Fred Eisenhammer Wins Marijane Viat Writing Award

AGOURA HILLS – Veteran journalist Fred Eisenhammer has been named the winner of the 2019 Marijane Viat Writing Award.

The annual award, presented by the California Bowling Writers, honors the individual who has written the top bowling story in a California publication in the past year.

Eisenhammer wrote a moving story in the Sept. 13, 2018 edition of the California Bowling News about memorable moments that bowlers sometimes achieve. These bowling achievements, Eisenhammer wrote, typically are

accompanied by emotional celebrations that can be viewed many years later as special events in one's life.

The headline of Eisenhammer's story was "Memorable, Emotional - You've Come to the Right Place!"

Eisenhammer has been writing for the California Bowling News for five years. Previously, he had written about 700 bowling stories for website examiner.com.

"I'm truly humbled by winning this award when there are so many truly talented bowling writers in California," Eisenhammer said. "I love to write humor" continued on page 6

Salinas, Diem Hoist Teen Masters Trophies

Julian Michael Salinas of Richmond, Texas, and Hannah Diem of Seminole, Florida, survived matches that came down to the final frame Friday to win the 2019 Teen Masters.

Salinas won the boys varsity title with a 42-game total of 9,197 after posting a 9-9 match-play record, while Diem went a blistering 16-2 in matches and won the girls varsity title with 8,653 at Sawgrass Lanes in Tamarac, Florida.

In the final position round game, both divisions came down to the final frame. Salinas needed any mark and five pins on the fill to secure the win. He went high on his first shot in the 10th frame and



left a six pin, which he easily converted, and then got nine pins on the fill to win.

Diem had a chance to shutout Caroline Thesier with a double in the final frame. She got the first

one but left a 10 pin on her second shot. That meant Thesier could win with a double and six pins on the fill, but she came up light on her first shot and left a two pin.

The Teen Masters only allowed bowlers to use a urethane non-flare bowling ball named the PBA Skills 3.02. The patterns were also much different than continued on page 6

Eve Adams Endures

It was January 1986 and she was on a stool 17 inches off the floor when she fell. She had socks on and she slipped. She said she felt her knee crush and heard bones break. X-rays showed the leg was broken in 19 places! Fortunately, a good micro orthopedic surgeon spent hours putting her leg back together and made a new knee out of her pelvic bones. She lived with two metal plates and 14 screws. She spent one and a half months on a motion machine in the hospital and at home. Since she needed assistance she stayed at her longtime friend Fran Thompson’s home for a month. She endured crutches (which she said were a challenge) and then had to suffer opening the wound when she got a staph infection but the metal plates were removed to be sure the grafts healed. At last, she got to go home. Rehab took two years.

She bowls on Wednesday.

You can’t keep someone who loves bowling away from the lanes and since she slid on her left leg, which was damaged, she had to get over her traditional four steps and use three and finish on her right leg. She continues to bowl with her right hand and a brace on the damaged leg.

So many good people have come from Oklahoma and Evedene Underwood is one. Her paternal grandmother was an American Indian and her grandfather was Irish. Eve came to California in 1942 at the age of 12. Her family moved to El Cajon where her father worked in the shipyards and her mother bought five acres in Tokay grapes where all helped work the land. The grapes were taken to Escondido to be pressed for wine.

The land had been subdivided into five acre lots and a family bought five acres next to Eve’s family vineyard which is where she met Vern Adams. Vern spent some time in the US Army and then a couple of years getting to know Eve and on May 22, 1948 they married. They moved to Linda Vista which was better for Vern’s asthma and moved into their first (and last) home where Eve has been for 66 years! The first of their three children, Linda, was born on October 13, Eve’s birthday, in 1949 followed by Daniel and Sheryl.

Eve got into bowling like so many of us in the years when bowling centers were appealing to housewives to come in, take lessons and join a league. The free babysitting was the real drawing card. She soon opted for a bigger league and the first meeting saw her coming away as Secretary.

Sound familiar? She really became enamored with bowling and the league concept and worked to increase

the size of the league. She joined a travel league at the invitation of Hall of Famer Connie Bechtel who convinced her to join the San Diego WBA Board of Directors. Ultimately she became president of the SDWBA when it had 28,000 members. She later was elected a director on the California WBA state board and is a Member Emerita. Eve endeavored to make everything better than she found it and in 1985 she was inducted into the San Diego Hall of Fame. She met her longtime friend Fran Thompson at a National Convention in Phoenix, AZ. And their friendship has endured through her 38 National Tournaments and 60 years. They have spent numerous summers and trips abroad together and even though Fran has retired in Washington State they manage to spend time at each other’s homes each year.

Vern had health problems and went through six bypasses and passed away in 1986. They had spent 38 years together.

Eve is a hardy, alert 88 years young person and says she loves bowling where her “old” friends love bowling as much as she does. The camaraderie is wonderful and no one sets the world on fire but you do your best and enjoy. She revers her 60 year friendship with Fran. At one point she actually averaged 184 and hit a high series of 686! She’s proud that the apple doesn’t fall far from the tree and her daughter Linda had served as President of the Tulsa, OK USBC and was honored in their Hall of Fame in 2017. They say attitude is everything and Eve Adams is proof.

She bowls on Wednesday.

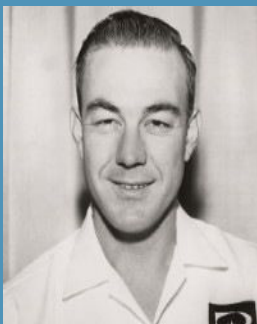

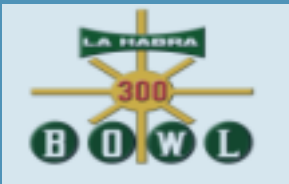

Williams, Mohr Take Commanding PBA50/60 Points Leads Into Season's Homestretch

Beginning with River City Extreme Open July 9-12

MONTICELLO, Minn. -- As the 2019 PBA50 Tour season travels back to the Midwest, Walter Ray Williams Jr. takes his more than 9,000-point lead in the PBA50 Player of the Year points race into the PBA50 River City Extreme Open presented by Hammer July 9-12 in Monticello, Minnesota.

After a rollercoaster ride in qualifying, and a big surge in match play, the two-time PBA50 Player of the Year salvaged a sixth-place finish in the Suncoast PBA Senior U.S. Open to lead with 24,800 points, 9,400 points more than USBC Senior Masters winner Amleto Monacelli who sits in second with 15,405 points and Norm Duke in third place with 13,950.

In pursuit of his fourth win of the season and a 15th career PBA50 Tour title that will give him sole possession of the titles record on the tour for players 50 and over, Williams started the season with three consecutive wins – including the PBA50 National Championship – followed by a seventh-, eighth- and a ninth-place finish in the USBC Senior Masters leading up to the Senior U.S. Open.

Reigning PBA50 Player of the Year and River City Extreme Open defending champion Michael Haugen Jr. became last season's only multiple winner when he defeated Bob Learn Jr., 247-246, in the title match of the 2018 event for his second PBA50 Tour title of the year and third of his career. Haugen is currently fifth with 10,735 points 615 behind Parker Bohn III in fourth with 11,350.

Leading the 2019 PBA50 Rookie of the Year points race is Hall of Famer Danny Wiseman in 13th place overall with 5,975 points. Wiseman has a best finish of second this season which came in the PBA50 Mooresville Open. Following Wiseman in the ROY race is Eugene McCune in 28th with 3,750 points.

McCune will have a good chance to gain substantial ground as Wiseman's schedule is expected to be limited for the rest of the season. While a distant 52nd overall with 2,020 points, PBA Hall of Famer Steve Hoskins also has time to make a run for the Rookie of the Year title.

PBA Hall of Famer Ron Mohr continues his bid for a fourth consecutive PBA60 Player of the Year crown leading players 60 and over with 9,925 points (sixth overall), 3,345 points ahead of Mike Dias who won the USBC Super Senior Classic in June. The 63-year-old Mohr, who also owns two PBA50 Player of the Year crowns, has a best finish of second this season which came in the PBA50 Hamilton Lanes & Entertainment Center Open.

The River City Extreme Open begins with qualifying on Wednesday, July 10 with squads at 10 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. CT, followed by second-round qualifying Thursday, July 11 also at 10 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. Match play begins Friday, July 12 with squads at 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. which will determine the top five players for the stepladder finals scheduled for 5 p.m. A practice session will be conducted from 10-1 p.m. on Tuesday, July 9 with a pro-am squad scheduled for 6 p.m.

After the River City Extreme Open, the PBA50 Tour stretch run continues with the PBA50 South Shore Open presented by Ebonite at Olympia Lanes in Hammond, Indiana, July 15-18; the PBA50 David Small's Championship Lanes Classic presented by Roto Grip in Anderson, Indiana, July, 20-23, and the PBA50 Spectrum Lanes Open presented by DV8 in Wyoming, Michigan, July 25-28. The PBA50 season concludes with the PBA50 David Small's Jax 60 Lanes Classic presented by Track in Jackson, Michigan, July 30-Aug. 2.

Two PBA60 events will close the year: the PBA60 David Small's Jax 60 National Championship in Memory of Mel Wolfe, Aug. 3-5 in Jackson and the PBA60 Dick Weber Championship presented by DeHayes Insurance Group & 900 Global at Pro Bowl West in Fort Wayne, Indiana, Aug. 7-9.

man interest stories involving bowlers and I want to thank the countless bowlers who opened their hearts to me and spoke so elegantly about their achievements. Bowlers are true characters and a breed apart and they’ve all developed their idiosyncrasies. I think that’s what makes bowling great because each bowler develops his or her style and feels unique in this sport. “In what other sport can one claim to be as good as Jason Belmonte – at least in one frame after delivering a strike?”

“I want to thank all my friends in the California Bowling News who enhanced my stories with their careful editing and layouts. And I also want to thank the members of the California Bowling Writers and Len Nicholson, the sponsor of the award.”

This marks the second time in three years Eisenhammer has won the Marijane Viat Writing Award. The award is named after Viat, who was the California Bowling Writers charter president. She worked tirelessly to promote the sport in many capacities before her death in 2001. The California Bowling Writers initiated the Marijane Viat award in 2010-11, replacing two writing honors: the Quill Award and the Profile Award.

Eisenhammer has more than 40 years of newspaper experience as a sportswriter, sports columnist, news editor and copy editor. He worked 20 years for the Los Angeles Times as a news editor and copy editor and has co-authored three sports books.

His last book, “College Football’s Most Memorable Games,” is still in print and is a top seller for McFarland Publishers. Eisenhammer also has written stories for the Los Angeles Times, the Chicago Tribune, the Ventura County Star and the Ventura County-based Acorn Newspapers.

Eisenhammer is a longtime Agoura Hills resident who has bowled in leagues for eight years. Currently, he bowls at Winnetka Bowl, where he freely admits he’s struggling with his game. “My goal from the start has been to score a 600 series and I seem to be regressing from that objective,” he said.

“Nevertheless, the game remains tremendously fun, in good times and bad, and the friendships from bowling often last forever. It’s awesome to be part of a family of bowlers. I wake up with a smile every morning when I know that it’s my bowling night!”

those used in today’s bowling with the long pattern (42 feet) and short pattern (32 feet) both having just under seven milliliters of oil. By comparison, PBA patterns have between 25 and 35 mL of oil.

The road to the title for Salinas and Diem included 24 games of qualifying followed by 18 games of round robin match play. The champions were determined based on total pinfall plus 30 bonus pins for each victory in matches.

Those bonus pins proved to be the difference for Diem as she easily had the best match-play record in either division. Diem averaged 194.60 for the tournament, which was more than two pins per game less than Thesier, but the 480 bonus pins loomed large for Diem. On the boys side, Salinas was in second place at the start of the day behind Andrew Guba, who led every round of the event heading into the third round of match play. Guba had a rough final block and finished the event in sixth place.

Champions were also determined in the junior varsity division with Kara Beissel and Eric Jones hoisting those trophies. Beissel made the cut to match play and finished in 15th place, while Jones finished in 34th place and was the highest JV player on the boys side.

PBA REGIONAL UPDATE: WALTER RAY WINS TITLE NO. 113 IN OHIO

FAIRBORN, OH – PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Oxford, Fla., did it again, defeating John Marsala of St. Louis by 65 pins to win the PBA50 Fairborn Central Classic presented by Roto Grip at Bowl 10 Fairborn (Ohio) Wednesday, and improve his all-time PBA titles total to 113.

Williams, who won only three of 10 head-to-head matches leading into the unique two-game final match play round, averaged 227.4 for the tournament and claimed his 19th PBA50 Regional title along with the \$1,500 first prize. Williams also has won 47 PBA Tour, 14 PBA50 Tour and 33 PBA Regional titles.

In the unique format, the top 12 players after qualifying bowled 10 games of round robin match play where the winner of each match received 10 bonus pins. After the 10th match, the top four advanced to a four-man, two-game final match where bonus pins were given based on two-game totals. The top scorer each game received 30 bonus pins, second received 20 bonus pins, third 10 bonus pins and fourth received no bonus pins.

In the two-game finale, Williams rolled games of 269 and 237 for a 506 total, earning 60 bonus pins and finishing with a 4,548 pinfall total to top Marsala’s 4,483 total. Marsala, who led Williams by five pins going into the final two games, earned \$1,000 for second place.

● Eugene McCune of Munster, Ind. and partner Matt Staninger of Centerville, Ohio, defeated Jeff Richgels of Oregon, Wis. and Tom Hess of Urbandale, Iowa, 2-0, in a best-of-three-game title match to win the PBA/PBA50 John Kontos Memorial Midwest/Central Doubles title at Town & Country Lanes in Joliet, Ill., Sunday.

Teams included one bowler age 50 or older paired with a partner under the age of 50. The title was McCune’s 24th overall PBA Regional title and Staninger’s second. They also split a \$4,000 first prize.

McCune and Staninger blanked Brian Menini of Brookfield, Mo., and non-PBA member Marc Heninger of Lee’s Summit, Mo., 2-0, in their best-of-three semifinal round match while Richgels and Hess swept Brian Kretzer of Dayton, Ohio and Ronnie Russell of Marion, Ind., 2-0, in the other semifinal round match.

● Brandon Curtis won his second PBA Regional title of the year Sunday, defeating the defending champion Steven Arehart of Chesapeake, Va., to win the third annual PBA Century Lanes Hampton South Open in Hampton, Va.

Arehart qualified in the number one position for the stepladder finals after leading the event virtually wire-to-wire, but he lost the championship match to Curtis, 242-235. Curtis finished with a a string of four strikes, but needing a strike or spare in his 10th frame for the win, Arehart left a 4-7-10 split that he was unable to convert.

In the first stepladder match, Curtis defeated PBA Tour titlist Ryan Ciminelli, newly-relocated to Lancaster, S.C., 268-206. He then eliminated another PBA Tour titlist, Jason Sterner, a new resident of Rochester, N.Y., 269-248, to advance to the title match. Curtis earned \$2,300.

- Brunswick Corp had 14 centers in So Calif. They gave out glassware awards with the Brunswick logo on it.
- Jesse Soria was the Big Cheif at **Alhambra Valley Bowl**. His native language “Ya-Ta-Hey” could mean either hello or goodbye. Sort of like Aloha.
- Who was the Director of ABT Orange County? Bill Cauble! He came up with some wild ideas. You'll find out as we go along. You might even have a story you'd like to share with our readers.
- Walk Block, PCB Secretary and his new bride honeymooned in Tahiti.
- Joe Norris had a heart operation. He wanted to heal up fast to bowl ABC for 51st time.
- Mr. Catalano took over **Macy Lanes** in Anaheim and called it **Catalano's Sports Bowl**. Several owners and managers tried to make a go of it, but it was hexed from the beginning. An exorcist would have been the only solution.
- The ABT (San Diego Division) ran a Labor Day Tournament at **Parkway Bowl**. Top prize? A 1990 Geo Metro car. (Ask your phone for a picture.)
- One of the World's greatest female bowlers- Marion Ladewig- was known as a bowling machine. She was Hall of Fame and a “celeb” wherever she went. A true athlete and roll model. She dedicated her later years to the Bowling Hall of Fame and museum. She was 75 years old in 1990.
- The 1990-91 California WBA Queen was Therese Abair. She won \$1405 and an entry into the WIBC Queens.
- Art Jackson took over the League Coordinator job at **Gage Bowl**. Art's smile could get you to join a league.
- Dennis Massad, former bookkeeper was promoted to General Manager at **Mission Hills Bowl**.
- Active West** ran a monthly full page ad spotlighting the “Employee of the Month” in each of their centers.
- The \$53 million **Santa Fe** casino hotel in Vegas was due to open in December. They had an ice rink for hockey games, several eating places, nursery, meeting rooms and 200 hotel rooms on 36 acres. More venues have been added over the years.
- \$25 million was put into the **Showboat** upgrade.
- Another new bowling center was being built in Mesquite...The **Virgin River Resort**. Bowls were popping up like mushrooms!
- The Western Senior Bowlers Tour (Seniors 50 and over) averaged 110 bowlers per event. Andy Marzick was the tour director. Their monthly events entailed traveling to Fresno, Reno, Bakersfield, Oceanside, Hemet, Carlsbad, San Jose, etc. etc. Stars included: Glenn Allison, Don Johnson, Bill Bunetta, Ed Bourdase, Vis Gassue, and Mick Prulhiere. - Lou Kasnick- “Bowling Santa”- always showed up at tournaments with bags of goodies...especially for the ladies. At age 86 he was honored for 50 years of service. Always a giver. In fact, he gave away 10,000 bowling balls, bags, shoes, diamonds and encouragement.
- Friendly Hills Lanes** in Whittier was purchased by ARC; modernized and re-opened in September 1990.
- John Schouda, **Cal Bowl** manager, was always in a white shirt and tie, looked good for the camera at the MANY events, both Pro and amateur.
- Mike Fowler, local stroker, had 2 great weeks in September; World Match Play Open and Cal-State Masters. \$10,000 in the bank.
- Pinky's Bowl** in Moreno Valley was owned by the Pinkalla Family from Milwaukee. They ran a speak easy in the 1930's on the spot where they built their first center. The 1959 Pink 4 door Cadillac Convertible in the lounge was a jaw dropper.
- Junior Star Mike Calvillo captured the JAT cup at **Friendly Hills**. He's still hunting the head pin in 2019.
- Tish Johnson won her 9th LPBT Title in Virginia beating Aleto Sill and pocketing \$20,000. (\$47,720 so far in 1990.)
- Granada Hills Bowl** bargain of the week: Saturday nights 12:30 to 2:30 a.m. 2 hours for \$6. How many games can you bowl in 2 hours?
- Raymond Hartoog made more money on T.V. than Tish Johnson. He won \$20,000 on the California Big Spin Lottery.

- Reed Freeman, **Conejo Village Bowl** owner was elected President of Bowling Proprietors Assn. of So. Calif.
- Bally's** in Reno ran an “Over 50” tournament for bowlers traveling in motor homes. No details available, sorry.
- Tish Johnson won her Third-in-a-row title in Baltimore. Another \$9,000 in the piggy bank.

- Granada Lanes** put on a “Junior Halloween All Nighter” The Lock 'N Bash was a costumed affair. Check this; all the food and drink you wanted, bowling tournaments, all night movies, pin ball tourny, even a pool tournament. Kids were locked in from mid-night to 8 a.m.

- Roy Hoernke and wife Brandy were owners of **Mission Bowl** in Oceanside. Roy was “THE” guy to go to for lane maintenance. They hosted the PCB many times.

Wish we could spotlight the “one win wonders” that only cashed once. For “that” bowlers it was a memory made, a tale to tell over and over. Maybe even a life changing moment. We salute you and your one day of fame.


