

USBC SENIOR QUEENS TO BEGIN THREE-YEAR RUN IN LAS VEGAS IN 2019

ARLINGTON, Texas – The United States Bowling Congress Senior Queens will extend its run at Gold Coast Hotel and Casino in Las Vegas for three more years starting in 2019.

The 2019 Senior Queens will take place March 15-19 and once again will follow the National Golden Ladies Classic, also an annual national bowling event for senior women. The Senior Queens is for women who are USBC members age 50 and over.

"We saw our largest field in nearly a decade and the majority of the participants liked the opportunity to compete in both events," USBC Executive Director Chad Murphy said of the 2018 event held at Gold Coast Hotel and Casino. "We appreciate their feedback and look forward to outstanding events in the next three years."

Last season marked the first time the Senior Queens was held following the National Golden Ladies Classic.

Following the 2018 Senior Queens, 78 of the 81 participants responded to a survey about the event. Two-thirds of respondents said they liked having the Senior Queens follow the National Golden Ladies Classic, though 78 percent said they would prefer a day off between the competitions. There will be a rest day for participants prior to the 2019 Senior Queens.

Every respondent said they would compete in a future Senior Queens tournament.



At the 2018 Senior Queens, USBC Hall of Fame member **Tish Johnson** of Colorado Springs, Colorado, defeated fellow USBC Hall of Famer Jeanne Naccarato in the title match. The left-handed Johnson had recorded four consecutive runner-up finishes at the Senior Queens from 2013-2016 before winning the 2018 title.

EJ Tackett Wins PBA Xtra Frame Parkside Lanes Open For 10th Career PBA Tour Title

Tackett defeats Bill O'Neill, 210-171, in title match for first win of the season

AURORA, Ill. – Entering the stepladder finals as the top qualifier, 25-year-old EJ Tackett of Huntington, Ind., beat a struggling Bill O'Neill of Langhorne, Pa., Monday to win the PBA Xtra Frame Parkside Lanes Open for his 10th Go Bowling! PBA Tour title.

Tackett beat O'Neill, who was also trying for his 10th win, 210-171, in the title match to also record his first win of the season.

"To make it to double digits is one of those milestones you always hope to accomplish." Tackett said of the 10-win milestone. "It's like winning your second title because it's another validation in your career that you can compete against the best in the world.

"There's no such thing as an easy win but this tournament felt easier than most for some reason," the 2016 PBA Player of the Year added.

In the title match, O'Neill ran into problems early when he left the 2-10 and 2-7-10 splits back-toback in the third and fourth frames and was not able to convert the splits.

Tackett, using a urethane ball on the PBA Chameleon 39-foot lane condition, which he chose for the title match, was able to hit the pocket consistently and never threw anything less than a nine-count until the 10th frame when the match had already been decided.

In each stepladder match the higher qualifier was able to select the lane condition for the match.

Frank Weiler — I am the only one who knows why bowling pins have a small hole centered in the bottom of each pin. Why? Because in the old days before top loaded manual pin racks, pin boys had a foot pedal that raised small medal pins from below the pin deck. The pin boys placed or "inserted" each wooden bowling pin into or onto the raised metal pins to set the wooden pins properly lined up. When I was a pin boy I used this system and later the above manual pin rack.

Celebration of Life for PBA Hall of Famer Pete Couture Scheduled for Saturday, Aug. 4, in Melbourne, Florida

MELBOURNE, Fla. – A Celebration of Life for PBA Hall of Famer Pete Couture of Cocoa, Fla., has been scheduled for 6-10 p.m. Saturday, Aug. 4, at 2950 Pineda Plaza Way, Melbourne, FL 32940.

At Couture's request, memorial contributions should be made to the Wounded Warriors Project in his name.



Couture, a 2016 inductee into the Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Fame, died Saturday at his Florida residence of undetermined medical issues. He was 73.

"Another Hall of Famer and friend of mine has passed away," said fellow PBA Hall of Famer Marshall Holman. "Pete was a great competitor and a good friend of mine for almost 40 years."

"Pete was one of the toughest, hardest-working players our sport has ever seen," added long-time friend Bill Spigner, a Connecticut native who grew up competing against Couture in New England.




Couture was born in Auburn, Maine, and spent many of his formative years in Windsor Locks, Conn. He was elected in the PBA50 Performance category based on his exceptional record for a minimum of 10 years as a "senior" competitor. On the heels of a 24-year career as a PBA Tour competitor, when he won five standard PBA titles, Couture began his PBA50 career in 1995 when he earned PBA50 Rookie of the Year honors. He won the first of nine PBA50 Tour titles in Reno in 1996, and captured a pair of USBC Senior Masters titles in 1998 (when he was selected as PBA50 Player of the Year) and 2002. He is one of nine players – all PBA Hall of Famers – to earn both PBA50 Rookie and Player of the Year honors.


At the time of his retirement, he had earned \$959,900 during his PBA career. In retirement, he operated a pro shop and coaching services at Shore Lanes in Merritt Island, Fla. He liked to say he was a "graduate of the school of hard knocks."

"If it wasn't for the senior (PBA50) tour I wouldn't be here," said Couture during his PBA Hall of Fame induction speech. "The senior tour was a second chance and an opportunity to re-invent myself.

"I'm kind of overwhelmed," Couture said. "It's a dream come true. I think everyone who bowls for a living has a dream of getting into the hall of fame, and to have it actually happen is unbelievable.

"I went from being a so-called star to being a superstar in that one year," he said of his four-title season in 1998. "Everything came together. When I made match play, I was able to get to the show, and when I got to the show I was pretty successful. Everything went the right way for me that year."

EJ TACKETT JOINS ELITE LIST OF YOUNG 10-TIME PBA TOUR CHAMPIONS

AURORA – By winning his 10th PBA Tour title in the PBA Xtra Frame Parkside Lanes Open Monday in Aurora, Ill., **EJ Tackett** of Huntington, Ind., joined an elite list of PBA players to win 10 titles at a young age.

The youngest player to win 10 PBA Tour titles was **Pete Weber** who accomplished that feat at the age of 24 years, 247 days. **Mike Aulby** did it at 25 years, 89 days – one day faster than **Wayne Webb**. Tackett, who hit the career milestone at 25 years, 329 days (he turns 26 on August 7), is fourth-youngest on that list after his win in Aurora.

Tackett was already PBA Hall of Fame "title-eligible" after he won his second major (and seventh overall title) in the 2017 PBA Tournament of Champions at the age of 24 years, 191 days. He won't become "participation eligible" for election, however, until 2032 – his 20th year of PBA membership – so he has plenty of time to pad his resumé.

For the record, PBA Hall of Fame eligibility is a twostep process. "Title eligibility" requires 10 standard PBA Tour titles or five standard titles plus two majors. The second requirement is "participation eligibility" which means a player must have been a PBA member for at least 20 years.

As a side note, had he won Monday, Parkside Lanes Open runner-up **Bill O'Neill** would have become "title eligible." O'Neill has won eight standard titles and one major (2010 U.S. Open). When he wins his 10th title or his second major, O'Neill (a PBA member since 2005) will become "participation eligible" in 2025.



easiest for me to break down with a urethane ball," Tackett said. "I just felt that I could avoid bowling 180 and it was my best chance to keep the ball in play. If I could bowl over 200 I felt my chances of winning the match were pretty good. I did exactly what I wanted to do."

In the opening stepladder match, six-time Tour winner Dom Barrett of England defeated four-time titlist Marshall Kent of Yakima Wash., 235-226, to advance to the second match against O'Neill who qualified third for the finals.

O'Neill went on to beat Barrett, 245-216, in the second match and then No. 2 qualifier two-hander Chris Via of Springfield, Ohio, 209-198, in the semifinal to advance to the title match.

Intended to put added emphasis on performing well every game, the unique qualifying portion of the tournament awarded bonus pins to players for each game depending on how they finished against their competitors on each pair of lanes. As an example, with four players on a pair of lanes, the top scorer would earn 30 bonus pins, the second high scorer 20 pins and third 10 pins with the lowest scoring player receiving no bonus.

The tournament was also conducted on three different PBA lane conditions with the first round conducted on the Chameleon followed by the second round on the 39-foot Don Carter and the third round conducted on the 39-foot Bear condition.

All PBA Xtra Frame events for the rest of the season will be covered live, from first ball to last, by PBA's new live streaming partner, FloBowling. Subscriptions are available at FloBowling.com (existing Xtra Frame subscribers can transition their current subscriptions by visiting https://www.flobowling.com/claim-account).



3. MULTIPLE PARTICIPATION: Entrants may participate multiple times per event. In order to place more than once in the prize list for position standings at least two players on the team must be different and you must change

partners in the doubles event.a 4. ENTERING AVERAGE: Entrants must use their highest 2017-18 book average. If none, entrants will use their January 1, 2018 average with at least 15 games. If none, entrants must use highest current average of 15 games at the time of entry. Proof of average verification must be provided with paid entry. A standing sheet, which must include a date to verify, signed by their coach or league secretary is proof for verification. If no average verification entrants must use a 225 average for all events. If current season average for at least 21 games at time of bowling exceeds last season's average by 10 or more pins, current season average must be used (Rule 319a-2). Rule 319e (15 or more pin increase in tournament average of 21 or more games in the past 12 months) must be used or bowler will be disqualified.

It is the bowlers' responsibility to verify the accuracy of his/her average, whether submitted by the bowler, team captain, or others. Failure to use the correct average shall disqualify scores if submitted average is lower than correct average, thereby resulting in a lower classification or more handicap. Prize winnings shall be based on the submitted average, if it is higher than the correct average. Corrections in averages can be made up to the completion of the first game of a series, or within 48 hours after completion of the series if the tournament manager, prior to the completion of the first game of a series, has given written consent to the bowler authorizing such extension of time to

5. RERATE/ADJUSTMENTS: Tournament director reserves the right to rerate or adjust a bowler's average upward prior to competition. If the bowler does not accept the adjustment a refund will be given. Any adjusted or rerated averages, whether accepted or refused, must be reported. Failure to do so is grounds for disqualification Any entrants, youth or adult, who have qualified for a cash and/or merchandise prize of \$600 or more in any tournament in final standings, brackets, side pots, all events, special/donated prizes in the last 12 months must report their scores, position and amount won to the Tournament Management prior to bowling for possible re-rating. Failure to comply will be cause for forfeiture of entry fees and prize winnings.

6. FORMAT: There will be two formats for this tournament. There will be a team event consisting of two Juniors and two Adults bowling a 3 game format. There will also be a doubles event consisting of one Junior and one Adult bowling a 3 game format. An optional Junior Gold event may be offered for the USBC Jr Gold members. The entry fee will depend on the division and will be collected at the tournament site prior to bowling. One in five qualifiers will receive a paid entry (not including travel or expenses) to the national tournament. Bowlers must be a current season Jr. Gold member prior to competition. Membership must be purchased prior to or at the tournament. National tournament qualifiers who are not current Jr. Gold members will be disqualified.

7. HANDICAP: Handicap will be 80% of the difference between the team's average and the top of the division (refer to front of entry form for figures).

8. DRESS CODE: Matching and/or professional attire is encouraged. Awards for matching teams will be given "Looking Good" pins. Male participants are asked to wear collared shirts and slacks or dress shorts. Female participants are asked to wear skirts, slacks, skorts or dress shorts and proper shirts. Skirts, shorts and skorts must not be more than 3" above the knee. Attire must be neat, clean and proper fitting. We strongly suggest no jeans, tank tops, hats, or attire advertising liquor or tobacco products, no attire with inappropriate language, or any apparel which the tournament director feels is inappropriate will be permitted. Smoking and/or consuming alcoholic beverages during competition is not permitted.

9. CONDUCT: Any conduct deemed inappropriate, foul language, obscene gestures or abuse of equipment may be cause for removal from competition, as determined by the tournament director. Any incident that reflects poorly

on the Reno Jr-Adult Invitational, reported to the Tournament Management, whether at the center or otherwise, may result in denial of further participation. Entry fees will not be refunded.

10. AWARDS: All prize/award fees will be returned 100% within each event, on a ratio of at least 1 prize for each 10 entries or major fraction thereof. The USBC SMART program will administer all scholarship awards, Acct #9312. 11. CHECKIN: Bowlers must check in 1 hour prior to squad time. Tournament spots are on a first-served basis. Bowlers failing to check in one half hour before their scheduled squad time will lose their scheduled spot. All substitutions should be made one hour prior to squad time.

12. Additional squads may be added during the course of the tournament as deemed necessary by tournament management, but no squad shall be added after the last advertised squad time. All decisions by the Tournament Director are final unless an appeal is made in accordance with USBC rule 329. All scores are unofficial until otherwise posted. Any questions or concerns must be brought to one of the Co-Tournament Directors. Official protests must be filed, in writing, with one of the Tournament Directors, within 72 hours of the completion of the tournament.






