

The winner of three majors on the PBA Tour, Koivuniemi defeats Brian Kretzer 259-237 in title match for first PBA50 Tour major title

LAS VEGAS – Known as Major Mika during a 16-year career on the PBA Tour, 14-time PBA Tour winner Mika Koivuniemi lived up to that nickname by winning the Suncoast PBA Senior U.S. Open presented by Storm Friday for his first title on PBA's tour for players 50 and over.

The 51-year-old native of Finland, who was top qualifier for the stepladder finals, reeled off the first six strikes in a 259-237 win over Brian Kretzer of Dayton, Ohio, in the title match at the Suncoast Bowling Center to win the season's third PBA50 Tour major.

"We may be getting older but winning never

gets old," said Koivuniemi, who won three majors during his PBA Tour career. "There's a lot of great bowlers out here and many of them are bowlers who I bowled against on the PBA Tour so the competition is still tough."

With the first six strikes in the title match, Koivuniemi was able to build a lead that was just too much for Kretzer to overcome.

"I really felt good mentally and couldn't have thrown the ball better considering I don't bowl as much as I used to," said Koivuniemi. "I used a ball that I felt good about but it's one that I either throw continued on page 9

MECHANICSBURG, PA. - In just her fourth career Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour event, Jordan Richard of Tipton, Michigan, rolled to a dominating win Saturday at the PWBA Greater Harrisburg Open.

Richard earned the top seed through qualifying and defeated eight-time PWBA Tour champion Shannon O'Keefe of O'Fallon, Illinois, in the title match at ABC West Lanes, 222-194. The stepladder finals were streamed live on Xtra

EJ Tackett Wins PBA Tour Finals Group 2 Semifinal Round Title Rematch with Jason Belmonte Set for June 19 Defending champ, runner-up to compete in best-of-two-game match on June 19 on CBS Sports Network

ALLEN PARK. Mich. - PBA Tour Finals defending champion EJ Tackett of Huntington, Ind., won his Group 2 stepladder semifinal round, which aired on CBS Sports Network from Thunderbowl Lanes, to set up a rematch with last year's runner-up Jason Belmonte of Australia in the PBA Tour Finals title match which will air June 19 at 5 p.m.

As the top seed for the Group 2 semifinal round, Tackett, a nine-time Go Bowling! PBA Tour winner, defeated Sweden's Jesper Svensson, 2-0, in the best-of-two-game final match, winning the first game, 235-206, and the second game, 245-203.

"I just made good shots down the stretch," said Tackett, the 2016 PBA Player of the Year. "When you have four of the top performers over the past couple seasons, I wasn't so much worried about the conditions but having to beat the great opponents I had in my group."

Like Belmonte did for the Group 1 semifinal, as top seed in Group 2, Tackett chose the 45-foot Dick Weber lane condition.

Even though Svensson appeared to be making good shots, the seven-time tour winner was having trouble carrying which was illustrated by six nine-pin counts in the second game of the match on seemingly good pocket hits.

"The way the lanes broke down worked in my favor," Tackett said of his match against Svensson. "The way we started I thought it was going to be anyone's match because he was able to get to the pocket consistently despite not being able to carry the 7 pin. I was able to string five strikes in the middle of the first game and started with the first four in the second game which gave me good momentum in each game."

Belmonte, who will be trying for his 18th tour win, won last week's Group 1 semifinal by beating fellow twohander Anthony Simonsen of Austin, Texas, 2-0 (265-259, 239-216).

In the opening Group 2 match, four-time tour winner Marshall Kent defeated 18-time winner Tommy Jones, 246-236. Svensson then beat Kent, 279-233, in the second match to advance to the final match against Tackett.



The semifinal stepladder rounds, as well as the championship round, feature the best-of-two-game format with ties broken by a 9th and 10th frame roll-off.

As runners-up in the semifinals, Simonsen will take on Svensson in the PBA Tour Finals third-place match which will precede the title match.

Tackett and Belmonte earned their positions in the semifinal as the total pinfall leaders in two previous positioning rounds bowling on the Petraglia 36, Roth 42, Carter 39 and Weber 45 PBA lane conditions.



TOURNAMENT RULES (New late charge in effect; see Rule #1)

The 20th Annual Reno Junior-Adult Invitational will be held at the National Bowling Stadium, 300 N. Center St., Reno, Nevada 89501, (800) 304-2695. The tournament will be held from July 27 to July 29, 2018, and will be USBC Certified. Deadline for entries is July 10, 2018. Entries received after the deadline will be charged \$5.00 per entry. Entries will be accepted 30 minutes prior to squad time and are subject to squad and division availability. Absolutely no refunds after July 10, 2018. Tournament management reserves the right to use substitutes to fill cancellations. No faxed entries will be accepted. Entries WILL NOT be processed without FULL payment and

information including average verifications. Tournament directors have the right to refuse any entry.

2. <u>ELIGIBILITY</u>: Open to all current <u>USBC</u> members. You MUST show your membership card or proof of membership when checking in. Any bowler not having a USBC Membership Card or proof of USBC Membership must purchase associate membership prior to bowling. Copies of USBC Membership Cards can be printed from bowl.com.

3. MULTIPLE PARTICIPATION: Entrants may participate multiple times per event. In order to place more than once in the prize list for position standings at least two players on the team must be different and you must change partners in the doubles event.a

4. ENTERING AVERAGE: Entrants must use their highest 2017-18 book average. If none, entrants will use their January 1, 2018 average with at least 15 games. If none, entrants must use highest current average of 15 games at the time of entry. Proof of average verification must be provided with paid entry. A standing sheet, which must include a date to verify, signed by their coach or league secretary is proof for verification. If no average verification entrants must use a 225 average for all events. If current season average for at least 21 games at time of bowling exceeds last season's average by 10 or more pins, current season average must be used (Rule 319a-2). Rule 319e (15 or more pin increase in tournament average of 21 or more games in the past 12 months) must be used or bowler will be disqualified.

It is the bowlers' responsibility to verify the accuracy of his/her average, whether submitted by the bowler, team captain, or others. Failure to use the correct average shall disqualify scores if submitted average is lower than correct average, thereby resulting in a lower classification or more handicap. Prize winnings shall be based on the submitted average, if it is higher than the correct average. Corrections in averages can be made up to the completion of the first game of a series, or within 48 hours after completion of the series if the tournament manager, prior to the completion of the first game of a series, has given written consent to the bowler authorizing such extension of time to correct their average

5. RERATE/ADJUSTMENTS: Tournament director reserves the right to rerate or adjust a bowler's average upward prior to competition. If the bowler does not accept the adjustment a refund will be given. Any adjusted or rerated averages, whether accepted or refused, must be reported. Failure to do so is grounds for disqualification Any entrants, youth or adult, who have qualified for a cash and/or merchandise prize of \$600 or more in any tournament in final standings, brackets, side pots, all events, special/donated prizes in the last 12 months must report their scores, position and amount won to the Tournament Management prior to bowling for possible re-rating. Failure to comply will be cause for forfeiture of entry fees and prize winnings.

6. FORMAT: There will be two formats for this tournament. There will be a team event consisting of two Juniors and two Adults bowling a 3 game format. There will also be a doubles event consisting of one Junior and one Adult bowling a 3 game format. An optional Junior Gold event may be offered for the USBC Jr Gold members. The entry fee will depend on the division and will be collected at the tournament site prior to bowling. One in five qualifiers will receive a paid entry (not including travel or expenses) to the national tournament. Bowlers must be a current season Jr. Gold member prior to competition. Membership must be purchased prior to or at the tournament. National tournament qualifiers who are not current Jr. Gold members will be disqualified.

 8. <u>DRESS CODE</u>: Matching and/or professional attire is encouraged. Awards for matching teams will be given "Looking Good" pins. Male participants are asked to wear collared shirts and slacks or dress shorts. Female participants are asked to wear skirts, slacks, skorts or dress shorts and proper shirts. Skirts, shorts and skorts <u>must not</u> be more than 3" above the knee. Attire must be neat, clean and proper fitting. We <u>strongly suggest no jeans</u>, tank tops, hats, or attire advertising liquor or tobacco products, no attire with inappropriate language, or any apparel which the tournament director feels is inappropriate will be permitted. Smoking and/or consuming alcoholic beverages during competition is not permitted.

9. CONDUCT: Any conduct deemed inappropriate, foul language, obscene gestures or abuse of equipment may be cause for removal from competition, as determined by the tournament director. Any incident that reflects poorly on the Reno Jr-Adult Invitational, reported to the fournament Management, whether at the center or otherwise, may result in denial of further participation. Entry fees will not be refunded. **10.** <u>AWARDS</u>: All prize/award fees will be returned 100% within each event, on a ratio of at least 1 prize for each 10 entries or major fraction thereof. The USBC SMART program will administer all scholarship awards, Acct #9312.

11. CHECKIN: Bowlers must check in 1 hour prior to squad time. Tournament spots are on a first-come, first-served basis. Bowlers failing to check in one half hour before their scheduled squad time will lose their scheduled

spot. All substitutions should be made <u>one hour</u> prior to squad time.

12. Additional squads may be added during the course of the tournament as deemed necessary by tournament management, but no squad shall be added after the last advertised squad time. All decisions by the Tournament Director are final unless an appeal is made in accordance with USBC rule 329. All scores are unofficial until otherwise posted. Any questions or concerns must be brought to one of the Co-Tournament Directors. Official protests must be filed, in writing, with one of the Tournament Directors, within 72 hours of the completion of the tournament.

stayed clean to force Richard to mark in the 10th frame. Richard rolled a strike to seal the victory and earn her spot in the season-ending PWBA Tour Championship.

"This win is just as much theirs as it is mine," Richard said. "They push me every single day to be better."

Richard joined the PWBA Tour just before the United States Bowling Congress Queens in May, and now finds herself as one of the front-runners for PWBA Rookie of the Year.

"I've tried to just play my own game and do what's best for me so far," Richard said. "And stay patient. That was the biggest thing I wanted to focus on coming out here. I didn't think I would win out here right away, because these girls are phenomenal and hard to beat. But, I knew if I stayed patient, my time would come, and it has been very exciting." O'Keefe, who made her fourth championshipround appearance of the season, benefitted from a pair of 10th-frame miscues from her opponents on the way to the title match.

In the semifinal, O'Keefe finished with 170, forcing Lindsay Boomershine of Perry, Utah, to roll nine on the first shot of the 10th frame to advance. Boomershine left the 1-2-10 combination and was unable to convert, finishing with 167.

In the opening game of the stepladder, O'Keefe finished with 157, giving Bryanna Coté of Red Rock, Arizona, the chance to move on with a mark in her final frame. Coté left a 7 pin and missed the spare to finish with 150.

Competition this week at the PWBA Greater Harrisburg Open included two eight-game qualifying blocks on Friday to determine the 32 players for Saturday's Round of 32. An additional eight-game block Saturday morning narrowed the field to 12 players, who bowled six additional games to determine the stepladder finalists.

The 2018 PWBA Tour season will continue June 23 with the second major of the year, the U.S. Women's Open. The event will be held at Boardwalk Bowl in Orlando, Florida, with the stepladder finals airing live on CBS Sports Network on Saturday June 30 at 2 p.m.



We bowled a bit in class with rubber balls in the gymnasium and I fell in love with it. My father signed me up for a summer bowling league and I even won a few trophies. We even won a trophy in a father-son tournament.

As I grew, I only bowled for fun, but I wanted to be good. Being consistent is harder than it looks. I think my lifetime high score is 227, and I think I only bowled one game with a clean sheet with no open frames. Like I said, consistency is hard.

It's fun now, watching bowling and the trend of twohanded bowlers. The better pros are now adopting the twohanded throw which puts more spin and a harsher angle into the pocket, spraying pins all over the place. I would love to try that, but my 52-year-old back won't allow it.

Back about a decade ago, the Professional Bowlers Tour came to Tulsa, but bowled their preliminary rounds at The Lanes at Coffee Creek in Owasso.

I attended the qualifying and got to rub elbows with some of those pros I have watched over the years. It is a very fanfriendly atmosphere – what other sport can you actually talk to the competitors during a tournament?

It's funny – they were all really short, much shorter than they look on television.

But it was a great experience.

I was watching YouTube videos one night and ran across a comedian named Jim Gaffigan who did this bit about bowling. It had me rolling.

Here are a few excerpts:

• I went bowling, I don't mean to brag. Really there are two types of people that go bowling. There are people who really love bowling and then there are the people that are like, "Wouldn't it be hysterical if we went bowling?"

• No one is ever jealous when they hear you went bowling.

• Bowling's great because you've got to love a sport you can eat while you play it. Never see that in tennis.


• *There's an ash tray built into the bowling equipment. Poker doesn't even have that.*

• And the hand dryer thing. If you're sweating while you're bowling, you are out of shape.

• I saw this college team championship and each team had a coach. What strategy is a bowling coach giving? "This time Timmy, I want you to knock down all the pins. Trust me."

Fred notes: I contacted Rick the day after the story appeared and asked if he got any reaction from it. Rick said not yet but joked: "I think people are still trying to process it."

As for that bowler who rolled that 100 game, it was Tom Daugherty, who despite that inglorious game has won two PBA Tour titles (see accompanying story about his fabled Tournament of Champions match.)

What League Bowlers Can Learn From Tom Daugherty's 100 Game

LAS VEGAS – Not too long ago, a bowler in a Los Angeles-area league apparently got frustrated over a shot that she felt deserved a better result.

"Frustrated" may be putting it a bit mildly.

After leaving the dreaded 7-10 split, this woman picked up two bowling balls – one in each hand – and slung them one after another at the two pins as her fellow bowlers looked

on in astonishment.

Her first shot landed safely in the gutter and her second shot crashed into the sweep bar – fortunately bouncing off and causing no damage.

This show of disrespect for the game happens more often than people realize as anger takes hold – especially during the course of league play when end-of-the-season payouts serve as incentive to bowl consistently above one's average.

League players also have been known to bounce their bowling balls off the floor when their shots misfire – often triggering a scary boom reverberating around the bowling center.

These disenchanted league players could learn a lesson

from professional bowler Tom Daugherty. His actions at a big-money tournament were decidedly upbeat despite a downbeat performance.

Showing grace and good humor during his nationally televised semifinal match in the 2011 Tournament of Champions in Las Vegas, Daugherty had the crowd eating out of his hand at the end as he couldn't catch a break.

Splits on frames one, three, five, six, eight, nine and 10 would have had lesser people kicking the ball return. Instead, the right-handed Daugherty kept chucking his ball down the lanes the best he could, hoping his string of misery would end – at some point.

It never did.

But the unshakable Daugherty celebrated when he knocked down two pins of his 4-6-7-10 split on his last shot to allow him to reach an even 100. And the fans celebrated with him, as he traded high-fives with much of the gathering with a big smile on his face.

Mika Koivuniemi defeated Daugherty, 299-100, in that one-sided semifinal match. Daugherty finished with two strikes and eight opens. Koivuniemi went on to win the Tournament of Champions title. (Daugherty still won \$50,000 for finishing third.)

It's worth watching the video of the Koivuniemi-Daugherty match online to see how someone can handle big-time misfortune without testily dribbling his bowling ball off the floor.

After watching the match, one can conclude that Koivuniemi was not the only winner in that tournament.

a lot of strikes with or throw a lot of splits. Fortunately, it was strikes today.

"My attitude has always been to focus on what I can do to win," he added. "Even though Brian was bowling well it didn't have any effect on what I needed to do going into the (title) match."

Koivuniemi, who has been retired from the PBA Tour for three years, isn't able to bowl as much because he is the full-time head coach for the United Arab Emirates national bowling team.

"I'm fortunate that I'm still able to get time off to bowl these tournaments," Koivuniemi said of competing in the Senior U.S. Open and USBC Senior Masters. "I believe I can win these tournaments so that's why I make the trip."

Koivuniemi's previous best PBA50 major finishes were seventh in the 2017 Senior Masters and ninth in the 2017 Senior U.S. Open.

Kretzer, who qualified fifth for the finals after making a big move from 14th after Friday's first match play round, started by winning the opening match against No. 4 qualifier five-time PBA Tour winner Ryan Shafer of Horseheads, N.Y., 208-196. He then went on to beat PBA Hall of Famers Parker Bohn III of Jackson, N.J., 243-193, and Brian Voss of Centennial, Colo., 257-196, on his way to the title match.

Kretzer, who owns one PBA Tour title, was trying for his first PBA50 Tour title. Bohn, a 35-time PBA Tour winner, was trying for his fifth PBA50 Tour title and Voss, a 25-time tour winner, was trying for his third and second of the season.

In danger of missing the cut to match play, PBA Hall of Famer Pete Weber of St. Ann, Mo., who was trying to become the Senior U.S. Open's first three-time winner rallied in the final two rounds of match play with an 11-1 match play record but fell just short of making the finals finishing sixth.

The PBA50 Tour will take a four-week break and return to action with the PBA50 River City Xtreme Open presented by Ebonite in Monticello, Minn., July 17-20.






