Monacelli Wins USBC Senior Masters for Fifth Major and Ninth Career PBA50 Title

LAS VEGAS – For the second time in his career, Venezuela's Amleto Monacelli hoisted the trophy at the USBC Senior Masters this time averaging more than 246 while climbing the stepladder at the Sam's Town Bowling Cen-

The 57-year-old right-hander entered Sunday's championship round as the No. 5 seed and won five games to secure the coveted major title and \$20,000 top prize. His run included a pair of wins over top seed Stoney Baker of Canton, Georgia, and made him the eighth bowler in history to win the USBC Senior Masters twice. His Senior Masters win was also his fifth major on the tour for players

Monacelli, a USBC and PBA Hall of Famer struck at least eight times in each match and closed the finale against Baker with five strikes for a 237-200 victory.

Because Baker had made it through the event's 64-player double-elimination match-play bracket without being beaten, he needed to be defeated twice to be denied the title. Monacelli topped Baker 255-243 to force the second

"It's a great feeling, and running through the stepladder, which is the hardest way, is even more special," said Monacelli, now a nine-time PBA50 Tour winner and 20-time PBA Tour titlist. "I think when I have to run the stepladder, it makes me a little more relaxed and more focused about how I'm going to play the lanes. I tried to come in without any expectations and just bowl my best. Luckily, things went my way today."

Baker, a 56-year-old right-hander and 31-time PBA regional champion, started the opening game with seven consecutive strikes, before a 10 pin ended his run at perfection. An unconverted 1-2-10 washout in the ninth frame gave Monacelli a chance to lock up the game, and the 2015 Senior Masters champion took advantage of the opportu-

Monacelli, who defeated fellow hall of famer Pete Weber of St. Ann, Missouri, two times to win the 2015 event, kept pace with Baker, slowed only briefly by a 7-10 split in the third frame. He followed the open frame with seven consecutive strikes and a single-pin spare to shut out Baker.

"I was two good shots away from winning this thing," Baker said. "I kind of rolled the thumb in the eighth frame. In the ninth, I didn't quite roll it off my hand. It didn't see any early friction at all, and that's why it just kept going on that shot."

Even as a part-timer on the PBA50 Tour, Baker has found success, including a previous-best finish of fourth. He's also the reigning PBA South Region Senior Player of the Year.

Since joining the PBA in 1986, the bowling center proprietor has enjoyed competing with and against the Tour's top stars, two of whom joined him in the finals Sunday -Monacelli and Norm Duke of Clermont, Florida.

"Amleto had great reaction and is a fabulous bowler, so you have to bring it when you bowl him, especially when he's got a few games on the pair and knows what's going on," Baker said. "It was my first time in a title match in a national event. I don't care who you are, you're going to have some nerves. I just didn't make enough good shots.

"If I could have thrown those two shots in the first game a little better, it might have been a different story. But, I'm not blaming anybody but myself. Overall, though, I'm happy to do what I did."

To earn his meeting with Baker, Monacelli remained unrattled after an eighth-frame gutter ball against Duke and closed with four strikes to escape with a 239-222 victory. Sunday marked Duke's third consecutive appearances in the Senior Masters stepladder, where he has collected finishes of fourth, second and third, respectively.

"The key today was just to get within myself and my process and try to keep my heart rate down, because I needed to be really relaxed before throwing the ball," Monacelli said. "My game is a game where I need to be careful about getting too fast. Overcoming a mistake like throwing it in the gutter is more of a mental test, but you have to remember, it was just a mistake. If anything, it reminded me to stay more behind it and throw good shots, and that's what I did the rest of the time."

Monacelli was one of the three players who advanced to Sunday's stepladder through a four-player shootout that included the last competitors in the Elimination Bracket. Having the third-highest score in the shootout earned him the No. 5 spot.

In the opening match of the championship round, Monacelli struck six times on his first seven shots on the way to a 258-188 win over Tom Adcock of Decatur, Illinois. He then overcame a missed single pin to defeat Gary Faulkner of Norfolk, Virginia, 245-223.

"It was a long road, but winning this title means a lot," said Monacelli, who now will head across town to compete in the 2019 Suncoast PBA Senior U.S. Open presented by Storm. "It's always special when you win, but this is another major title, and it's a tough tournament with 300 bowlers. I am going to enjoy today and think about tomorrow's event tomorrow."

Walter Ray Williams Jr., the only player to win both the USBC Masters and Seniors Masters twice each, was the last No. 1 seed to win the senior edition, doing so in 2017.

In 2018, Chris Warren of Grants Pass, Oregon, defeated the top-seeded Duke twice to join Williams and Dave Soutar as the only players to win both the Masters and Senior Masters.

Warren's title defense this week at Sam's Town was short-lived. After qualifying third for match play, he lost his first two matches and was eliminated.

The Senior U.S. Open begins with first-round qualifying Monday at 9 a.m. PT and continues with qualifying rounds Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. The field will then be cut the top 25 percent of the field that will advance to match play on Friday which will determine the top five players for the stepladder finals to begin at 4 p.m.

Major Mika Set To Defend Senior U.S. Open Title

LAS VEGAS – A tough stretch for PBA50 Tour bowlers continues next week as their endurance will be tested in the 2019 Suncoast PBA Senior U.S. Open.

The event kicks off Monday with the first round of qualifying and wraps up Friday with the stepladder finals at Suncoast in Las Vegas. All rounds will be broadcast live exclusively on FloBowling.

Here are a few key points to get you ready for the Senior U.S. Open:

Major Mika Back To Defend

It's not often we see Mika Koivuniemi compete on the professional level anymore. The 52-year-old said knee problems keep him from competing as much as he used to.

That said, however, Koivuniemi will be back again this year to defend the title he won at the 2018 PBA Senior U.S. Open, which also took place at Suncoast.

The Finnish native, who has the nickname Major Mika for his reputation of stepping up in major events, defeated Brian Kretzer, 259-237, to win the title last year.

The other players who made the show were Brian Voss (third), Parker Bohn III (fourth) and Ryan Shafer (fifth) last year.

In a FloBowling podcast interview with Tim Burg, Koivuniemi said winning last year was a big surprise. "Nowadays I only bowl a few tournaments a year," Koivuniemi said. "I know most of the great players on the PBA50 Tour they bowl a lot of tournaments a year, and I know a lot of them are still full-time bowlers. So, it was a surprise for me."

No rest for the weary

Nearly all of the players who will compete in the Senior U.S. Open are also competing in the USBC Senior Masters, which is currently underway at Sam's Town in Las Vegas.

In fact, the stepladder finals for the Senior Masters are the same day as the practice session for the Senior U.S. Open, leaving virtually no time for a break for the world's best senior bowlers

The Senior Masters and Senior U.S. Open represent the most important stretch of the PBA50 Tour as both events are majors. The only other major this season was held back in April when the PBA50 National Championship took place.

The two Las Vegas majors also offer the biggest paydays on the PBA50 Tour with the Senior Masters paying \$20,000 for first and the Senior U.S. Open paying \$15,000.

The format and lane conditions

The Senior U.S. Open follows a very simple format that is heavy on qualifying starting Monday.

Four of the five days of competition are qualifying with four six-game rounds. There are two squads each day and after 24 games of qualifying, the top 25 percent of the field will make the cut into match play.

After qualifying on Monday through Thursday, match play gets underway Friday morning at 8 a.m. Pacific with two six-game rounds of modified round robin action.

When 36 games have been completed, the top five players will advance into the stepladder finals, scheduled for 4:15 p.m. Pacific on Friday.

According to the PBA's website, the pattern being used is the PBA Marshall Holman lane condition. The pattern is 41 feet in length with a total volume of oil of 30.91 mL. The ratio is 2.49:1.

How to watch

The only place to watch the PBA Senior U.S. Open is live on FloBowling. Every round of the event from qualifying through the stepladder finals will be broadcast live with archives available shortly after each round ends.

2019 Suncoast PBA Senior U.S. Open Storylines

LAS VEGAS – As the most demanding stretch of the PBA50 Tour season continues with the USBC Senior Masters this week in Las Vegas, players will once again have to dig deep when the second half of the major doubleheader continues with the Suncoast PBA Senior U.S. Open presented by Storm wraps up the western swing June 10-14.

The Senior U.S. Open marks the halfway point of the season which, thus far, has been dominated by PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. in what could already be considered a "Player of the Year" worthy season.

The Senior U.S. Open will be streamed live in its entirety via FloBowling beginning with first-round qualifying June 10. Visit www.flobowling.com for subscription and schedule information.

Here's a look at a few of the storylines for the third and final major of the 2019 season:

Walter Ray Williams Jr. continues his PBA50 Player of the Year march: In the first five tournaments of the season, PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. started with three consecutive wins that included the PBA50 National Championship, followed by eighth and seventh-place finishes heading into the Senior Masters, an event he has won twice.

The seven-time PBA Tour and two-time PBA50 Tour Player of the Year holds a huge 10,000-point lead in the PBA50 Tour points race over reigning PBA50 Player of the Year and 2017 Senior U.S. Open winner Michael Haugen Jr. Williams, the career leader on the Go Bowling! PBA Tour titles list with 47 wins, continues his pursuit of a 15th PBA50 Tour title which would give him the career titles lead for both of PBA's national tours. He is currently tied for first on the PBA50 all-time titles list with fellow Hall of Famer John Handegard with 14 wins.

Mika Koivuniemi returns to defend Senior U.S. Open title: The PBA Hall of Famer earned the moniker of "Major Mika" after winning two majors for his first two titles early in his PBA Tour career before winning his first PBA Tour standard title. The 14-time tour winner, who is the head coach for the United Arab Emirates national bowling team, hopes that history will repeat itself on the PBA50 Tour after winning the 2018 Senior U.S. Open with a 259-237 title-match victory over Brian Kretzer for his first PBA50 Tour win. With his win, Koivuniemi – who won the 2001 U.S. Open on the PBA Tour – joined Amleto Monacelli as the only international Senior U.S. Open champions.

Will the Senior U.S. Open see its first three-time winner? Hall of Famers Pete Weber, Amleto Monacelli and Tom Baker will be trying to become the first three-time winner of the Senior U.S. Open since it began in 2003. All three players have won it in consecutive seasons – Weber (2015, '16), Monacelli (2012, '13) and Baker (2005,'06). The other two-time winner is retired hall of famer Wayne Webb who also won in back-to-back years in 2008 and '09.

Can Pete Weber bounce back? Weber, who is tied for sixth on the career PBA50 Tour titles list with 11 wins, took some time off from the PBA50 Tour earlier this season, but after winning a PBA regional in early May, hopes that tune-up will provide some momentum for the rest of the PBA50 Tour season.

Local favorite Ron Mohr looks for second Senior U.S. Open win: Among other notables entered in the Senior U.S. Open is 2011 champion and two-time runner-up Ron Mohr of Las Vegas who owns 10 PBA50 Tour titles and is a two-time PBA50 Player of the Year. The 63-year-old Mohr was inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame in 2018 for his accomplishments on the senior tour.

The PBA has added \$10,500 to the top five positions of the Senior U.S. Open prize fund with first place increased by \$5,000 to \$15,000.

The entire field will bowl six-game qualifying rounds June 10-13 with squads at 9 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. PT. The top 25 percent of the field will then advance to match play which gets underway June 14 at 8 a.m. after which the top five will be determined for the stepladder finals at 4 p.m.

Kris Prather Wins Inaugural PBA Playoffs Takes Home \$100,000 First Prize

PORTLAND, Maine – Kris Prather of Plainfield, Illinois, made critical shot after critical shot in defeating Bill O'Neill of Langhorne, Pennsylvania, 226-215 and 216-185, to win the inaugural Professional Bowlers Association Playoffs Championship and its \$100,000 first prize Sunday at Bayside Bowl.

The championship match aired live on FOX, concluding a 13-tournament qualifying series leading into a 24-player match play elimination competition. A calm and confident Prather, who entered the Playoffs as the No. 9 seed, was in complete control in claiming the championship.

"It was a lot easier thinking that no matter what happened, I was going to help my family financially," Prather said after the biggest win of his career. "I told myself last night I couldn't be disappointed no matter what. But after watching Bill's ball motion not being that great, and me throwing a few good shots that loosened my arm swing really helped.

"When I came out on tour, I didn't treat it as a job and it showed," he added. "I hope people can see how much I've matured over the past five years, and it's really having an impact on the success I'm having."

Prather, a 27-year-old five-year PBA Tour veteran, used a string of four strikes to build a lead over the struggling O'Neill in the first game but had to convert a 3-4-6-7-10 split in the 10th frame to win the first in the "race to two points" match.

"I threw the ball about as bad as I could in that situation, and it showed," Prather said. "On the spare I told myself I make that split all the time, so I just wanted to hit the pin in front and if I made it, it was meant to be."

O'Neill, who didn't throw back-to-back strikes until the sixth and seventh frames, had a chance to win by a pin with three strikes in his 10th frame but left the 2-8 on his second shot.

"I was unsure of what I was doing," O'Neill admitted. "In hindsight I should have played the lanes a lot straighter. It was more a tactical error on my part. That second shot in the 10th frame I thought was pretty good, but that's

what happens when you're not playing the lanes properly."

Prather, who won his only PBA Tour title earlier in the season in the PBA Scorpion Championship during the PBA World Series of Bowling X, retained control in game two with a string of three strikes after O'Neill failed to convert the 4-9 split in the first frame and again struggled to put together consecutive strikes. When O'Neill finally put together a double, he left the 3-6-9-10 in the eighth frame and failed to convert, basically sealing the victory for Prather.

"This was the first time, in the whole playoffs, I had the lead early. In every other match, except one, I had to come from behind," Prather said, noting he was surprised by how well the Bayside Bowl fans embraced him considering he'd never bowled in Maine before this year. "These fans are incredible. I never thought I'd be accepted into a

place I'm not from, like I have been in Portland. You hear about how enthusiastic these fans are, but you don't really know until you experience this place."

The 2019 Go Bowling! "DAVID VS GOLIATH" The Glenn Allison Controversy, Continued

Glenn Allison's 900 was the greatest series ever rolled by a human being. He overcame more than any other 900 series bowlers; all-wooden lanes, low-tech ball, second-shift conditions, mixed-league competition and late hours. On top of that, he alone had the additional pressure that comes from doing what's never been done before. Of all the names now on "THE 900 LIST," how many would be there under similar circumstances? The answer is very few, if any.

When the ABC failed to sanction his series, he appealed that decision. Of course, the ABC denied that as well. He then filed a lawsuit seeking to overturn the ABC ruling. He lost that case, not on merit, but because of a technicality. "The judge explained that Allison was a card-carrying member of the ABC and had to abide by its governing decisions."* That judge created a real "catch-22," a dilemma from which there is no escape.

What happened to Glenn Allison in the days and years since that historic performance was not all bad, but the denial of recognition by the ABC was a travesty. It will haunt this sport forever unless the people in charge of the USBC decide to do the right thing. The right thing is to officially sanction that 900 and be done with it! But, why should they?

I propose that the trial Mr. Allison was denied should take place. Where? Right here, in the court of public opinion. You, as readers of the California Bowling News, are now both judge and jury in the case of:

"ALLISON VS ABC/USBC."

Factual Evidence Supporting the Sanctioning of Glenn Allison's 900 Series

Let the record show that on July 1, 1982:

- La Habra 300 Bowl was a bowling center sanctioned by the ABC. That's a fact.
- the lanes of La Habra 300 Bowl had been sanctioned by the ABC. That's a fact.
- the pins used by La Habra 300 Bowl were of a brand and construction type sanctioned by the ABC. That's a fact.
 - La Habra 300 Bowl had no history of "non-compliance" with the ABC or BPAA. That's a fact.
 the Anchor Girl Trio League was a league which was sanctioned by the ABC. That's a fact.
 - the Anchor Girl 1110 League was a league which was sanctioned by the ABC. That's a fact
 - Glenn Allison rolled 36 consecutive strikes while competing in that league. That's a fact.
 - dozens of other bowlers witnessed Glenn Allison delivering the highest score in history. That's a fact.
 - Glenn Allison was a sanctioned, card-carrying member of the ABC. That's a fact.
 - Mr. Allison's ball, a Columbia Yellow-Dot, had been sanctioned by the ABC. That's a fact.
 - Glenn Allison possessed the ability and credentials to roll three 300 games without cheating.
 That's a fact
- That's a fact.
 the 900 score was entered onto Allison's "League Sheet," and became sanctioned as part of his
- officially-sanctioned league average. That's a fact.

 the night of Glenn Allison's "miracle," scores for The Anchor Girl Trio League were lower-
- than-average. That's a fact.

 lane conditions provided no advantage to Glenn Allison; he shot a 578 series in the prior league.
- That's a fact.
- Factual Evidence for Continuing the Denial of Sanction For Glenn Allison's 900 THERE ISN'T ANY!
- The following excerpts are from various publications which detailed the arguments used by the ABC and USBC for their failures to sanction Glenn Allison's 900 series.
- "The ABC, after inspecting Lanes 13 and 14 at La Habra 300 Bowl, refused to sanction the 900 series, citing lane dressing conditions that were not, "in compliance with Article 7, Section 3 of the rule book."** That's a fact, but whether or not the lanes were really "non-compliant" is debatable.
- > Four local inspectors (Bob Ramirez, Edward "Bud" Pinchot, Terry Johnson, and Bob Strange) had checked the lanes less than an hour after Allison's series, Ramirez telling Glenn that "everything was in order."
- > Denial of Allison's series occurred after ABC representative, Burt Kellerman, was flown in from Milwaukee the following day. It was he who said, "No."
- > Had the lane condition at La Habra 300 Bowl actually been non-compliant on the night of July 1, 1982, ABC rules made it incumbent upon the inspectors to issue a citation against the facility. Not one of the local inspectors did so; neither did ABC Assistant Secretary-Treasurer, Burt Kellerman. Apparently, either all five were incompetent or there was actually nothing wrong with the condition that night.
- > The only time an oil application can be <u>legally</u> judged for compliance is immediately after it has been applied. The ABC did not do that. Oil is moved/removed by balls rolling over it. It also evaporates. The readings taken that night, and the following day, were tainted by a minimum of two shifts of league competition and the passage of a considerable amount of time. Tainted evidence is not allowed in any court, including this one.
- > The ABC never stated exactly what was non-compliant about the lane condition that night.
- "The ABC's decision was litigated before the United States District Court, Central District of California which upheld the ABC's determination in all respects."*** That statement by the USBC is not a fact; it's not even true.

When Glenn Allison filed a lawsuit seeking to overturn the ABC's ruling, the judge reviewing the case refused to hear it. As cited above, he ruled that because Allison was a card-carrying member of the ABC, he wasn't allowed to question its governing decisions.* The court did not uphold, "the ABC's determination in all respects." It only allowed the ABC to uphold its own determination! This court's decision doesn't support the USBC's position to uphold the ABC's ruling. To the contrary, it opens the door for the USBC to reverse the ABC's mistake. If the USBC were to retroactively sanction the 900, Allison would have to accept that as well because he is now a "card-carrying member" of that organization.

• "Any official change to Glenn Allison's 900 would also impact thousands of scores in that era."*** This statement is not a fact; it is a factoid used by the USBC as a deflection from the real issue. It is irrelevant to this case.

This controversy is about one person and one score. There are not thousands of bowlers from that era claiming they shot the first legitimate 900 series.

- "We can't turn back the hand of time and change the rules in 1982."*** This USBC quote is not a fact; it's a platitude, "a trite, meaningless or prosaic statement often used as a thought-terminating cliche, aimed at quelling social, emotional, or cognitive unease. Platitudes give a false impression of wisdom, making it easy to accept falsehoods." Wikipedia
 - > As indicated above, all the rules <u>were</u> followed by everyone but the ABC.
- > There is no need to go back in time. There are honorable people from that era (i.e. Carol Mancini and Timmy Smith) who are willing to testify, under oath, that the ABC did not act in good faith. This statement DOES NOT support the USBC's position, either.
- "As a National Governing Body with a legal responsibility to enforce rules uniformly, we simply can't re-write history for one score and apply a different standard more than 30 years later."*** This USBC statement is factual nonsense. It has two interpretations which cancel each other.
- > The first interpretation supports Glenn Allison. Using the "standard of 1982", Bob Ramirez (Orange County Bowling Association secretary) inspected the lanes and told Allison, "everything was in order." All other local inspectors must have agreed since none of them issued a citation to La Habra 300 Bowl for "non-compliance" that night.
- > The second interpretation destroys the credibility of the USBC's argument. Burt Kellerman used the exact same standard <u>to deny</u> that "everything was in order." What's uniform about that?
- > The USBC can't rewrite history. That's true, but they can write the future and in the years to come, Glenn Allison's name should be in the #1 position on their list of "900 Series Bowlers." It seems everyone in the world who is familiar with this saga believes so, except the folks at the USBC. As Timmy Smith said, the USBC should issue a statement saying, "In the past, mistakes were made. We screwed up by doing nothing about it. Now, we're going to fix this."
 - "USBC's Board of Directors has agreed the issue is now settled given that all the evidence has

been considered."*** This argument is not a fact.

With all due respect, that statement is also false. Does the USBC really believe it has all the evidence? Was Carol Mancini, Timmy Smith or any one of the actual witnesses or inspectors interviewed? The most meaningful "hard evidence" still in existence would be the low scores from that night, and those scream for Allison's 900 to be sanctioned retroactively, ASAP!

Closing Argument

I rest my case. In 1982, Glenn Allison was denied his day in court. Ladies and gentlemen, you now have the opportunity to act as judge and jury. I submit that a preponderance of the evidence clearly shows sanctioning Mr. Glenn Allison's 900 series is justifiable, and should be done, post facto, by the USBC, ASAP. By their failure to do so since taking over for the ABC, this same evidence proves the USBC to be guilty of dereliction-of-duty, negligence, incompetence and deceit.

Allison was denied justice because of a technicality and Goliath (AKA the ABC), for unknown reasons, tried to stomp his historic feat into oblivion; it failed! The new Goliath (AKA the USBC) is guilty of perpetrating that mistake for far too long.

They underestimated the passion many still harbor for Glenn Allison, his achievement, his reverence for the game and willingness to accept the ultimate disappointment. His name should finally occupy its rightful position atop the USBC's list of bowlers who have achieved perfection. An asterisk placed after his name should indicate that his was not only the first legitimate 900 ever, it was the greatest of them all.

A personal note: The USBC needs to be shaken up and there is now only one way to get their attention - money. It is my belief that our sanctioning body has "dug in its heels" so deeply it can't honorably discharge its duty over this issue. Personally, I intend to boycott the USBC by withholding any further sanction fees until such time as they do one of two things:

- > Retroactively sanction Glenn Allison's 900 and place his name in the #1 spot on "THE LIST," or
- > Issue an honest and detailed report explaining exactly why he doesn't belong there. I pray some of you will join me and spread the word using social-media. GOOD BOWLING!

able to win a title?' And now I'm sitting at 10."

While the 10 career wins checked off an item on her bucket list, her main goal for the 2019 PWBA Tour season was just getting back to basics. She said the end of the 2018 season had become a grind, as she made a push for PWBA Player of the Year, and realized she needed to focus on the things she can control as a competitor.

"My goal this season was getting back to playing the game and loving it like when I was that 13-year-old girl running around the softball field with my hair on fire, and just doing it because I love the pure competition side of it," O'Keefe said. "That's my goal this season, to be able to do that. It's a lot more fun bowling that way than with putting pressure on yourself."

In Saturday's title match, O'Keefe struck on five of her first six shots against Rodriguez. The strike in the sixth included the 2 pin and 9 pin tripping late, and following a made spare in the seventh, O'Keefe struck out to capture the title.

"I threw every single one of those shots perfect; well, at least that's what it felt like," O'Keefe said. "So, for it to result in a win and title No. 10, it's one I'm going to remember."

Rodriguez made the title match with a 247-216 victory over Liz Kuhlkin of Schenectady, New York. Rodriguez earned the No. 2 seed with a blistering performance on Saturday that included averaging 245 during the Round of 12 to jump from 14th into third. "You always have a plan when you come into bowl and normally it doesn't work," Rodriguez said. "Then you have to search through bowling balls; that's why we have so many balls. But we had a plan, we had four balls and we just used those four balls."

Kuhlkin also had made some big moves during the day to reach the stepladder and was nearly perfect in the opening match against Danielle McEwan of Stony Point, New York. The duo matched strikes for the first four frames before McEwan had a 9-count in the fifth.

But Kuhlkin kept striking and threw 11 consecutive strikes before leaving the 9 pin on her final shot in a 299-226 victory. There were two perfect games rolled during Saturday's competition. Sydney Brummett of Wichita, Kansas, had a 300 in Game 4 of the Round of 32 and Kelly Kulick of Union, New Jersey, had 12 consecutive strikes in the opening game of the Round of 12.BowlTV.com provided live coverage of all rounds of the event.

Competitors at the PWBA Tucson Open bowled two eight-game qualifying blocks on Friday and then the field was cut to the top 32. Another eight-game block on Saturday morning narrowed the field to 12 players, who bowled six more games with the 30-games pinfall total determining the stepladder finalists. The 2019 PWBA Tour now heads to Fountain Valley, California, for the PWBA Fountain Valley Open at Fountain Bowl. Competition starts June 14, and BowlTV.com will have live coverage of all rounds, including the stepladder finals.

State Association Manager Larry Peppers was called on several times to





Sunday's delivery was 20 percent better than first-run PBA telecasts averaged on TV in 2018 (553,000 viewers) and ranks as the most-watched PBA telecast since FOX's February 10, 2019 airing of the PBA Tournament of Champions that delivered 1,132,000 viewers.

A total of 7,941,000 viewers watched the series of PBA Playoffs telecasts across FOX, FS1 and FS2 including repeats.

Earlier in the season, FOX had the most-watched bowling telecast of any kind on any network since 2005, with the PBA Clash averaging 1.8 million viewers.

FOX Sports coverage of the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour resumes Tuesday, July 16 at 4 p.m. on FS1 with the first of three consecutive nights of live coverage of the PBA League Elias Cup finals from Bayside Bowl in Portland, Maine.

hold, but it went straight through the head pin, leaving the 3-6-10 standing.

After Martinez cleaned his spare up; it was Campagnale's turn, leading by one pin and badly needing to clean his spare up to put pressure. He watched in disbelief as the ball sailed through this tough oil pattern and chopped the 3 pin, leaving the 6 and 10 standing.

It was a tie game, and Martinez only needed to keep the ball on the lane. The anchor bowler went quite light, taking six pins down for a six-pin win.

He led Sysco with a 207 game; with Lucas pacing Buddy's with a 213 game.

The end result, a 793-787 win in Game 1 for Sysco.

Game 2 brought the 26-foot short pattern for these boys to play on. The first strike didn't come until the second frame by Basurto. The first frame saw three washouts by Buddy's and two by Sysco.

Sysco's first Game 2 strike was a J.T. Diso brooklyn strike. But the scoreboard doesn't say how the pins fell – just that they did.

While Diso doubled, he would fall off a bit. This is where Sysco showed that there was no I in team. As he would all night, Martinez put he and the team on his back.

Meanwhile, absolutely no breaks would come for Buddy's. Velasco would whiff on plenty of pins throughout this game, leaving four standing at one point. Basurto and Lucas consistently getting tapped.

Campagnale gave it a go in the 10th though, doubling before leaving a 4 pin for a team-high 193.

Martinez came into the 10th frame on a turkey; but didn't need much more than good count to shut out Buddy's. He got nine pins, and covered the 3 pin he left and followed it with a strike to finish with a 225, best on the team.

A 706-678 victory put Buddy's on the ropes heading into the third and deciding game.

The first two games saw a lot of spares missed, and not too many strikes; but it was now time for the high-scoring house pattern.

It was strikes for everybody, and it got to a point where whoever stopped striking was going to lose.

At first it looked like Buddy's would take off with the match. But Sysco never said die, and kept matching Buddy's strike for strike.

In fact, Sysco kept swinging hard, opening up a 76-pin lead after only four frames, thanks in part to Martinez starting out with the front four.

Buddy's stuck a beer frame on Campagnale in the fifth; but Sysco came back with a captain's frame on Kinstler – continuing to look great.

Campagnale really deflated at this point, opening in three consecutive frames, including missing a 10 pin on the third of these opens.

Barraco went relentless in his attempt to secure the crown, throwing five strikes in a row, and really separating the two teams.

Knowing the result was already at hand, Campagnale went away from his notorious two-handed approach and threw the 10th frame one handed, leaving a split.

Sysco was just way too much on this evening. Barraco wound up with a 239; Diso added 241 to Kinstler's 194. The team was led by its MVP, Martinez's 252 game.

Campagnale led the way with Buddy's with a 224.

A 99-pin win 926-827 helped Sysco reign victorious once more.

Martinez shot a 684 series for the evening, a 228 average for the round. Lucas led for Buddy's with a 584, or a 194 average.

It's the fifth crown for Kinstler (third all time behind Leonard Ruiz, Jr. (7) and Steve Gurrieri (6); fourth for Barraco and Martinez – and first for Diso.


