Team USA Wins Weber Cup XX Evens All-Time Series

LAS VEGAS - The Weber Cup was conducted over a span of four days on a single lane in a stadiumstyle setting at Mandalay Bay in Las Vegas. Team USA took advantage of the Weber Cup being contested on its home turf for the first time in history as it defeated Europe 18-14 to win bowling's version of the Ryder Cup.

The Americans entered the fourth and final day of competition with a 14-9 lead and was able to secure the victory in seven matches Friday. The U.S. victory evened the all-time series at

Danielle McEwan Wins Second Major at 2019 U.S. Women's Open

LAS VEGAS – Needing a double in the 10th frame for the chance to win the 2019 U.S. Women's Open, Danielle McEwan of Stony Point, New York, delivered a pair of strikes and toppled nine pins to win her second career major champion-

McEwan defeated top seed Tannva Roumimper of Indonesia in the title match, 201-199, to claim the coveted green jacket and \$20,000 top prize for her fifth career Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour title.

The 2019 event was held at Texas Star Lanes, and the stepladder finals was broadcast live on CBS Sports Network.

"This was one of my top goals - to win the U.S. Women's Open," said McEwan, who also won the 2015 PWBA Tour Champi-

onship. "When you look at this event, they're the best in our sport. To add my name along theirs is amazing."

The tightly contested finale saw both players open toward the end of the match, helping create the dramatic finish.

Roumimper left the the people who have won 4-6-7-10 split in the eighth frame, while McEwan faltered in the ninth frame as she was unable to convert the 2-4-10 split.

McEwan, who was making her fourth championship-round appearance at the U.S. Women's Open, needed to fill 28 pins to secure the win and delivered in arguably the biggest mo-

Perseverance: It's Money in the Bank for Mary Basore

WINNETKA - Perseverance.

Those players who know how to exhibit that trait have a huge edge, but it's not an easy task.

Simply put, bowlers get frustrated, irritated and sore when pins don't fall a certain way. And that often leads to more frustration, irritation and soreness.

On the other hand, if bowlers can shake off those inevitable tough times, they accept the fact that adversity comes and goes.

Those perseverance peeps know that one bad break doesn't make for a bad game or a bad series.

Same with two bad breaks. Or three bad breaks.

How about *four* bad breaks?

Mary Basore knows the answer to that. She started her recent league series with nasty splits in her first four frames at Winnetka Bowl.

Mary's game, though, didn't come to a screeching halt after those four open frames.

"That was a typical night," laughed Mary, who carries a 124 average. "I wasn't surprised I got the splits. I'm very inconsistent. But I wasn't depressed."

When husband Mark, a lights-out 200 bowler, came over to comfort her and make a suggestion, Mary didn't turn him away.

She listened to her teammate.

"In the past, I wouldn't allow him to give me criticism. It's the husband-wife thing," said Mary, who's been bowling with Mark for 30 years.

This time Mary followed Mark's advice to roll the ball over the arrows instead of the dots.

Mary rallied to come out of nowhere and register an

That wasn't even the highlight of her night. Her crowning moment came when she knocked down the scary 3-6-7-10 split – sliding the 3 pin across the lane to upend the 7.

"I'm on a roll," said Mary with a big smile, "and I'm not going back."

Belmonte, a four-time winner in 2019, has won four previous ESPYs. During the 2019 Go Bowling! PBA Tour season, he has won the PBA Tournament of Champions and a second consecutive PBA World Championship for his 10th and 11th PBA Tour major titles, surpassing Earl Anthony and Pete Weber for first on the all-time majors

Just shy of his 55th birthday, Duke, a four-time ESPY winner, won the Go Bowling! PBA Indianapolis Open and the Go Bowling! PBA Jonesboro Open for his 39th and 40th tour titles, becoming the oldest player to win back-toback tour titles. He joins all-time PBA Tour titles recordholder Walter Ray Williams Jr. (47) and Earl Anthony (43) as the third player ever to win 40 PBA Tour titles.

Butturff, a two-time winner so far in 2019, is looking for his first ESPY. He won the USBC Masters for his first PBA Tour major. He also was runner-up to Belmonte in the PBA World Championship.

Simonsen, who became the youngest player ever to win a major when he won the 2016 USBC Masters at age 19, became the youngest to win two majors when he captured the 2019 PBA Players Championship at age 22. He also is hoping for his first ESPY.

JAKOB BUTTURFF, LIZ JOHNSON TOP 2019 WORLD BOWLING TOUR POINTS LISTS

Jakob Butturff of Tempe, Ariz., and Liz Johnson of Palatine, Ill., are the early men's and women's leaders in World Bowling Tour points in the races for three berths in the 2019 World Bowling Tour Men's and Women's Finals. The finals will take place for the first time in Kuwait at the conclusion of the World Bowling-PBA International Tour's Kuwait Open, Oct. 31-Nov. 6.

Points are earned in designated World Bowling Tour events held around the world. Seven additional events are on the men's schedule in 2019 while women have eight more events, including this week's U.S. Women's Open.

Butturff heads the men's qualifying list with 1,080 points, followed by PBA Tour rookie Mykel Holliman of Collierville, Tenn. (636 points); defending WBT Men's Finals winner Jason Belmonte of Australia (600); Mitch Hupé of Canada (468) and AJ Chapman of Manchester, Iowa (444).

The women's top five are Johnson (1,224); Danielle McEwan of Stony Point, N.Y. (928); Tannya Roumimper of Indonesia (720); and Clara Guerrero of Colombia (696). Missy Parkin of Laguna Hills, Calif., and Dasha Kovalova of Ukraine are tied for fifth with 600 points each.

month at the United States Bowling Congress Queens. "I tried to just be happy and smile and control what I could control because my heart (was pounding). There was so much going on in my mind, and I needed to get it all out.

"She threw two really good shots in the 10th, so she deserved it. I just need to believe that everything happens for a reason, and my day will come. It will. I just need to keep believing in that and one day, it will be mine."

McEwan's 229-225 semifinal win against Shannon O'Keefe of Shiloh, Illinois, shared the same excitement as the title tilt, with McEwan rolling three strikes in the final frame to advance.

O'Keefe, who was looking for her first win at the U.S. Women's Open after a pair of runner-up finishes, finished the semifinal with two strikes in the 10th frame, which forced McEwan to fill 27 pins to move to the title match.

O'Keefe won her first match Sunday, defeating defending U.S. Women's Open champion Liz Kuhlkin of Schenectady, New York, 233-192.

Kuhlkin, who defeated Shannon Sellens of Long Beach, New York, in the opening match of the stepladder, 213-183, was looking to become the fourth player to successfully defend a title at the event and 12th bowler to win the tournament multiple times.

All competitors bowled 24 qualifying games over three days to determine the 36 players advancing to a cashers' round. After eight additional games, the field was cut to the top 24 bowlers for round-robin match play.

The five finalists were determined by total pinfall, including bonus pins, for 56 games.

Each round of the 2019 U.S. Women's Open leading up to the stepladder finals was broadcast live at BowlTV.com.

PBA REGIONAL UPDATE: UMBRELLO ROLLS CLUTCH DOUBLE FOR FIRST PBA TITLE

• Corey Umbrello of Westminster, Mass. rolled a clutch double in the 10th frame to defeat Ryan Graywacz of Canastota, N.Y., 227-224, to win the PBA Homefield Bowl Eastern Open presented by MOTIV in Yonkers, N.Y., Sunday.

Umbrello, who qualified first for the stepladder finals by 65 pins over Graywacz, opened in the ninth frame to give Graywacz an opportunity to close him out. But after throwing strikes in the ninth and 10th frames, Graywacz failed to throw the clinching third strike in a row and Umbrello then doubled to secure his first PBA title and the \$3,000 first place prize.

Graywacz almost missed the stepladder finals, but defeated Michael Markis of Scranton, Pa., in a one-game roll-off, 206-176, to make it into the four-man finals. Graywacz, who also was looking for his first PBA title, then defeated Jonathan Van Hees of Charlestown, R.I., 213-190, and defending champion Anthony Pepe of Elmhurst, N.Y., 201-189, to advance to the championship match.

• John Janawicz of Winter Haven, Fla., defeated Kristijonas Sergejevas of Lithuania, 235-196, Sunday to win the fourth annual PBA Timmy See Memorial South Open presented by MOTIV at BreakPoint Alley in Tavares, Fla.

Janawicz, a 2018 USBC Hall of Fame inductee, qualified in the top position for the stepladder finals with a 17-game pinfall total of 4,238, and easily won the championship match after starting with four strikes while Sergejevas opened in the third frame and failed to throw consecutive strikes until the eighth and ninth frames.

In the opening match Anthony DeStasio of Fort Lauderdale, Fla., defeated Shawn Naumann of Orlando, Fla., 248-235. Sergejevas then defeated DeStasio, 257-224, to advance to the final match.

Janawicz earned \$2,300 for the win but doesn't get credit for a PBA title because he is not a PBA member.

The Perfect Game: Albert (Allie) Brandt

On October 25, 1939, Allen's Alleys in Lockport, NY became the center of the Bowling Universe as Albert "Allie" Brandt set a new world record for the highest score ever recorded in an ABC sanctioned event. Pummeling pins for scores of 297-289-300, his 886 series would stand as the epitome of bowling excellence until July 1, 1982.

Who was Allie Brandt? Born on December 14, 1902, he became "the man to beat" just shy of his 37th birthday. His record lasted for almost forty-three years. Was he just some guy who got lucky one night? Hardly. That series foreshadowed what the future held for this man. He would become a highly successful professional bowler with many accolades to his credit. Nicknamed, the "King of Bowling" by the locals, this 5' 4" family man lived and loved this sport. The following is a brief resume of his bowling career.

- In 1946 & 47 he was named to the First Team All-American Bowling Team.
- In 1953, he built and operated "Allie Brandt Bowling Lanes".
- In 1958, Brandt became a charter member of the PBA and served as the first treasurer on the Board of Governors until his death in 1982.
- In 1960, he was inducted into the ABC Hall of Fame.
- From 1975 77 he served as president of the ABC Hall of Fame.
- In 1976, he became a charter member of the Hall of Fame of both Lockport and Buffalo Bowling Associations.
- In 1980, he sold the center he built, but it still bears his name.
- In 1982, he became a charter member of the New York State Bowling Association Hall of Fame.
- Allie Brandt bowled in 49 ABC National Tournaments, his final one in Baltimore, at the age of 70. (He would have bowled in three more, but WW II got in the way.)
- On April 17, 1982, the world of bowling lost a giant when Allie Brandt passed away at the age of 79.

On the lanes, Allie was known as a "feisty" battler driven by a fierce determination to succeed. In 1946, his talent and stamina carried him to the final match of the 100-game ABC All Star Tournament. He finished second to another bowling legend, Andy Varipapa.

Away from the lanes, Allie was well known, well liked, and highly respected. He and his wife, Nina, were married for over 50 years and had two children, Albert Jr. and Anne; both still reside in Lockport. When I contacted Anne, she was gracious enough to share some of the memories she has of her father. Here's a sample of our conversation:

Steve: Anne, when your father rolled his epic series, you were five years old and your brother was eight. What was it like to know that your dad had just done something so special?

Anne: To us, it wasn't really a big deal. Dad didn't talk about it. It was just something that happened and life went on. He was a humble man. He wasn't conceited about it and he never bragged about it.

Steve: What was your father like? Was he friendly? Demanding? Stern?

Anne: I wouldn't say he was stern; he was fair-minded. He was also a gentleman. He was the type of man who felt that if you wanted something, you had to earn it; he worked every day. He didn't talk much because he didn't have to. He had icy blue eyes and whenever my brother or I got into trouble, we'd just get "the look." That look said, "Come on! Toe the line!"

Steve: Did he ever talk about his friendships with any of the ABC officials or Board members?

Anne: No. Dad just wasn't a talker. He was a very private man. He didn't gossip or talk about his bowling. He was a "mans man," whatever that means.

Steve: I think it means he had a certain set of principles that he lived by, and he didn't much care what anyone

else thought.

Anne: Yes, that pretty well describes my father.

Steve: Are you familiar with a man named Glenn Allison?

Anne: Yes, I've heard of him.

Steve: He was the man who beat your father's record.

Anne: Yes, I know.

Steve: How do you think your father would have reacted to that?

Anne: My father was a real sportsman; a TRUE sportsman!

He would have been the first to congratulate that man if he had been there!

One Final Note

On October 25, 1939, Allie Brandt made one bad shot. The twelfth ball he delivered in his first game resulted in a seven-count. He must have been furious with himself and probably wished he could take that one shot over.

The same thing almost took place for Glenn Allison. In the tenth frame of the last game, his first ball went too high on the headpin and almost left him with a 4-9 split. Had that happened, he would have regretted that delivery for the rest of his life; even a spare followed by a strike would have left him shy of the record. A few years ago, Glenn told me, "That 4-pin shouldn't have fallen, but somehow it did."

Why did that pin fall? Why did it fall so perfectly that it wobbled the 9-pin just enough to make it drop as well? Anne Litz said her father, "would have been the first to congratulate that man, if he had been there." Who's to say he wasn't?

Albert Brandt and Glenn Allison had a lot in common. Brandt was a humble gentleman, Allison still is. Both possessed incredible talent and dedicated much of their lives to this sport. Both were fierce competitors, became champions, and attained Hall of Fame status.

Allie Brandt knew the day would come when his record would be broken. My bet is this: He would have been elated it was Glenn Allison who broke it.

PBA World Series of Bowling XI Returns to Las Vegas in 2020

Fan-friendly South Point Bowling Plaza to host world's best bowlers for multi-event series March 6-18

LAS VEGAS – The Professional Bowlers Association's World Series of Bowling XI will return to the South Point Bowling Plaza in 2020 for its traditional multi-event championship series, capped by the PBA World Championship.

The 11th anniversary World Series of Bowling, featuring the world's best bowlers, will include the PBA Cheetah, Chameleon and Scorpion Championships as well as the PBA World Championship and the USA vs. The World team event to conclude five consecutive days of television coverage by FOX Sports.

All of the competition will be contested in the South Point Hotel Casino & Spa's state-of-the-art 60-lane Bowling Plaza where FOX Sports will again televise the finals of each animal pattern championship and the PBA World Championship live on consecutive days, followed by the annual team event. PBA's livestreaming partner, FloBowling, will provide live coverage of all preliminary rounds.

The 10th anniversary World Series was highlighted by Jason Belmonte's second straight PBA World Championship victory and record 11th PBA major title. WSOB X, which returned to Thunderbowl Lanes in Allen Park, Michigan – the home of the inaugural World Series in 2009 – was watched by a cumulative audience of more than three million viewers on FOX Sports' network of television and media outlets,.

South Point previously hosted the WSOB from 2010 through 2014. The WSOB VI finals were the first official competitions conducted in South Point's new \$30 million Bowling Plaza, a facility that is specifically designed for world-class tournaments in a fan-friendly environment.

WSOB XI will get underway on Saturday, March 6, with a Pre-Tournament Qualifier (PTQ) open to PBA members who have not earned exemptions into the tournament. Competition begins in earnest with qualifying rounds for the Cheetah, Chameleon and Scorpion Championships on March 8, 9 and 10, respectively. The Cheetah finals will air live on Sunday, March 15; the Chameleon finals live on Monday, March 16; the Scorpion finals live on Tuesday, March 17, and the PBA World Championship finals live on Wednesday.

FOX Sports' coverage of the World Series program will conclude with the USA Vs. The World team match on Thursday, March 19, as the fifth consecutive day of coverage. Additional tournament scheduling information for WSOB XI and the 2020 Go Bowling! PBA Tour season will be announced soon.

- stages. This time it was the PBA Regional. Do lefties have an advantage???
- Bullhead City Bowl opened....across the river from Laughlin, Nevada.
 Mark Baker finished fourth in Western Pro Open...traveled to Anaheim, bagged \$520
- and the victory in the 6 gamer at Linbrook. Not quite what "The Tour" pays!
- Young Pete Weber won his 13th title in Green Bay, banking \$20,000.






