Barrette Gets Grand Slam As USBC Women's Championships Closes

CHARLOTTE, N.C. - For the third consecutive year, Leanne Barrette made a major impact on the final standings at the United States Bowling Congress Women's Championships.

Barrette won her fourth title in the past three years and her fifth overall as Ebonite Bowlers Map of Roseville, Calif., won the Classic Team title with 3,210 at this year's Women's Championships, which concluded its 82-day run Monday in suburban Charlotte, N.C.

The former professional star shot an 804 series, the second highest series in tournament history, en route to winning the team championship.

Barrette was joined by USBC Collegiate spokesperson Kim Terrell (634), 2006 USBC Queens champion Shannon Pluhowsky (621), Lauren Takahashi (581) and Sandra Terrell (570).

"It's so awesome to win team event, and now I have the grand slam," said Barrette, who won all-events in 1987 and 2005, singles in 2005 and doubles with Takahashi in 2006. "Ever since we stopped bowling on tour, I've been bowling really well in the Women's Championships, and I don't know why."

Barrette's team competed in the Women's Championships on April 25, just days before the start of the USBC Oueens. In fact, all the Classic Division winners came during a flurry of activity in those few days.

Qualifying on Saturday, July 21st, begins at 8:10AM on Practice and 8:20AM Starting Time: Check In Time will be at 7:30AM. Bowl 10 Games straight. Finals, Sunday, July 22nd for both divisions will start at 8:30AM.

Keep in mind, the Super Seniors, with high enough qualifying scores will bowl in the Regular Division Finals, and the number of finalists will not change in their division. A chart is posted at the bowling site scoreboard of the format for the finals of this tournament, on how many bowler will be in the finals, determined by number of entries in the tournament at the start.

The tournament entry fee is \$165.00 for current WCST Members, Guests to add \$15.00 to that fee. The tournament will pay a minimum of one cash place for every 3 bowlers entered in each division. Optional Money Action: High Game Side-Pots, and Brackets. On Friday, July 20th, with a Check In Time of 2:15PM, and a starting time of 3:00PM, there will be a 5 game Singles Sweeper, that is also expected to have a good turn-out.

\$60.00 is the Entry Fee, and that includes High Game Side-Pots, Brackets will be optional. On Friday and Saturday, Side-Pots will be operated by Bart DiBartolo, and Brenda Blandina. \$500.00 will be the 1st place prize based on 40 or more entries.

BOWLING NEWS

This is a mystery to me....

One of the great mysteries of the bowling industry is the oversight of our industry leaders to take advantage of the dedicated and grassroots members of our own community. A perfect example of this is the promotional genius and expertise of Joan Romeo. Joan has been involved with amateur and professional bowling for thirty years or so; beginning around the time her daughters Robin and Tori began their professional bowling careers. Anyone that knows her will agree that she is one of most tireless, diligent, and creative individuals in the sport. Many would agree with me when I say that she has been involved in as many, if not more, promotional projects than anyone in the game, primarily using her own personal means.

Joan originally hailed from New York. She is a current resident of Van Nuys, California. She is the mother of five children, including Robin, a 2005 California WBA Hall of Fame inductee, as well as a member of the WIBC Hall of Fame and Tori, also an accomplished bowler. Her oldest son Billy and her son-inlaw Steve occupy prominent roles in the movie industry. Steve is married to Joan's oldest child Debbie. Her youngest child, David leads a successful music combo, switching back and forth on several cruise lines all over the world.

Joan's husband Ray passed away in 2000. In addition to being Robin's greatest booster, he had a gregarious personality and was loved by everyone who knew him. Prior to settling in California, Ray was a driving school instructor in New York. In addition to this, he was a tremendous cook, having previously operated a catering service. He was involved in and vigorously supported his daughter's bowling careers.

Joan currently operates her own marketing business, the "Marketing Team". She is an "idea" person; an asset to any group... .a classy, creative person who has the ability to organize details like no other. She has been instrumental in promoting Pro-Ams, working with and promoting Team USA through USA Bowling. She developed and produced, along with Jerry Koenig and Elaine Hagin, the first FIQ International Senior Open.

She is the ultimate promoter for any sponsor but, despite her involvement in a myriad of bowling promotions, Joan Romeo has never been offered a permanent and meaningful position in the bowling industry.

A good analogy of utilizing the talent within our sport and one of the most strategic moves made by the United States Bowling Congress was the hiring of Tom Clark, former sports columnist for USA Today. Clark's ingenuity has done wonders for the USBC. (Clark will be featured in a future column) Joan Romeo is cut from the same mold.

At the recent Bowling Writers Association Columbia 300 Press Party and Awards banquet, I had the honor and pleasure of presenting Joan Romeo the Remo Picchietti Humanitarian Award. Not only was Mrs. Romeo deserving of this honor; it was long overdue.

One of Mrs. Romeo talents include event planning; from beginning to end; flawlessly takes care of every detail. This includes arrangement of economical hotel rates for bowlers, writers, and officials attending bowling events in the Reno area. She has close ties with several hotels, including Circus-Circus, Atlantis, and Peppermill. Mrs. Romeo has over 30 years experience of advertising, production, public relations, event sponsorship and non-profit marketing with such agencies as the Pearlman Group, Jim Terry Productions, Centipede Films, and Grey Advertising. Her representative list includes the Ladies Touring Players Association, Women's International Bowling Congress, Permanent Charities Committee of the Entertainment Industries, Federation Internationale Des Quilleurs, California Women's Bowling Association, and USA Bowling.

In 2004, in Las Vegas, she negotiated getting the Armed Forces involved which resulted in the largest Team USA National finals ever, bringing together 254 finalists from all over the world."

Nicholson Earns 47th Flowers Award

Las Vegas: For years, the 2007 Flowers for the Living honoree has had one of the most unenviable jobs in sports. On June 26, during the 2007 International Bowl Expo, the tables were turned in Las Vegas when all the kudos he earned for doing that job so well and under the most trying conditions netted Len Nicholson the 'Flowers' award. It is an honor presented to someone in bowling who is admired, respected and, indeed, loved.

Turnabout, as they say, is fair play. In Nicholson's case, we might add, it was overdue.

Nicholson was part of the PBA's original lane maintenance team, along with Sam Baca. In that role either with Baca, or individually - he has been involved in analyzing, cleaning and conditioning bowling lanes in more bowling centers, in more cities, in more states, and in more countries than anyone in the history of bowling. The numbers are staggering. He has been involved in doing the lanes for the PBA for over 800 tournaments, which included the National Tour, the Senior Tour and all of the PBA's seven regions.

He has the distinct honor of being the only person to have been in charge of conditioning lanes for every PBA member who is currently in the PBA Hall of Fame. This man traveled the PBA Tour for over 25 years and has worn many 'hats' in this sport that he loves. As a result, his insights into bowling are unique and often sought after from his peers.

These days, as host of a 24/7 internet-based bowling webcast, many know Nicholson as 'The Phantom.' He has turned 'Phantom Radio' into a 'must hear' webcast since originating the show in April of 2001. His webcast has attracted a litany of guests and celebrities all across the bowling spectrum in the over 270 shows he's done since.

As bowling Hall of Famer and longtime friend Billy Hardwick describes him, "Lenny was totally crazy but, everybody loves the guy. You can't help but like him. He's a man's man."

The Sam Levine Flowers for the Living Award was created in 1961 by the late Cleveland Kegler Publisher Sam Levine, and is based on a poem by former Ohio Associated Press editor Fritz Howell. In the poem, Howell suggested that deserving individuals be honored while they were "still alive to smell the flowers." The award is intended as a surprise to the recipient. Honorees are determined by a special committee of prominant bowling writers. This year's award was presented by Hall of Fame legend Billy Hardwick, and Bowlers Journal Editor Jim Dressel, former chairman of the committee.







LAS VEGAS-By all accounts, International Bowl Expo 2007 was a smashing success

Staged annually by the BPAA (Bowling Proprietors' Assn. of America), which is celebrating its 75th (diamond) anniversary this year, Bowl Expo was held June 23-28 at the Mandalay Bay Hotel, Casino & Convention Center.

Hall of Fame writer Dick Evans reports that 5,538 individuals attended the '07 Bowl Expo. That's a remarkable 6% increase over last year and included proprietors, bowlers and writers from several foreign countries.

Evans' best comment, I thought, was his suggestion that "the giant Mandalay Bay complex could use walking sidewalks." It must've been a quarter of a mile-at leastfrom the hotel lobby to the Convention Center.

It was a very busy week for more than 80 members of the BWAA (Bowling Writers' Assn. of America), which was staging its annual convention in conjunction with Bowl Expo.

What made the BWAA Convention and Bowl Expo so successful, to me, were the people there.

It started with the Columbia 300 dinner, hosted by Hall of Famer Jowdy. For decades, this dinner has been the highlight of BWAA Convention week...and this year was no exception.

The reason was the presentation of the BWAA's three most prestigious awards. First, the Rip Van Winkle Award, honoring an individual whose bowling accomplishment has gone unrecognized for 20 years, went to Reg Pearson, the man most responsible for the creation of the National Bowling Stadium in Reno.

This award is being discontinued by the BWAA, causing Pearson to remark that he was happy he was selected "even though I'm the last person to receive it."

The BWAA Remo Picchietti Humanitarian Award was presented to Joan Romeo, who owns a successful public relations and advertising firm, The Marketing Team, of Van Nuys, Calif. Joan, the mother of USBC Hall of Famer Robin Romeo, was so surprised that er L.A. Junior All-Star Travel all she could say was an emo-

scent of a story.

Another Bowl Expo highlight was when John Sommer, the very modest proprietor from Rockford, Ill., was presented the Vic Lerner Award, qualifying him as the newest member of the BPAA Hall of

> Fame. Sommer gave a heartfelt acceptance speech, which he ended by imploring the bowling industry to back a new women's pro tour. Sommer, who founded the PWBA (Professional Women's Bowling Assn.) Tour, spent \$3 million of his own money to finance the tour for two decades before pulling the plug in 2003.

> I was delighted when I saw Kim Terrell at Bowl Expo. Terrell was recently appointed head coach of the women's bowling program at Delaware State University, located in the city of Dover.

Terrell is a perfect fit for the job. The native of San Francisco was a two-time All-American at San Jose State, a Team USA member for two years, and won nine PWBA titles, including two majors, the 2001 Women's U.S. Open and 2002 WIBC (now USBC) Oueens.

Terrell is also a USBC collegiate spokesperson and served as a junior Team USA assistant coach for the past four years. She plans to continue her USBC duties while coaching at Delaware State.

"Will you have to move to Delaware?" I asked Terrell.

"Yes," she replied, "but I won't mind because my husband works in Washington, D.C., which isn't too far (from Delaware)."

Terrell will do a great job at Delaware State, and I'm predicting that she'll produce an NCAA title contending team within three years.

I had another wonderful experience at Bowl Expo. I happened to be sitting by myself when a beautiful woman asked if it was okay for her to sit down next to me. "Sure," I said...then I did a doubletake.

It was Cheryl (Kominsky) Robinson, whom I hadn't seen in more than 20 years. I knew Cheryl when she was about 13 and one of Southern California's top junior bowlers.

GREENDALE, Wis. - Bowling greats Nelson Burton Jr. and Marshall Holman and award-winning USA Today columnist Christine Brennan have been named as the announcers for the ESPN telecasts of the 2007 U.S. Women's Open presented by the United States Bowling Congress.

The U.S. Women's Open will be conducted at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nev., in August and will feature a unique televised bracket-elimination format featuring the top 16 players after qualifying rounds. The first four elimination rounds will be taped Aug. 17-18 and shown Sept. 16, 23, 30 and Oct. 7 on ESPN. The final four competitors will return to Reno for a live televised championship round on Oct. 14.

Brennan, one of the country's most respected sports columnists, will serve as sideline reporter and essayist. She also is a best-selling author and has worked as a commentator for ABC News, ESPN, National Public Radio and FOX Sports Radio. A leading expert on the Olympics and women's sports issues, she also is a nationally known speaker. Her latest project is a new book, Best Seat in the House: A Father, A Daughter, A Journey Through Sports.

Burton, a member of the USBC and Professional Bowlers Association Halls of Fame, was part of one of sport's most famous broadcast teams, partnering with lead announcer and fellow hall of famer Chris Schenkel as color analyst on PBA Tour telecasts for 23 years. Burton has most recently served as emcee for US-BC's Hall of Fame induction ceremonies.

Burton also had an outstanding bowling career winning 17 PBA Tour titles and holds the record for most USBC Open Championships titles with nine, including the 1976 Masters.

Holman, a member of the PBA Hall of Fame, returned to the booth in April as color analyst for the 2007 USBC Queens. He previously served as a color analyst for PBA telecasts from 1996 to 2001.

Holman, the 1987 PBA Player of the Year, retired from the tour in 1996. During his career he won 22 titles including two Tournament of Champions (1976, '86) and two U.S. Opens (1981, '85).



The championship match of all four PBA Women's Series events will be televised as part of the ESPN telecasts of Denny's PBA Tour events scheduled to take place in the first half of the 2007-08 season, with air dates set for Nov. 4, Nov. 11, Nov. 18 and Dec. 2.




