Derry ARCADIA—As a slightly-gullible and innocent growing up in the corn belt state of Iowa during the Depression Days, I heard often a phrase from adult lips that held admonishment and fervor of a quality that grabbed my short adolescent attention span, mostly because the words bespoke of a "forbidden fruit" existence that would, one day, entice post-puberty persons and that was "Nice people do not frequent pool halls, beer joints, gambling houses and, lastly, bowling alleys!'

And so it wasn't until I was the co-titular head of my own household that I took up one of the four named above - bowling and discovered that "some of my best friends are bowlers!" Sixty years later (and I am counting!) bowling with some 120 Seniors every Tuesday and Thursday at Action Lanes in El Monte, is a fullblown adventure the minute I hit the front door of this beautifully remodeled Alley. Truly, I am delighted when the key to my locker works the first time and the smell of coffee permeates the designated area which has become my comfort zone two days a week. Perfection would be served if homestyle buttermilk donuts frames replaced the traditional "beer" frames, but that isn't going to happen anytime soon, now is it?

Seniors who have traveled every journeyed path congregate on a daily basis at Alleys across the nation; and there is no doubt the bowler in Des Moines suffers the same confliction as the bowler who obsesses on properly knotted shoestrings on properly powdered bowling shoes two thousand miles away in sunny Southern California. It is not "misery" that loves company as we have been led to believe for lo these many years. It is the "bowler" who knows deep down that the next game will be The 300 Game, and loves/ needs the company of a League of Bowlers to witness this definite possibility. This expectation is not to be underestimated... .it could happen! Most days, the final scores of these seniors who come for exercise, fellowship, constructive criticism and kudos, of which there are plenty to go around, reflect an attitude of "nothing to it!"

Knocking down 300 pins in No Tap play can be child's play for some of the more experienced bowlers while neophytes are applauded and appreciated for their handsome handicaps. It's the pin action as the most modest of all bowlers would say.

Senior bowling has enhanced the lives and the health of these "young at heart" that ignore, for the most part, the aches and pains that are alleviated by an early-morning full-body rub-down with Asperçreme or Blue Emu. Magnetic wraps are good, too, but have been known to wipe out credit cards which could prove to be embarrassing when treating the gang at the nearest Krispy Kreme hang-out. Revered, along with the day's high game, is the socializing that goes on amongst the citizenry. Latest remedies, including the highly popular VicksVapoRub treatment for most every condition except labor pains and the newest, Castiva, made out of castor oil and other by-products purchased at better drugstores everywhere, are discretely discussed.

Still experiencing a deeply ingrained sense of post-adolescent curiosity, I recently conducted a spontaneous survey pertaining to the "earning quarters" years of my fellow guy-and-doll bowlers. Small talk is permitted when bowling, of course, but "What did you do before you retired?" hooked the interest of some who eagerly responded. Impressive, outstanding, you're kidding! Wow! .. .all descriptive of vocations held during those pre-Social Security years by some of "my new best friends." I did not know until I asked that two bowlers celebrate their 90th birthday this year and improving with age which gives me hope. One of these two is a former orchestra leader (in the manner of Woody Herman) and a member of Los Angeles symphony orchestra in his salad days. Ballroom dancing, preceded by a career with Pacific Bell, still scores big for the other, the widow of a major league baseball player out of Chicago who played against the likes of Babe Ruth and Joe DiMaggio as centerfielder for the Cleveland Indians and the Milwaukee Brewers in the early 1930's. Even President Dwight Eisenhower did not know that his cousin, two times removed, personally installed the hand sewn carpet fit for a president in Ike's personal cabin space on Air Force One; and as his cousin was telling me... "When one looked at the carpet at floor level, it appeared that the carpet "actually moved." Still taking pride in his craftsmanship, my bowling buddy

spoke the names of Gene Kelly, Dorothy Dandridge, Anne Francis, and Dolly Parton and "The Rifleman" - Chuck Connors as carpet clients, promising stories of sometimes contrary celebrities as league season progressed.

Smiles broadened as tidbits were shared around the anchored tables. Past achievements were met with "ooohs" and "ahhhhs' The willowy grandmother told of her employment as a matron/ guard at the famous Taycheedah, Wisconsin Women's State Prison from which the infamous "Bambi" escaped some years ago ... but not on her watch! The Explorer was sent into orbit via JPL and the General Dynamics Red Eye Project completed under the watchflul eye of yet another of our "Grams," a research engineer. The Industrial Arts school teacher and cosmetologist each an owner of a local restaurant, the secretary to a concert pianist, the insurance salesman, the used car dealer, the military veterans, the gateman at Santa Anita Race Track, financial consultants and business CEO'S are but a few of the many who comprise compatible groups of three or four, determined to cross off the day's little annoyances but not cross over the foul line at any of the 32 lanes at Action Lane

Culled from those designing and installing carpets to exploring outer space, from those driving big rigs, Greyhounds and school buses to typing church bulletins, from those milking cows to composing advertising to sell the milk, from those heading up port security to professional boxing, from those pioneering in the computer/geek category to medical technicians, from those shepherding actors and actresses during performances at the San Gabriel Community Playhouse to rounding lers for the set Vegas jaunts, from those in the news media to beer brewers, the most-senior population at Action Lanes has regenerated a zest and enthusiasm for a once-dwindling participatory sport. The unparalleled joy of seeing a string of strikes on the animated electronic scoreboard lives on long after the dinner dishes are done, the garbage can lids resettled, and the lights turned off at the end of one fine day, and that same unrelenting joy remains strong harboring the unspoken thought that the next time the 7-10 split happens hey, anything's possible,. And as we are pointedly admonished to do so by that young whipper-snapper 60-ish Dennis Hopper on television, this truly-experienced generation takes unbridled delight in agreeing that one is never too old to dream ... can even make it happen! Many of you bowlers out there know Hall of Famer Chuck Tuma. Chuck's dear wife Marian contacted me a few weeks ago to let me know that he, unfortunately, is in the first stages of Alzheimer's disease and can no longer compete in his beloved sport of bowling. She thought his many, many friends would like to know and that

it would please him to no end if they could send a card. Just a few tidbits of Chuck's life....His family settled in Orange County when he was only 7 years of age. His father was City Treasurer until his untimely death at age 45 then he lived with his mother, aunt and sister. Chuck attended Anaheim High and graduated in 1929.

His illustrious bowling career began shortly after graduation when he joined a league at Santa Ana Recreation Center and bowled with Johnny Johnson. He also bowled at Kona Lanes with the late, great Dick Stoeffler. Chuck knew ALL the "stars" and bowled with them too: Glenn Allison, Rocky Marsh, Fred Riccilli and even the "Greatest", Earl "The Pearl" Anthony. He truly enjoyed those years and learned much about the sport of bowling; not only technique but also etiquette on the lanes which, he felt, was SO very important. He never forgot the "simple" rules of the game and lived by them throughout his bowling career. As the 1946 season got into full swing, so did Chuck. He scored the very first 300 game to be bowled in league play at the Santa Ana Recreation Center and holds the distinction of being the 3rd bowler to roll a 300 ever recorded in Orange County history at that time. He was also a member of the championship team of the very first Orange County Bowling Association Tournament.

When the 1950's rolled around, we saw Chuck continue his competition in Orange County, Long Beach and Los Angeles classic leagues where he was beginning to be known as "That tough shooter from Orange County". In 1956 Chuck won the singles and all events division of the OCBA Tournament, and also took second place in the prestigious Examiner Classic.

Chuck met and married his one true love Marian, in 1956 and they just celebrated 51 years of wedded bliss this past April 1st. She never indicated that they met in a bowling center but, chances are...They have three fine children and are a close knit family.

The 1960's continued to see Chuck carry the Orange County banner to the lanes and Fashion Lanes in Santa Ana was the setting of his 297 game in 1967. Starting into his sixth decade of his association with the game of bowling, Chuck still hadn't shown any signs of slowing down and saw him capture numerous other awards.

Even after retiring in 1972, Chuck still stayed active in his game of bowling. The records show he has been active in starting things for bowling all of his life. 1981 was no exception as he became a charter member of the first Senior Scratch Travel League in the United States. Then bowling in league at Carter Bowl in 1982 at age 72, Chuck showed them all that he could still "string 'em when it counts" by rolling a 737 series. He was a proud member of the Orange Empire Travel League which he loved and where he met many, many friends and formed lasting friendships.

Not only has Chuck been a devoted participating bowler over the years, he has also worked behind the scenes too. Starting from 1948, when he worked as a lane maintenance man in Santa Ana, he also held various positions behind the approaches. He was Bowling Com-missioner for Northrop Aviation Anaheim (1950-52); a deskman, league coordinator and a manager at Futurama Lanes (1956-60) and a pro-shop owner. Both he and Marian bowled together and held office in the Regal Lanes Bowling Club, traveling to many centers away from Orange County. Chuck was also a director on the OCBA board for several years. He also bowled in eight ABC national

tournaments and was active in the National 700 Club of America. I first met Chuck at College Bowl. Do you all remember that really neat bowling center on State College Blvd.?? Well, that was my first league experience and Chuck owned and operated the Pro Shop. He was such a personable man and very informative. He sure helped my bowling! He would very often come out and watch us and could tell at a glance, what we were doing wrong. Thanks for that, Chuck; you were a great teacher!

Many years after College Bowl closed, I remember seeing him when my Orange County Travel Trio league would cross with his league at good ol' Orange Bowl (also now closed.) One day he was just coming in the door (thank goodness they were automatic) pulling his bowling equipment with one hand and balancing a very large box of donuts in the other. I jokingly asked if I could relieve his load by taking a donut; know what he replied? "Sure, but you could help more if you'd just pull my bowling equipment!" What a guy and, oh yes, I DID get a yummy donut. That was Chuck!!

Chuck was installed into the Orange County Hall of Fame in 1991 in the Superior Performance category and Marian says it was one of the most memorable days of his life, knowing the purpose is to honor, pay tribute to, and to perpetuate the names of those bowlers who have contributed to the growth and welfare of the great port of bowling by their ability and/or through meritorious service. For his eight decades of bowling prowess we feel Chuck certainly deserves his place and his smiling face adds grace to the wonderful Hall of Fame wall. I hope everyone has been able to view this "wall" of Fame featuring the best of the best in the Orange County bowling world, located inside La Habra "300" Bowl; if not, you'd better toddle on down and take a look - you won't be disappointed! Marian asks if y'all would be so kind to send cards in care of: Marian Tuma, Tuscany Village, 525 West La Palma Ave., Anaheim, 92801. She says she knows he would really, really enjoy hearing from anyone. His eyes and ears are still good. She faithfully reads his mail to him EVERY single day; he still has that twinkle in his eyes and still smiles and, remembers.....for now!
