

Kulick, O'Neill and Williams vie for 2010 ESPY Awards by B. A. Campbell

LOS ANGELES-Three of the hottest names in pro bowling are in contention for the 2010 "Best Bowler" ESPY award, and YOU get to vote! USA Squad Selected For World Youth Championships

ARLINGTON—Eight upand-coming bowlers will follow in the footsteps of stars such as Kelly Kulick and Tommy Jones by representing Junior Team USA at the 2010 World Tenpin Bowling Association World Youth Championships in Helsinki, Finland, next month.

The Junior Team USA boys selected to compete are Jake Peters of Decatur, Ill., Andrew Koff of Miami, Craig Hanson of Orlando, Fla., and Devin Bidwell of Simi Valley, Calif. On the girls side, the representatives are Christine Bator of Warren, Mich., Jenn Boisselle of Brandon, Fla., Kristie Petravich of West Palm Beach, Fla., and Brittni Hamilton of Web-

ster, N.Y.

The World Youth Championships will take place at Tali Bowl in Helsinki from July 24-Aug. 1 and will feature bowlers from an estimated 48 countries.

"This event is the ultimate stage for youth bowling and a chance for your young players to compete against the world's best," Team USA head coach Rod Ross said. "The World Youth Championships is the experience of a lifetime and a key step in developing the next generation of Team USA stars."

Past medal winners in the World Youth Championships from the United States include bowling stars Kulick, Jones. Liz Johnson, Robert Smith, Stefanie Nation, Michael Fagan, Shannon Pluhowsky, Diandra Asbaty, Lynda Barnes, Tammy Boomershine and Kim Terrell-Kearney.

At the most recent World Youth Championships in 2008 in Orlando, Fla., the United States came away with a bronze in boys team and Dean Richards won the silver in Masters match play. The girls did not medal.

In the coveted four-player team event, Junior Team USA last won the gold medal for the girls in 2004 in Tamuning, Guam, while the boys last earned the gold in 2000 in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic.



National Deaf Bowling News

News Flash...Ed Abakumoff Wins Deaf King, Decker Deaf Queens At Las Vegas

HENDERSON — This writer got an unexpected surprise news flash e-mail on the night of June 22 from Ed Abakumoff from Sunset Station Hotel where the National Deaf Mixed Bowling Association was holding its 10th anniversary mixed bowling tournament. Ed briefly wrote that he and teammate Lindy Decker, York, PA won the NDMBA's scratch individual tournaments, King and Queen, respectively at the Sunset Station Bowling Center.

Also, he mentioned that the team foursome of Ken DeGroff, CA, Karen Hager, IL, Kim Wroldsen, KS and Carl Malucci, NV won both scratch and handicap NDMBA team event that day. No word from Ed on how his mixed team placed in that event.

The mixed doubles event was scheduled on the next day followed by the Senior Galaxy and separate male and female Galaxies, which are handicapped match play events. Incidentally, Decker, a renowned hearing-impaired who holds many deaf women's bowling records and Ed from Riverside were entered as doubles partners and Ed was the top qualifier in the Senior Galaxy event.

This writer is anxious to know the results of these events but alas, no word was received since last Tuesday night.

Keeping Tabs On Deaf Pro Frank Gallo Jr. In PBA Senior Tour

SEATTLE — This writer has not heard from his old friend, PBA Senior Tour bowler Frank Gallo Jr., who withdrew in the 2nd round of the PBA Senior US Open at Suncoast Hotel and Bowling Center and did not bowl in the following USBC Senior Masters. I hope that nothing serious happened at Suncoast, and that Gallo would continue to bowl in the remaining three events on the Senior Tour in August.

Back in the early 1970's this writer met the young eager Gallo Jr. of New York who said he would finish one more year of 190 or better average in order to join the PBA. I wished him luck that time and sure enough in the following year Gallo was accepted as the first deaf member of the PBA. Then more deaf and hearimpaired bowlers followed his lead, becoming members of the PBA but many did not stay long.

Most had quit the PBA when they found it hard to cash in and because almost all deaf tournaments forbid entry of PBA members. Gallo had won several prestigious deaf tournaments and for that reason was banned from them. Though he misses bowling with his deaf peers, he likes the challenge PBA gives him.

At present Gallo is in his 28th year as PBA member and this writer followed him through PBA.com to find out his statistics on the Senior Tour.

This year through experience, Gallo, now bowling as a Super Senior has steadily improved in average, now at 210.60 for 5 events on the Senior Tour ranking him 41st out of 176 bowlers. He cashed in 3 out of 5 events for a total of \$2,900 placing him 46th on the list. He is 52nd with total points of 15,908.

Last year, Gallo averaged 209.66 for 8 events, cashed in 5 out of 8 events for a total of \$4,500. The year before, his "stats" were 207.27 average for 10 events, \$5,950 earnings and 7 cashes out of 10. That was quite a jump from his prior average of 199.77 for 8 events, cashing in 4 events for \$2,900.

Though Gallo had retired from his government job and his yearly earnings from bowling in PBA never break even with his expenses. Being deaf, he travels alone and with no one to share, he just hopes to hit it big someday. Just like two years ago, Gallo finally won his first PBA tournament in 26 years, a PBA Eastern Regional tournament.

MONTCLAIR — Terry Hodgson parlayed a big game 3 in the the semis to become the top seed and went on to down Bob Ricketts in a matchup of the elder statesmen in the title game to claim his first ABTA and deservedly so.

The scoring was tough, but lower as Men +23, and the women +11 made the cut to the semis. By the account of the nice turnout of 258 bowlers saw 63 bowlers advance to the semi finals. Included were the added super seniors Ester Licauco, Walter White, and Adam Drozdz.

The scoring in the semis was still on the tough side with Men +34, and the women +8. After a double 9-10 frame roll off Robert Ricketts eliminated Tony Tang who finished 17th place making the top 16 single elim finals and having the chance to win it all.

Terry Hodgson got hot and in the 3rd game took over the lead+101 from Jon Baracca. Terry led the to be seeded tops and bowl for the title. In second was Barracca + 76 who would sit out the first round of the single elims and enter in round two.

Losers in round one were Alvin Francisco, Tom Tran, Bobbie Mc Collum, Joenito, Soo, Ada Won Faye Josefat and Je Je Gabriel. They got checks of \$105.

Round two saw Julian Conwi, Matt Garcia, David Dittliinger and Jon Barracca lose out and were 6-10th places and checks of \$110.

Round 3 got interesting as Bob Ricketts downed Anthony Martinez 217-185. Andrew Lung got to Vic Paolucci 298-188. Vic and Anthony were 4th and 5th with Ricketts and Lung to meet for the right to bowl for the title. In the 1st game Ricketts put it together in a 234-184 win. Andrew was 3rd with fine bowling and Ricketts off to the title game vs. Terry Hodgson.

The title game was on some tough lanes. Terry, the top seed starts on the left lane and begins with a solid three bagger. Former BWAA President Walt Steinsiek Dies on Eve of Bowl Expo

MICCO-Walt Steinsiek, who served as president of the Bowling Writers Association in 1988, passed away June 27, 2010 of apparent heart failure while preparing to leave his Micco, Florida home to attend International Bowl Expo in Las Vegas. He was 84.

Steinsiek was widely known as "The world's greatest bowling cartoonist." He drew thousands of cartoons about the sport he loved, provided mostly without charge to various bowling organizations; but he also published a half dozen bowling cartoon books, the first in 1973, called Balls-Bowling of Course!

He followed that successful debut with his "Approach" series -- A Funny Approach, A Funnier Approach, and the latest, The Funniest Approach, in 2006.

Steinsiek also was the founder of the Bowling Cartoonist of the Year Award in the mid-1990s. The award has been presented to distinguished cartoonists who used bowling in their work. Winners include Peanuts creator Charles Schulz, Jim Davis, who created Garfield, and Dean Young, creator of the Blondie cartoons.

When not drawing cartoons, Steinsiek was writing about bowling. He started the Baltimore Bowling News (later Baltimore-Washington Bowling News) in the 1980s. He sold it and moved to Florida in 1992. In Florida, his weekly bowling columns have appeared in several Scripps Howard newspapers for many years.

Walt Steinsiek was passionate about bowling, and his work earned him several Hall of Fame honors and industry awards. In 2006, he received the prestigious Sam Levine Flowers for the Living Award. On Wednesday of this Bowl Expo week, he was to receive the John Davis Award for outstanding industry service.

On Memorial Day of this year, Steinsiek fulfilled a lifelong dream of visiting his brother Henry's gravesite in Holland. Henry was killed in World War II in 1945. Walt also served in that war as a proud member of the Merchant Marines.

Walt is survived by his wife Jane of 55 years. They have a daughter, Denise, who also lives in Florida.

"Making these selections is always difficult because we have such a talented pool of players to choose from," Team USA head coach Rod Ross said. "The coaching staff feels strongly that the players who have been selected will repre-

coveted five-player team gold medal with a team of amateur bowlers in 2006 in Busan, South Korea. After a change in WTBA legislation that allowed professional bowlers to compete, the United States sent a team of five pros and one amateur and defended the title at the most recent World Championships in 2008 in

2008 did not come easy, however. The Americans took on Korea in the one-game finals and the teams finished tied at 1,084, forcing a roll-off. Page defeated Korea's Kim Tae-Young, 49-39, in the oneplayer, ninth-and-10th frame roll-off to win the title. In total, Team USA came

away with four gold medals in 2008. The Americans won doubles (Page and Allen), while Walter Ray Williams Jr. won gold in singles and Masters. Williams is unavailable to compete in the 2010 World Championships.

Four of the players who competed in Bangkok will be back to help the United States defend its team title. Barnes, Jones, Page and Allen will be joined by first-time World Championships competitors O'Neill and Malott.

The 2010 WTBA World Men's Championships will feature 377 competitors from 68 countries competing for medals in six events - fiveplayer team, trios, doubles, singles, all-events and Masters match play.

Brunswick Takes Early Lead in GEICO PBA Team Shootout

JACKSON-With help from the unique "endless 10th frame" and the only woman in the competition, Brunswick took the lead in the Manufacturers' Cup standings after the first two rounds of competition in the GEICO PBA Team Shootout hosted by Six Flags.

The first four of 12 Baker scoring system round-robin team matches aired Sunday on ESPN. In Baker team bowling, each member of a five-player team bowls two frames to complete a full game. In the GEICO Team Shootout, the "endless 10th frame" allows a team to extend its 10th frame as long as it can continue to throw strikes. The entire series, consisting of six head-to-head matches between each team plus a three-match stepladder final, was conducted outdoors on specially-constructed lanes on the grounds of one of the Atlantic Coast region's most popular theme parks.

In the opening match of the GEICO Team Shootout, Ebonite International was the "home team" and selected the PBA Shark lane condition for its match with Brunswick. The decision backfired when Brunswick's Parker Bohn III, Johnny Petraglia and Sean Rash – bowling in the second, third and fourth positions in the lineup - each threw two strikes to propel their team to victory.

In Match Two, Storm Products also selected the Shark pattern and rolled to a 213-183 win over 900 Global. A turkey on strikes by Pete Weber, Rhino Page and Jason Belmonte in the seventh, eighth and ninth frames proved to be the difference. Brian Voss threw three strikes in the 10th frame to give 900 Global the first "endless 10th frame" opportunity, but Michael Haugen Jr. was unable to extend the contest when he left the 6-7-10 on the next shot

Carolyn Dorin-Ballard, however, did cash in on the opportunity in Match Three. Brunswick opted for the Scorpion lane condition against Ebonite International, but Ebonite gained a three-pin advantage heading into the 10th frame behind a string of strikes by Mike Fagan, Chris Barnes and Tommy Jones. Rash struck on all three shots in Brunswick's 10th to set up the "endless 10th frame." Dorin-Ballard, the only woman in the competition, added another strike and Bohn ran the string to five to put Brunswick in the lead. Barnes answered with three strikes in the 10th for Ebonite, but Jones left the 1-2-4 on his "endless 10th" attempt to foil Ebonite's rally. Brunswick won the contest, 222-215, and improved its record to 2-0.

"I made a move on the lane for that shot," Dorin-Ballard said. "The lanes were breaking down and it just so happened that all the pins fell down. That's about all I can say. Those were probably the hardest frames I've ever bowled. Bowling in 100-degree heat and your hand sweating like crazy? It was really, really hard.

"But I had a blast," she added. "Bowling with that Brunswick team was, by far, one of my most memorable bowling moments. was an honor bowling with those guys for two days.

Bowling on the Viper pattern in Match Four, 900 Global got perfect performance from seven-time PBA Player of the Year Walter Ray Williams Jr. who rallied his team to a 218-213 victory over Storm Products. Storm got a string of four strikes from Page, Duke, Wes Malott and Weber to take a modest edge heading into the 10th frame. Williams followed Voss' strike in the ninth frame with three more in the 10th to put Global 900 in position for the come-from-behind win.

"But we still had to wait to see what Norm (Duke) did," Williams said. "I was really comfortable with the lane condition that day, and I threw some good shots and got some strikes. When I got the last one in the 10th, we were in position for the endless 10th frame, and we figured we'd need it. But Norm left the baby split after his first strike, so we didn't need to keep going.'

After the opening series of telecasts, Brunswick held a 2-0 edge in the Manufacturers' Cup. Storm and 900 Global had 1-1 records while Ebonite was 0-2. The won-lost records at the conclusion of the round-robin matches will determine the seeding positions for the championship round. Ties will be broken by actual pinfall totals, not including "endless 10th frame" bonus pins

GEICO Team Shootout telecasts will continue on ESPN on Saturday, July 3, at 2 p.m.; Sunday, July 4, at 1 p.m., and Sunday, July 11, at 1:30 p.m. All times are Eastern.
