RENO - Kelly Kulick is the best woman bowler in the world; and she proved it once again June 27 in Reno. Bowling on a very challenging tournament condition on outdoor lanes installed on Virginia Street under the historic Reno Arch, Kulick defeated M issy Parkin 171-160 to earn the $\$ 40,000$ top prize and her third U.S. Open crown.

(pictured right), added another green jacket to her collection as she won the 2012 Bowling's Senior U.S. Women's Open at the $N$ ational Bowling Stadium on Tuesday. The 1989 U.S. Women's Open champion defeated fellow Hall of Famer Lucy Sandelin of Tampa, Fla., 225-188 to claim the championship trophy, green jacket and \$5,000 phy, green

her win in the inaugural running of the event, she becomes the first remale bowler in history to own both a U.S. Women's Open and Senior U.S. Women's Open title. "It's awesome," Romeo said. "(BPAA Executive Director) Steve Johnson just told me I made history because I won the U.S. Women's Open in 1989 so now I'm the first
the best woman bowler in the world did June 27 under extremely trying conditions in Reno. Kelly Kulick found a way to win.
"Watching the previous matches was an advantage for me because it gave me the chance to have a good game plan. It was obvious to everyone that the lanes were very dry and tough, so I decided to go with a shiny ball and just ine up like I was shooting a -pin; and it paid off. I was very determined not to let it slip away like last year. M issy made some good shots, but I got a couple of breaks. It is wesome to win my third $U S$ Open."

The talk of the evening was all about the tough condition created by the breakdown of the already tough oil pattern in the outdoor arena; but the simple fact is that the victory was earned the old fashioned way - by making spares. K uick made those she needed; arkin missed two easy ones in her loss. No doubt is was a grind out victory where few strikes were made and spares were critical.
What cost Parkin the match was a missed 4-pin and a missed 4-7. "I'm not proud

to win both. I didn't even re member that I did get the green jacket. I love it."
Romeo was able to jump out to an early lead in the title match as Sandelin opened in two of the first five frames. Despite the early lead, Romeo knew she had to keep pressing until the final frame was in the books.

## Dust Bow: A REAL U.S. Onen experience

RENO - By now you have hopefully heard plenty of buzz about the event which was held on the streets of Reno, NV, right under the famous "Biggest Little City in the World" sign. If you've not heard any buzz, then let me fill you in. The elements of a bowling lane outside in the high desert and being on a city street most certainly came into play
Four of the five finalists were throwing polyester, yes SPARE balls, at the head pin in each match. Only Lynda Barnes did not throw plastic, but said if she would have had one more frame, she would have. The wind was blow ing up to 20 mph , and the dust from the desert was everyw here, essentially drying the ef ane out the finals was turned in by Shannon O'Keefe with 182, and the overall average was 162 . Does that sound like a premier condition for the greatest women bowler's on the planet to compete on for the biggest tournament in bow ling?
I've honestly been thinking about this non-stop since last Wednesday trying to determine where I stand. I've talked to several people to get their opinion. Genie talked to each of the finalists right after they got finished, I spoke with Steve Johnson, the Executive Director of the BPAA, and also two PBA members, one of which is a past US O pen champion.
I will start with my critical view. At first glance, it appears a huge risk to take by putting a bowl-
ing lane outside in an unpredictable environment This isn't the first ing lane outside in an unpredictable environment. This isn't the first time that a bowling event has been held outside, it's just the BIGG EST bowling event that's been held outside, and oh by the way, in the most un-manageable area
In this case I felt that the BPA A took on an extreme amount of risk, and hurt the competitive balance of the tournament. Why puta a bowling lane outside and turn the finals of the biggest ladies event on the planet into a circus? So "asked steve johnson that exact question, since it would be his call to proceed with this venue, "The biggest risk for us is to do what we have always done, Doing the same things we have always done nasn t worked, he said, "et bowling be seen and be bowling, even less to lose so why not spin the wheel and see what happens. Time will tell if this day in the sun has the impact they hoped for, and Johnson said as much, but why not gamble.
His answer really swayed my thinking. Is there risk when you have little to lose? The greatest moments in history are born from people that see the world through a different lens. A nd maybe this was that moment.
Johnson added, "This was a great show case for the industry and the sport of bowling, it was a spectacular evening and should translate into finding new fans." He mentioned that they threw a party and a bowling match broke out, and from what I heard it was exactly that. The idea is that bowling happens in a stagnate, sterile environment, and in order to have new and different people get interested in the sport, something needs to change. A nd THIS was no sterile environment. There were approximately 2,500 people in attendance for the "bowling festival" with 600 in the stands
watching the final matches. So when you look at it from that angle it was a huge success. hat's what pros do they overcome obstaces, and that was I hhison's exact stance "Pro ath and hat's what pros do, they overcome obstacles, and that was ohnson's exact stance. "Pro ath etes have to be adaptable and be able to change strategy at any time. come from NA SCAR and in that environment you always have to ber eady for change. Tese lades did exactly hat, you could se them and they represented the industry very well," he said.
They key ingredient is that the lanes were exactly the same for all five players, and it was the U.S. O pen right? It's supposed to be tough, it's supposed to be the greatest challenge in sports, and you win, you really won something.
By now you are probably wondering what those two PBA players thought about the event. They were both emotionally tied to the outcome, but both said the same thing. They would have LOVED to be down on that lane, bowling on that condition, in that environment. A nd to recap, there was NO oil on the lane, no one could hit the right side of the headpin, and spares were almost impossible, yet they both wanted out there bady
$I$ agree with them. Did we just see the re-birth of an actual challenge in bowling? No one intended for the wind to blow that hard and the dust to be everywhere, but it happened. The five pros got out there and gave it all they had, and there was a winner who felt like they really conquered The fact that all of the bowlers basically throw
mpetitive gets me really excited Thascor threw the same ball and each match was extremely competitive gets me really excited. The score doesn't make the game exciting. The game makes the game exciting. And if the game is actually challenging, then people will come, people will most
definitly come.

Super Seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55 . That would give us 65 bowlers making it to the semi-finals.

Top Qualifiers for the Men Chris Romero with a +160 and for the women it was B eth Borci with a +149 . They will get a paid entry into a future regular A BTA event. Our top seed draws the $M$ atch Series. This time it was worth $\$ 1,094$. Chris drew a 555. We had two bowlers that bowled this score during the qualifying squads. They split the pot and each took home \$597. They were David Owens and Samson Kong. We will estimate the $M$ atch Series at $\$ 1,500$ at South Point Hotel \& Casino event. The last bowler for the 3-6-9 roll-off was Sol Cericos. He would miss on his first shot and take home a \$ 50 consolaion and we will increase the pot to $\$ 2,200$ at South Point. In our optional doubles, inishing in first were Ted Vil aroman and Beth Borci with 1470 for $\$ 200$. Finishing in second was Roland Sanchez and Fel Garcia with a 1425 for $\$ 180$. There was a total of $\$ 2,500$ paid out in doubles, 33 paid spots with low to cash of 367
in the semi-finals, finishing in +161 , after having a big final 161, after having a big fina was Carlos Umishing in 2nd to sit out the first round. Our top seed in semi-finals had the honor of drawing the $M$ atch Gameworth $\$ 3,500$. M att drew a 277 , and that was only 1 pin off his own score of that 276 during the semis. ## FOCUS <br> Robert Ellison

NORWALK－Todays topic is one of the most crucial aspects of bowling－maintaining focus during bowling．
How long is your attention span while listening to a lecture？ 10 mins？ 30 mins？One hour？ It＇s difficult to maintain focus for hours at a time while listening to the instructor．Now apply this during bowling．How long can you maintain your focus while bowling？ 10 mins？ 30 mins？One hour？In this case，its not the LENGTH，but the＂concentration＂of each FRAME．Focus on the ＂here and now＂，You can not control what happened in the last shot－nor can you control it in the future（next frame or game）．Bowling is $90 \%$ mental and $10 \%$ physical and maintaining you focus on EACH shot requires mental concentration．It＇s important to train your mind as well as your body during practice sessions to improve concentration．

During league play，tournaments，or competitions it＇s difficult enough to maintain ones focus on bowling while avoiding any distractions．Distractions could be socializing／conversating with friends or fellow bowlers，watching TV（playoffs or superbowl）or watching others bowling nearby while you are awaiting your turn between frames．It＇s essential to keep and conserve your energy （mental and physical）for when it is needed．By doing that you are preparing for the execution in order to optimize scores while bowling．During competition try and avoid too much interaction with others on your pair of lanes or nearby lanes－this is one way to maintain focus on your bowl ing game．

We tend to look up at the scoreboard and figure out our bowling scores．This is only useful if you need to make a crucial score to advance in a tournament．Otherwise it is recommended to no watch the scoreboard，but instead focus and concentrate on your current shot and next delivery．

The key to bowling well is to overcome the physical part of the game and make lane challenge during competition．By reducing the number of things you think about between frames（and be tween games）will help direct your focus and concentration to the important parts of the game

The prime goal in bowling is making shots into the 1－3 pocket（or 1－2 for lefties）and striking ach time．You can prepare yourself and setup a pre shot mental image of what you want to do when you are on the approach．Once you＇re on the approach，you want to clear your mind of everything you are on the approach．Once you re on the approach，you want to clear your mind of everything
Take a deep breath．Breath in and out，then start walking to the foul line．It＇s important to manage Take a deep breath．Breath in and out，the
distractions while you＇re on the approach

Its important to concentrate fully and commit to your target on each delivery and train yoursel o do so during every practice session．Practice with enthusiasm，with purpose，and with intent on focusing on your physical game and alignment techniques．

John Jowdy＇s favorite suggestion in transforming concentration is to draw a picture in your mind，wherein your strike shot enters the pocket，and demolishes the pocket．This is positive think ing．While you are waiting for your turn to bowl－its important to keep a positive mind set－thus you will get a postive result．If you do not strike on your shot－analyze what happened and work on what you want to do right．As stated earlier－you can not change the past，however，you can work on the＂here and now＂

1－Focus on the here and now－get the feel of each shot．Focus on the execution of each shot．
2－Remain positive－focus on positive outcomes and concentrate on good shots
3－Focus on a consistent pace or tempo of footsteps－this will allow you to swing naturally and allow your arm－swing to match your steps in tempo．The final two steps of your approach are the most critical．

4－Upon release of ball，＂pose＂and hold your form at the foul line－keep your position until the ball passes target．While you are＂posing＂the balance during and after the critical release of the ball is vital to accuracy and good results．

It’＇s essential to concentrate and focus on executing shots one frame at a time．Have a good beginning and end while making one shot at a time，and close with a strong finish

Once you＇ve established a strong mental game this will give you an advantage and edge ove the competition．Top bowlers are able to keep their minds free of distractions by putting all their concentration towards acheiving strikes in the outcome
Until next time－FOCUS！Good scoring and high scor

##  THROWS PBA SENIOR PLAYER OF YEAR

## 

NORWALK - Mike Edwards’ 701-691 victory over Hugh Miller to lock up his first PBA Senior Tour title - and first major - in the USBC Senior Masters on June 15 at South Point Bowling Center in Las Vegas threw both the PBA Senior Tour Player of the Year and Rookie of the Year races into a tizzy heading into the final three events of the 2012 season.

Edwards, who turned 50 in December, ran the table in the Senior Masters, posting a 7-0 record in the three-game, doubleelimination match play event in becoming the first Native American to win a PBA Senior Tour title. The victory came a week after Edwards finished third in the Etonic PBA Senior U.S. Open in
his debut as a senior player, and 18 years after winning his only PBA Tour title in the 1994 PBA IOF Bowling for Miracles Open in Toronto, Ontario.
The win also earned Edwards 24 points in the PBA Senior Player of the Year race. Combined with the eight points he earned for his third-place finish in the Senior U.S. Open, he now has 32 points and he's tied for No. 1 on that list with PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. and fellow Senior Tour "rookie" Amleto Monacelli, who mirrored Edwards' finishes in the season's two senior majors: Monacelli won the Senior U.S. Open and finished third in the Senior Masters for his 32 points.

Trailing Williams, Monacelli and Edwards in the POY points chase are rookies Bob Learn Jr. (18 points) and Lennie Boresch Profitt and Miller (12 each). Petraglia is currently sidelined re covering from shoulder surgery.

Parents of organized young league bowlers know their youngsters will be in ac ion, no matter how well they shoot, and that the kids will be in a classified situation that is either competitive or will be by a handicap procedure that makes for some semblance ff equality based on current ability.
Bowling is fortunate that it is a sport that can handle differences in age, size or ability in one of the fairest ways of any sport. PBA Tour's 2012-13 Season Has Been "Super-Sized" FRANK WEILER

SEATTLE (June 26, 2012) - The Professional Bowlers Association has been super-sized. The upcoming 55th annual PBA Tour season will be longer. The number of titles up for grabs will be greater. The fields will be larger. Even the length of many TV shows will be increased.
PBA Commissioner Tom Clark made the announcement Tuesday that the PBA's historic 2012-13 campaign will run from November's PBA World Series of Bowling IV at South Point Hotel and Casino in Las Vegas through December 2013 and include up to 40 opportunities for players to win PBA Tour titles.
"This season will be big," Clark said. "Every year the greatest players in the world produce unforgettable moments in their quest for PBA titles, but the PBA and its fans wanted more. The stage is now set."

The PBA schedule will include two World Series of Bowling, five major championships, new Winter and Summer Swing open events with multiple titles at stake, and an estimated 15 World Bowling Tour stops that will aw ard PBA Tour titles if won by PBA members and PBA International members.

A pproximately 50 hours of action will be televised nationally during the season. A dditionally, the PBA's online bowling channel Xtra Frame plans more than 200 hours of live coverage.

Clark said the 14-month season will also mean a move tow ards a regular calendar-year PBA season starting in J anuary, 2014.

Significant highlights from the 2012-13 schedule include:

- The United States Bowling Congress Masters will be held at Brunswick Zone Carolier Lanes in North Brunswick, N.J., in February, the PBA Tournament of Champions will be hosted by longtime PBA host Woodland B owl in Indianapolis in M arch, and the 70th U.S. O pen will be held at a site to be announced in July 2013.
- The new PBA Winter Swing will be contested in January at Thunderbowl Lanes in Allen Park, M ich., host of WSOB I. In addition to four national titles including a revamped PBA Players Championship, the Winter Swing will introduce a significant new format to be announced.
- Ten of the scheduled nationally-televised shows have been increased from 90 minutes to two hours, which means the USBC M asters and PBA Tournament of Champions, among others, will feature five-player stepladder finals instead of four
- All World Series event finals will return to stepladder formats.
- The PBA Tournament of Champions will return to a traditional limited-field invitational event.
- The World Tenpin Bowling Association's World Bowling Tour points list - based on cumulative totals over a span of two years - will determine the finalists for the men's and women's WBT Finals presented by the PBA which will be held at both WSOB IV and W SOB V.

Also to be announced will be the annual PBA Chris Paul Celebrity Invitational.
