Begins Recovery After Stroke SEATTLE — Mark Roth, recently ranked No. 5 on a list of the Professional Bowlers Association's 50 greatest players in the organization's first 50 years, has suffered a stroke which has left him partially

paralyzed on his left side. Roth, 58, was admitted to St. Joseph's Hospital in Syracuse, N.Y., on Sunday, his wife Denise said, after feeling ill for several days.

"He's brighter today," she said Thursday. "His (left) leg is showing a little improvement. He told me he's going to walk again and I believe him. He has the will power to do it."

Denise Roth said her husband will be transferred to a rehabilitation facility as early as Friday to begin a lengthy recovery process.

"Mark and I both want to extend a heartfelt thank you to everyone, from the bottoms of our hearts. The out-pouring of affection and concern and well wishes has been overwhelming," she added.

Roth, who owns 34 PBA Tour titles and a pair of Senior Tour titles, is widely considered the player who introduced the "power game" to bowling. The Fulton, N.Y., resident was inducted into the United States Bowling Congress Hall of Fame on May 1 in Reno. Nev. NOTE: Denise Roth has asked that well-wishers not send any additional flowers or cards until Mark is moved. She will advise the PBA as soon as she knows his new address. His contact information will then be posted on pba.com.

ARCADIA—Tao Yang was tops winning his first ABTA Title at popular Bowling Square Lanes which has became very popular for our club. Tao topped 265 entrants to win his first title. He took home a nice \$2,200 top prize. He won the hard way, winning five straight matches in the single elim finals, finally edging the top seed Youna Yun in the final frame to take the title in a very exciting game that would have gone either way. The top seeded position downing upstart Derek Lee for the win.

The scoring was good and making the cut were Men +64 and the ladies +50. Added were Super Seniors Rico Cayton, Marty Nakunz, and his lovely wife Bobbie Nakunz.

A fine turnout of 265 bowlers saw 64 Semifinalists cash and a \$6,800 Prize fund. Nice Pots, and Brackets and more all day long! The Semifinalists took the floor, of which all would cash. The top 16 to advance to the single elim finals with 3 women min guaranteed to the top 16.

The scoring was contentious with a record +124 to make the top16 for the men and the 3 guaranteed women chipped in at +22. The coiffeur from Buena Park, Minh Dang lead the field with an enormous +215. In second place was Derek Lee +197. Minh sat out for the title. Mr. Lee to enter into the second round of the top 16 finals. It took a +45 to make the top 16 Single Elims which included 4 women.

The first round went. We had Marty Nakunz, Anthony Kwan, Melvin Finner, Alan Basto, Roland Salariosa, Laura Vasquez, and Christina Cheung lose out. They received checks of \$115 in 10-16th places.

Round two had Ken Morris, Billy Chao, Greg Velarde, and Roger Pierce lose out and get checks of \$125 in 6-9th places.

Round three got hot as Tao Yang edged Rey Hernandez in a shootout 263-248. John Gonzales took out the Cutlery Expert David Quon 242-211. Rey and David were 4th and 5th with fine bowling and \$135, with John and Tao to meet for the right to bowl the pretty lady, Youna Yun for the title.

The semi final match was on. Yang held strong in a 241-213 over the likeable Gonzales who bowled well and thrilled the crowd :-) John, a past champion, was 3rd with fine bowling and Tao off to the title game vs Ms. Yun who was on her game at Bowling Square.

The title game was on. Youna elected to start and left the 7-9 split. Tao started strong with a three bagger to take a nice lead. Youna was now right there and was clean in frames 2-7. Yao was having his trouble with opens in frames 4-6 & 7 and when Young split in the 8th with a strong pocket 8-10. Tao then opened in the 9th. Youna struck in the 9th. Tao finished with 169/209. Youna struck the first in the 10th and needed one more for the title and came up a bit high to finish at 168/205. What an exciting match for the crowd. Tao did very well and wins his first title and in front of his fans of the infamous Mou Liu to boot. Great bowling by a very nice young man who finally cashed well in the ABTA. He is most deserving, and is on the improve for sure. Congrats to Tao from all!

What else can we say about Youna Yun, one of our faithful members who is liked by all. She really bowled well and almost won. It was so close! This is her second runner-up in the ABTA. Congrats Youna!! Youna and Tao had plenty of cheers going in that title match. Nice bowling by John Gonzales in third also!

As in my last article Overrated Bowlers with 3188 placed first in scratch division and Wilmington Club for the Deaf won the handicap event with 3263. Now I am reporting the winners of other events.

Brady Wins Both Singles With 763 & 770, Krpata Rolls 300/733 for 2nd

Dennis J. Brady, Watertown, NY who is the president of (now in limbo) National Deaf Bowling Associatioin rolled games of 276-256-232 for 764 to capture the scratch singles title and with his 6 handicap 770 total also took the handicap singles title. But the spotlight was on Daniel Krpata, MD who after a 245 start, punched 12 in a row for the tournament's high game 300 and finished with 188 for a 733 for scratch 2nd place and with his zero handicap also placed 2nd. The perfecto is Krpata's 2nd in EADB as in last year's tournament he rolled a 300 in the team event. The Canadian bowler who makes his yearly trip to EADB tournaments from Ontario, George Halas placed 3rd in scratch with 688 and John Taylor, NY took handicap 3rd place with his 730.

Moran-Morris Duo Wins Doubles With 1339 But 2nd In Handicap

The champs Overrated Bowlers' duo of Kevin Moran and James Harris, MD claimed another scratch title in doubles with 1339 total but with their zero handicap their 1339 in 2nd in handicap. 
(good for a free entry). There were no winners. The Mystery Pot is available to all members and costs only \$5.



– BNN Interview – **Keystone Jr's Wendy Macpherson**

Submitted by Jim Goodwin PART 11 Tell us about the experience of winning the **USBC Singles.**

You know what, Jim – I can't put it in words. I'll never forget a quote of Pat Costello when I won the 1986 U S Open. She said, "It will be a little while before you realize what you have actually done." I'm now three years past winning that 2006 event, and I've been down to Cashman Center in Las Vegas a few times this year, and I always think like 'Wow, I have an Eagle in this historic tournament.' I just can't believe it happened. And it happened on a weekend that came after I had not bowled for three months because I had been caring for my father, who had just lost his battle with cancer. I hardly got dressed or left the house for three months after we lost him. I flew to Corpus Christie on the day he was cremated.

We all know how close you were to your dad - will your thoughts be of him when you accept your Hall of Fame plaque?

Absolutely. And my mother. My mother was one of the greatest ever, and it's been so many years- she passed away in 1992. . .so many people didn't really get to see her true colors. She was just an angel. As the years went by, due to the circumstances, my father and my sister Blair and I really got to know each other. We were all we had, and my father was just a great man. One of the saddest things I'm facing in this whole Hall of Fame process is not having them here with me. But nothing was left unsaid. I know that he wanted to be with me and stick out his chest and be proud and involved, but it just didn't work out that way. When I got the call from president Boje, I cried. I cried for a week. I didn't want to be a part of the ceremony. I was more sad than happy, but since January, I now see it in a different light. Now, I am very excited, and very happy, and very honored to be here.

Now, you have entered the politics of bowling as a new member of the USBC Board of Directors. How hard is politics compared to bowling?

Bowling is still harder. Politics is simply doing what you believe in; and maybe understanding why other people do things, and maybe changing your mind, or not changing your mind. Bowling is far more difficult than that. I'm excited about it, because it is a whole other avenue of bowling for me, and something else I can do without throwing a ball.

We remember that you were usually very outspoken when it came to politics in the PWBA - will that carry over to USBC?

I had my opinions, and like a lot of people, I think I've gotten more opinionated as I've gotten older. I just have such love for the sport of bowling. If I can do anything to help the sport, I will love being a part of it.

For some of us, it seems like yesterday that you won the S Open at age 18, and now at 41, you are still young enough that you have many years to add to your career in bowling does it seem that way to you as well? I'm Hopeful. Some days, I feel a little older, but there are days when I can hardly believe I'm not still 18 and that so many years have gone by. Some days, I wake up with joints aching, and I know how many years it has been. Are you still hopeful that a real Women's Pro Tour will return? I can't have anything but hope. I'm biased. I only know one type of tour. I only know one type of format. I only believe one way – so I'm biased. I believe the way we did it with the multiple games and the lane conditions – bowling the US Open on A, B, and C squad without ever running the lanes is the way to go. I don't think we need to bowl on fresh oil every time we bowl. I don't think we need to allow people to get lucky to win a match to advance. I think the best bowler in any given tournament should win. That is not happening under the formats that are being done now
