MI—The 92nd United States Bowling Congress Women's Chamconcluding the 88-day event which crowned champions in 20 events. A field of 7,330 five-player teams (more than 36,500 bowlers), which came from all 50 states and a record nine foreign countries competed in the event. Countries in addition to the U.S. represented in the Women's Championships were: Australia, Canada. China, Colombia, Dominican Republic, Japan, Malaysia, Mexico and the United King-

Two notable records were set or matched by seniors. Mini Tvaska, 90, of St. Petersburg, pionships drew to a close Fla., broke the participation Sunday at Super Bowl Lanes record by attending her 62nd consecutive Women's Championship. Emma Hendrickson, 99, of Morris County, N.J., tied the record for oldest participant in tournament history. She matched Ethel Brunnick of Santa Monica, Calif., who competed at 99 in 1987.

The high individual game of the tournament was a 297 shot by Jen Richter of Sheboygan, Wis., which was rolled on May 23. The USBC Women's Championships returns to Reno, Nev., in 2009.

PBA Senior Northern California Classic

Morgan, an amateur bowler from Sacramento, Calif., won his first Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) Senior Tour title at Harvest Park Bowl here Wednesday when he defeated Dale Traber, Cedarburg, Wis., 247-227, in the championship match of the PBA Senior Northern California Classic.

Realizing a dream that began in his junior bowling days, Morgan was thrilled with his victory. The University of California-Davis collegiate bowling coach has tasted success in the collegiate ranks and as a past winner in the High Roller 40-and-over division, but, "This one definitely tops them all by far." Like many PBA Seniors, Morgan has lived a "normal" life, raising a family and working for UPS for the last 25 years, but competing at the highest level has always been on his mind.

"I'm close to retirement at UPS and I plan to bowl the PBA Senior Tour when that time comes," he said. "The Senior Tour seems to be going in the right direction."

Morgan attributed his success in Brentwood to playing a straighter line to the pocket than most of the other players. "Straighter was greater this week," he said. "I played dead straight all day and I made some good ball changes along the way. I never lost a single game all day.'

Morgan, seeded No. 3 into match play based upon his qualifying standing, started his title run with a 3-0 best-offive-game sweep of reigning three-time Senior Player of the Year Tom Baker, King N.C., in the Round of 16. He then disposed of Scott Hansel-Farrell, Stockton, Calif., 2-0, in a best-of-three match, and PBA Senior Tour champion Rohn Morton, Vancouver, Wash., 245-236, in the single-game Round of 4.

Traber was the final victim before Morgan collected his championship trophy and \$8,000 first place check.

The PBA Senior Tour will take a month-long break before completing its season with the PBA Senior Hammond Open at Olympia Lanes in Hammond, Ind., Aug. 4-7, and the PBA Senior Decatur Open at Spare Time Lanes in Decatur, Ill., Aug. 9-12.

Bowling Overseas.....

During the past 10 years or more, American bowlers, particularly Tim Mack, have been feasting on international bowling competition. Although Mack is the most renown American player to establish a reputation and earn as much or more than the top players on the PBA tour, several other Americans have turned their attention to European and Asian tournaments, including Bill Hoffman, Michael Fagan, and Chris Barnes.

Needless to say, the aforementioned players have more than held their own against the top international stars.

Additionally, several American female bowlers have taken their chances on the European tour, particularly when women are accorded the luxury of an eight-pin handicap against male competition.

Unfortunately, Tim Mack's domination of international competition was derailed by a serious shoulder injury that sidelined him for a long period and opened the door for the world's most famous two-handed thumb-less bowlers, Australia's Jason Belmonte and Osku Palermaa.

Brian Voss, by virtue of his inability to qualify for the PBA Exempt list, has extended his career by concentrating on doing instructional work overseas and, at the same time, engaging in European bowling competition.

Although the European tournaments seem like easy-pickings compared to regular PBA competition, I have come to the conclusion that the grass may seem greener in foreign competition; particularly in view of the sagging American dollar overseas. Anything less than a first place finish would seem an exercise in futility. I base my opinion on facts I experienced on a recent vacation that included a week in Italy and a 12 day cruise through the Balkan states...Norway, Sweden, Denmark, Finland, Estonia, and St. Petersburg, Russia.

To say the American dollar has depreciated is a gross understatement. For example;

after landing in London, we decided to store 2 pieces of luggage at the Gatwick Airport in order to lessen the load as we traveled through Italy for a week. The cost was six and a half pounds per bag per day. At a rate of two dollars per English pound, the cost of storing two pieces of luggage for the week came to \$210.

In Italy, we rented an economy- sized car for one week at a rate of 908 Euros, or about \$1400. The first two days we stayed at two different hotels at a cost of 129 Euros a day. At a rate of \$1.67 per Euro, these hotels, which weren't even the equivalence of a decent Motel Six, cost us \$200 per night. We were happy to spend the next five nights at a nicer hotel in Sorrento...also at a \$200 per night rate.

In Norway, Sweden, Denmark, and Finland, a 7- ounce bottle of Coco Cola sold for \$6. Gasoline all over Europe was at least \$2.40 a liter, or approximately nine dollars a gallon.

In London, we stayed at a Hilton hotel before going on a Baltic cruise at a meager rate of

\$400. After returning from our cruise, prior to our return home, we registered at the Gatwick Airport Hilton at a \$375 rate, which seemed very reasonable after our 5:30 p.m. snack in the dining room. My wife Brenda ordered a club sandwich and a cup of coffee. I ordered a small 6" pizza. The cost of this small snack came to 29 euros, or, \$58 in U.S. currency.

The moral of this tale is: if you plan on spending \$5000 on a European visit, I suggest, or better yet, caution you to prepare to shell out around \$10,000.

The Fist And The Wrist

"Words Are Things!"
Ralph Waldo Emerson.

That quote reminds us that bowlers are, after all, still people. As such, they infer meanings from the terms they hear, just like all human beings. That's is important to remember, because those of us who call ourselves teacher/coach have to get ideas across to the bowlers we work with. Unless we successfully communicate our instructions, no student can be expected to respond with a successful result.

No, this is not meant to be an article for coaches. But bowling coaches are also bowlers, so this applies to all of us.

Some time ago, a bower who wanted to get more revs into her ball asked me for help. I knew exactly what was necessary to achieve this. Instead of "triggering" her fingers during the release, she was opening her fingers, letting the ball to fly off her hand with very little rev action, so that's what we focused on. But after three or four sessions, I got a bit frustrated (as did she) because her revs hadn't increased much. All the instruction techniques in my repertoire had been only partially successful.

Now I know that different people often respond differently to the same instruction. Over time therefore, I've developed a number of different ways to explain the same thing in various aspects of the game. Some of these came from other bowlers, including the pros, but many from my imagination when the standard explanations didn't work. That's what I mean when I say that most of what I've learned about teaching our sport has come from the students themselves.

1. The "Fist" Solution

One day, in desperation, I said to that bowler, "Make a fist when you release the ball!"

Presto! More revs.

Now, this expression had never been used by anyone I know of, nor did I learn it during any of the coaching certification seminars I've attended. My frustration just suddenly caused me come up with that expression. It just happened to hit me that when you make a fist, the fingers have to close tightly. Since it's the action of the fingers that plays such a great role in creating revs, I visualized myself making a fist at that moment, and just blurted it out.

Not only did it work for that bowler, but for others as well. So I continued to use it as just another way of expressing how to create the "triggering" finger action so necessary to help add rotational speed to the ball. (See illustration 1.)



After the fact, I realized that this fist method also had a couple of other advantages, which I never thought of until it happened. Namely, that it turned out to be of some help in avoiding the common mistake of overturning the hand, which so often leads to the dreaded chicken wing follow through. It also made it easier to avoid muscling the ball on the downswing. That's because the "fisting" tactic transfers the power action from the arm to the hand, at the bottom of the swing, where it belongs. It actually

seems to help the bowler "hit" the ball at the bottom of the swing, rather than forcing it down from the top of the backswing.

Naturally, the fist must be made quickly and with some force in order to work. It's also important to not use the thumb when making the fist...just the fingers!

2. The Wrist

Try this test: Stand with your bowling arm hanging down and make this quick fist a few times, just to get the feel of that action. Be sure to do it quickly and forcefully. You'll notice that the same time you do this, the wrist also wants to automatically snap into a "cupped" position. For those of you who haven't yet learned to snap the wrist to add revs to your release, this quick little wrist cupping action can actually be the beginning of such a wrist snap.

After practicing this with a ball for a few games, it becomes time to add more force to that wrist action. That's done by first collapsing the wrist backwards a bit just a split second before making the fist! This takes more practic, I admit. However, it is worth the time invested. If you're familiar with the vicious wrist snap used by many professionals, you can visualize it. But the timing of it is critical, so it requires some focus to drive it into your muscle memory (See illustration 2).




Illustration 2

3. Nothingness...Is It Zen?

"Rolf, what's going on when I throw a ball and feel nothing?"

I've heard that question, usually from bowlers with whom I had been working on developing a "free" armswing. When I get that question I always ask, "What happened to your shots while that "nothing" sensation stuck with you?"

"Well, I threw 7 in a row, then that feeling went away." Or, "I threw one of the best games of my life, but it didn't last...but I never felt "nothing" before, so I wasn't sure. It was great to get those strikes without seeming to do anything, though."

When I remind them that during their "free arm swing" lessons I had told them that the less effort in the swing, the better the shot, they finally got the idea. "So that's what you meant" they often say. It wasn't that they weren't paying attention during lessons...it's just that any explanations, even when visualizing

(though visualizing is extremely necessary), can never provide the actual sensation you get when it all finally falls into place.

4. Slow Motion

Many high level bowlers report that when they're really hot, they feel as though everything is happening in slow motion. This is virtually the same as that "nothing" sensation. When this effortless "free motion" sensation kicks in, that's what happens to you; you'll feel either like nothing is happening or that your movements are in slow motion. When everything is right, the sensation is so effortless that you're not aware of an identifiable "feel", as such...that perfect feel is no feel at all! So if you feel something, it's often a warning that you didn't execute optimally!

That does not mean, however, that you're not bowling well unless you feel nothing. Many good bowlers seldom get that perfect "nothing" sensation, yet are happy with the results. They just never delve deeply enough into truly optimal techniques to develop the execution level required for true "automatic excellence".

Of course, many purely recreational bowlers play for years with habits that just don't allow for good form. So that effortless free armswing which would generate this marvelous "no feel" effect never comes. Since many such bowlers never seek help from a teacher/coach, bad habits persist, thus shutting the door to any real opportunity for such rewarding performance.

But if you do have a coach, you must understand that even you may find that this great sensation of freedom from feel is not immediately guaranteed just because you're taking instruction. It may tske some time, simply because while learning new movements and techniques, your body may rebel at first. But when the day finally comes that you're putting it all together, wow...what a reward! You'll feel you're in the "zone" of totally effortless perfection.

This is true in other sports as well, of course. The occasional good golf shots I've made felt as if I had hit nothing, yet the click of the club face effortlessly hitting the ball was the only evidence that anything had happened, but the ball sailed 275 yards or more (a helluva distance for me). Batters, pitchers, tennis players, etc., all agree that they get that same Zenlike "nothingness" sensation during winning performances.

5. The "Floating Ball" Technique

The weight of a ball never changes, of course. But the sensation of weight against the arm and shoulder joints (gravity) increases and decreases, depending on which part of the swing you are in at any given moment. This is due to centrifugal force, which decreases as the ball reaches the top of the backswing, but increases as the ball swings downward and reaches its maximum at the bottom of the downswing.

As it happens, the ball feels weightless at the top of the backswing. At that instant the ball has lost all its gravity as far as your muscles are concerned. Right then the automatic inner reaction of the body is to help that weightless ball down at all costs! And that's a major reason for muscling the ball from the top down.

To eliminate this, just tell the ball t float down from the top and you'll notice that the ball takes the arm with it, instead of the arm doing the work. So...the ball swings the arm. Then, when you trigger your fingers at the bottom, you will have "hit" the ball, rather than muscling the ball. Important, because when you wait for that ball to get to the release point before triggering it, that's when that marvelous "in the zone" sensation is felt. You'll love the results of that!

GREENDALE—The United States Bowling Congress has named versatile and highly respected bowling industry veteran Steve Kloempken to the position of Technical Director of the sports national governing body.

Recognized as having one of the industry's most innovative minds in bowling ball design and construction, Kloempken will manage the USBC Specifications and Certifications team, which primarily performs advanced testing and research on bowling balls, lanes, pins and lane dressing to ensure that all equipment meets guidelines set by the organization before it is used in USBC competition.

Kloempken officially is slated to start Aug. 1 at the current USBC testing and research facility in Greendale, Wis. Eventually, Kloempken and his staff will operate from the research portion of the USBC International Training Center that will be constructed at the new USBC Headquarters facility in Arlington, Texas. Plans call for the training center, scheduled to open by June 2009, to have six lanes for testing and research and 14 lanes for training and coaching.

I'm extremely excited about the opportunity to join the USBC, said Kloempken, 38, who has served as the marketing director for Storm Products, Inc., in Brigham City, Utah, since 2006. He was the technical director at Storm from 2000-06. This organization already has many talented people, and I'm honored to be a part of this great team.

Kloempken has a varied and extensive bowling background. The two-time Team USA member (1991, 1994) shined on the international stage in 1991 as a two-time gold medalist in the Federation Internationale des Quilleurs World Championships and U.S. Olympic Festival. He won one gold medal in the Pan Am Games. Kloempken helped Wichita State University to three straight Intercollegiate Bowling Championship titles from 1993-95, earning IBC All-Tournament Team recognition in 1993 and 1994. He also was the 1995 National Collegiate Bowling Coaches Association Most Valuable Player, a first-team All-American and the Bowling Writers Association of America Collegiate Bowler of the Year. The right-hander has rolled several USBC-certified perfect games and a USBC-certified high series of 820.

In addition, Kloempken is a USBC Silver coach, an International Bowling Pro Shop and Instructors Association Level II certified technician and a BWAA member. From 1998-2000, Kloempken served as the Pro Tour Consultant for Storm.

Kloempken has a considerable amount of technical expertise in bowling.

His list of accomplishments in that area includes: developing and presenting more than 40 seminars on bowling ball design, reaction and drilling; generating 10 different types of technical ball drilling instructions; attaining certification on the StormPro Digital Coaching System; and authoring articles in more than 15 publications.

Steve's background makes him a perfect fit for the USBC team, said current USBC Vice President National Governing Body and former USBC Technical Director Neil Stremmel. He has a technical background and a business sense that USBC needs to move forward and continue recent success.

With USBC, Kloempken takes the reins of a Specifications and Certifications staff that has recently made a significant impact on the sport. Under Stremmel's leadership, the USBC research team has secured patents for biomechanics systems for motion capture, foot pressure, grip pressure and a landmark, twoyear bowling ball motion study conducted jointly with bowling ball manufacturers.

As the USBC Technical Director, I'm looking forward to building upon the recent successes of the department, such as the bowling ball motion study, Kloempken said. Our team will con-


