Will Another ‘Perfect’ Opportunity Slip Away?

LA HABRA—July 1st marks the 25th anniversary of Glenn Allison’s remarkable feat of being the first person to roll a 900 series - stringing together 36 strikes (actually 43 strikes but that’s another story) for three 300 games in the same series in the Anchor Girl Trio league at LaHabra 300 Bowl in LaHabra, California. The ABC (now USBC) has never officially recognized this remarkable accomplishment even though longtime bowling enthusiasts will always refer to Allison as “Mr. 900.”

Why did the ABC deny the recognition? It all had to do with the way the rules were written at the time concerning lane conditioning. If Allison could have waited just a few years when the rules were changed - his 900 series would have been acknowledged without question.

Allison is a right-handed bowler - this was the second league session on the condition (he competed in the early league, too) and no one else in the Anchor Girl Trio league broke 670. However, Allison’s accomplishment has forever been ignored by the ABC (USBC).

Well - not totally ignored. In 2002, a special celebration was held at LaHabra 300 Bowl to commemorate the 20th anniversary of the 900 series. Over 100 of Allison’s friends and admirers came from all corners of the country to commemorate the 900 series. During that program, Glenn was given numerous accolades about his bowling ability, his teaching expertise and his notoriety as being one of bowling’s best ambassadors. Some of these accolades were done in person and some were sent in the form of a letter. Here is one of the letters:

May 2002 - On behalf of the American Bowling Congress and its 1.8 million members we congratulate you on the upcoming 20th anniversary, July 1, of your 900 series. ABC appreciates your understanding and grace in handling what we all recognize as a difficult situation over those 20 years.

As an ABC Ambassador, you have represented yourself and the sport of bowling with class and have distinguished yourself as a true gentleman in our sport.

All the best in your future bowling activities.

Signed by none other than

the Executive Director of the ABC - Roger Dalkin (now USBC).

How does Allison feel about being ignored and denied the recognition he richly deserves?

“I would certainly like to see my 900 in the record book - even with an asterisk,” said Glenn. “The bowling public has generally accepted me as “Mr. 900” and that has meant a lot to me. I just appreciate being remembered for what I did 25 years ago.”

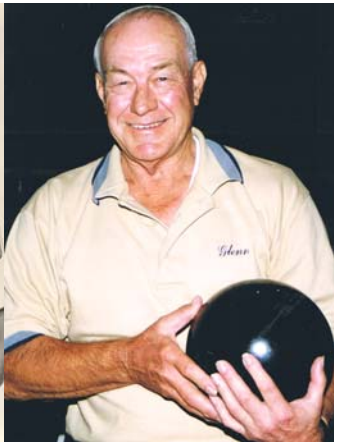
A grassroots campaign has been ongoing since about the year 2000 to have Allison’s 900 series officially recognized. Many people have been behind this movement including longtime noted bowling writers Bob Johnson, Jim Dressel, John Jowdy, Dick Evans, Chuck Pezzano and well as hundreds of personal bowling friends. The fight is ongoing and it’s hoped one day Glenn Allison will be given the will get official word.

But, it really doesn’t matter. Mr. 900 will always be recognized by true bowling aficionados as the first person to break Allie Brandt’s record of 886 which stood for 43 years regardless of what the ABC (USBC) decides.

The Anchor Girl Trio league and LaHabra 300 Bowl have established a new tournament in honor of Allison’s 900 series. The 1st Annual Anchor Girl Trio Tournament is scheduled to be held Saturday and Sunday, June 30-July 1. For information call at 714-526-2058.



Glenn Allison moved to Chicago in 1956 to compete with the Pabst Blue Ribbon team. That year he recorded a 259-300-300/859 series – firing 28 consecutive strikes. During the 1958-59 season he was invited to compete with the famed Falstaff Beer team after he completed the Chicago All-Star league at a 221 pace – the third highest (at that time) in the history of Chicago bowling annals. That same year he was named King of Chicago Bowlers. This teammates on the Falstaff squad included Steve Nagy, Harry Smith, Dick Hoover, Al Savas and Norm Meyers. Lights! Action! High Tech Bowling! Morongo Tribe Opens State-of-the-Art Canyon Lanes

Banning, California, June 8, 2007—According to Randy Johnson, it’s the Lamborghini of bowling centers. Revved up with hundreds of thousands of dollars in the latest high tech sound from Bose, dazzling dance club lighting and sleek, state-of-the-art lanes, Canyon Lanes at Morongo is set for a strike.

“Saturday night here will never be the same again,” said Johnson, general manager of the new \$3.4 million facility built by the Morongo Band of Mission Indians. “Families, teens, couples on a date, weekend keggers and serious pin crushers all have a new place for fun because Canyon Lanes at Morongo is open with 24 lanes of bowling for everyone.”

Located just east of the Morongo Casino Resort and Spa, inside the former casino building, Canyon Lanes covers 30,000 square feet. Each of the two dozen lanes can accommodate 12 people, and the facility has an overall capacity of 288 people. Guests can enter on the building’s north side where there is both valet parking and ample public parking.



Canyon Lanes at Morongo will be open seven days a week. Hours of operation will be from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 a.m. on Friday and Saturday.

One of the largest participatory sports in the world, more than 95 million people enjoy bowling in 90 countries spanning 6 continents. Tribal leaders believe the center will prove popular with resort guests as well as desert visitors and local residents.

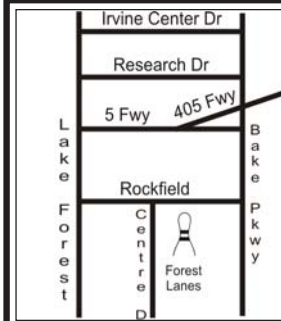
“This is another important step in expanding the recreational opportunities associated with the Morongo Casino Resort and Spa. At the same time we expect this project will help to enhance the quality of life for everyone who lives in the area,” said Morongo tribal chairman Robert Martin. “By diversifying our leisure offerings, we are helping to ensure continued economic growth and stability for the community as a whole.”

Martin said the total investment to retrofit the building and create the new bowling center was approximately \$3.4 million and that the center will employ approximately 25 to 30 people when fully staffed.

Wilhelm Construction & Development, the general contractor for the project, oversaw the gutting of the original interior and the new installation. Dallas-based Scheirman Associates Architects oversaw the interior design of the facility. Recognized as one of the leading architectural firms in the bowling industry and with more than 250 bowling and family entertainment centers in the United States and Asia, the firm was selected by the Morongo tribe for its special expertise in the design of family entertainment facilities. They were recently captured top honors in the Bowlers’ Journal International’s 22nd Annual Bowling Center Architecture and Design Awards.

Scheirman’s dramatic color palette, the retro-styled aluminum ceiling, distinctive drop lighting fixtures and innovative seating incorporate visual impact with practicality. Customers can enjoy the 32-inch LCD monitors that record their scores and provide player prompts. The “split house” design, which features lanes on both

Tenpin Slants

When the popular Ladies & Legends tournament was resurrected recently—on May 7-10 at the Cherry Bowl in Rockford, Ill.—it brought back fond memories for a lot of people, including this ancient pin scribe.

The first L&L, matching members of the PWBA (Professional Women’s Bowling Assn.) and the PBA Senior Tour, was held in 1995 at Village Bowl in El Cajon, a few miles east of San Diego. The winners were Cheryl Daniels and Jim Brenner.

El Cajon also is renowned as the home of John Jowdy, the USBC and PBA Hall of Famer. Jowdy, a former bowler who is enshrined in the Texas Hall of Fame, is also a world-class bowling coach, an author and a syndicated columnist. (Is there anything in bowling this guy hasn’t done?)

Since Jowdy’s palatial hillside home is just minutes away from Village Bowl, he decided to host a dinner party for some of the bowlers and members of the media.

About 20 people attended the dinner. The cooking was done by Brenda Jowdy—she’s the good-looking half of the Jowdy family—and Ray Romeo, a gourmet chef who loved to cook. Ray was there because his two daughters, Robin and Tori, were bowling in the tournament.

The dinner—and party—turned out so well that the Jowdys decided to host another the following year. That was during the Ladies & Legends tournament won by Liz Johnson and Mike Kench.

This time, the word had gotten around about the dinner party, and at least 50 people showed up at the Jowdy’s door.

So Brenda Jowdy and Ray Romeo had to scramble around for more food. They emptied the freezer—and prepared a feast fit for a king. It was an amazing gastronomical performance by a couple of gourmet geniuses.

The two Ladies & Legends tournaments were huge successes. Not only did the bowlers enjoy the competition, so did spectators and the tournament sponsor.

PWBA officials also were pleased and they planned to go national with other L&L tournaments, holding similar events in different geographical areas.

Instead, the PWBA Tour folded in 2003, and it wasn’t until four years later that the Ladies & Legends tournament was reborn. And that was fine with Liz Johnson, for she and her partner, Roger Kossert, were the winners in Rockford. That gave Johnson two out of three L&L titles, thanks to the PBA and USBC, which cooperated in reviving the popular event.

As a final note, the tournament in Rockford was officially known as the PBA Hammer Ladies and Legends Presented by the Illinois State BPA.

Looking at the calendar, I noted that the First of July was just a couple of weeks away. That date is rather significant in the annals of bowling, for it was just 25 years ago—on July 1, 1982—that Glenn Allison became the first bowler in history to roll three consecutive 300 games and a 900 series in a league sanctioned by the American Bowling Congress (now the United States Bowling Congress).

Allison accomplished the feat in the Anchor Girls Trio league at the appropriately named La Habra “300” Bowl in La Habra, just east of Whittier. Allison, a member of the ABC Hall of Fame at the time, was bowling with a sanctioned bowling ball, against sanctioned bowling pins, on lanes sanctioned by the ABC.

Yet, the ABC refused to acknowledge Allison’s 900 because the lane dressing failed to meet ABC specifications. There was too much oil in the center of the lanes, according to ABC inspectors. Hogwash!

Today’s lane conditions are far more compatible for shooting high scores than the lanes on which Allison shot his 900. As a matter of fact, the Anchor Girls Trio league didn’t even shoot its overall average that night, in spite of the 900 series.

Although many bowling aficionados, particularly in Southern California, think the USBC should recognize Allison’s 900—even with an asterisk—nothing will be done to correct the travesty. And

that’s just fine with Allison, a.k.a. Mr. 900, who says he’s gotten far more publicity than if the 900 had been approved. So be it.

Mea Culpa: In my last column, I wrote that USBC Hall of Famer Donna Zimmerman had triple bypass surgery. As it turned out, it was quadruple bypass surgery. A resident of Thousand Palms, Calif., Zimmerman, who says she has been recuperating at home, still needs to have a stent placed in her right carotid artery before she’s through seeing her cardiologist.

I also wrote that Robin Romeo, Newhall, Calif., had been elected to the National Italian American Sports Hall of Fame. That was correct, but I also mentioned she was the first female bowler so honored—and the fourth bowler overall. Wrong! She will be the seventh bowler.

Robin, a USBC Hall of Famer, will join six male bowlers in the National Italian American Sports Hall of Fame when she is inducted during ceremonies on Nov. 2-3 in Chicago.

Those six men are Lou Campi, Buzz Fazio, Hank Marino, Johnny Petraglia, Carmen Salvino, Jimmy Smith and Andy Varipapa.

Addendum: Robin Romeo, who hit the Big Five-Oh on June 5, celebrated the occasion at a huge birthday party at the Toluca Lake home of her older sister, Debbie. Younger brother David, an excellent drummer who has his own band, provided dance music for the 40 to 50 guests, including USBC Hall of Famer Barry Asher and his lovely wife, Christy. Everyone had a great time—I know I did. It was one of the best birthday parties I ever attended.

I asked Robin, now that she’s 50, whether she’ll bowl in the regular USBC Queens tournament or the USBC Senior Queens next year. “The regular Queens,” quickly replied Robin, who can complete the triple crown of women’s bowling by winning. She has already won the U.S. Women’s Open and the PWBA National Championship (a.k.a. Sam’s Town Invitational).

Robin added that she’ll definitely compete in Jeanette Robinson’s National Golden Ladies Classic next March at The Orleans Hotel/Casino/Bowling Center in Las Vegas. “I also plan to enter a few of the PBA Senior men’s tournaments,” she said, “including the Masters (July 8-13 at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno). I’ll keep bowling (in tournaments) as long as I have the fire (to compete).”

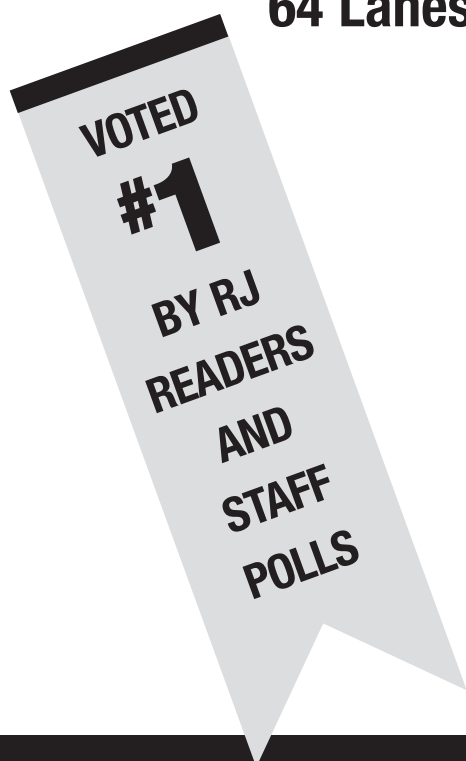

winnings for his upcoming 27th wedding anniversary.

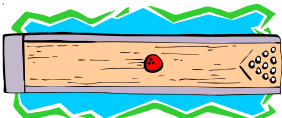

sides of an island concourse, is different from traditional bowling centers where lanes line up on one side with the concourse behind the bowlers’ area.

A state of the art light show and sound system create the atmosphere of a sophisticated dance club. The spectrum lighting provides multi-colored LED projection that changes colors and shapes as it washes across the bowling lanes. The pin spotters monitor and adjust themselves, providing easy-to-follow diagnostics and unique light towers that report lane status.

Automated bumpers convert the lanes for families playing with young bowlers and the scoring units scroll to 12 players rather than the standard 6.

The center’s HPL bowling lanes are the highest scoring lanes in the industry. In fact, the highest scores in history were recorded on HPL lanes in an ABC Tournament. HPL lanes look like natural wood and provide explosive power that consistently rewards bowlers with higher scores. 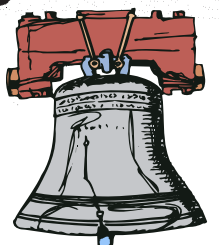

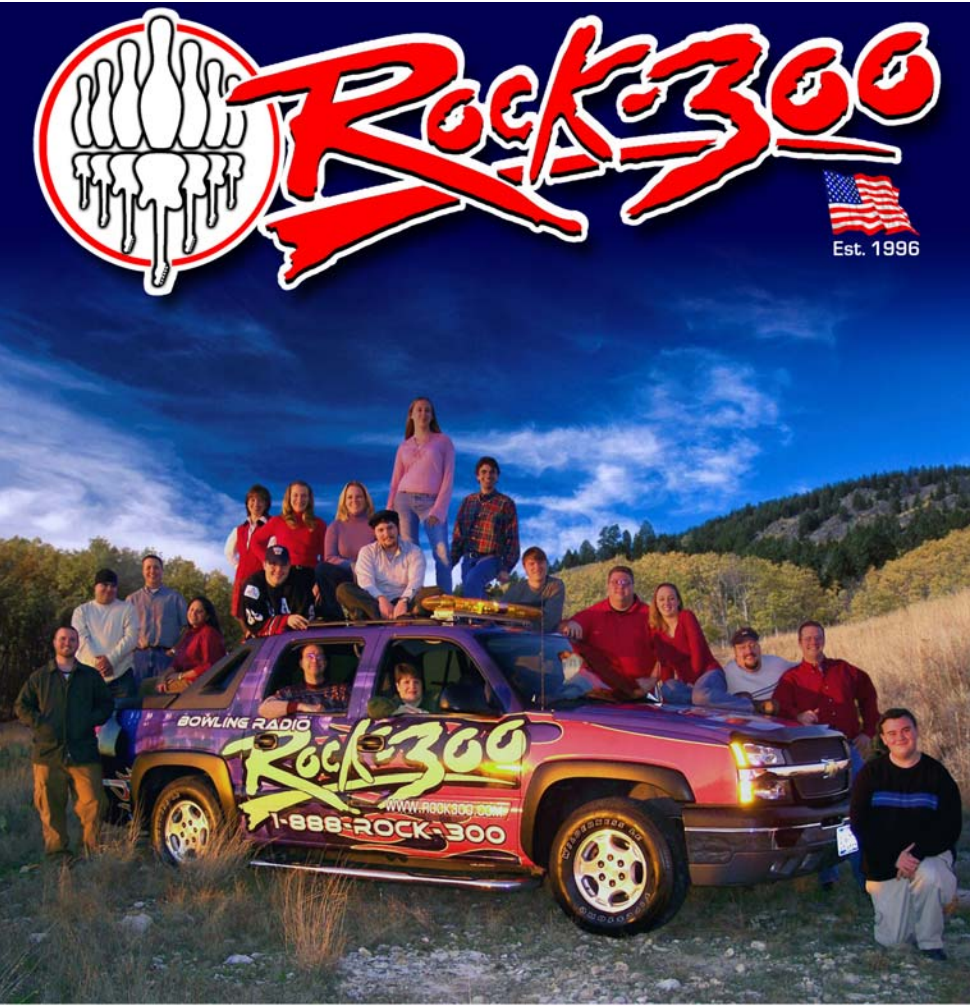

For the better part of the 15 years that the WCST has been in existence, with the exception of the years 2001 to 2004, the super senior format of this organization has been 2nd to none, as this format allows the super senior, if the qualifying scores are high enough, they would bowl in the regular division finals, which has more money and places to bowl for. If their scores are not high enough for the regular division finals, then they bowl in their own finals, another words, the super seniors have two chances to make a finals for their entry fee.

Our Guide-Lines and Rules state, that all bowlers entering a tournament are bowling for the main prize fund at the start, and at the end of qualifying will determine what finals they bowl, as well as what cash places they win. No super senior may cash for any regular division prize under the regular division finals.

The super senior brings over to the regular division, if he or she makes the regular finals, their portion of their prize money, they pay into the tournament, and that money is paid out in extra places to the regular division bowlers. Our format allows so many super seniors to make their finals, no matter how many super seniors cross over to the regular finals.

We have a chart that we use as guidelines for that part of the tournament. Super Senior Age Eligibility is for the Men, 60 and up, and for the Ladies 50 and up, The Regular Division Ages, for the Men 45 to 59, and for the Ladies 40 to 49. If you are at the age of the Super Seniors, and would like to join our organization, it's only \$60.00 per year, and it is good for one year from the time you sign up.
