BOWLING'S U.S. WOMEN'S OPEN ON TRACK TO SHATTER ENTRY RECORD

ARLINGTON—Excitement about the 2011 Bowling's U.S. Women's Open continues to grow as the Bowling Proprietors' Association of America (BPAA) announced entries for the event are on track to be the highest of all-time. As of June 6, 2011, the event has more than 275 entries, breaking the previous record of 267 set in 2003.

The finals of the U.S. Women's Open will take place June 30, 2011 in Arlington, Texas, on the field of Cowboys Stadium, the first time that a women's major professional bowling event will be held at a traditional sporting venue.

"The 2011 Bowling's U.S. Women's Open will be an event that catches the attention of the world and I expect this will not be the only record we see broken," said BPAA Executive Director Steve Johnson. "The interest level in this tournament shows the bowling industry can deliver showcase events in the greatest sports venues in the nation. It also gives a terrific example to proprietors everywhere that tournament bowling is strong and a great way to get people committed to the sport."

Adding yet another level of excitement to the event, BPAA will award a \$1 million cash prize to any competitor who rolls a perfect game of 300 in the 2011 Bowling's U.S. Women's Open Championship match - an unprecedented prize in the history of bowling. The bowling industry also will attempt to break the all-time attendance mark at a professional bowling event at the finals on June 30.

Presented by The Brands of Ebonite International, the Open Finals will feature the world's top five women bowlers who advance through the 2011 Bowling's U.S. Women's Open tournament, which will kick-off with qualifying rounds on June 24 at AMF Euleless Lanes in Euleless, Texas. Game 2 was on the house shot as Vern Adams led the Sysco group with a perfect 300 to put Katie Jakes down 2 games to none. Sysco scored Barraco 205, Wong 221, Kinstler 237, and Adams 300 game. Katie Jakes, Cormack 179, Yamauchi 185, Valmonte 236 and Brandon 212/812. Sysco

NATIONAL DEAF BOWLING NEWS

PACIFIC COAST DEAF BOWLING TOURNAMENT RESULTS

TIM ESTES FINALLY WINS CONNIE MARCHIONE DEAF MASTERS TITLE

HENDERSON—After almost two decades of traveling from his home in Tacoma to participate in the Pacific Coast Deaf bowling Association and its coveted Connie Marchione Deaf Masters tournaments, Tim Estes finally included his name among the 40 other winners of the prestigious Deaf Masters since its start 51 years ago. In winning, Estes had to do it the hard way, coming back from his first loss in the championship finals to defeat Mike Scharnow in the 2-games rematch 459-449. Previously, former (2005) Champion Scharnow, Dublin, CA after winning his first two matches, suffered his first loss in his third match and had to win three more matches in the losers' bracket to his way up to the Championship Finals against the waiting Estes. In the title finals Scharnow gave Estes his first loss, 494-483 after Estes failed to double in his 10th frame. With both having one loss each, another match was needed and Estes prevailed in winning the exciting close decider.

This 51st Deaf Masters held at Strike Zone Lanes in Sunset Station Hotel and Casino, drew 52 bowlers including 6 former champions and two 199 average Las Vegas female bowlers, Sara Sain-Jurgens and Melchora Lee. The handicap event started with 4 games qualifying round on Saturday afternoon May 28 after the end of the PCDBA team event.

Ron Hogue, Garden Grove, CA was the high qualifier with 228-224-257-226/935 plus 48 handicap for 983, leading a record nine 900 plus scores. Hawaiian former (2007) champion Ralph Collier placed 2nd with 232-234-227-245 for the event's high scratch 938 series plus 36 handicap for 974. Third place qualifier Stan Booth, Moreno Valley with 967 and 11th place Ed Abakumoff, Riverside with zero handicap 896 rolled the event's high 278 games.

The event was a high scoring one with two bowlers from San Diego Stephen Sinatra and John Buhay tying for the last two positions 15th and 16th for the match play rounds with record 871 scores. Also new record tying non qualifying handicap scores 865 were made by Dan Emery, San Diego and Hawaiian former (2002) champion Eric DeLa Pena, Sr. The new titlist Estes qualified 5th with 936 and besides Collier and Runner-up Scharnow (7th with 919), two time former (1988 & 2006) champion Robert Ellison, Apline, Ca also qualified in 10th with zero handicap 897.

The Sunday afternoon two games double elimination match plays saw the top three; Hogue, Collier and Booth got their first loss in 2nd round. Booth was eliminated in the next round and Hogue and Collier kept on winning. Estes and Abakumoff, both winning their three matches without a loss and hungry for their first title, met in 4th round with the winner going to the title finals. Estes gave Abakumoff his first loss, 496-462.

Prior to meeting Estes, Abakumoff gave Scharnow his first loss in the 3rd round, 506-392 and then in the losers bracket 5th round Scharnow ousted in order Hogue 417-412 and Collier in 6th round 457-451 in close matches. This entire going on while Abakumoff was waiting in the 7th round for another match with Scharnow. Scharnow got his revenge by ending Abakumoff's title quest, 478-441. Then in the finals Scharnow gave Estes his first loss and got himself beaten by Estes in turn. For his title efforts Estes gets \$800 and champion plaque and Scharnow \$400 and runner-up plaque. Abakumoff, Collier, Hogue and others down to 16th place will get their prize money.

TOM PARKER WINS HIS FIRST PACIFIC COAST DEAF SENIOR MASTERS

HENDERSON—The 23rd annual PCDBA's Don I. Miller, Sr. Deaf Senior Masters drew an all time low 16 seniors aged 60 and over at Strike Zone Lanes in Sunset Station Hotel and Casino. This year's format is to use handicap instead of previously past scratch scores and 8 qualifying positions for match plays.

Therefore with handicap added the bowlers' PCDBA tournament all-events total used as basis for 8 qualifying positions, Paul Sanchez, Anaheim led with 1724 plus 549 handicap 2273. PCDBA President Howard Sultan, Moreno Valley placed 2nd with 1801 plus378 for 2179 and new senior rookie Tom Parker, a long time North Californian, now from Columbus, OH had the high 1902 all-events but with 207 handicap 2109 as 3rd qualifier.

The remaining 5 qualifiers were former (1997) champion Connie Marchione who as one of 3 founders started this Deaf seniors Masters 23 years ago, had 2108 for 4th, former champion (2004) Pete Morreale, Las Vegas 2091 for 5th, last year's runner-up Don Tousignant, Riverside 2073 for 6th, Bert Smith, No. Cal, 2044 for 7th and defending champion Bob Bergan, Whittier, 2043 for 8th. The double elimination one game with handicap match plays began on Sunday afternoon May 29 with Bergan and Parker wining all their 2 matches without a loss and face each other in 3rd round match. Parker gave Bergan his first loss 223-181, sending Bergan to the semi-final round while Parker waits in the championship finals.

Meanwhile Tousignant who lost to Parker in first round, went on a win spree, ousting Smith, Morreale and Marchione in order to get in semi-finals against his nemesis Bergan who beat him in last years finals. This time Tousignant got his revenge eliminating Bergan 262-223 to get in the title finals against waiting Parker.

Both seniors wanted the prestigious title so bad and Parker won the close battle denying Tousignant to another year. The score: Parker 245+10=255 Tousignant 213+38=251. Parker gets \$400 and Plague and Tousignant \$200 as runner-up again.

Bergan gets \$140 for 3rd and Marchione \$100 for 4th. Next year's 71st annual PCDBA and accompanying 65th annual PCDWBA tournaments will be in Tacoma, WA on 2012 Memorial Day weekend. Bowling will be at Secoma Lanes and hotel headquarters is Quality Inn & Suites, both in nearby Federal Way, WA.

Bryan Moore Wins ABTA at Bowlm

Match Series estimate of \$1,300 Saturday
Match Game IS \$3,500 • 3-6-9 is \$1,700 at Classic Lanes

*ABTA Returns to Classic Lanes in Norco this weekend
Rooms for Las Vegas South Point extended til Sat. June 18*

MONTCLAIR—Welcome everyone to the weekly edition of ABTA news. First of all Note that the Las Vegas Rooms have been extended to this Saturday June 18 if you want one at a great price get it by then Please!

We returned to Bowlm Lanes this past weekend with a nice turn-out of 272 entries in our one-day event, that featured the first of the two-week handicap special. For those that came out at 6 pm, we had a super squad of 144 bowlers during the last squad. We had a decent shot for the tournament making the cut scores of +41 for the men and +29 for the women. The Super Seniors added to the board (3 men and 1 female) were James Futch (+38), Fred Ringor (+36), and Omenza Gaston (-14). Super Seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 64 bowlers making it to the semi-finals this week.

Our top qualifier for the Men was John Licauco with a +161, and for the women it was Deborah Sanders with a +66. If you remember the story from last week, these are repeat top qualifiers for both the Men and the Women. I believe that is a first for the ABTA. Each of them will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Each week our top seed overall draws the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$764. The top seed drew a 664. We had no bowlers that bowled this score during qualifying. At our next event we will estimate the Match Series at \$1,300. For the 3-6-9 qualifying, Nghiem Tran was the last person standing of all the qualifiers. He would go for the pot, but he missed on the second shot and received \$50 consolation. The 3/6/9 will be \$1,700 at Classic Lanes.

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were John Licauco and Jiradej Harnpanakitpanich with a 1475 for \$140. Finishing second was father and son, Thomas and John Licauco with 1469 for \$120.

There was a total of \$1340 paid out in doubles and 22 paid spots with low to cash of 1311.

In the semis we saw three different leaders during the semis as the shot was different across all sections. In the end it was Ken Morris who would finish with a +105 to sit out and bowl for the title this week. The others that lead during semis were Dericio Atkins and Salvatore Galluzzo. Coming in second was Nghiem Tran with a +82 to sit out the first round. It took a +25 for the men and +18 for the women.

Morris, an ABTA regular, and the top seed in semi-finals had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$3,500. The pot is maxed out and we have back-up pot that is also maxed out, with a third pot now started, that will for sure put the Match Game at \$3,500 for our next three events. Ken drew a 219. We had no bowlers who shot that score. We will have \$3,500 next week at Classic Lanes, and continue to build on the back-up pot, which is \$520. This week we had eleven new bowlers join us. Let us welcome these new bowlers to the club, Jeng Aquino, Donald Strong, Ken Paraiso, Aldrian Arana, Inger Bortolazzo, Jun Castro, Lito Eusebio, Kevin Cho, Denis Kabistan, Richard Tan, and Lucy Velasco.

This would bring us to our top 16 Match Play finals. In the first round, the seven losers were Thomas Licauco, Victoria Toro, Dericio Atkins, Cezar Marcella, Julian Conwi, Jamescart Alarcio, and Som Seng. They received checks of \$115 each. In the second round, the losers were Dana LeCount, Faye Josafat, Ben Mach, and Nghiem Tran. They received checks of \$125 each. This would get us down to the final four bowlers. At this point, our horses would be paying anywhere from a low of \$47 (Andy Yu) to a high of \$65 (Salvatore Galluzzo and Michael Benavides) depending on who would win. In this round we saw Bryan Moore (9th seed) bowling

Michael Benavides (15th seed). In this match, we would see Bryan continue his hot bowling to finish with a 218 to 177 and advance to the next round. In the other match we saw Andy Yu (6th seed) bowling Salvatore Galluzzo (7th seed). In this match, Andy would also continue his hot bowling to finish with a 239 to 195 and advanced. Salvatore and Michael finished in 4th and 5th getting checks for \$135 each.

Our semi-final match was all set now. It would be bowled on Lanes 7 and 8 this week and pitted our 6th seed against our 9th seed. In the weekly "horses" we would see Bryan paying \$61 and Andy paying \$47 if they win their match. In a match that was close all the way to the end, we would see Andy open in the 7th frame to allow Bryan to take the lead. Andy would finish the match first and mark in the 10th to force Bryan to get a mark. Bryan came up and got a strike on the first ball that would send him on to the title match with a 180/218 to 154/202. That would give Bryan the victory and for those lucky "investors" that had him as a horse, he paid \$61. Andy finished 3rd and received \$210.

The title game is set and bowled on Lanes 9 and 10 this week. We would see one of our regular bowlers, Ken Morris, bowling Bryan for the title. Ken being the top seed elected to start the match. Ken would start like he was on a mission to the title as he would stay clean through the first six frames, while we would see Bryan have two opens in the first six frames. The tide would change quickly as Ken would leave the 6-7-10 split in the 7th frame and then come back up in the 8th and chop the 6-10 to have back to back opens. That would give Bryan a slim lead at that point. Bryan would come up in the 9th frame to finish the match first. He got his strike in the 9th and then come up in the 10th to double. He got an 8 count and then picked up

Ken Morris (2nd Place) is from Mission Viejo and used a Hammer Hot Sauce Pearl drilled by Dick Braasch. He is engaged to LeAnn with a New Years Eve wedding that is being planned. He would like to say thank you to the ABTA, staff, and Andy Nieman for his coaching along with Dick for drilling his equipment, with a special thank you to LeAnn for allowing him to do what he loves, bowling.

Andy Yu (3rd Place) is from Monterey Park and used a Nano drilled in Japan. He is married to Winie and would like to say thank you to the Mao-Liu league and his friends Billy Chao, Kenny Kwan for their support along with the ABTA and staff.

The weekly ball sponsor winner of a 900 Global Ball was Jason Yeh, and he won the Double Clutch. Each time you bowl, you get a free ticket for this prize given away by our Sponsor, 900 Global. LOW, SCHULTZ EARN \$1,000 SCHOLARSHIPS FOR JUNIOR BOWLERS TOUR INVITATIONAL WINS

MONTCLAIR—Wesley Low and Shauna Schultz earned \$1,000 scholarships each as Champions of the Junior Bowlers Tour's Southern California Conference Invitational tournament, hosted by Montclair's newly remodeled Bowlum Lanes.

Proving once again that age is not the determining factor of success in our events, 14 year-old Low becomes our youngest scratch major tournament champion, beating a field of talented bowlers as old as 22 on the way to the title. After 5 games on a very demanding lane condition where a 178 average was enough to qualify for the 16-bowler triple-elimination matchplay, 17 year-old Adam Dubia was the leader, and he breezed through the early rounds of matchplay with only one loss through seven rounds. Wesley was undefeated through five rounds before Adam handed him his first loss in round six.

Eventually only Low, Dubia, and Derek Acuff remained standing, all with two losses each. In what became the semifinal match, Low eliminated Acuff 213-195, setting up the fitting title match between the two best players of the day. Though a brilliant 4-10 conversion appeared to give Dubia some momentum mid-game, Low countered that with a 5-bagger, and confidently rode that to a 233-208 win, and the fifth title of his JBT career for the little guy with a huge future ahead of him. Adam earned \$500 for second, Acuff won \$300 for third, Steven Manier finished fourth for \$275, and Ben Canfield rounded out the top five for \$150.

Schultz qualified #11 for the 16-bowler handicap finals, and then caught fire in the triple-elimination matchplay, going undefeated through the first six rounds before losing to #1 seed Tyler Wolff, who was outstanding all day, but needed to beat Shauna to stay alive in that round. In round eight, Schultz eliminated Martinez and Bissett eliminated Wolff, setting up a title match situation where Bissett would have to beat Shauna twice to win the title.

It looked like Alex was going to win the first game to force a decider, but after a shaky mid-game, Shauna rebounded with marks in her final four frames to swipe the game back 211-201 and win the title, the first of her career, and the \$1,000 scholarship windfall. Bissett settled for \$500 for second, Wolff earned \$300 for third, Martinez (making yet another major event top-5) pocketed \$200 for fourth, and Goad, also having a fantastic year, earned \$150 for fifth.

CLASS + TALENT

REDLANDS — Edsel (Ed) Shipley was a class act, a great person, and a bowling talent. This “EDSEL” was no lemon. Now he belongs to the Bowling Gods.

Ed passed away recently, just outside of Brunswick Foothill Lanes, in Fontana. He and longtime doubles partner MARY ANDRUCZYK were headed for another tournament, when Ed became ill. JOE DE LA TORRE was with Ed during his last moments, and assured family and friends that Ed was aware to the end and passed calmly, in no apparent pain. Ed exhibited the bravery of a CHOCTAW warrior, right to the end. Ed was part Choctaw, and proud to be a Native American.

A group of more than fifty Citrus Belt bowlers attended a memorial service for Ed, last Tuesday, at Riverside National Cemetery. We witnessed the Navy Honor Guard give Ed a well deserved rifle salute. Mr. Shipley served honorably in the US Navy and always had a place in his heart for our sailors.

After the official program was completed, one bowler after another stepped forward and shared their memories of Ed. There were plenty of tears and some smiles. Ed's wife Fran and daughter Kristy spoke of their love for Ed, and his love for them. “Adopted daughter” MONICA ROLAN also shared her memories of good times past.

All of Ed's friends (including myself) were lucky to cross his path.

He always was willing to stop what he was doing and spend time with a friend, a teammate, and even an opposing bowler. He was wise beyond his years, and that's saying a lot when you're getting ready to turn 84!

Speaking of bowling talent, Ed had it. He was a 200 plus bowler for years, and was still averaging 192 as he approached his 84th year. He rolled numerous perfect games, five at Empire Bowl alone. His high series was a 822 in 2003, when he was 76!

I REMEMBER BOWLING IN TAVA LANES TOP LEAGUE, about ten years ago, AND WATCHING ED COME IN AS A SUBSTITUTE ONE NIGHT, AND BOWL 814! Can you believe it. Ed comes into a new league for one night, on unfamiliar lanes, and bowls 800. That's a talented bowler. I averaged 210 for the season, in that league, and never bowled 700. Ed rolled an 814 in just one week in the league.

Shipley was an ABT bowler since the 1970s, one of the clubs first SoCaL members. He was a multiple champion, with at least four ABT titles. He was an avid reader of the BOWLING NEWS and we regularly discussed it's contents. His long time friend, DARWIN BALDING, joined many of our conversations.

Ed's friends want to THANK the BOWLING NEWS for honoring his memory.

CBW Annual Meeting Approves Restructure

ONTARIO—President Joan Romeo presided over the 13th annual California Bowling Writer's annual meeting at the Radisson Ontario Airport hotel on June 10. The organization is small but mighty with an active agenda. Reports found CBW financially sound and extolled the virtues of their newsletter The InfoLink, which is mailed to membership four times a year; their thriving Phone Card charity that raised nearly \$7,000 to send 685 phone cards to troops overseas and a successful Media & Publicity luncheon hosting 76 men, women and youth.

The most challenging item at the meeting was the legislation that proposed restructuring the board of directors. The membership approved the following amendments: Amendment No. 1:

The board would be reduced to a President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and four Directors. In addition, jurisdictional boundaries for Director's North and South were eliminated. This eliminated one Vice President (terming out in 2012) and the Sergeant at Arms (terming out at the end of her term in 2011.) Reason: The Board of Directors would be more balanced. Currently there are six line officers and only four directors.

Amendment No. 2: The President, with the approval of the elected Board of Directors, shall appoint two (2) Directors at Large with voice and vote to serve for a one year term.

Reason: As it currently stands, the full membership gets the opportunity to elect the line officers and four directors and all too often there may not be two viable candidates for each office so choice is limited further. In most cases, we elect a director because we believe they'll be a good leader. This doesn't necessarily mean they have the best skill set to assist in running the organization.

Elections brought back incumbents Barbara Metzinger of Carmichael, First Vice President; Secretary, Donna Dillard of Pasadena; Jill Williamson of Pacoima and new to the board, Paula Vidad of Citrus Belt.

Terming out will be Sgt-at-Arms Marian Mann of Daly City (2011) and Marianne Evans, 2nd Vice President, Simi Valley (2012.) Andrea Adamson was defeated in the plurality vote of Directors.

CBW Youth Liaison Debbie Haggerty spoke on the state of youth retention. Recently appointed to the USBC National Youth Committee, Haggerty said tournaments like Junior Gold are thriving with large numbers participating but the youth ranks are shrinking because of a lack of good Youth Coaches. The new Program Kids Bowl Free has been a smash with hundreds of kids taking advantage of bowling two games free every day all summer and it brings in the folks too.


Secretary Donna Dillard reported that CBW membership is at 93 and we picked up several new and member renewals during the weekend. The Email Connection operated by Mary Lynly keeps in touch with members and Mary says, “As a communication organization – we don't remove members whose membership has expired.
