## Kulick Makes History

first time in PBA history, a woman will bowl full time on the Tour.

Kelly Kulick averaged 224.04 in 45 games over five days to finish sixth out of 140 bowlers in the 2006 Denny's PBA Tour Trials Sunday at Stardust Bowl I to earn one of 10 exemptions for the 2006-07 Denny's PBA Tour season.

The PBA opened its membership to women in April 2004 after the Professional Women's Bowlers Association (PWBA) folded. Kulick was the 2001 PWBA Rookie of the Year and won the 2003 Women's U.S. Open before the league folded.

In 2004-05, the Denny's PBA Tour went to an all-exempt field with 58 bowlers earning full-time exemptions for each season. While two women - Liz Johnson and Cathy Dorin-Lizzi - have qualified for single Tour events through weekly Tour Qualifying Rounds, no woman had ever earned a full-season exemption.

'To be the first woman is huge... words can't even describe the feeling," said Kulick. "I feel confident I can be a good enough competitor to stay out on Tour. My next goal is to make a television show and become the first woman to win a PBA Tour

Kulick came into Sunday eighth overall with the final day taking place on the Tour's highest-scoring oil pattern. Each of the five days featured one of the PBA's five different oil patterns.

The 29-year-old from Union, N.J. averaged 232.89 over the final nine games – including a 300 in game four – to finish sixth with a 10,082 45-game pinfall.

Leading the field was Mark Scroggins (Amarillo, Texas), whose twin brother Mike is also exempt on Tour. Scroggins finished with 10,301.

Michael Haugen Jr. (Las Vegas), a 10-year Tour veteran, finished second with 10,279.

Making his way back on Tour after a two-year hiatus was 12time Tour titlist Del Ballard Jr. (North Richland Hills, Texas), who finish 10th with 10,009.

Needing a 186 in his final game to qualify, Ballard shot a 219 to earn the final spot.

Jim Pratt (Glendale, Ariz.) finished third with 10,189, Chris Hayden (Orlando, Fla.) finished fourth with 10,188, while David Tessman (Tampa, Fla.) rounded out the top five with 10,109.

The 2003 PBA Rookie of the Year Chris Johnson (Garland, Texas) made his way back on Tour, finishing seventh with 10,065. Also qualifying were Patrick Girard (Jonquiere, Quebec) & Ritchie Wolfe (Vienna, Va.).

## Tenpin Slants by Joe Lyou

TARZANA—Billed as a charity event, the recent "Bowling With the Stars" production raised more than \$1,000 for the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Research Foundation. But, it could wind up being a much more lucrative promotion.

The United States Bowling Congress has big plans for "Bowling With the Stars" (or BWS, for the sake of brevity).

BWS, conceived and hosted by the USBC, was staged at Corbin Bowl, a cozy 26-lane center on busy Ventura Boulevard in the city of Tarzana, smack dab in the heart of Southern California's San Fernando Valley.

It was called "Bowling With the Stars" because it was just that, for nine Hollywood celebrities were teamed with three of America's best women bowlers—Carolyn Dorin-Ballard, Kim Terrell and Diandra Asbaty—in a three-game, Baker-style exhibition match.

It has been well documented that Dorin-Ballard's team "won" the match. But in reality, there were no losers, for all nine celebrities received souvenir gifts and a bowling pin with which to collect autographs.

Two TV cameramen and a still photographer were on hand to film the fun event. What seemed like miles of film were used. The evening cost the USBC "a ton of money," as one writer noted, but there's a possibility that BWS may pay big dividends in the future.

The USBC is planning to take all the film that was shot and edit it into a one-hour pilot, which they hope to sell to a TV network. "Dancing With the Stars" was a huge television hit, so why not "Bowling With the Stars"? True, BWS may not be quite as popular, but it could rival "Skating With the Stars" in the TV ratings. In the meantime, the staff at USBC is keeping their fingers crossed that the pilot sells.

Inasmuch as most of the nine BWS celebrities had no previous bowling experience, they were given a 30-minute crash course by their respective team captains prior to the start of their exhibition match.

One of the celebrities, however, is a die-hard bowler who has participated in leagues for 17 years. He is Shawn Parr, a deejay on KZLA (93.9 FM) in Los Angeles—the most listened-to country music station in the world.

Parr is also an actor with a golden voice who is in much demand for voice-overs. He says he loves the game of bowling.

Did Parr enjoy his evening at Corbin Bowl? Read what he posted the next day on his message boards (Blog) at kzla.com:

Wow, what a night! It was incredible, with the competition coming down to the third game and the LAST frame. Three teams made up of celebrities and one female pro.

I was given a new Storm ball to use (they were the BIG sponsor with Etonic Shoes). Sharon from Corbin (she works in the pro shop) drilled it perfect, and I averaged 203 for three games after dialing it in.

The kid celebrities who showed up to bowl were amazing and very polite! We had a lesson from our Pro's, Kim Terrell, Carolyn Dorin-Ballard and Diandra Asbaty (all true professionals and very classy!), and then it was down to business.

(Parr then went to give a ball-by-ball account of how his team almost won the match, losing in the last frame when Terrell left a pocket 7-10 split.)

But what WONDERFUL event, and it was taped for TV as a pilot and we shall see what happens. The most important thing was raising money for the Susan G. Komen Foundation for breast cancer research, and that mission (was) ACCOMPLISHED!

I want to thank everyone at the USBC and Corbin Bowl for being so gracious and everyone who came down to watch.

Kim Terrell, my pro, was so amazing (look out Wednesday bowlers, she gave me a 30-minute lesson). Sharon, who runs the pro shop, HOOKED ME UP and my new PYRO ball will be on fire tomorrow night.

I also want to thank my two new friends (and teammates), child stars Alyson Stoner ("Cheaper by the Dozen 1 & 2" and Robbie Bruce ("Stuart Little"); Carolyn and Diandra, and all the other wonderful child stars, and Joan Romeo for getting me involved.

We are blessed, my friends, and this is yet another event I was proud to be part of. God bless. Shawn.

\* \* \*

Corbin Bowl could well be called "Robin Romeo's Corbin Bowl." Yes, I mean THE Robin Romeo. The one who won 17 titles on the PWBA (Professional Women's Bowling Assn.) Tour and was later elected to the WIBC (now USBC) Hall of Fame.

When Corbin Bowl changed hands a couple of years ago, Robin and two of her business partners bought the center. She says, "Business has been good, especially on the weekends."

Strangely enough, Robin does not participate in leagues at Corbin. The only league she bowls in is the "Mission Majors" at Mission Hills Bowl. Asked why, Robin replied, "I like the league, and besides, it's closer to my home (in Newhall)."

During the staging of "Bowling With the Stars," Robin served as the official hostess, representing the Corbin Bowl management. As a matter of fact, BWS was virtually a Romeo family production.

Joan Romeo, Robin's mother, had been hired by the USBC to help publicize the BWS event. Joan, of course, has many years of experience in the field of public relations and advertising, for she is the owner of The Marketing Team of Van Nuys, Calif.

Tori (Romeo) Carter and husband Jeff collected tickets at the gate, while Joan's youngest son, David, helped move tables and chairs where needed. And Joan's eldest son, Bill, who works in the entertainment world, was there to offer his help. Even Billy Jr., Joan's grandson, was in attendance.

Tom Clark, the USBC Director of Communications, was running around and making sure that everything went right. It was his first visit to Southern California. Clark said he liked the beaches—a photo shoot was conducted at Santa Monica and Venice—but he wasn't too crazy about the freeways.

"I kept wondering what it'd be like if my car broke down and I was stuck in all that traffic," he said.

Tennelle Milligan, the defending USBC Queens champion, made the long drive from Orange County to Corbin Bowl because she wanted to show her support for the charity event.

Ditto for Kathy (McNaughton) Solowitz. Kathy, a member of the San Fernando Valley Women's Hall of Fame, had another reason to be at Corbin. Her stepson, Alex Solowitz, a 26-year-old actor, was one of the nine BWS celebrities.

Alex, when introduced to the audience, proudly proclaimed, "My mother's a professional bowler. Alex is a former star of MTV's "2Gether" and can be seen in the upcoming Bruce Willis movie, "Alpha Dog."

Here's a trivia question: What do Robin Romeo, Tori Carter, Carolyn Dorin-Ballard, Kim Terrell, Diandra Asbaty, Tennelle Milligan and Kathy Solowitz have in common?

Answer: They're all entered in the 2006 USBC Queens (June 17-21) in Reno. More than 300 other distaff hopefuls are expected to be competing for the \$30,000 that goes to the winner. It's the richest prize in women's bowling—and the only major tournament remaining for the ladies to bowl in.

As a final note on BWS, the event was more than a charity fundraiser and a TV pilot. BWS presented a raised image of bowling in general and women's bowling in particular. It also presented a positive image for youth bowling, for seven of the nine BWS celebrities were teen-agers, all of whom enjoyed their experience at Corbin Bowl.

In a way, BWS also helped to promote the '06 USBC Queens, so it would seem that the USBC was more than justified in spending "a ton of money" to sponsor "Bowling With the Stars."



## National Deaf Bowling News Bill Hayse's 859 Has Games Close To Prefection 3 Times

KNOXVILLE—Last week William "Bill" Hayse if Knoxville reported that he had rolled games of 286-284-289 for a 859 series in his Knoxville league. His 859 is a BIG series, right but the oddity is the husky righthander had started with 10 strikes in row in all three games. That was so close to hitting a 300 three times.

Hayse said last September he hit a 824 from games of 257-267-300. So far he has 19 perfect games and six 800 series in his lifetime. Hayse's record is not surprising because he is a two time (1986 &1989) National Deaf Masters Champion and was the runner-up in the 1996 National Deaf Masters.

Anyway for keeping up the deaf Bowling record on 800 series, Hayse's 859 is the 3rd highest. Tony Passarelli, Denver's 888 is the top among deaf bowlers. Mark Fisser's 867made last December does not count because it was bowled in a unsanctioned league and Ken DeGroff's 865 remains as 2nd highest. DeGroff is the leader with most 800 series.

## 5TH ANNUAL NDMBA TOURNAMENT SLATED IN LAS VEGAS AT THE ORLEANS THIS FALL

ANAHEIM—William "Bill" Cozad, the head Honcho of National Deaf Master Bowlers Association mailed out to more than 400 deaf bowlers the flyers, entry forms and information for his 5th annual NDMBA tournament. To celebrate its 5th anniversary the event will be held in glittering Las Vegas at The Orleans Hotel and Bowling Center on September 30 and October 1, 2006.

Cozad said, there is a change from the last 4 years' scratch format to a handicap format. It is necessitated because his scratch format did not work out in drawing the bowlers while the other deaf tournaments' handicap Masters drew over 100 bowlers.

The advance entry fee is \$195.00 on or before August 10. After August 10 the late and walk-in entry fee is \$215.00. Cozad encourages paying the advance entry fee to get the bowlers' names on the schedule in the program book for the bowlers and fans to follow.

Also with the advance entry fee out of the way, the bowler can bring more money to gamble or pay for some of the extra sidepots the tournament offers like brackets (3 games \$5.00), 12 games \$20.00, & "Pot of Gold" \$60.00.

Important dress code: Entrant must wear a shirt with collar and first and last names on back. No shorts or blue jeans. There will be a fine per day if this code is not followed.





## BLANCHARD STRIKES GOLD AT AMERICAN ZONE YOUTH CHAMPIONSHIPS

Big games early and late seal boys gold medal in singles event

PUEBLA, Mexico—Junior Team USA's Josh Blanchard knew he would experience nerves Sunday while representing his country in international competition for the first time. He just didn't expect them to stay away for as long as they did.

"I didn't have any nerves during the first five games, which is very surprising," said Blanchard, 18, of Upland, Calif. "But that last game, some nerves started to creep in as I got closer to gold."

Blanchard shot 1,323 over six games to take the gold medal in the boys singles event at the 2006 American Zone Youth Championships at Bol La Noria Pro -\* and looked very comfortable in the process.

Blanchard averaged 220.5 with his only sub-200 score coming in the final game. He paced the field after opening his set with 216 and 256.

"The lanes really played to my advantage," said the right-handed Blanchard, who was playing the 10 to 4 line with his Lane Masters Mirage. "I thought they were going to break down and work against me like they did in the practice session (Saturday). Instead, they ended up favoring me -\* a little oil pushed out toward me and I had a good line all morning."

Mexico's Isi Eskenazi Yaakovsky cut Blanchard's lead down to 10 after four games. However, Blanchard distanced himself by firing a 266 in Game 5. Only a stone 9 pin left standing in the sixth frame stood between Blanchard and 10 consecutive strikes to open the game.

"I just knew I had to keep

striking to keep up with these guys," Blanchard said. "I got great carry that game and ended up posting a great score."

Yaakovsky took the silver medal with 1,285, while Canada's Darren Klassen earned bronze with 1,248.

A late charge from Junior Team USA's Dan Vick, Pittsford, N.Y., came up just short of resulting in a bronze medal. Vick shot 267 in Game 5 to move up from 10th place into fourth, where he finished with 1,211. Daniel Farish, Louisville, Ky., placed 14th with 1,129 and Matt O'Grady, South Amboy, N.J., was 16th with 1,108.

In the girls competition, Bryanna Caldwell, Tucson, Ariz., was the high Junior Team USA finisher \* placing fourth at 1,148 \* just two pins short of the bronze. Canada's Felicia Wong captured gold with 1,204, followed by Puerto Rico's Jessica Santiago with 1,161 to claim silver and Venezuela's Patrica De Faria at 1,150 for the bronze.

Emily Maier, Sparks, Nev., shot 1,116 and Kayla Bandy, Danville, Va., had 1,115 to place eighth and ninth, respectively. Rose Brown, Modesto, Calif., finished 22nd with 980.


