

Memorial Day Etiquette For Bowlers

Many bowlers have served our country with honor. Many bowlers have given their life's that we may be free. Free to speak, free to worship and free to pursue happiness as we choose. Oh yes, and **FREE TO BOWL!** Memorial Day is celebrated by bowlers nationwide so let us understand why we do and how we should.

Memorial Day is all about remembering those who gave their lives to preserve our freedom. It **is a "solemn day"** that deserves more attention than it's given today. We owe those who gave the ultimate sacrifice so much. **They gave their lives for us. They gave their lives for YOU!**

I consider Memorial Day as important as any other National Holiday. **Abraham Lincoln** said it best when in his **Gettysburg Address** he said that we cannot dedicate, we cannot consecrate, we cannot hallow the ground in which our war dead are buried any better than they themselves did in fighting and dying to preserve this nation. Nonetheless, we must never forget what these soldiers did.

That remembrance is what Memorial Day is all about. Honoring our war dead.

We must always remember; we must forever ensure that Memorial Day be celebrated. We owe it to those who made the ultimate sacrifice, we owe it to the nation, we owe it to ourselves.

What then is Memorial Day, what is its history and its traditions?

Memorial Day has been a tradition in the United States since the Civil War. Back in the day it started with ordinary citizens honoring their loved ones who gave their lives in battle. They did so by holding springtime tributes, decorating gravesites with flowers and reciting prayers. Some communities began celebrating with parades, speeches, and picnics. Still there was no official holiday.

Eventually some states and local communities set aside a day of remembrance in honor of our fallen war heroes. At first this solemn holiday was called **Decoration Day** because of the tradition of visiting cemeteries and decorating gravesites.

While there is a record of a soldier's memorial celebration in Charleston, South Carolina in 1865 the Federal Government declared Waterloo, New York as the official birthplace of Memorial Day.

Waterloo first celebrated Memorial Day on May 5, 1866 with an annual community-wide event, during which businesses were closed and residents decorated the graves of soldiers with flowers and flags.

General John A. Logan, the leader of a Northern Civil War veterans organization called for a nationwide day of remembrance on May 5, 1868, later that month on May 30, 1868. On that first so call Decoration Day **General James Garfield** spoke at Arlington National Cemetery. Five thousand participants decorated 20,000 graves of Civil War soldiers.

Decades passed and many Decoration Days came and went. Still no official National Holiday. Finally United States Congressional legislation went into effect in 1971 making Memorial Day a National Holiday. Now Memorial Day is officially celebrated on the last Monday in May.

Confusion sometimes exists about what is the difference between Memorial Day, Veterans Day and Armed Forces Day. Memorial Day honors those men and women who died while serving in the military. Veterans Day honors our military veterans living and deceased and Armed Forces Day honors the men and women currently serving in the military.

What about Memorial Day customs? It is customary to fly the flag nationwide. Proper protocol calls for the flag to be flown at half-staff in the morning, until noon. At noon the flag should be raised to full-staff. In the morning, when lowering the flag to half-staff the flag should first be raised to full-staff before lowering it to half-staff. The flag should never be lowered from the poll from a half-staff position. The flag is always raised to full-staff before lowering and removing it from a flag poll.

Did you know that 3 P.M. local time on Memorial Day is special? At that time **A NATIONAL MOMENT OF REMEMBRANCE** takes place every year on Memorial Day? **SILENCE PLEASE!** Where were you and what were you doing at 3 P.M. on Memorial Day?

Speaking of custom and tradition: **Never wish anyone "Happy Memorial Day"**. It is considered impolite.

Many people celebrating Memorial Day wear a red **POPPY** flower in their lapel or on their collar as a mode of remembrance for our fallen comrades. It all started with a World War I poem "In Flanders Fields". This tradition became popular after "**The War To End All War**" and was popularized by the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) organization. As a young man I fondly remember this custom. **Those were the days when bowlers loved their country!**

5th-11th) for the USBC Senior Masters. For those that aren't aware, Sam's Town is only about 4 miles south of the venerable Showboat Lanes site on Boulder Highway.

The Showboat, later known as Castaways, officially closed its doors on January 29, 2004. I remember both locations so well, as AMF's New College Park Bowl was in competition with both of these historic icons for league customers. To be in contention with either Sam's Town or The Showboat is a bit of an oxymoron, since the only gambling devices we had to compete with their luxurious casinos were one-armed bandits and a couple of bingo pinball machines. But somehow, we held our own within the local community.

The highlight of the senior circuit this year will be the first ever PBA50 World Series of Bowling, which will be broadcast from JAX60 in Jackson, Michigan, from July 15th to the 23rd. The event will feature four title tournaments, including the main-event PBA50 World Championship, which will boast a first place prize of \$25,000. Similar to the PBA Tour's World Series, the Senior World Series will have multiple oil patterns. Let's hope they keep the same oil pattern on both lanes during the respective events, for the sanity of the senior competitors!

It's always fascinating to see how the PBA coordinate the events in terms of geographical location. I can remember how it was always a bit of a struggle to travel from Denver to Dallas, or Southern California to Oregon in a period of 1 or 2 days. We usually had no time to stop and see the physical and historical sites along the way. Thankfully I was usually traveling with Larry Laub and others in his motorhome, and he always seemed to make each trip itinerary a priority. Whenever time would allow, he would stop to see and enjoy the sites. One that I remember fondly was his annual trip to the Russian River rapids near Cloverdale. California.

A look at the 2023 schedule finds that travel will still be excruciating for most of those frail bodies over age 50. You probably won't find this analysis anywhere else, but here's what the old timers are up against in terms of distances:

- · Las Vegas, NV to Greeley, CO: 807 miles (12 hours)
- Greeley, CO to Columbus, OH: 1,274 miles (19 hours)
- Columbus, OH to Hammond, IN: 332 miles (5 hours)
- Hammond, IN to Jackson, MI: 186 miles (3 hours)
- · Jackson, MI to Morgantown, WV: 373 miles (6 hours)
- Morgantown, WV to Sterling, VA: 198 miles (3 hours)
- Sterling, VA to The Villages, FL: 835 miles (13 hours)
- The Villages, FL to Ft. Myers, FL: 199 miles (3 hours) Ft. Myers, FL to Lakeland, FL: 110 miles (2 hours)

In addition to the travel on the road, you also have to contend with hotel arrangements, transportation to and from the bowling center, laundry, food and a myriad of other decisions. How anyone could accomplish all of this and still be married with children is beyond me, which is probably why I remained single for all those years.

Virtually all of the bowlers that I can remember competing against have retired from both the regular and senior tour, with the exception of Johnny Petraglia. At the age of 76, he continues to participate in many events. Larry Laub will be turning 80 this year, as will Nelson Burton Jr.! Where does time go?


Last season the legendary Parker Bohn III, age 59, won PBA50 Player of the Year honors, winning 4 titles and leading the senior tour in earnings with \$62,435. Chris Barnes was a distant second with \$49,400 in earnings, and senior rookie sensation Dino Castillo finished third with \$37,250. Other top names that figure to compete in 2023 events include Walter Ray Williams Jr., Pete Weber, Jason Couch, Amleto Monacelli and Ron Mohr.

decade covering the bowlers and bowling events of California, Bob wrote with style and grace about everything from outstanding league accomplishments to local sweeper results to pro tournaments.

Among his most-remembered feature stories were several about Glenn Allison's 900 series (at La Habra "300" Bowl in 1982), one about Pete McCordic's televised 300 game (at Gable House Bowl in Torrance in 1987) and one about how local bowlers and other residents prevented Midtown Bowl in Los Angeles from being burned down during the so-called "Rodney King riots" in 1992.

Bob also began writing feature stories for Bowlers Journal, Bowling Digest and Junior Bowler magazines. He wrote features about President Richard Nixon (a native of Whittier.) and "Peanuts" comic strip creator Charles M. Schulz (a long-time resident of Sonoma County).

During his career, Bob has served as Editor of six national magazines — Bowlers Journal International, Bowling Center Management, Bowling Entertainment Center, Pro Shop Operator, International Bowling Industry (then based in Westlake Village) and even a short stint with Bowling, the ABC magazine. He also was a volunteer member of the SoCal Bowling Writers Association for many years, serving as one of the presenters at the annual SoCal Bowling All-Star Awards Banquet and writing stories about the various award winners for the local media.

Johnson has won more than 80 national writing awards — earning him inductions into three national bowling halls of fame: USBC (2019), PBA (2019) and International Bowling Media Association (2009).

This year, California will honor Bob where he spent a significant portion of his career. Congratulations Bob!

Hall of Fame Professional Performance - Barry Asher

Barry Asher is bowling lifer. He has been inducted into 8 Halls of Fame, has 10 National PBA titles, 4 USBC Open Championship titles and owns a pro shop inside Fountain Bowl in Fountain Valley. What some of you may not know are the cool things that Barry has done because he IS a bowling lifer. His father was a prop man on the set of Lassie that ran back in the 50's to 70's so Barry visited the set often. Barry also bowled league with the infamous Roy Rogers at Reseda Bowl and the coolest thing is that Barry was the technical adviser for the movie, the "Big Lebowski". For 10 days he was on set making sure that the bowling scenes were authentic. Barry was also was invited to Ken Griffey Jr.'s Hall of Fame induction. I'm sure they all celebrated later in Barry's bowling pin shaped swimming pool. Congratulations Barry! California is so proud to honor you.

Hall of Fame Professional Performance – Michael McGrath (posthumous)
Mike McGrath from Petaluma was nominated for this induction by his good
friend, Barry Asher. Mike grew up at Golden Gate Lanes in El Cerrito (East Bay)

and started his professional bowling career at age 19 winning his first event in 1965.

Mike won back-to-back PBA National Championships in 1969 and 1970 when he was the tour's leading money winner. McGrath finished his career with 10 tour titles, \$238,305 in career earnings and the legacy of being one of the top left-handers in the PBA. McGrath is a member of the PBA Hall of Fame (1988), the USBC Hall of Fame (1993) and this year, a member of the California USBC Hall of Fame posthumously. We sadly lost Mike in 2017 at the age of 71. He will be honored posthumously by his good friend Barry Asher, who is also being inducted this year.

Hall of Fame Superior Performance – Bill Bunetta (posthumous)

Bill Bunetta has a long history with bowling starting in the 1960s. He was intrigued with instruction, development and coaching of many PBA members on the tour and became known as the "Professor". Many of those that he helped became PBA Hall of Famers. Bill also implemented many rules and regulations that are still used today on the PBA tour including the top 5 stepladder finals format.

Bill also mentored Nelson Burton Jr. as a broadcaster. AMF sent Nelson Burton Jr. to travel with Bill as his understudy for a year. Bill himself was a familiar and popular bowling personality as a TV color commentator and competitor on the popular TV show "Championship Bowling" in the early to the mid-1960's. Bill was also a commentator on "Celebrity Bowling," "Make that Spare," and "Jackpot Bowling." He shared the mic with such legendary voices as Fred Wolfe of "Championship Bowling"; Jack Drees, the famous voice for ABC and CBS; Bud Palmer, sportscaster and former NBA basketball player for the NY Knicks; ABC sports commentator Keith Jackson, who on March 2, 1969 called the PBA San Jose Open where Johnny Guenther rolled the PBA's second-ever televised 300 game; and Chris Schenkel, the legendary broadcaster (the voice) for bowling on Wide World of Sports along with Nelson Burton Jr.

A lot has been said about Bill as a bowler, an instructor, a theorist and ambassador of the sport of bowling. It has also been said that Bill was one of the finest and most pleasant men to meet. His character, kindness and love for his family and fellow man was extraordinary. His love for life and his passions were infectious and were felt by everybody that came in contact with him.

Bill had an unprecedented career that saw almost every facet of the sport of bowling. He is an author on ball drilling, a member of 8 Halls of Fame, has 5 USBC Open Championships titles, holds CA State Championships record for most consecutive strikes bowled in one series (32); is the second oldest bowler to shoot 300 in CA State Championships at age 76, has taught in all 50 states and 21 different countries, is a 6X World Team Champion with E&B and Pfeiffers and even has 2 holes in one in golf! Just prior to his passing in 2010, Bill was the recipient of an award re-named in his honor by the IBPSIA. This honor is much overdue, and we are proud to honor Bill posthumously this year.






