Tis Time To Tap Saturday At Cal

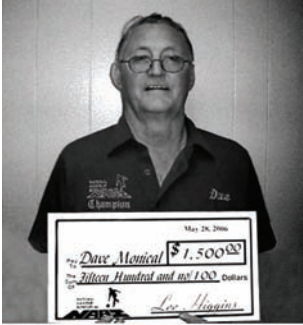

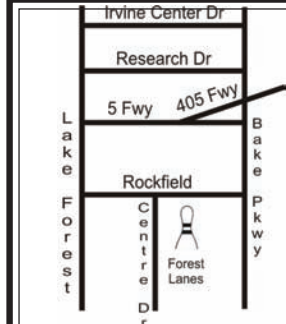
The Memory Walk which consisted of nearly 50 - 11X17 sheets of pictures from our history albums which contained convention and hospitality photos, were put together by Joan Scharsch and all were labeled. Joan also added a "before and after" of numerous board members many vintage 20 to 25 years. Nuggets from our files going back to the first issue in 1950 were set out for people to take and this thrilled publicity people who found treasures they didn't know existed. Also included were old tournament promotion posters. Six lighted ficus trees nestled among the displays created a warm welcome.

The CWBA board of directors, Life Members and Members Emeritae were dressed in black or Navy and each wore a specially made scarf by Jan Morzov. California WBA Retires

The pomp and circumstance was there but the hearts of nearly 300 delegates were not. The California Women's Bowling Association brought a close to 82 years of tending the women bowlers of California on May 21, 2006.

The room was transformed into a classroom setting following a gala evening of celebration and the two tiers for officers and directors were filled following the traditional bringing in of the flags and the final parade of association flags followed to the music of our own Ellen Patterson. Each association flag bearer bowed to the delegates and brought their individual flags back to their assigned district area.

President Linda Johnson called her final meeting to order and introduced the board of directors and Life Members and Members Emerita present. Special guests included Al Hoffmann of Novato, President of the newly formed USBC California association and Larry Peppers of Petaluma, interim Manager of the association.

A moving memorial service to honor departed members with special memory of past CWBA President Mary Hinman was brought to the delegation by Phil Severance of Sonoma.

The delegation was greeted by Host Association President Irene Raff and Secretary Delinda Mitchell as well as Sacramento Hostess Association Chairman Barbara Metzinger.

The impressive bios of the Stars of Tomorrow were read and Nicole Miller of Petaluma and Jerell Maneja of South San Francisco will take their place on the roster of distinguished Stars

honored over the years by CWBA. Maneja gave an impressive acceptance as he outlined how important this honor was to him.

Laura Hardeman and Kim Terrell were added to the CWBA Hall of Fame for Superior Performance and both were thrilled to be included in the prestigious CWBA Hall.

Chairmen of the Senior Tournament (Phil Severance and Leslie Spears), the Princess Tournament (Sherry Howe) and Queens Tournament (Mabel Sheasley) all reported for the last time. It was probably most nostalgic for Phil and Leslie who have seen the tournament through most of 25 seasons.

The 41st Annual Queen's Tournament will be held July 8-9, 2006 at Fireside Lanes in Citrus Heights and thanks to sponsors there is \$3200 in added prize money. Entries close July 1.

The Princess Tournament will be held in Antelope Valley at Brunswick Vista Lanes on October 13-15, 2006 and the Senior Tournament is in Indio at Fantasy Lanes and is being hosted by the Citrus Belt WBA. Entry deadline is June 15th.

Editor of the California Nugget Jan Hogue announced that there would be one more issue published, a wrap-up issue.

A final report from the Transition Team advised the delegation that programs being continued will be the above tournaments and a Kick-Off for the 2007 Tournament in San Diego will be held at the Town & Country Hotel in September, the site of the 2007 convention which will be held June 2-3.

New, and being passed out to the bowlers is the "Advanced Entry" form. Any team can reserve the date and time of their choice by returning the form with a \$100 deposit and in October you will be mailed an entry form to be filled in with the

remaining money by November 1. This has proven to already be popular with 17 returned the first weekend.

USBC National Director Elaine Hagin brought a message from USBC concerning the new philosophy as opposed to the old and said their goal was more value for your membership and they feel their future is bright.

BVL awarded four associations who exceeded the \$10,000 mark – Citrus Belt WBA, Napa-Sonoma WBA, Orange County USBC and the San Fernando Valley/Los Angeles USBC. Once again, a fantastic total so far and at the close of the meeting the amount totaled \$206,071.16. Winners of the recent roll-off were announced.

Tournament Director Melissa Ade announced the Early Bird award (entering the tournament by November 1) was an Orange County team and Tournament Recognition Awards went to the following: Orange County (most teams,) Marin County (most teams based on membership,) and Sacramento (hosting the tournament.)

Joan Romeo of Van Nuys was honored as the 2006 Distinguished Service recipient. Joan has been a valuable asset to CWBA and bowling in California as an advisor and providing sponsor and organizational support.

Mary Lynly reported on the Celebration 2006 show and dinner and said it had been enjoyed by all with nearly 400 attending the show and 335 enjoying dinner.

The California Bowling Writers reported on their successful luncheon with 97 in attendance and announced that Mary Lynly will serve as the new president. The 500 and 600 clubs reported and the 15-Year Club announced their charitable donations of \$600 giving \$100 each to: the Senior Tournament, Princess

Tournament, Queen's Tournament, Team USA, BVL and the International Museum and Bowling Hall of Fame. Their new president is Bobbie Kabage.

The tears flowed as the CWBA flag was retired in a military folding ceremony by the past presidents. The flag was then given to the ranking CWBA president, Agnes Duffy of Sonoma.

As we vacated our California WBA and ceded to the new USBC organization the feeling was - what next? We are one of only five states who are merged. We all hope for the best but an empty feeling was in the pit of most people's stomach as to the future of our state organization.

National Deaf Bowling News

Pacific Coast Deaf Bowling Association Results at Canoga Park Bowl

WINNETKA—Pacific Coast Deaf Bowling Association drew a low of 22 teams for its 70th annual tournament last Memorial day weekend but the scores at Canoga Park Bowl were high and exciting for so few teams. Los Angeles Club for the Deaf had entered a team or two for most of the past tournaments had won for its second time. The last time it won was in the tournament’s 7th annual event back in 1948.

LACD “B” team composed of Capt. Bob Kerker, Jose Gonzales, Charles Baxter, Dan Flores, and Devin Barnes scored games of 941-1073-1097 for 3111plus 495 handicap for the winning 3606 total, The team will split the \$1550.00 prize.

Barnes led the team with 206-215-256/677and closely followed by Gonzales’ 192-268-242/672. Its 1097 and 3111 are probable PCDBA records and its 3606 is 10 pins short of the record made last year in Hawaii.

Twenty-four pins back in 2nd place were So. Calif. Deaf Bowlers#2’ 3582 from games of 985-941-1011 plus 645 handicap. Robert G. “Bob” Jones led the team with 235-226-249/team event high 712. Third place went to LACD “A” team with a whooping 870 handicap 3577 score. Stavios Baucom led this team with 213/581.

Last place 7th to cash was Shut Up and Bowl pick up team’s 3417 pacing with Hawaiian Eric Dela Pena’s 695 (206-277-212). With Dela Pena’s 277 as the event’s high individual game, besides Jones’ high 712 series, other 700 series were Denver Joseph Hershfeldt’s 223-266-214/703 and So. Calif. Darrell Stogryn’s 222-245-235/702. Robert Ellison, San Diego missed a 700 by one pin

with his 699.

COLLIER & LEE WIN DOUBLES EVENT WITH NEW RECORD 1526 WITH HANDICAP

Hawaiian pair of Ralph Collier and Barrett Lee led a set of 5 other duos in breaking the old record of 1490 with handicap with their 1526. Collier rolled 248-204-277 for the event’s top series of 730 and Lee, Las Vegas did 192-226-234 for 652 in their doubles games of 440-431-511 and 1382 plus 144 handicap. They will share the \$700.00 prize.

So. Calif. pair of Richard Pennington and Andy Lorenzo together rolled 412-465-383 for 1260 plus 258 hdp for 1518 for 2nd place. The host Golden State Deaf duo of Joseph Weiss and John Segafredo had doubles games of 429-413-383/1225 plus 282 for 1507 for 3rd and Jerry Grigsby, Livermore and Gene Takinen, Phoenix paired for 408-426-432/1266 plus 237 for 4th place 1503. Two other teams broke the old record with 1499 and 1491. Last place 14th to cash is score of 1433. Doubles teams with high scratch game and doubles series of 1300 were Barry Cossman (288/717) and Tommy Koerwitz (224) 512 and 1347, Nicholas Rivera and Dela Pena 480 & 1357 and Ed Abakumoff and Darrell Stogryn (713) 468 and 1355.

SAGER WITH 874 SHATTERS SINGLES RECORD KING HITS 299 AND HERNANDEZ 298

Angel West Deaf’s Marvin Sager who entered with 146 average, rolled his lifetime best series 664 with games of 205-235-224 in the singles event. Sager’s 664 with his whopping handicap of 210 gave him a BIG 874 record total which shattered the old handicap record of 830 by a wide margin. Sager will get \$350.00 for his efforts.

Angel West Deaf’s Javier Hernandez and Las Vegas’ Tommy Hoerwitz also broke the old record with their 847 and 833 respectively. Hernandez, Sacramento’s Kirby King and Robby Pyper, Santa Maria stirred excitement with the crowd expecting a 300 game or two in the afternoon squad’s 2nd game with their 10 strikes in row. Pyper was first to fail as he left a pin and spared for a 289. Hernandez and King made their 11th strikes but on their 12th ball,

Hernandez left two pins for a 298 and King a pin for 299.

In his 847, Hernandez sandwiched his 298 with 195 and 245 for 738 plus 108 handicap for 2nd place. Koerwitz’s 833 consisted of 246-245-258 plus 84 handicap for 3rd place. An 815 for 4th place was made by So. Calif. Don Millwee with his 248-255-169 plus 144 handicap.

King’s 299 was sandwiched with 225 and 259 for top scratch series of 783 and a meager 6 handicap (for his 218 average) for 789 tie in 5th place. The low score in the money 28th place is 736. Bowlers with 700 series in the money were Patrick Stecker 705/777 for 7th, Ed Abakumoff, 705/750 for 16th and Pyper 703/739 for 24th. Darrell Stogryn had a 725 but his zero handicap put him out of money.

SAGER ALSO SHATTERS ALL-EVENTS RECORD WITH BIG 2326

Marvin Sager’s tremendous 664 in singles along with his 527 in team and 505 in doubles for 1696 total pins and a huge 630 handicap gave him an unheard of 2336 total for 1st place and \$300 in all-events. His 2326 and two others, Javier Hernandez’s 2313 and Rudy Martinez’s 2253 shattered the old record of 2251 made last year.

Hernandez’s 2313 came from his 654 in team, 738 in singles and 597 in doubles for his lifetime best 1969 total pins plus 324 handicap. Martinez’s 2253 had 530 in team, 508 in singles and 621 in doubles plus 594 handicap.

The 10th last place in money is the 2205 total by Eric Dela Pena from 695-680-677 for 2052 plus 153 handicap. Other respected scratch 2000 all events out of money were made by Darrell Stogryn’s top 2140 from 702-725-713, Robert G. Jones’ 2083 from 712-698-673, Ralph Collier 2054 from 639-685-730 and Robert Ellison’s 2003 from 699-673-633. There were also eight 1900s.

LAKE FOREST — Bowling is a peaceful sport. The AMF-Bowling World Cup sanctioned by the Federation International Des Quilleurs, has been active since 1965 starting in Jack Murphy's 12-lane Stillorgan Bowl (Dublin, Ire.) with 22 nations participating.

Orange County Register recently printed a Chicago Tribune Iraq war story by Aamer Madnani, bowlers battle to keep their sport rolling.

Apparently Bagdad had a few ten-pin centers, had a bowling federation, had many enthusiastic sport fans and the Iraq Olympic Committee budgeted \$50,000 for their 2006 national bowling team.

In the 60s Kuwait was one of the first to send a FIQ sanctioned representative. By 1972 all continents with ten-pin centers had reps. K. Kiani, Iran placed third and in 1988 Mohamed Khalifa, United Arab Emirates won the Guadalajara, Mex. title.

The media tried to create problems but the players ignored them. They loved amateur ten-pins and were more interested in improving their game.

Part of the \$50,000 was to maintain what's left of the dilapidated Al-Gazal center. They have a star, Maher Abdul Hussein, their Federation's champion. He is currently in Amman, Jordan practicing and managing a center.

LaythTommy Thomas the Federation president said, "If we could only have something like they have in Amman, I know our bowlers could raise the Iraqi flag over the Arab world."

This writer since 1968 covered 23 BWCs. Bowlers just seemed to be happy, friendly, left their hostility at home. From events with only 20 nations the next "Cup" in South America is expected to lure nearly 100 nations.

Yes, maybe we could play games, bowling games, and solve our problems peacefully.

There seems to be some Iraqis that think games, sports can help world peace — \$50,000 worth?

We can do better than that!

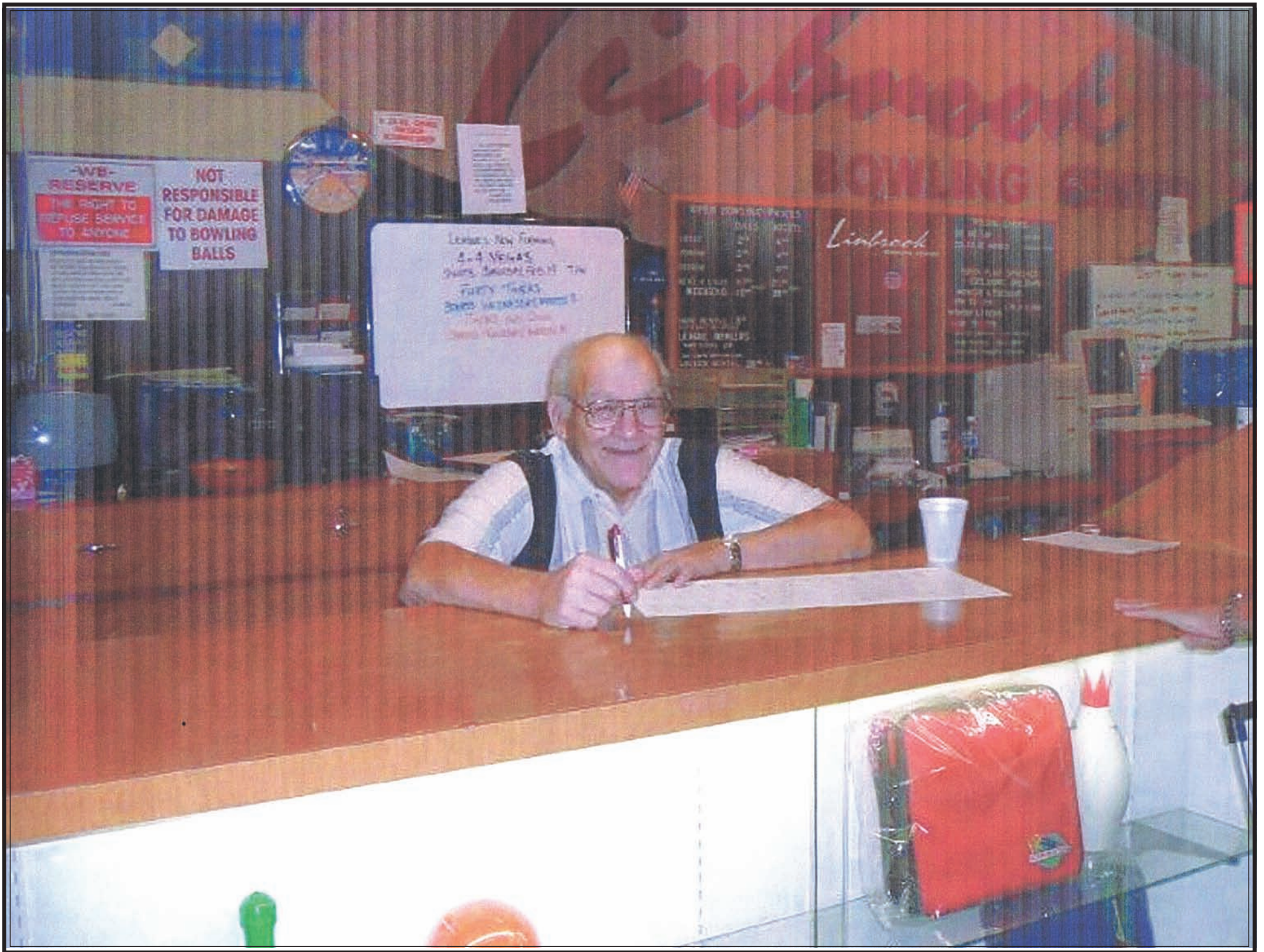
