## Bowling's Decline

NORWALK — It goes without saying. Bowling has been in an alarming decline for the past 20 to 25 years.

There are various reasons for the shrinking numbers. Some are very obvious, while others remain unanswered. One of the most obvious causes is the ever-increasing market value of real estate; so much, in fact, that in numerous cases, many bowling establishments with thriving businesses have relented to astronomical offers and chosen the easier path to retirement. In fact, many proprietors have profited as much as three times the value of their prime real estate locations, plus the advantages of keeping their equipment for possible relocation.

During the past three years, two of the most successful bowling centers in Southern California have succumbed to these tempting offers, thus eliminating over 100 lane beds.

You don't have to be a rocket scientist to weigh these type decisions.

What would any sane person do? Assuming you owned a business that continually faced ever-increasing insurance costs, 24-hour vigilance, never-ending promotional efforts, the constant anxiety of maintaining leagues and, of course, the shrinking membership in the United States Bowling Congress, what would you do?

If you came to the conclusion that your love of the sport was paramount, you would either be a multi-millionaire or an extremely irrational businessman. Of course, the thought of selling one's bowling establishment and collecting sums of money beyond the imagination would be a no-brainer to anyone past the age of 60. As a matter of fact, even individuals in their early years would be hard-pressed to decline offers that would retire them for life.

While the closing of bowling centers is but one of the major reasons for the decline of the game, several other factors have contributed to the decreasing figures in bowling. One of the major woes of bowling was the smoking environment that existed. As of late, many, in fact most of the bowling centers in America have adopted the Cali-

fornia policy of banning smoking anywhere in the bowling center, including the bars and lounges.

The closing of so many bowling centers, especially those within short distances for league play, has also affected the shrinking numbers. Late leagues (2nd shift) have practically disappeared. For early league participants, the longer distances between homes and bowling centers have posed two disadvantages. For example, bowlers who participate in 6 o'clock leagues are forced to drive in heavy traffic. Additionally, the crime rate, especially after dark in larger cities, has dampened the spirits of concerned citizens.

In my opinion, gambling has become one of the main culprits in the reduction of league play. Perhaps I may be in the minority regarding the damaging effect that gambling has played in the declining numbers in our sport. Years ago, when brackets infiltrated bowling in tournaments and later spread into league play. I voiced my opposition to what I considered an illegal and dangerous practice. In fact, I confronted the late ABC Executive-Secretary Darold Dobs (God rest his soul) and expressed my opposing views...but to no avail. Mr. Dobs, whom I considered one of the greatest leaders in ABC history, maintained it was not gambling but instead, an opportunity for individual bowlers to pit their skills against other bowlers. Rather than initiating a great furor over the subject, I decided not to pursue the matter any further, yet couldn't help wondering what Frank Baker, the former venerable squeaky-clean ABC Executive's position would have been. I'm almost positive Mr. Baker would have NEVER permitted anything that was slightly related to gambling.

If operating brackets isn't gambling, what are pot games, jackpots, or side bets considered during league or tournament play? I vividly recall a famous tournament in San Antonio years ago where brackets were running rampant. During this activity, several members of the vice squad walked in, confiscated all the money, and arrested the brackets operator. Could this have happened if brackets were legal?

If I sound prudish, reserved, or over-modest, perish the thought. In my younger years, I did more than my share of gambling, in and out of bowling com-



# National Deaf Bowling News

## Pacific Coast Deaf Masters Results at Canoga Park Bowl Undeatefated Ellison Beats Jones In Title Finals, Mike Moore Hits 300

WINNETKA—It took 18 long years for Robert Ellison to win his 2nd Pacific Coast Deaf Bowling Association’s 45th annual Connie Marchione Masters, so named after this writer when he started the first one for deaf bowlers in 1961. The tall slender right hander from San Diego won his first one in Seattle back in 1988, the scene where he first met the Deaf Masters’ namesake. Ellison also made the title finals on 1993 when he lost to Lance Picha in all San Diego finals.

In winning his 2nd title, Ellison beat a hot scoring but tiring Bob Jones from Chatsworth, in the two game match 221+217/438 to 197+225/422. In the first game Ellison ran ahead with 5 strikes in row from 2nd frame to 6th and struck three more from 8th to 10th while Jones started with two strikes and did not double again till 6th frame. Jones’ 197 was his first game under 200 after 15 consecutive 200+ games since his 173 first round match starting game, which he rallied to win by one pin with a 202 game. Ellison kept clean in his 2nd game while Jones got better but could not get enough strings of strikes to catch up.

Prior to meeting Ellison in the championship finals. Jones beat Mike Moore, Norwalk, 234+258/482 to 213+215/438.

Two rounds earlier Moore had rolled his 2nd career 300 game after a 235 start for a high 535 match series. Jones also beat upcoming Patrick Stecker, Costa Mesa 214+231/445 to 192+219/411.

In this high scoring match plays, Jones probably has the highest average for his 20 games. Some scoring gems besides Moore’s 300 and 535, LeRoy MacMonagle, Moreno Valley started his first round with 244+279 for 523 but in the next round Gene Takinen, Phoenix took the high match series honors with his 268+269/537. Besides MacMonagle’s 279, Jones, Ralph Collier, Hawaii, and Bruce Tan, Jr, San Diego also hit 279s.

There were a low of 53 entries and Barry Cossman, Las Vegas led

the 4 games qualifying round with 949 (227-254-191-277). Jones followed him with 947 (224-213-231-279) and Bert Enos, Hayward 3rd 929 (205-201-268-255). The eventual champion Ellison was 6th with 880 and a woman Stacey Thompson, Kansas City, qualified for the first time in this Masters’ history with 247-213/844 for 15th. A 162 average Bob Kerker, Palmdale’s 774 in 32nd place was the low score to qualify.

This 45th edition Deaf Masters which drew a low of 53 entries, had a rule change limited entries to bowlers under 210 average which made higher average deaf bowlers stay away participating in the regular tournament. In the past 35 year excluding last year’s, which had 63 entries at Hawaii, the unlimited average Crown Jewel Deaf Masters drew 100 or more entries. With all the high scores rolled in this one by 210 and under bowlers, it made no sense excluding the over 210 average bowlers.

**SEGAFREDO BATTLES BACK TO DEFEAT RODGERS FOR SENIOR MASTERS’ TITLE**

WINNETKA—Pacific Coast Deaf Bowling Association’s Don Miller Senior Masters with its namesake benefactor passed away a couple months ago, drew a low of 28 age of 60 plus deaf entrants. The number is the lowest, not counting the 20 last year in Hawaii, since 36 entered in 2002 at Concord. Before that it was 39 in its first year 1989.

John Segafredo, Granada Hills bowling in his first Miller’s Senior Masters fought back after being defeated by Gardy Rodgers, Los Angeles 173-225 in the 4th round. In the loser’s bracket Segafredo eliminated former two time champion Don Millwee, Lawndale 209 to 191 and former champion Pete Morreale, Las Vegas 182 to 168 to get in the title finals against Rodgers.

In the Championship finals Segafredo gave Rodgers his first loss, 232-175 and another match was needed for one to be eliminated. Rodgers fought hard but his 182 was not enough to beat Segafredo’s 218. In becoming the 15th champion in this Senior Masters’ 18 years, Segafredo averaged 202 for his 8 games. Rodgers as the runner-up averaged a creditable 193 for 6 games.

As the event’s qualifying basis, 28 entrants used their regular Pacific Coast Deaf Tournament scratch all-events scores and former champion Jose Gonzales, Bakersfield led with record high 1971 (672 team, 667 singles, 632 doubles). Segafredo was 2nd with 1808 and Millwee third with 1787. Morreale’s 1571 was the low cot score for 18th place. Next year’s Pacific Coast Deaf Bowling Association tournaments will be held at Denver with both men’s and women’s tournaments in one center, AMF Northglenn Lanes.

petition. I know what gambling denotes... and brackets in bowling IS gambling. And again, it doesn't require a degree in accounting to realize the damage being inflicted on league bowlers who engage in brackets, side pots, and other forms of gambling. Bowlers who were accustomed to bowling three or four leagues a week can no longer afford this luxury. Although the price of league play has increased over the years, it is petty compared to the cost of engaging in brackets and side pots (which can run from \$30 to \$65 per night). At this rate, who can afford to bowl more than once a week, unless you are the BIG KAHUNA in the bowling center and enjoy a great advantage over your "bowling buddies".

While I maintain that gambling has inflicted as much damage on league bowling as any other factor, rising property values; greater selection of recreational choices; as well as the fact both men and women are working harder and longer to maintain today's lifestyle, not leaving much time and cash for bowling.

On a brighter note, proprietors are making up for loses by coming up with creative ways to bring in revenue, stimulate interest in bowling and at the same time providing the venue where people can enjoy themselves.. I see bowling centers filled to capacity with parties for both the young and the old. The glow and cosmic bowling have been a hit as well. .

Being as involved in the bowling world to the extent that I am, I still see a core of people that love bowling both sport and recreation to the same degree that I saw in my youth. Of course, only time will tell what the future holds for bowling; but it sure has been around for a very long time; has survived the test of time in that it has been here since the early civilizations. That's staying power!




