Ken Clay's Pigeons Are Vanquished - Again!

MURRIETA — The “coaches” did it again. For the second consecutive season Ken Clay and ALAN MOJADO teamed up to win Cal Oaks 640 Scratch League title and a \$4,000 pay check. Ken Clay and his team (INSPHERE INSURANCE SOLUTIONS) are beginning to make their competition look like clay pigeons. KEN CLAY’S clay pigeons, Clay pigeons who can easily be picked off with a pea shooter. Or should I say easily picked off with a Storm Vivid bowling ball. That’s the ball Ken and every one of his trio used to win the championship.

I am not aware of anyone else repeating as league champions in Cal Oak’s top scratch league. I know that JIM MURTISHAW’S team has been runner-up several times, and DON MOSER’S team has consistently been in the running. However, none of these PBA stars have repeated as league champions.

Ken and Alan are “fondly” referred to as the “coaches” because Ken is a USBC certified Bronze coach while Alan is Silver certified. They host a clinic every Saturday morning at Cal Oaks for junior bowlers. In September they will be moving their successful Junior Gold League to Cal Oaks.

The coaches attribute their success to coaching, communication, and teamwork. I would add talent to that list. The coaches guided teammate BOBBY NEILL to a 22 pin average increase and most im-

proved league bowler award.

Bobby was bowling in his first scratch league and went from a 180 to a 202 bowler. Bobby’s incredible improvement played a major role in the team’s dominance. Not only did they win the championship match by a whopping forty-six pins, they won two regular season blocks, one week before the position round week! They dominated the league in points won, winning percentage and total pinfall.

I would like to congratulate the coaches on their title. My question is: Can they threepeat? With averages of 232 and 228, the coaches will have to find another Bobby Neill to fit under the 640 cap. If they do, watch out all you clay pigeons out there in the southern part of the CITRUS BELT.

Walter Ray Williams Jr. Wins PBA Senior Northern California Classic For Second Title of the Season

Hall of Famer defeats Hugh Miller 248-231 in championship match for fourth career Senior Tour title

BRENTWOOD — Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. made a bid to become the favorite for 2012 Senior Player of the Year honors by winning the PBA Senior Northern California Classic presented by Track Wednesday at Harvest Park Bowl.

The seven-time PBA Player of the Year became the first two-time winner this season by defeating Hugh Miller of Seattle, 248-231, in the championship match.

“A lot of my matches today were closer than they looked,” said Williams, who was the 2010 PBA Senior Rookie of the Year. “It wasn’t all smooth sailing because I had a couple of matches that came down to the 10th frame. But I did what I had to do to win.”

Williams, who won the Senior Don Carter Memorial earlier this season, captured

his fourth career Senior Tour title to go along with his PBA Tour career-leading 47 titles. He also improved on seventh and 17th-place finishes in his previous two Senior Northern California Classic appearances.

“The first game I bowled in match play I shot 194 and missed the pocket one time so I had to go to another ball to get a better reaction on the backend,” said Williams, who won a total of four matches Wednesday. “I had one open and don’t think I missed the pocket maybe two or three times all day. I’m just glad I didn’t waste all my strikes in qualifying.”

Miller was trying to become the seventh different winner of the season and was coming off a fifth-place finish in the Etonic PBA Senior U.S. Open and second-place finish in last week’s United States Bowling

Congress Senior Masters.

In the semifinals, Williams defeated Mike Dias of Lafayette, Colo., 259-228 and Miller defeated Hall of Famer Wayne Webb of Columbus, Ohio, 216-205, to advance to the title match.

The 2012 PBA Senior Tour season takes a six-week break before it resumes with the PBA Senior South Shore Open presented by DV8 at Olympia Lanes in Hammond, Ind., Aug. 6-9, and the season-ending PBA Senior Decatur Open presented by Brunswick Aug. 11-14 at Spare Time Lanes in Decatur, Ill.

NATIONAL DEAF BOWLING NEWS

NOTE TO ALL CALIFORNIA DEAF SENIOR BOWLERS AGE 50 AND UP

SANTA CLARITA — JULY 1 IS LAST CALL FOR ENTRY IN MY DEAF GROUP IN CalUS-BC SENIOR SINGLES TOURNAMENT AT SANTA CLARITA LANES in Saugus, CA. Bowling on Saturday morning August 18 at 10 AM. If you are over 50 and do not have an entry form, let me (Connie) know fast by TTY 818-785-1478 with your age and address. Then I will mail you the entry form and you will have to fill out and rush it back to me with your \$40.00 entry fee.

If you had missed reading about this tournament in my National Deaf Bowling News column in June 7th Bowling News, I will explain briefly.

This is an annual hearing 6 games singles tournament for California seniors age 50 and up with separate male and female prizes in 6 different age groups from 50, 55, 60, 65, 70 and 75 up. You enter once at \$40.00 entry fee paid by entry deadline of August 1, 2012. The choice of bowling dates are August 17, 18 and 19 and squad times of 10 AM or 2 PM.

Last year at Visalia, CA, I had a group of 4 deaf seniors bowling together and want to bowl again. Many had made advance paid entry reservations for this year's tournament. That is why I want more deaf seniors to bowl together and send entries early as a group. The rules says, bowlers wanting to bowl as a group must send entries together.

This year I have 6 seniors and would welcome more if I get their entries by July 1. If you cannot send your entry now but later you could send in before August 1, you may have to pick your choice of date and time. Next year's tournament will be in Stockton.

GALLO CASHED AS SUPER SENIOR IN BRENTWOOD'S NO. CAL SENIOR CLASSIC

BRENTWOOD — The saga of Frank Gallo, Jr. continues. After failing with below average scores in his last two tournaments, the deaf Jacksonville, FL right-hander bounced back in the first round qualifying in PBA Senior Northern California Open, presented by Track at Harvest Park Bowl in Brentwood, CA

Wiping out his failures in USBC Senior Masters at Las Vegas and PBA West/ Northwest Regions Wine Country Open at Double Decker Lanes in Rohnert Park, CA from his mind, Gallo started anew on Friday June 15 at Harvest Park Bowl with 1778 for 8 game s average of 222.5. That is a good start placing him 13th for the first round.

Unfortunately for Saturday's 2nd round of 8 games to make the top 24 bowlers for the match plays, Gallo struggled with 1623 (202.8 ave.) for a total of 3401. That placed him in 29th, just 19 pins short of 24th place cut off. Also Gallo missed getting \$900 for 28th place by 3 pins. But anyway Gallo was one of the 4 super seniors (60 years old and over) cashing for \$700 each in this tournament.

Right now PBA Senior Tour is on hiatus for 5 weeks until August. It is not known what Gallo plans to do during that time but I will be watching for his name in the PBA regionals.

ABTA at Cal Bowl for Special Handicap Frozen Event

Las Vegas Open Next week July 4-5-6-7

COVINA — We returned to Covina Bowl where we saw 197 entries come out on Saturday and bowl on a difficult shot. The cut scores on Saturday night were +59 for the men and +23 for the women. The Super Seniors added to the board (2 men and 1 female) were Sun Sundara +54 and Romy Cajucom +32. For the women it was Bobbie McCollum +1. Super Seniors men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 49 bowlers making it to the semi-finals.

For all qualifying squads, our top qualifier for the Men was Samson Kong with a +158 and for the women it was Beth Borci with a +122. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Each week our top seed overall draws the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$630. Samson Kong drew a 388. We had no bowlers that bowled this score during the qualifying squads. We will estimate the Match Series at \$1,200 at Cal Bowl. The last bowler for the 3-6-9 roll off was pretty Yen Lach. She would miss on her first shot and take home a \$50 consolation. We will increase the pot to \$2,100 at Cal Bowl.

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were Jerry Chang and Samson Kong with 1473 for \$120. Finishing in second were Michael Kong and Samson Kong with 1450 for \$100. There was a total of \$1,150 paid out in doubles and 22 paid spots with low to cash of 1348.

After bowling the three game semi-finals, finishing in first was Jerry Chang with a +151, after having a big second game. Finishing in second was Gino Mansilungan at a +98 to sit out the first round. Our top seed in semi-finals had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$2,220. Jerry drew a 283. After a review of all the scores bowled, we had no one who shot that score. We will estimate the pot at \$3,500 at our next event at Cal Bowl.

This would bring us to our top 16 Match Play finals. In the first round, the seven losers were Carla Sanchez, Romy Cajucom, Cecilia Lung, Mikko Miller, Louis Bachus, Errol Geralde, and John Armenia. They received checks of \$100 each. In the second round, the losers were Sun Sundara, Tony Leogrande, Thomas Licauco, and Gino Mansilungan. They received checks of \$105 each. This would get us down to the final five bowlers. The weekly horses payed a low of \$53 Beth Borci, to a high of \$116 Jamescart Alarcio. In this round we saw Teddy Villaroman (10th seed) bowling Kenny Kwan (4th seed) where we would see a match that would go down to the wire with Teddy getting a 3 bagger in the middle of the match. But it was Kenny who would survive and finish with a 185/241 to 187/230 and advance to the next round. In the other match we saw Jamescart Alarcio (6th seed) bowling Beth Borci (7th seed). In this match, it would be Jamescart who would struggle to find his shot. Beth would keep get-

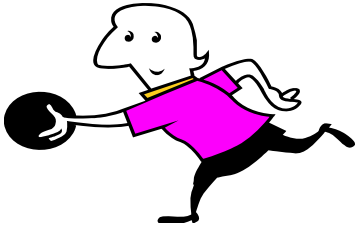

Almost \$9,000 in Scholarships King, Thompson, Riggin Win JBT So Cal Invitational

EL CAJON —Kyle King, Valerie Riggin, and Austin Thompson earned titles in their respective divisions as champions of the Junior Bowlers Tour So Cal Invitational Tournament, hosted by Parkway Bowl in El Cajon. Almost \$9,000 in scholarships were awarded over Invitational weekend!

Arguably the most demanding lane pattern of the season tested the talented field, putting the emphasis on shotmaking and mental toughness all day long. Steven Manier earned the top seed as one of only two bowlers to average over 200 in qualifying, and with a shot at catching Cameron Smith for Bowler of the Year, rolled through the first seven rounds of the triple elimination matchplay finals a 6-1 record. When Kyle King eliminated Smith in round eight, it meant that Manier needed to win the tournament, and grab third high game or better in the remaining matches, to pass Smith. However, Manier lost his next match to Eric Hatchett, and when King gave Steven his third loss in the next round, Smith locked up Bowler of the Year, his fourth B.O.Y. award this season- perhaps the most impressive single-season feat in JBT history.

Hatchett and King were thus left standing, and with two losses each, the next match would determine the winner. In that match, Kyle’s mid-game five-bagger blew open the match, and the 234-201 final tally gave King the win, another \$1,000 scholarship, and the 59th title of his unparalleled JBT career.

Kylie Shishima bowled great to earn the #1 seed in the handicap division, but scuffled through matchplay with a 3-2 record through early rounds. #7 seed Alyssa Tucker had no such trouble though, going 8-0 to put herself in terrific shape. In round nine, Alexis Atkin enjoyed a much-needed bye while #15 Austin Thompson handed Tucker her first loss. Tucker eliminated Atkin in the next round, setting up a best 2-of-3 between Austin and Alyssa for the title.

Thompson won his first career JBT title the day before, and by this point had locked up Bowler of the Year as well. Riding a huge wave of momentum, he stayed in control the rest of the way, winning two games in row over Tucker to earn the title, and the \$1,000 top scholarship prize, completing a dream weekend. Former Invite champ Kyli Selley finished fourth, and Megan Carlson earned perhaps the bravest fifth place finish in Invite history, coming back from a dislocated knee in qualifying to make it all the way to the final five.

Ashley Dunn, who led the scratch division through four rounds, and Valerie Riggin (who went on to finish fifth in scratch), advanced to the title game of the simultaneous So Cal Girls Invitational, with the girls points race close enough that the winner of the game would not just win the Invitational, but Bowler of the Year as well. Fittingly, the match came down to the final frame, and when Dunn couldn’t get the tenth frame strike, Riggin escaped with the 187-185 win, winning the title, Bowler of the Year, and a \$200 bonus courtesy of JBT Women’s Series sponsor Impact Bowling.

Oscar Chan won a copy of Mark Baker’s new book ‘GameChanger’, not to mention the day’s Ebonite ball, so we expect big things from him in his next event! Big thanks to ‘Bakes’ for his continued support of JBT.

The top 20 season long point scorers now advance to the Touring Players Championship, where they will face the best of the rest of JBT, playing for the \$2,000 top prizes and our biggest honor. Thanks to everyone at Parkway for hosting the event, which awarded nearly \$7,000 in scholarships to bowlers of all averages and all ages! Want in on all this fun?
