tournament director, chairperson or advisor to such events as the World DBA Championships, Pacific Coast Deaf Singles Championships PCDBA Senior Masters and the National Deaf Masters. He was the bowling chairperson for the USA Deaf Sports Federation, He fielded the best team for the USA for the Deaflympics in 2001 in Rome Italy. The team took gold in every event, singles, doubles, trios, team and match play, the team set records and some still exist today.

As a bowling writer, he started the Pacific Coast Deaf Bowlers newsletter, the Deaf Bowler magazine - the official publication of Nation Deaf Bowling Association and wrote a column for deaf bowling for the California Bowling News. Connie became a member of the Southern California Bowling Writers Association. He was elected to the SCBWA Hall of Fame and a new annual award was named after him, Connie Marchione Deaf Bowler of the year. Connie is in the PCDBA and NDBA Halls of Fame.

The overwhelming honor that Connie Marchione received is his induction in to the USBC Hall of Fame in 2007 for meritorious service, in Nashville, Tennessee.

I made the announcement of Connie's passing on Facebook. I received many comments, one stood out above the rest, it was from Mike Cammarata, manager at Del Rio Lanes. He replied, "bowling has lost a Legend".

to the No. 2 seed, averaging 248.72 over six matches.

"Honestly, I'm very happy with my performance," Sin said. "The scores were low for me during the first two days, so I had to fight really hard to qualify for the top 64. I bowled really well in match play, and it's anybody's game in a one-game match. So, no regrets."

Sin started with eight consecutive strikes on her way to the title match, defeating Colombia's Clara Guerrero, 267-224. A 4 pin in the ninth frame ended Sin's run at 300.

Guerrero advanced to the semifinal after recording a thrilling 242-232 win over Indonesia's Tannya Roumim-

Guerrero, finishing the match first, had the chance to shut out Roumimper with three strikes in her final frame but left a 10 pin on her final delivery to allow Roumimper the chance to tie with three strikes of her own. Roumimper struck on her first shot but left a 3-6 combination on her second to finish in fourth place.

In Tuesday's opening match, Roumimper struck on six of her first seven shots in a 231-195 victory over Singapore's Daphne Tan.

A total of 192 bowlers from 17 countries competed in three five-game blocks of qualifying over three days this week to determine the 63 players who joined defending champion Shannon O'Keefe of Shiloh, Illinois, in the bracket.

O'Keefe, the 2018 PWBA Player of the Year, made a strong run through the elimination bracket Sunday and Monday, before falling to Shannon Pluhowsky of Dayton, Ohio, 651-566, to finish in ninth place.

Each bracket match leading up to the stepladder included three games, with total pinfall determining which player advanced.

All rounds of competition leading up to the stepladder finals were broadcast at BowlTV.com.

with two rounds of qualifying on Sunday and Monday. Each round is eight games and there are two squads each day.

After 16 games of qualifying, all cashers will advance, though not all into the same round.

The top eight qualifiers after 16 games will be seeded directly into the second round of match play, while qualifiers ranked No. 9 through No. 16 will be seeded into the first round of match play.

The remaining cashers after qualifying, those ranked 17th or lower, will bowl a five-game cashers qualifying round with the top eight players from that round advancing into the first round of match play.

All pins are dropped before each round of match play. The first round of match play is five games with the eight cashers round advancers joining qualifiers ranked ninth through 16th. The top eight bowlers from this round will

The second round of match play is six games with the top eight from the first round of match play joining the top eight qualifiers.

When all that is said and done, the final five will bowl in the stepladder finals on Tuesday at 6:30 p.m. Pacific.

It should be noted that the event currently has 89 entries. If that total increases to 96 or more, then qualifiers nine through 24 will be seeded into the first round of match play, while those cashers who qualify 25th or lower go to the cashers round. As for the lane condition, the tournament will use the PBA Mark Roth pattern. It's a 42-foot pattern with 27.49 mL of oil and a ratio of 4.00:1.



O'Neill, Rash Win Round of 8 Matches to Complete PBA Playoffs Semifinal Matchups

Simonsen vs. Prather, O'Neill vs. Rash matches to air live at 9 a.m.on FOX on June 1 from Bayside Bowl

PORTLAND, Maine – With wins by No. 6 seed Sean Rash and No. 7 seed Bill O'Neill in their Round of 8 matches that aired Monday on FS1, the stage has been set for the historic PBA Playoffs semifinal round matches that will be televised live on FOX on Saturday, June 1, leading into Sunday's championship finals at Bayside Bowl.

O'Neill and Rash will join No. 4 seed Anthony Simonsen and No. 9 seed Kris Prather in the Race to 2 Points format semifinal matches at Noon ET with the winners advancing to the championship match on Sunday at 12:30 p.m. The winner will take home \$100,000, the richest prize of the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour season.

In Monday's first Round of 8 contest, O'Neill, the winner of the season-opening PBA Hall of Fame Classic, beat fellow 10-time Go Bowling! PBA Tour winner No. 15 seed Wes Malott in both games of the Race to 2 Points match – 229-217 and 246-202 – to advance to the semifinals.

In the first game, the 37-year-old O'Neill recovered from a 4-6-7-10 split and an open in the third frame to defeat Malott.

"I could feel myself rushing and was having a little trouble trying to calm down," said O'Neill. "I was confident in my ball reaction but had to keep telling myself to settle down so I could focus on making good shots. In the Round of 16 against Jesper (Svensson) I learned that lesson. The crowd and atmosphere here just get you so amped up which adds to the normal pressure you experience to win the match.

"It been a super season so far," O'Neill said of his journey to the semifinals. "With the help of my dad I've put in a lot of work in the offseason and it's obviously paid off. I've had a great support system all around to get to this point so I'm confident I'll be as prepared as I can be when we come back."

In the second match, No. 14 seed Dom Barrett won the first game over Rash 226-205, and seemed to be in control in the second game after starting with a spare and six straight strikes, but an eight count and spare in the eighth frame provided a hard-charging Rash with an opportunity to come back for the win. Down by 21 in the fourth frame, Rash reeled off seven strikes to take the second game 268-253 to force the ninth and 10th frame roll-off. Rash completed the comeback victory in the roll-off with four strikes and the maximum 60 pins to Barrett's 40 to ad-

vance to the semifinals.

"I was just concentrating on filling frames and hoped it was enough to beat a great player," said Rash, who won the Mark Roth-Marshall Holman Doubles Classic with Matt Ogle for his 13th tour win earlier this season. "If I hit the pocket and didn't strike, I had to re-group and make sure I made the spares.

"I had two bad shots in the first game and I paid the penalty for both of them," Rash continued. "In the second game I made a decision to move right and could have bowled a 180 or 280. Fortunately, I was closer to 280 and was able to carry that momentum into the roll-off.

"The season's been a little frustrating with some highs and lows, but right now things are good and I'm looking forward to coming back to Bayside Bowl to make some history."

Rash, who earned a first-round bye advanced to the Round of 8 with a win against No. 11 Kyle Sherman in the Round of 16. O'Neill, who also earned a bye, advanced by beating No. 23 Jesper Svensson in the Round of 16.

The journey to the PBA Playoffs semifinals started in January with the PBA Hall of Fame Classic. After 13 Go Bowling! PBA Tour tournaments – including three majors – the top 24 players on the PBA Playoffs points list earned berths in the Playoffs and a trip to Bayside Bowl for Round of 24, 16 and 8 matches that aired on FS1 over the past eight weeks.



PBA REGIONAL UPDATE: KUBA TOPS PATE FOR FIRST REGIONAL TITLE

- Matt Kuba of Chicago Ridge, Ill. defeated Nick Pate of Inner Grove Heights, Minn., 242-236, to win \$2,500 and his first PBA Regional title in the PBA Glo Bowl Midwest Open presented by 900 Global at Glo Bowl Fun Center in Marengo, Ill., Saturday. Kuba defeated Jakob Butturff of Tempa, Ariz., 232-223, to advance to the championship match after Kuba downed Nick Kruml of Downers Grove, Ill., 237-214, in the first stepladder match.
- Stoney Baker of Canton, Ga., defeated PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Oxford, Fla., 247-224, to take the first prize in the PBA50 Canton South Open presented by Roto Grip at Cherokee Lanes in Canton, Ga., Sunday, improving his all-time PBA titles total to 31.

Baker qualified in second place for the stepladder finals with an 5-3 match play record and a 16-game total of 3,800 pins, including match play bonus pins, and then won two consecutive matches to earn the \$1,700 first prize. Williams, who led from the start to the title match, posted an 4-4 match play record and had 3,975 pins to qualify first, 175 pins ahead of Baker, but had to settle for the \$900 second prize. After Williams took the lead with an early double, Baker rolled six consecutive strikes to take the commanding lead.

In the first stepladder match Joe Beck of Montgomery, Ala. defeated Dave Han of Birmingham, Ala., 188-181. Baker then disposed of Beck, 214-161, in the semifinal match.

• Cole Schroyer, a non-PBA member from Stanton, Texas, pulled ahead of the field late in the 13-game qualifying round and then won seven of his eight matches in the modified round-robin finals to thoroughly dominate the competition in the second annual PBA Waxahachie Southwest Challenge Sunday at Hilltop Lanes in Waxahachie, Texas.

Schroyer had built a lead of more than 100 pins early in the match play portion of the finals and added to it throughout his first six matches. He then put a stamp on clinching the victory with the tournament's high game of 296 in the seventh game, taking an insurmountable 341-pin lead into the final position round match. For his victory, he earned the \$2,000 winner's check, but as a non-member, he won't receive credit for a PBA title. PBA Challenge events are open only to players who have not previously won a PBA title.

Norm Duke Takes PBA50 Northern California Classic Lead

Former major league pitcher John Burkett trails by 45 pins in bid for his PBA50 Tour title

BRENTWOOD, Calif. (May 27, 2019) - Norm Duke of Clermont, Florida, seeking his first PBA50 Tour title of the 2019 season, advanced from fourth place into the lead in the PBA50 Northern California Classic presented by MOTIV title Monday at Harvest Park Bowl.

Duke, a five-time PBA Tour titlist, rolled games of 243, 168, 248, 229, 254, 279 and 248 Monday for an eight-game total of 1,904 and a 16-game total of 3,836 pins – a 239.75 average – to take a 45-pin lead over former major league baseball pitcher John Burkett of Fort Worth, Texas.

Duke, 55, earlier this year won his 39th and 40th titles in Go Bowling! PBA Tour competition to become the third player in PBA Tour history to win 40 titles. In his two PBA50 Tour appearances in 2019, he finished fifth in the season-opening PBA50 Johnny Petraglia BVL Open in Clearwater, Florida, and third in the PBA50 National Championship in The Villages, Florida.

Burkett, 54, is trying for his first PBA50 Tour title in his fifth year as a "senior" player. Burkett, who grew up bowling in the Pittsburgh area, finished fourth in the 2015 Northern California Classic for his best career PBA50 Tour finish.

Bob Rosenau of Redding, California, retained third place with 3,778 pins. He was followed by Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Oxford, Florida, with a 3,769 total and Parker Bohn III of Jackson, New Jersey, with 3,734 pins.

Tuesday's five-game cashers round begins at 8 a.m. Pacific followed by two eight-game modified round robin match play rounds to determine the top five players for the stepladder finals at 6:30 p.m.




