NATIONAL DEAF BOWLING NEWS 64TH ANNUAL PACFIC COAST DEAF BOWLING RESULTS AT HAWAII

35 TEAMS WITH BOWLERS FROM SCATTERED CITIES OF US ENTERED HAWAII...For more than a decade Hawaiian Ralph Collier made frequent trips to mainland to bowl in Pacific Coast Deaf Bowling Tournaments and other deaf tournaments whenever he could afford. He thought of having the PCDBA tournament some day in Hawaii.

So five years ago with his Hawaii Silents Club's approval, Collier made a bold bid for the 2005 Pacific Coast Deaf Tournament asking the mainland deaf bowlers to plan their vacation with bowling in Hawaii. The captains and delegates voted for it and the word spread out and the bowlers began saving their money for this once in a lifetime trip.

Then later Collier and his club found it hard to get a hotel headquarter during the Memorial Day weekend which Pacific Coast Deaf established its tournaments for the past 60 years. A one-time change to middle of June was met with approval with reasoning that schools closed for summer so families and deaf school teachers who are bowlers could plan their vacation. There were thoughts of a 50-team entry.

A year ago in the PCDBA tournament at San Diego the deaf bowlers were making plans to go but early in this year, they slowly dropped their travel plans. By deadline time the count was 24 men teams and 11 women teams (175 bowlers) entered, The counts included 5 teams from host Hawaii Silent Club, bowlers from as far as Maryland, a couple of bowlers each from Australia, New Zealand and Canada.

The men bowled at Leeward Bowl and the women at Aiea Bowl. Ala Moana Hotel served as the headquarters. Also planned were a golf tournament, beach volleyball and no-tap tournament prior to the bowling tournament and after the tournament several took the 7 island cruise.

ARIZONA-CALIFORNIA TEAM HITS RECORD HANDICAP 3616 FOR TEAM TITLE

At Leeward Bowl on June 17 a make-op team, Arizona-California consisted of bowlers from both states led by Mark Brugnoni, Phoenix's 599 scored games of 942-865-933 for 2740 plus its 2nd highest handicap 876 for a new record total of 3616 to capture the team title.

The host team Hawaii Silent Bowlers which had a couple bowlers from mainland placed 2nd with 3536. Ed Bazan, San Jose led the team with 703, followed by the host co-chairmen Ralph Collier's 698 and Eric dela Pena, Jr's 633. The team scored 924-1058-975 for 2957 plus 579 handicap.

Third place was taken by Angel West-California with 3522 total from 1041-884-976 for 2901 plus 621. Javier Hernandez, Anaheim led with the event's high 704 series, followed by Deaf Team USA's Darrell Stogryn's 645. Malino Mixed from Las Vegas with Barrett Lee's 637 and Chris Smith's 629 scored the event's high scratch team series 2958 with a 1019 first game but placed 5th with 3433.

TRUETT-ESTES DUO REPEATS AS DOUBLES CHAMPS WITH 1466

In the Doubles event Larry Truett and Tim Estes, both from Seattle made PCDBA history as the first doubles team to repeat as champions. Estes rolled 720 and partner Truett 545 and closed with a big 498 game for 1265 plus 222 handicap for 1487 to place first. Last year they won with 1466 and their 1487 was 3 pins short of the record.

Twenty pins back in 2nd placed are Bert Enos and EdBazan, Redwood City with tourney high scratch score of 1335 but with 132 handicap had 1467. Enos shot a big tourney high 753 and Bazan a 682 as they closed with 476 and 467 in their 1335 series.

Minnesota's Alan Sellman (600) and Gregory Burk (642)had 1242 plus 210 for 1452 to place third. San Diego's Dan Emery (686) and Jim Theyken (628) had 1314 but placed 10th and Darrell Stogryn rolled the other 700 but he and Javier Hernandez, Anaheim placed in a tie for 16th.

Nathan Domingo was the best as he downed upstart Gil Potempo in the title game to take home a nice top prize of \$1,000 for his stellar performance. This was a special Tournament with the handicap frozen for the Big ABTA Las Vegas Open this weekend at the Gold Coast. Nathan bowled the best all day as he led the semifinals and sat out to bowl the title match. The scoring was good with Men+96 and ladies +67 to make the semis. Due to a nice turnout of 218 entrants we had 51 bowlers return to the semis including the 3 Super Seniors (added) by the ABTA. they being Rico Cayton, Ely Cruz and Imee Ahorro.

In the Semifinals the bowlers advanced to the Cash Line in hopes of making the top 16 single Elim finals. They were led by Domingo with his nice +137, and right behind with his + 130 was Steve Bryant. Nathan would sit out and bowl for the title game with Speedy to enter in round two of the single elims receiving a first round bye. It took a nice +69 and +48 for the women to make the top 16 which included 3 guaranteed women.

The top 16 single elims got going. Losing in the first round of the finals were Rich Warner, Belinda Crowder, Nancy Brown, Lito Dizon, Sol Cericos, William Ele, and Gilbert Liu. They received checks of \$105 finishing in 10-16th places.

In round two we had Bryant enter and he blitzed Chris Ko 221-194. Jason Fowler was upended by Gil Potempo 239-192. Lea Viernes sent Ron Chandler trucking 228-218. Chad Lane beat Joseph Baghdadlian 261-202. The losers in round two received \$120 in 6-9th places.

Round three had Mrs. Viernes strike often in downing Lane 249-217. Potempo downed his portsider pal Speedy 257-208. So Speedy and Chad were 4th and 5th in a good showing and \$135 each. Lea and Gil to met for the right to bowl Nathan Domingo for the title.

This was another good one. We saw Gil finally pull away from the feisty lady in a big 249-209 win. Lea was 3rd with great bowling and \$210, with Gil off to the title game vs Nathan Domingo.

The title match was on lanes 15 and 16. Nathan elected to have Gil lead off and he pared. Nathan then opened with a double. Gil had a big split in frame #3 and Domingo spared and started his march to the title with another four bagger. Gil having a double keeping it fairly close but then going for a turkey he chopped the 4-7-8 and Domingo had an insurmountable lead. He then doubled the 10th in a resounding 244/262-175/198 win over the affable Mr. Potempo. His first title was welldeserved. ABTA Notes: Tourney Hi Qualifiers were Jason Fowler +230 (men) and Belinda Crowder who led the ladies +147 and they will get paid entries into any regular ABTA Event.

The optional doubles were taken by Bedell Vasquez, and Jason Xa. Their 1497 got them \$140. Part of the Bowling Romero family Ping and Gil were 2nd by one pin 1496 and \$130 and we paid 11 places in the doubles this week.

Two fine lefties Rich Warner and Demetrius Cash couldn't eliminate one another in the 3-6-9 rolloff so we will go for a sweet \$800 in the 3-6-9 roll-off in Las Vegas this week. There is a \$300 reserve pot also. The Match Series worth \$950 was UnMatched this week as the 654 drew by Jason Fowler was not hit so we will go for an estimated \$1,700 in Las Vegas, and for only \$2.00

USBC Continues Exploration of Women's Professional Tour

GREENFIELD, Wis. - The United States Bowling Congress Board of Directors has explored available resources and has decided to retain the assets of the Professional Women's Bowling Association until a viable proposal is found. "As the governing body for the sport of bowling, USBC recognizes

As the governing body for the sport of bowling, USBC recognizes the importance of keeping the tour alive and keeping professional women bowlers in the spotlight," USBC President Michael Carroll said. "However, to have sustained success, the tour needs a commitment of financial resources that USBC is not able to provide at this point."

Based on the needs of the tour, a successful re-launch would require USBC to partner with a manufacturer or entrepreneur and secure a television contract.

"USBC has been open with its members about the key factors needed to re-launch the tour, mainly television and sponsors," Carroll said. "While we will continue to pursue these avenues, the current marketplace has not provided the resources needed to move forward at this point. USBC is committed to examining any and all future proposals."

The transfer of PWBA assets to USBC includes, but is not limited to, the right to the PWBA name, trademark, logo and Web site domain (pwba.com). The United States Bowling Congress acquired the PWBA when the Women's International Bowling Congress merged with the American Bowling Congress, Young American Bowling Alliance and USA Bowling on Jan. 1, 2005.

In the fall of 2003, the PWBA ceased operations before the completion of its 2003 season, although WIBC had sponsored the tour for the 2003-04 season. The transfer of the assets to WIBC satisfied that sponsorship arrangement.





USBC To Review "System of Bowling"; Governing Body Addresses Credibility Issues in Scoring Environment

GREENDALE, Wis. - The United States Bowling Congress is concerned

with the degree of influence technology is having over player skill as the primary factor for success in bowling today at all levels. As the national governing body, the USBC has begun a thorough review of the entire "System of Bowling," which includes the lanes, lane condi-tions, bowling balls and pins. Through improved set standards following ongoing research by the USBC Equipment Specifications Team, the USBC will ensure the future of bowling does not suffer from a lack of sporting will ensure the future of bowling does not suffer from a lack of sporting credibility.

The greatest evidence of this concern is the disproportionate rise in scoring over the past 20 years in certified league play. Similar damage has been inflicted to the credibility levels of specific aspects of the game that made it an endearing lifetime sport, such as bowler-produced power and accuracy.

"Bowling is suffering from a lack of credibility in the scoring environ-ment," says Jeff Henry, USBC Director of Sport. "Advancements in tech-nology together with the artificial assist allowed by current lane dressing specifications have led to an environment which minimizes the influences of player ability and skill development."

Bowling is unique in that it has approximately three million certified league bowlers competing at differing skill levels, with a maximum score for a game at 300. While not all certified bowlers possess the abilities to take advantage of today's technological advances, perceptions of the sport are driven by them.

Among the goals of the USBC's efforts to reset the parameters of the game will be to

- Grow the sport through the respect that a credible playing field provides.

- Enhance the 'risk vs. reward' element to bowling.

- Better define the stars of the game.


