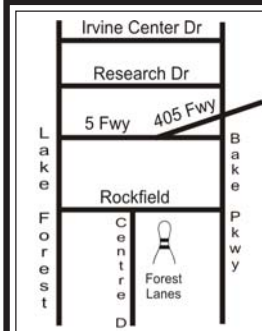

A Tarheel (Peake) Wins ABTA Gold Coast Open, Tops 703 Entrants

Dizon Match game \$3,500 • Big Pots carry over this week at Bowling Square

LAS VEGAS—Daryl Peake stepped up and won his first ABTA title and it was a good one, topping 703 entrants and winning a sweet top prize of \$9,000. Daryl did it the hard way winning 6 straight matches in the top 32 single elim finals. Finally he downed the top seed, Marty Nakunz of Highland, CA for the title.

This was the third Gold Coast Open Event for the ABTA. We allowed new members up to a 208 average and several joined us there. We had bowlers from 13 different states participate. Hence they are now eligible for all ABTA Events.

It was great to return for our Annual Event at the Gold Coast, everyone was treated fairly. We had a separate (cut) Qualifying board each day which took 1 in 5 1/2 entrants to the semis.

The scoring was very tough, with separate qualifying boards daily. With the shot being the same each day and after the 703 entrants, we saw a whopping 145 Semifinalists take to the lanes for the semifinals in hopes of making the Top 32 single Elim finals, which are very exciting. The top 32 had 7 ladies guaranteed.

In the Semis we saw the pride of the Inland Empire, Marty Nakunz light up the lanes with a huge +131 which catapulted him to the Championship match. He would sit out and wait for a winner to challenge him for the title. In second was ABTA veteran Orpah Tolliver with her fine +102. She would sit out in the first round of the finals and enter in the second round or top 16.

Losers in round one of the top 32 single elims were Don Johnson, Charissa Moskus, Joy Ispiritu, Gil Gissendanar, Chris Romero, David Yun, Hein Rim, Claudio Puglisi, Darren Stillwell, Vickie Flanders Jun Nacion, Beth Borci Robert Gonzalez, Roger Amparo and Eduardo Perez. They finished in 18-32nd places and got checks of \$215.

In round two we saw Levi Slocum, Orpah Tolliver, Manny Loria, Thomas Licauco, Danny Reese Sr., Anna Bautista, Freddy Ringor, and Junior Guiramy lose out. They cashed in 10-17th places and garnered checks of \$245.

Round three heated up as Daryl Peake came back from the dead with a four bagger to edge Tommy Newman who whiffed a 10 pin 222-221. Fred Galvan escaped due to a late frame collapse by Carl Nixon 214-211, Lito Dizon escaped from J.T. Jackson 209-206, and Noel Espiritu got by Lucinda Griggie 211-196 and losers of round three got checks of \$400 for the fine bowling finishing in 6-9th places

Round four (top 5) saw Peake dig deep and best a tapped Espiritu 203-188. Lito Dizon struck early and held on in a

200-185 win over Freddie Galvan. So Fred, and Noel were 4th and 5th and \$800 each with a great showing at the Gold Coast. Now we would see Lito and Daryl meet for the right to bowl for the title against Marty Nakunz.

In this game we had the crowd favorite Dizon seem to lose his shot a bit and Peake cruised to a 211-170 win and Lito was third for \$2,000 with Peake off to the title game vs Nakunz.

The title match was set and Marty elected to start the match. He nervously got a six out. Marty struck and spared. Marty seemed uneasy and spared then opened again. Daryl was clean. Marty doubled in frames 5-6 and trailed by only 10 pins. Peake however was not pounding the hole but he was keeping clean on the tough lanes. Marty then tried his all, but split in frames 7-8. Peake was clean til frame nine opened but had a nice lead and coasted to a 178/202-136/164 victory. He was a happy young man to be sure as was his friends and newly wed wife, Tracey who was on hand. His friends who joined, and ABTA members were on hand rooting him on. Great bowling by a young gentleman who had some breaks in the finals but made them count. Good things happen to Good People. Congrats again Daryl!

Great bowling by Marty, who also had many friends, and family here. His lovely wife Bobbie, son Mike and daughter-in-law Jennifer are all ABTA supporters. Great going Mr. Nakunz!

Great going by Lito “Boy” Dizon in his 3rd place finish for \$2,000. Lito had many friends cheering him on in Vegas. Lito had some luck earlier in the day as his fine 242 game was drawn by Nakunz to the tune of \$3,500. Lito was buying the beer :-)

The Optional Doubles were taken by Ronnie Chandler and Deedra De Coster. Their 1341 got them \$210. We paid 12 places and \$1,260 in the doubles there.

Last up in the 3-6-9 was Danny “El Presidente” Guevarra who missed on the shot and we will go for \$800 in the 3-6-9 this week in our one day event at Bowling Square.

The Match Series was drawn by top seed Ms Wiley, and it was unmatched due to the 657 score. We have a carryover of \$1,944 and will estimate the Match Series at \$2,200 this Saturday, and for only \$2 entry fee.

The Match game 3 was matched by one of our finest, Lito Dizon worth a capped \$3,500 for his \$5 entry and his score of 242 drawn by Nakunz got him the loot. There is a Carry Over of \$1,844 in the Match Game 3 so it will estimate going for \$2,900 this Saturday. .

DOWNEY — For at least 10 years I have been an advocate for “One Association - One Card Sanctioning”. The past four years I have voted at every opportunity for the birth of U.S.B.C. Now we have it. What’s going to change?

Is the U.S.B.C. going to convince every league organizer in the U.S. to sanction? Who is going to demand that organized league bowling be sanctioned? Who is going to coerce seniors into purchasing a card? Are juniors participating in our sport illegally if they are not sanctioned?

Let’s take a long deep look inside the hundreds of centers in California. In a cluttered office, sits a league co-ordinator (or activity director) whose job it is to fill the lanes, generate cash flow and don’t spend money doing it!

So, the games begin, with merchandise provided by Leading Edge Promotions and encouraged by the Bowling Proprietors Assn’s. To mention a few merchandise leagues: Angel Tickets, Dodger Tickets, Spiderman Balls, Incredible Balls, Disney Balls — all short term and unsanctioned. Sure they fill up the lanes and provide cash flow. But — had a few dollars more been built into the league fees, every bowler could be sanctioned. Could belong. Could receive awards. Could become a regular league bowler!

Are we asking or expecting too much from the Brunswick and A.M.F. centers that pledged to sanction 100%? Are we expecting too much from league organizers?

The price of gas goes up. The associations are in turmoil. Who wants to drive to an office to sanction a league?

Show me a center that is giving free lessons. Show me a center teaching the “gimmick” league bowlers how to keep score or fill out a recap sheet, much less talk to them about sanctioning.

Show me a center where the league co-ordinator sits in full view of the bowlers, and knows which league needs a bowler (In case one should ask).

I’ve been duped, brainwashed, and asleep. I felt I was pretty informed, but the light came on!

It’s the league co-ordinators of the world that have control! Not U.S.B.C.
