

NATIONAL DEAF BOWLING NEWS

MORE ABOUT FRANK GALLO, JR. THE DEAF PBA BOWLER

JACKSONVILLE—This year marks the 40th year Frank Gallo, Jr., Jacksonville, FL has been a member of Professional Bowlers Association. Frank began bowling as a youngster when his father owned the Deer Park Bowl in Long Island, New York. In growing up, Frank attended New York School for the Deaf at White Plains, NY. When leaving school, he loved competitive bowling and started bowling in deaf tournaments.

That was how this writer met Frank for the first time in 1972 at Rockford, IL when I found out the he had a 190 average entering in the World Deaf Bowling Championship and National Deaf tournament. After we met, I was struck when he said his father owned a bowling center and that he would be joining the PBA as he already had two consecutive years of 190 averages.

That was the beginning of more deaf and hearing-impaired bowlers joining PBA and ten years later that led to one by one each deaf bowling associations and clubs banning deaf PBA bowlers from bowling in their deaf tournaments.

Why? Just a few deaf and hearing impaired PBA members had cashed but not very big in money. They cannot make a living in PBA events so they quit in order to be eligible to bowl in their deaf tournaments. Frank missed bowling in deaf tournaments but he made his choice.

All but Frank who at that time was a die-hard PBA member and he knew he could mot make a living bowling in PBA. So one day after a PBA event in Los Angeles he stopped at my home on his way to see a NY classmate of his, the late Dr. Lawrence Fleischer who was Director of Deaf Studies at California University at Northridge. Dr. Fleischer who was also a friend of mine, passed away a couple of years ago.

The reason was Frank was worried about his future and asked me what I thought. My thought was that Dr. Fleischer was the best person to advise him. After Frank returned with Dr. Fleischer's advice of enrolling at Gallaudet University in Washington, DC, he asked what I thought of that. Great, I said, I wished I did that at his age no matter he was too old to attend.

Eventually Frank enrolled there and graduated with a good job at IRS. All during that time Frank kept his membership in PBA active as he bowled part time whenever he could. When he retired from IRS, he bowled full time.

This year was good for Frank. Last March he won his first PBA South Region Senior event to add to his first PBA East Region event which he won after 36 years of trying without success.

More recently he cashed in two PBA West Region Senior event and PBA Senior U. S. Open. But after these he failed miserably in USBC Senior Masters and PBA Northwest/West Region Senior events. PBA South Region Seniors statistics as of 6/4/2012 has Frank Gallo, Jr. in top 10 of two categories. Both in 6th places with Gallo, Jr. in Points ranking with 4 events and 48.246 points and in Earnings with 4 events and \$2,200. These are great.

But in averages and percentages of cashing per event he is below the top 10. He averaged 215.47 for 43 games which placed him 13th. His percentages of cashing and making the finals are 2 times in 4 events for 50.0 per cent. There are other statistics I am not able to get at this time but we certainly hope that Frank improves in them.

Bowling Tips - The Armswing

NORWALK—One of the most important parts of the bowling game is having a smooth/free armswing. Almost all of the pro bowlers on tour have this "fluid" armswing. John Jowdy indicates there are three different types of armswings: 1) relaxed/free; 2) semicontrolled/muscled down, and 3) controlled/completely muscled.

What is "smooth/free armswing"? First- lets define armswing. Its where you swing the ball freely upon push away of the ball. When you push the ball out- the weight of the ball "swings" back and then forward- much like a pendulum. The swing is generated by law of gravity - where as the ball must go forward upon pushing back- this is basic physics 101. The arm is completely relaxed at the shoulder, and the ball swings in a straight forward motion- do not muscle the pushway- if you do, then the ball will not roll the same every time you release it. It is essential to keep the swing "natural" - and not muscle the swing. Many bowlers try and use muscle to power the shot into the lane. Key word is GRAVITY. Let the gravity do the work for you throughout the swing - this form of swing will create quality and you create more consistency of your shots. In addition, the free armswing helps lessen fatique throughout the league/tournament. If you "muscle" the shot- not only will you create inconsistency, but you will end up putting strain on your muscles thus tiring sooner during the game. Just to name a few freeswing bowlers, Chris Barnes, Norm Duke, Wes Malott, Parker Bohn III, and David Ozio.

The "semi-controlled" swing is where you swing ball back naturally; but when you swing the ball down, you use the muscle on the downswing. This is where you allow gravity to take the ball back even though you use muscle on the downswing. The inverse being you muscle it to the top of the swing, and then let gravity take control thru the downswing- Pete Weber uses semi-controlled technique. The final armswing is where you control all elements of the armswing using muscle and not necessarily use gravity- ie. Doug Kent or Ryan Schafer.

In order to get more consistent in your bowling game, its important to create a free armswing which will help you with the physical and mental part of your game. You will notice a difference in your game when you feel more relaxed and let the ball do the work for you. This will increase your scores. Until next time- good bowling and high scoring!

BRING BACK COMPETITIVE BOWLING

NORWALK — The programs instigated by USBC
(life insurance, credit cards,
discounts, etc) to increase
membership have merit, but do
little to recruit and retain new
bowlers (check statistics).

Let's go to the core of bowling; the bowling centers and USBC. Typical centers have reduced their bowling to a few leagues (few, if any, double shifts). Worse, some have reduced their hours of operation, or close for the summer. Other fill-ins are parties and glow (cosmic) bowling. Lastly is "Curb appeal". Too many centers have no appeal. Even centers in Las Vegas are not set up with "curb appeal".... beautiful centers, but hidden behind acres of slots.

The real bread and butter of any business, as any good entrepreneur knows, is "repeat business". We need to answer the following: Does the center have a database of everyone who enters the center? Do they maintain a " mail out" on a regular basis of all activities? Do they have any activities to promote competition with league bowlers, or with the casual and "open play" bowlers? Do they actively engage a sales person to solicit one on one canvassing the bowler's area to promote center activities or to increase league bowl-

To increase business for a service or product, you must have a sales team. There are few, if any, USBC sales people in most centers. How can you sell a product without sales people? Each center MUST have a USBC rep present during open hours to explain USBC and recruit new league bowlers. If they don't have any (sales people) in the ranks, then they must be recruited from outside or pay a sales force if necessary.

Lane patterns are another area that needs close attention. Everyone knows the high scoring conditions are out of control (I counted 78-300 games in one monthly publication). Leagues should be limited to two patterns to be eligible for high scores awards, either 2 to 1 or 3 to 1 ratio, and two lengths, not less than 38 feet. Some would say bowlers wouldn't bowl with such restrictions. They said the same about no smoking centers, but open play is up, especially families, because of it. USBC must "bite the bullet" and lay down the law. Let's go back to more competitive conditions, not just PBA experience leagues but for all leagues. We could sanction other leagues (with reduced fees), but without high score awards.



Donovan Chung Wins 1st ABTA

WEST COVINA — In our return to West Covina Lanes we saw 172 entries come out on Saturday and bowl on a semi tough shot. The cut scores were + 54 for the men and + 42 for the women.

The Super Seniors added to the board (2 men and 1 female) were Ely Cruz +48 and Jerry Fagan +39, and for the women it was Bobbie McCollum +32. Super Seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 44 bowlers making it to the semi-finals.

Our top qualifier for the Men was Giang Huynh with a + 141 and for the women it was Mary Huynh(No relation) with a +102, they will get a paid entry into a regular ABTA event. Each week our top seed overall draws the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$294. Giang drew a 544.

We had no bowlers match this score, so we will estimate the Match Series at \$700 at Covina. The last bowler for the 3-6-9 roll-off was both Bryan Moore and Johnny Tran as they both missed on their final shots. So both will share the \$50 consolation and we will increase the pot to \$2,000 at Covina.

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were Giang Huynh and Don Chung with a 1436 for \$110. Finishing in second was Willie Parawan and Korng Ngow with a 1401 for \$90. There was a total of \$930 paid out in doubles and 19 paid spots with low to cash of 1322.

Then semifinals began and finishing in first was Bobbie McCollum with a +119, after having a big third game to

overtake the top spot. Finishing in 2nd during the semifinals was Mikko Miller at a +110, who led both the first and second games, so he will sit out the first round of the single elims . Bobbie had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$1,040 and she drew 196. After a review of all the scores bowled, no bowler shot that score. We will estimate the pot at \$2,500 Saturday at Covina.

This would bring us to our top 16 Match Play finals. In the first round, the seven losers were Kent Maruyama, Tim Tran, Korng Ngnow, Wendy Soo Hoo, Marvin Crowder, Lonzell Burnett, and Kurt Valmonte. They received checks of \$100 each. In the second round, the losers were Edrich Miller, Bonnie Roberto, Benjamin Chung, and Giang Huynh. They received checks of \$105 each. This would get us down to the final four bowlers.

With the weekly horses paying a low of \$31 (Cecilia Lung) to a high of \$73 (Sun Sundara). In this round we saw Donovan Chung (6th seed) bowling Mikko Miller (2nd seed). We would see a match where the scoring would continue to be tough as both bowlers had trouble early on, but it was Donovan who found something to finish out with a 215 to 174 and advance to the next round.

In the other match we saw Sun Sundara (10th seed) bowling Cecilia Lung (4th seed). In this match, it would be another of those tough scoring matches where neither bowler was able to find a good shot, but it would all come down to the 10th frame, and finishing first

was Cecilia. She got a 6 count followed by only picking up 2 of the pins.

That would bring up Sun who needed to just get 8 to win the match, he would also get a 6 count, that meant he needed to get 3 to win. He picked up his spare to send him onto a 190 to 180 victory and advance to the next round. Cecilia and Mikko finished in 4th and 5th getting checks for \$110 each.

Our semi-final match was all set now, and would pit the 6th and 10th seeds from the semis against each other. In the weekly "horses" we would see Sun paying \$73 and Don paying \$55 if they would win their match.

This was another one of those low scoring matches as we continued to see the hard shot that was to play a role in the tough scoring all day. This match would be "who was able to get the most marks in it", and that would go to Donovan, as he was able to muster 7 against Sun's 5 and finished with a 147/202 to 123/168 and send Donovan onto the title match.

Finishing in 3rd place was Sun Sundara this week for \$200. For those lucky "investors" that had Donovan as a horse, he paid \$200.

The title game was set. It would be Donovan Chung against the top qualifier Bobbie McCollum. Bobbie elected to have Donovan start the match first. He would start out with a strike and that would bring up Bobbie. She would match him, but in the 2nd she would leave the three pin and miss it. In Donovan's half of the 2nd he would get a spare

Sun Sundara is from Diamond Bar and used a Storm Thunder Struck drilled by Ben Mach. He is married and they have four children. He would like to thank everyone at the ABTA left watching the finals and especially the ABTA Staff for an outstanding tournament. Also, best wishes to Tim Tran and Adam Drodz.
