## Annette Anderson California U.S.B.C. Coach of the Year

ONTARIO — This year California U.S.B.C. elected Annette Anderson, Coach of the Year for 2011.

Annette has been involved in bowling since she was five years old. She started helping her Mother with youth bowling at the age of 14 and when she was 17 she started running her own program. She helped family members become better bowlers and showed them how to sharpen their skills.

In 1992 Annette was having trouble with her back and had to have back surgery, which was unsuccessful, but that didn't keep her from coaching the youth. In 2003, Annette started the Turtle Bowl Youth program at the request of some of the parents of the youth bowlers she was teaching.

Annette served with the C.A.U.S.B.C. Youth Board, and ran the District 7 Pepsi Tournament. She was a Level 1 Certi-

fied Coach under A.J.B.C. then under Y.A.B.A. she was a Level Coach 1 & 2. And in 2008 she became a Bronze Level Coach with the U.S.B.C.

She learned how to become a Youth Coach from her Mother and she's been running youth leagues ever since.

She was on the San Gabriel Valley Youth Board when they merged and worked in the office with the Men and Women's Board.

While many of the delegates and guests headed in all different directions to enjoy a relaxing lunch, several attended the California Bowling Writers Media and Publicity Luncheon and were entertained by the keynote speaker, the talented Mark Baker, holder of four PBA National Tour titles. Mark offered his insight to his unique approach to coaching.

The afternoon “Jamboree” held from 2-4 pm. was again a “full house”. Both Mike Larsen and Bob Schoeneman USBC Western Regional Representatives were on hand for the discussions and Q & A session.

All Delegates and guests were on their own for dinner and invited to (Poolside) from 6:30-9:00 pm for our Hospitality Social. Introduction of the Hall of Fame Inductees Laurie Soto (Superior Performance); Al Hoffmann and Clarence “Butch” Wittman (Meritorious Service) were first on the program followed with our bowling interpretation of “Deal no Deal” game. Nine of our gentlemen board members and Mike Larsen donned a woman’s wig (all of different styles); lined up triangle fashion, holding a replica of a white numbered (1-10) bowling pin in lieu of a suitcase (as is done on the TV show Deal or No Deal). Larry Peppers was the “money manager” and Kathy Bruegeman, wearing a skull cap, performed as the TV emcee Howie Mandell. All delegates present had their name put into a bowl and drawn at random as a “contestant”. Following the format of the TV show, they picked a number and whatever dollar amount was attached to that pin was crossed off the board. All the contestants played for “cash money” while the audience were truly entertained.

The Star of Tomorrow \$1, 000 Scholarship Award was presented to Anthony J Rose of Carpinteria. Distinguished Service Award went to Ron Webber of National City, Manager of Brunswick Premier Lanes. Proprietor of the Year was awarded to Jim Hornung, Sr. owner of Yorba Linda Bowl and Coach of the Year to Annette Anderson of Pomona and Coach at Oak Tree Lanes. North County USBC was awarded Association of the Year.

The meeting was recessed for lunch just before noon. At our Annual Luncheon held around the pool area, a delicious menu was served to 154 delegates and guests. When the meeting resumed at 1:30, the Nominating Committee presented their Slate of Candidates for a two (2) year term beginning August 1, 2011. Elected to 1st VP Rosie Parker; 3rd VP (must be Youth) Anastasia Sylvestser; Directors: (Incumbants) Elaine Baker, Dennis Ganduglia, Mike Lucas, Mabel Sheasley Sandi Thompson,

Larry Worrall. (Newly elected) Chris Addington, Ernie Santos. On the Slate for the Youth Committee: Members-at-Large:

With no further business, President Johnson adjourned the meeting at 3:30 pm.

## New Classified Doubles leaders emerge at USBC Open Championships

RENO — A few years ago, Gary Weldon of Temple City, Calif., decided he was going to bowl in three leagues in three different bowling centers in order to challenge himself with a variety of lane conditions.

The 62-year-old right-hander has become a student of the game and enjoys learning about the latest bowling technology. His diligence paid off this season with his first 300 game and a 200 league average for the first time, and his success continued at the USBC Open Championships on June 17.

Weldon made a run at a perfect game in his final game of doubles, and although he fell short and finished with 289, the effort was enough to lift him and Velvet Sanderson of Norco, Calif., into the Classified Doubles lead with a 1,223 total. Susan and Dennis Combs of Howard, Ohio, previously held the top spot with 1,213.

“I was just trying to hold my concentration, but I let the 11th shot go about a board too far right,” said Weldon, who made his third Open Championships appearance. “I had some lucky hits earlier in the series, and I’m grateful for those. All I really wanted was to bowl well for doubles.”

As he stepped up for his shot at perfection, Weldon had no idea he also needed the first strike for the doubles lead. He finished with games of 233,

178 and 289 for a 700 series, his best on the tournament lanes by 70 pins. Sanderson, whose husband, Dean, has helped coach Weldon, added games of 188, 156 and 179 for a 523 set, her best in five tournament appearances.

“This just blows my mind,” said Sanderson, a 48-year-old right-hander who bowls league at AMF Bowling Square Lanes

in Arcadia, Calif. “I’m glad we had no idea what the leading score was or that we were close. We just wanted to bowl well for each other, and it feels incredible that we were able to take the lead. I’m certainly not a big bowler, and that’s the best I’ve ever done here. You need a good energy for doubles, and we like that we were able to be there to lift each other up.”

## PBA GEICO Team Shootout Begins This Weekend on ESPN Saturday-Sunday Telecasts Begin Race to Manufacturers Cup

CHICAGO — Four major bowling ball manufacturers— Brunswick, Ebonite International, Storm Products and 900 Global—will once again do battle for bowling industry bragging rights when the fifth edition of the Professional Bowlers Association’s GEICO Team Shootout airs on ESPN on Saturday, June 25 at noon ET, and Sunday, June 26, at 4 p.m. ET.

Four teams, each made up of five Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour competitors, will represent the bowling ball companies in a series of singles, doubles and team matches leading to the Manufacturers Cup and a \$70,000 first prize. The competition at 10pin lounge in downtown Chicago marks the return of PBA competition to the Windy City for the first time in 47 years.

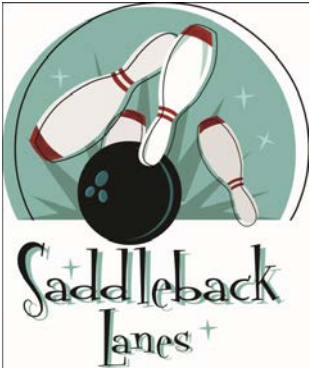

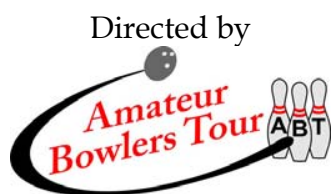
