## Bowling's Top Senior Players Return To Las Vegas For ABC Senior Masters

GREENDALE, Wis.—A capacity field of 384 players will compete for one of senior bowling's most prestigious titles when the 13th American Bowling Congress Senior Masters, a United States Bowling Congress event, is conducted June 12-16 at the Suncoast Bowling Center in Las Vegas.

The Senior Masters will feature senior professionals and amateurs ages 50 and older who will compete for a projected \$140,000 prize fund with \$20,000 going to the winner.

In the 2004 Senior Masters held at the Suncoast, ABC and Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer Gary Dickinson of Edmond, Okla., won his second Masters and 11th senior title by defeating fellow hall of famer Roy Buckley of Westerville, Ohio, 638-580, in the three-game championship match.

The Senior Masters again will feature a world-class field of bowling legends. In addition to Dickinson, other senior stars entered are past champions Pete

Couture (1998, 2002), three-time PBA Senior Player of the Year Bob Glass (2001), Dave Soutar (2000) and Dale Eagle (2003). Also scheduled to compete are hall of famers and former PBA Tour stars Tom Baker, who won the 2005 Senior U.S. Open, David Ozio, Bob Chamberlain, Teata Semiz and Ernie Schlegel, among many others.

The ABC Senior Masters was first conducted in 1993 in Tulsa, Okla., and has traditionally featured senior bowling's strongest and deepest field.

The Senior Masters gets underway with five-game qualifying blocks for all competitors June 12, 13 and 14 beginning at 8 a.m. After 15 qualifying games, the top 63 players will join Dickinson in three-game double-elimination match play June 15 and 16. The championship match is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. (EDT; 4:30 p.m. PDT) on June 16. Practice and pro-ams will be conducted on June 11.

## NATIONAL DEAF BOWLING NEWS

### SIX RECORDS FALL IN 69TH GREAT LAKES DEAF TOURNAMENT AT MERRILLVILLE, IN

(This writer apologizes for this late news as he got the results a couple weeks ago and more importantly three of these records are new all time deaf tournament records) MERRILLVILLE...As the oldest deaf bowling tournament in U.S., the 69th annual Great Lakes Deaf Bowling Association tournament held last April 14-17 at Stardust II Bowl in Merrillville, IN had another successful tournament. The event drew 77 teams comprising of 385 men bowling for an aggregate of over \$35,000 prize fund.

According to GLDBA secretary-treasurer Michael Jasko from Cleveland, in addition to a record three 300 games, one each by Kevin Moran in Masters, Richard Aylesworth in Singles and Ben Mack in Team rolled that weekend, five GLDBA records were broken. One team, Fast 'N Furious from Detroit set two new GLDBA in high team game 1194 and high team series 3334 replacing 1145 and 3274. They are also all time deaf tournament records beating the record 1185 and 3326 made by Team USA in the 2001 Rome Deaflympics.

Jasko added that a pair of Toledo bowlers, Scott Helberg and Richard Egger set two new GLDBA records in doubles event with high doubles game of 537 and high total of 1486. The old GLDBA records were 534 and 1425.

Also Egger is getting better as getting older when he became the first deaf or hearing-impaired bowler to break the all-events 2200 barrier in a deaf tournament when he totaled 2210. Egger had the old GLDBA record if 2136 and Robert Ellison, San Diego had the former record 2188 score made in other deaf tournament. Rochester's Nothing But X team captained by Darrell Aggas scored 3231 actual pins for 3rd place actual prize \$250.00 plus 123 handicap for 3354 to take 2nd place \$1,925.00 prize. Third place handicap prize \$950.00 went to 3346 total of 5 Young Guns, a team of bowlers from Ohio, Indiana, Michigan & New York captained by Ron Zuchegno, Jr. Rochester which scored 3208 actual pins (4th place \$150.00) plus 138 handicap.

Tough luck for one team which also broke the old record with 3284, 200 Club, a team of 200+ average bowlers from Illinois, Ohio, Indiana & Michigan, captained by Robert Pokorny, Cleveland placed 3rd in actual pinfall for \$450.00. But with its meager handicap of 30, it had 3314 for 4th place \$550.00.

Ironically the center, Stardust II Bowl provided easy scoring conditions as with the 3 perfect games and top 6 teams scored actual 3125 or better and none scored in 3000s as the 7th team scored actual 2946. The team actual prizes ran to 10 places while the main handicap prizes at 1 to 4 ratio ran to 20 places. It took a whooping high handicap score of 3131 to cash in 20th. That must be an all time record.

Former (1986) World Deaf Champion Ben Mack rolled his 300 (667) in this event.

DOUBLES EVENT - HELBERG-EGGER 1486, FOLERZYNSKI-MacDONALD 1424 & DEARING-MATTERN 1411

Toledo bowlers Scott Helberg and Richard Egger combined 737 and 749 respectively for GLDBA record 1486 and with zero handicap won both Doubles actual prize \$280.00 and handicap prize \$1,540.00. Their 567 game is new GLDBA record.

Chicago duo of Ed Folerzynski and Robert MacDonald scored 1337 for 3rd place actual prize \$140.00 and with their 87 handicap totaled 1424 for 2nd place \$770.00 handicap prize. Jacksonville, IL pair Joe Dearing and David Mattern tallied 1411 to place 3d in handicap prizes for \$390.00. Detroit's Trayner duo of Paul and Gerald posted actual 1370 total for 2nd place \$180.00 and 1403 with handicap for 5th place \$170.00. The Doubles actual prizes paid to 10 places while the mail handicap prizes went down to 46 places.

SINGLES EVENT - MCGARTLAND 771, RON HOOD, JR. 763 & CASSELL 757

Roger McGartland from Quincy, IL rolled a 771 series to top in Singles actual for \$140.00 and with zero handicap took the handicap prize \$770.00 anyway. Ron Hood, Jr. Rochester, NY hit a 724 series for 5th place \$50.00 in actual prize and with 39 handicap for 763 got \$385.00 for 2nd place.

Third place handicap prize \$200.00 went to South Carolina's Vic Cassell who tallied 757 with handicap. Second place \$90.00 in actual group went to Deaf Team USA member Robert Ellison, San Diego, CA. Ellison who had zero handicap, also collected \$150.00 for 5th place in handicap prize. Toledo's Egger hit 730 series for third place \$70.00 in actual prize and place 10th with same score for \$100.00 in handicap prize.

There were 10 actual score prizes with 680 low and 92 handicap prizes with 650 low with handicap. ALL-EVENTS - RON HOOD, JR 2222, RICHARD EGGER 2210 & JOEY HARRIS 2192

Two young men and one veteran placed in first 3 places in handicap All-events but not in that order. The veteran, Richard Egger who had notched up several 2000 all-events score including last year's 2105, did better with age when he rolled 730 in team event, 749 in doubles and 741 in Singles for the deaf bowling first ever 2210 series and a new record. His 2210 placed first in actual prizes for \$75.00 but with zero handicap it was 12 pins short to place first in handicap. Egger placed 2nd for \$210.00.

First place \$340.00 in handicap all events went to Ron Hood, Jr. who hit his first 2000 plus series, 2105 plus 117 handicap for 2222. Hood, Jr. had 702 in team, 679 in doubles and 724 in singles to collect 3rd place \$40.00. Joey Harris, Las Vegas, NV also hit his first 2000, a 2048 for 6th place \$16.00 and with his 144 handicap 2192 total good for 3rd place \$175.00.

Detroit's Nicholas LoGreco of the team champions had 2142 for 2nd place actual \$55.00 prize and the same with zero handicap in 4th place \$140.00. here were eight 2000 plus all event scores in actual prizes, which had 10 places. The handicap prizes showed 1990 low to cash in 36th place. SINGLES/DOUBLES EVENT - HOOD, JR. 1481, EGGER 1479 & LENNY PACE 1440

In this event which combined series made in doubles and singles events, Egger led with 1479 actual score for \$60.00 but with no handicap lost to Hood, Jr's 1481 in handicap. Lenny Pace, Detroit had 1446 with handicap for 3rd \$130.00 and LoGreco's 1440 placed 2nd \$40.00in actual prize and Scott Helberg's 1414 3rd \$30.00. Ten places prizes in actual and 33 places in handicap.

The California State YABA awarded \$60,000 to 276 scholarship recipients in this year's annual Pepsi Championships. The District Finals saw 4,479 participants compete at 8 different sites throughout the state on March 12-13 and March 19-20, 2005. Thank you to the hosting centers for their hospitality and to everyone for their help and support. 1,618 participants were in the 11-Under division and based on a ratio of 1:8, 206 bowlers earned scholarships totaling \$20,000! **Congratulations!!**

The State Finals for the 12-up divisions were held at Fountain Bowl in Orange County on May 7-8. A total of 539 bowlers traveled from Eureka to San Diego to compete for scholarship money and eight berths into the Pepsi International Finals and the Junior Gold Finals to be held in Indianapolis this summer. There were 317 Boys 12-Up Handicap, 152 Girls 12-Up Handicap, 56 Boys 12-Up Scratch and 14 Girls 12-Up Scratch participants. Of these 539 bowlers, 16 bowlers (the top 4 from each division) qualified for the stepladder roll-off that followed the final squad of qualifying on Sunday. In the 12-Up Boys Handicap division, top seed **ERIC HANSEN** from Albany Lanes qualified first with a 6 game series of 1464 with **PAUL REGINA** from Jet Lanes immediately following. In the final match, Eric emerged victorious, earning the biggest scholarship award of \$3,000. **KYLE NAKASHIMA** from Gardena Bowl and **CARLOS JIMENEZ** from Gage bowl will be rounding the final four boys who will be going to Indianapolis to participate in the Pepsi International Finals. In the 12-up Girls Handicap division, 2nd seed **SARAH MIWA** from Del Rio Lanes defeated top qualifier **DANIKA COLLINS** from Java Lanes for the championship. Both girls will also be going to Indianapolis joining the other finalists to compete for an additional \$20,000 in scholarships!

In the 12-Up Boys Scratch division, top seed **BRIAN CARMICHAEL** (1371) held on to his top spot and defeated fellow Yorba Linda league member **SAM HITCHCOCK** for the championship with a nice 261 game. The 12-Up Girls Scratch division had top seed **JENNIFER EAVES** from Cloverleaf Bowl hold on to her top position (1281) in the championship match defeating 2nd seed **ALYSSE MCGINNES** in an exciting 266-206 match. Both Brian and Jennifer will be representing CA in the Jr. Gold National finals in Indianapolis and will have an opportunity to compete for additional scholarship dollars earmarked specifically for Pepsi qualifiers.



**MOSES MADE THE RULES**

LAKE FOREST — Yes, that's right. Moses. Moses Bensinger, president of Brunswick got the only ball in New York City rolling after years of pressuring bowlers and proprietors to get serious about their game and make standard playing rules, specifications, and promotions of the game of tenpins.

There were lots of alleys, 200 of them, nothing standard. After the 1895 Beethoven Hall meeting, the American Bowling Congress was organized.

Oh, the ball was a Mineralite by Brunswick.

Moses was there with rules and suggestions, how to organize teams, leagues, and tournaments. He knew there were other sports trying to get the newly awoken sports fan. At the turn of the century only golf and tennis were participation sports.

Moses knew the skilled workers were becoming the middle class with eight-hour shifts enjoying more leisure time.

And, he knew those five-man team league bowlers would enjoy competing in a national tournament so Brunswick promoted an ABC championship — the first in Chicago 1903. You guessed, Brunswick equipped the next 40 ABC tournaments.

To keep pace, they/he developed the "Simplex" pin spotters; Backus Pin Rack; Backus Semi-automatic Rack, Power (electric motor) Backus and then AMF and Brunswick came up with fully automatic pin spotters and scorers.

Since 1903 tenpins spread around the world, made many happy, rich, and recently poor. Yes, tenpins can use Moses.

At least, his bowling Commandments:

1. Proprietors, USBC, local associations help organize teams, leagues that create bowlers with averages who can bowl in sanctioned tournaments.
2. Keep a clean/modern house.
3. Protect tournament and league prize funds.
4. Friendly, knowledgeable staff.
5. Community affordable fees/prices.
6. Be community friendly.
7. Establish and enforce playing rules, good fellowship and conduct.
8. Provide instructions, encourage competition, stressing fair conditions.
9. Bowlers: Pay your fees on time.
10. Leave your center with a smile!
11. Elect Moses Besinger International Bowler of the Centuries.

For your information, John Brunswick started Brunswick Corp. in 1845. In 1867 Moses married John's daughter Louisa. Because of his business/sales savvy he climbed the corporate ladder rapidly.

Since then the name has been changed numerous times. So did the product line: billiard tables (1845), tires, back bars, phonographs, records, boats, motors, radios. During the wars, developed a number of military items. To promote, Brunswick sponsored many well known stage, radio and TV stars. At times to pay their salaries, made and sold hard rubber (white) toilet seats — up until the end of WWII.

It's possible Brunswick might look up those 1895 Beethoven Hall minutes, and repeat Moses' successful program!

LAS VEGAS—With just weeks before the start of the High Roller, Sam's Town Hotel reports that 1 night is now filled and others are getting close! This would be a good time to call and make your room reservations. Call Sam's Town toll free at 1-800-634-6371 and mention High Roller.

All qualifying squads still have openings. Those who attended the Super Bowl High Roller remember the mob scene and how quickly squads fill up on site. It is a good idea to prepay. With only 56 lanes to use, it doesn't take much to create shut-out situations. 8 squads were filled in February and we are anticipating the same this summer.

We were asked a pertinent question: Why do we no longer use our old match play format that we used for 22 years?

Well, there are several parts to the answer.

1) When High Roller was the "only game in town", it was easier to build a huge prize fund. Now with other tournaments staged at the same time, everything is diluted. The 1 in 4 prize ratio in match play tournaments causes nothing but "token prizes" unless you reach the top 8. And now with a 4th tournament instead of 3, well, we'll see.

2) Bowlers have a choice. By paying 1 in 4 like we did for 22 years, the bottom prize can only be Money Back. In every other tournament, the rewards are greater - and the entry fees are lower! Tough combination to run a Match Play tournament.

3) The players have accepted "divisions". Although not perfect in all cases, they work and help many, many players. The Match Play tournament has no divisions and there are a lot of good bowlers out there. We found that many players who feel they are less than top caliber have elected to spend their entry fees elsewhere.

They are the main reasons we don't offer that format anymore. We understand match play is popular and we will keep it in for our events in a modified format until we can figure out a way to "get back to the old days!"

We were very saddened to learn of the passing of long-time High Roller contestants and friend Larry Braithwaite. Larry, at age 68 was killed in a car accident over the Memorial Day Weekend. Larry bowled in the very 1st High Roller in 1982 and since has bowled in 71 other High Rollers. Known for his good nature, great manners and overall friendliness, Larry was the "iron-man" of the High Roller. He came to bowl and wouldn't miss many squads. The gentle man with the white hair, said to look a little like Kenny Rogers, spent part of his last High Roller helping some local kids on lanes 55 & 56 at Sam's Town. We will miss him and we offer our deepest sympathies to his family.

# Up Your Average

Instruction to Help Raise Your Scores



THERE’S NO SUCH THING AS A STUPID QUESTION  
So the old saying goes, “There’s no such thing as a stupid question; only stupid answers.” As long as the question is a sincere one, I totally agree. Fortunately for me, sincere questions are the only ones I ever get from bowlers, my students and my readers. Some, as a matter of fact, are pretty deep, searching and interesting to many bowlers. Such requests have been piling up, so to those of you who have waited, thanks for your patience. We’ll cover as many as we can, and since we’ll no doubt run out of space, we’ll continue next month.

CONCERNING THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN BOWLING BALL ROTATIONAL ANGLE AND AXIS TILT  
Here is the answer to a question several readers had about this subject. What was asked for was the specific law of physics, which states that a traveling ball’s degrees of angle of axis *tilt* cannot exceed the number of degrees of rotational *angle*.

The following is a short excerpt from a brilliant article by former Team USA coach, Palmer Fallgren, entitled “MATCHING UP ROTATION AND TILT”. It concerns the physics involved in the limitation of a bowling ball’s axis tilt in relation to its rotational (rev) angle. I’ll quote Palmer directly as follows:

Rule: “You can create a higher degree of rotational angle with a lower degree of axis tilt...but the degree of axis tilt *cannot* exceed the degree of rotational angle.”

This law is more important than you many think, because it has a direct effect on what can be done with a bowling ball in terms of behavior on the lanes. I’ll keep it simple.

PERSONALLY TESTING THE RULE  
Even though I remember this rotation/tilt law from my long ago physics classes, I can’t recall the wording of the law itself. But it’s easy to prove it to yourself, if you like.

Merely locate and mark your positive axis point (pap) on any one of your balls. How to do this appeared in one of my past newspaper articles. Or ask any ball driller or teacher how. It’s worth it.

Put the ball on the floor with the pap tilted upward at any angle you choose. Next, attempt to roll that ball *straight forward* by hand *along your normal ball track*. You’ll find that the pap will continually wobble, constantly changing its angle during such a ball motion, but *will not remain tilted at any specific angle while following your track!* The only number of degrees of tilt the axis will maintain during such a ball motion is *zero*.

So...zero degrees rev angle means zero degrees axis tilt, thus proving the above rule.

This is usually the reason straighter shot players can’t keep the ball from hooking too early and rolling out on dry lanes, usually leaving corner pins. These bowlers often resort to changes such as increased speed, polished high RG, low flare balls, more loft and super deep inside swing shot lines in an effort to overcome the damaging early roll out.

Such bowlers might do better to employ a simpler solution...a greater rev *angle* release with which more axis tilt can be created (a simple cocked wrist position will do the trick) thus allowing the much needed longer ball in such dry conditions. This low rev angle/ low axis tilt shot *is* perfect for oily lanes, because the ball grabs earlier, preventing skidding through the pocket.

Here’s another place where the importance of the word ‘*matching*’ comes into play (as Palmer also pointed out). Proper matching of rev angle and axis tilt can be of great assistance, by allowing the bowler to easily control skid, hook and hook-out without resorting to the more difficult options mentioned above.

MORE ON THE ‘PERSONAL’ PAP  
To answer some other reader questions...for example, “How can I achieve the optimum window of strike opportunity by getting the ball into its roll at the proper distance from the pocket?”

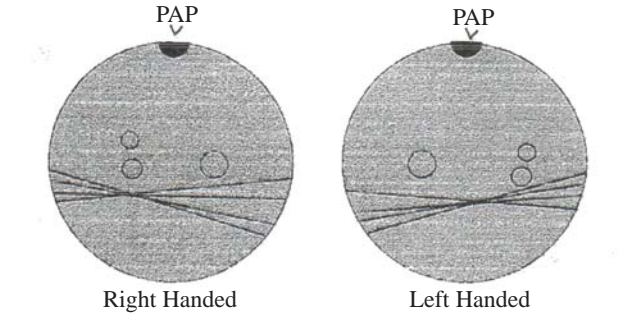
OK - First, find your personal positive axis point (pap) with the help of a ball driller or teacher. Then mark it on the ball with a square of ¾” white tape. This mark allows a visual feedback for you, of how the ball rotates around its axis as it travels. This provides important clues to the ball’s skid, hook, hook-out, roll and possible roll-out characteristics. Illustrations show how all this might look as the ball runs down the lane.

At any rate, a few readers asked for some clarification of the pap’s visible behavior in relation to the ball track. So here goes (if it sounds a bit intricate, bear with me...you may have to read it twice):

But first, let’s go back for just a moment to the days before the current reactive, core torqued balls first appeared...before the early nineties. Virtually all bowling balls before that time had a pancake weight block. Simply put, such balls could be drilled to hook more or less, go longer or shorter before hooking, but not to the extent of today’s balls.

These balls developed no track flare whatsoever, regardless of what type of release was used by the player. The track was just a single thin line of oil around the ball, its position simply showing whether the ball was a full, ¾, semi roller or spinner, based on how low or high the track was in relation to the holes. This is one reason why these balls often skidded out and left a lot of corner pins on pocket hits.

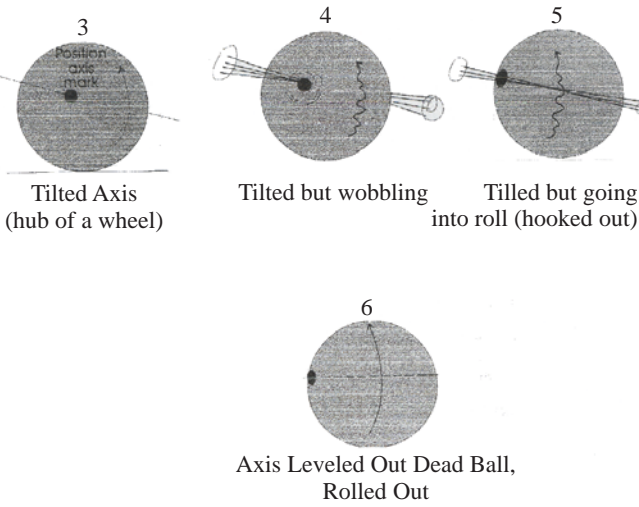
However, when a track flares, it gradually migrates downward, away from the holes on the top side of the ball, then migrate upward again on the bottom. This means that these flaring track paths must cross over each other twice, on opposite sides of the ball. These crossover points (called bow ties) appear on opposite sides of the ball...one the hole side of the ball, the other on the bottom. (illustrations 1 and 2 show only the flares on the hole side. You can visualize these flares as mirror reverse on the opposite side).



During the early portion of the ball’s travel *the tape (pap) will appear to be absolutely still, the ball rotating around it, like around the hub of a wheel*. This is because a properly placed pap mark (tape) will be perpendicular to the highest flare segments of the track.

Now... *with each track flare segment the position of the axis in relation to the ball path also changes slightly*. This is what causes the pap (made visible by the tape) to wobble as the ball travels farther down lane. (If the pap mark is inaccurate, it may wobble first, then stand still, then wobble again.)

By the way, anybody who has a hard, pancake block spare ball (or any old ball from the 1980s or earlier) can easily prove this out. As I said, a properly placed pap tape, perpendicular to the track, will appear absolutely still during the very first few revs after the release...during its early skid...then begin to wobble as the tape migrates around the side of the ball until it hooks out and eventually rolls out (illustrations 3, 4, 5 and 6).



Incidentally, in a past article on individual bowling improvement, I commented that the old saying, “*If it isn’t broke, don’t fix it*” may work for your car or lawn mower, but it does *not* apply to sports!

Champion athletes, including bowlers, certainly aren’t broken, yet they keep ‘fixing’ anyway. Why? *Because no athlete can ever stay the same!* “*Improve or decline*” is an accepted philosophy used by virtually all successful bowlers, golfers, on and on. The only way to improve is constant experimenting. The never ending adjustments in execution, strategy, the mental game, etc., being made by top professionals attest to that.

One last point...to my knowledge only one professional bowler in history, back around the 1940s, was ever consistently successful bowling off the wrong foot! *Just one!* I currently work with a bowler who does this, but only because he can’t put any weight on the other leg due to an injury. He would love to change, but can’t.

## USBC To Launch Two New Membership Magazines

US Bowler, US Youth Bowler to debut in August

GREENDALE, Wis.–To help keep its nearly three million members fully informed about the organization and sport, the United States Bowling Congress will begin publishing new quarterly magazines for adults and youth later this summer.
