Bowl Expo Proves It's Okay For Bowling To Be All Things To All People

LAS VEGAS—The age-old question of whether bowling is a sport, recreation or business may finally have been definitively answered June 27-July 1 at International Bowl Expo 2010 in Las Vegas.

After years of arguing that it had to be one or the other, it was apparent to the thousands in attendance that bowling indeed is all of them together. And that seemed okay to the many experts there.

"We promote bowling as a sport, entertainment and business," Brunswick President of Bowling Products Brent Perrier told the Bowling Writers' Association of America. "It's all three."

Sure, traditional establishments, which Perrier estimated receive 70 percent of their revenue from bowling, remain prevalent. But the expanding family entertainment center concept with just 33 percent bowling revenue is picking up steam. So, too, are the boutique centers with 30 percent bowling and hybrids which combine the family and boutique concepts.

"You must appeal to all bowlers – sport, recreation and family," Perrier said. "I don't think many bowling centers are relevant to today's con-

sumer. When the proprietors do renovate and improve, they make money."

After all, that's the bottom line to businesses that are nearly all privately owned. Bowling may be the world's only sport and recreation where there are virtually no publicly-owned facilities.

Perrier is one who believes the industry was tilting too much toward recreational play.

"We got lazy in the bowling industry with some good open play numbers," he said. "Now with the economy down, open play is down to where we've been doing more marketing to leagues the past few years. We are doing as much marketing to open as we are to leagues."

While it's clear bowling is a sport at the Professional Bowlers Association, collegiate, high school and Junior Gold levels, the line becomes a bit foggy beyond that. Even league bowlers associated with the United States Bowling Congress consider themselves to be recreational as often as competitive.

"The sport of bowling is evolving, spreading out if you will," USBC Managing Director of Media Pete Tredwell

Scott Pohl Wins \$20,000 at Summer Mini-Eliminator

LAS VEGAS — Scott Pohl, a 41 year old right handed bowler from Burnsville, MN won the 2010 Summer Mini-Eliminator and its \$20,000 top prize. Scott rolled a fantastic 276 game in the championship shootout to defeat the senior division champion Sam Carter of Ben Lomond, CA (224) and 210 & under handicap champion Bob Godden of Las Vegas, NV (189). Sam earned \$10,000 for his runner-up position while Bob won \$7,500 for third place.

All three bowlers in the final shootout, which brings together the champions of the three Mini-Eliminator qualifying divisions, were Super Bye winners which guaranteed them \$4,000 and only 1 round away from the championship shootout. The three bowlers that were eliminated in the semi-final round, earning \$4,000, were David Haynes of

Las Vegas (49 & under), Jorge Siegrist of Mexico (senior) and John Wiley Jr, of Charlotte, NC (210 & under handicap).

At the Summer Mini sev-

eral other champions were crowned. Les Shirwindt (senior) of Las Vegas, NV won the Lane #1 Shootout by defeating Richard Samson (210 & under) of Camarillo, CA 265-219. Les earned \$5,000 for winning the shootout while Rich took home \$2,500.

There were also 3 Early Bird Champions crowned during Mini-Eliminator week each earning \$1,000. The Early Bird Champions were 210 & under champion, Dustin Keener, Cleveland, GA, Senior Champion, Ed Roberts, Braintree, MA, and 49 & under Champion, Greg Velarde of West Covina, CA.

Over 1,300 entries were recorded during tournament week and more than \$250,000 in cash and prizes were paid

out. The 2010 Summer Mini enjoyed an 11% increase in the number of bowlers from the previous year with 47 states represented and 13 different countries.

The next Mini will be the 2011 Winter Classic which will be hosted by the South Point in Las Vegas in early February. Exact dates will be announced shortly.

SAN BERNARDINO—Two very competitive divisions, last weekend at Del Rosa Lanes in San Bernardino, CA for the WCST Ebonite Singles. The regular division, in a major transition period at this time, only 10 entries, Marc Levy (Cathedral City), in a different format being used for this tournament, where after the qualifying for this one day tournament, that each bowler bowled 8 games. The top 3 qualifiers, bowled an additional two games added to their qualifying total pins. 3rd place bowler, eliminated after that, and the top two bowlers, bowled the best 2 out of 3 games, with all total pins dropped to determine the championship, Marc beat Steve Smith 2 out of 3, and won his 2nd WCST Title. Steve was the qualifying leader with 1961 for the 8 games. 3 checks paid out in this division, 1st Place, Marc Levy (Cathedral City) \$625.00, 2nd Place: Steve Smith (San Diego), \$450.00, and 3rd to Kevin FATHERree (Northridge), \$325.00 \$1400.00 paid out.

The little giant from Lakewood, Ca Kevin Gannon, won his 33rd WCST Championship, in a very close battle from 2nd place finisher, Mike Rausch. Kevin led the qualifying for the 8 games, with 2047, to hold a lead of 80 pins over 2nd place, and 116 pins over 3rd place. 26 entries for this division, had 8 bowlers go to the finals. Kevin’s lead for the 1st 6 games ranged from 67 pins all the way down to 9 pins. His 7th Game, a typical move by this champion, with a big 296 game, a game he needed as Mike Rausch in his 7th game rolled a 247 game and won his match, to be within 58 pins of the leader, going into the position round. Both bowlers in the final game had one open, but Mike had plenty of strikes in between, and finished with a 266 game, Kevin, also had many strikes, and had to throw the 1st strike in the 10th frame, to win the tournament, he got it, and finished with a 253 game, even with the loss of the match, won the tournament by 15 pins. Ron DeMaio, started in 8th, and closed fast for 3rd Place.

said during a BWAA panel discussion where the question was asked if bowling is becoming more entertainment than sport. “The purest level is PBA which is separating from the league and recreational base.”

“If you want to be a successful sport on TV, it has to be entertaining,” said PBA Deputy Commissioner and Chief Operating Officer Tom Clark. “A taped series, a made for TV event, is that a sport? The Chris Paul event was a made-for-TV event but they were playing our sport.

“Perceptions in bowling are the biggest thing we have to overcome. At the grassroots level, the entertainment side is overwhelming things. The first thing people think of in bowling is the entertainment aspect.”

“We as bowlers are sensitive to anything that we think de-mans our sport,” said Las Vegas Review-Journal sportswriter and bowling columnist Jeff Wolf. “We get sensitive because we are slighted so often.”

“To me, sport is entertainment,” said Bowlers Journal Executive Editor Jim Dressel.

The educational seminars held early in the week also focused on bowling’s multiple aspects. For the sport enthusiast, there were pro shop and coaching sessions. For the recreational/entertainment crowd, there were marketing/promotion, technology lab, food and beverage and entertainment income seminars. And for the business people, there was business planning.

The Wednesday general session also mirrored the tone of the week. It started when Strike Ten Entertainment Vice President Frank DeSocio, continued with the keynote address by former Alaska governor and 2008 Republican vice presidential candidate Sarah Palin and concluded with the announcement of the return of the U.S. Women’s Open in 2011.

DeSocio got the crowd warmed up with positive news such as participation being up 4.6 percent overall and 5.6 percent for frequent bowlers plus announcing Budweiser as the new official beer of bowling.



Palin talked about how bowling centers are a true slice of Americana because of their community ties.

“I have a personal appreciation for what you do,” she said. “There were a lot of cold nights where I’m from where after basketball games we would meet at the bowling center. I have an appreciation of what you provide in your community.

“My Dad was on a Thursday night bowling league,” she added. “He bonded with his buddies. I have memories of that point of my life which mean very, very much to me.”

Palin also was impressed with how bowling centers have

fared during the recent recession.

“What I find fascinating is how you have been able to evolve and innovate during changing times,” she said. “You’ve stayed open later. You’ve added automatic bowling machines and a variation of disco bowling. Because you

were innovating and adapting you’ve seen resurgence.”

Palin’s speech was followed by the announcement of the return of women’s bowling most prestigious events, the U.S. Women’s Open. The televised finals will be held June 30 at Cowboys’ Stadium near the International Bowling Campus in Arlington, Texas.

When new BPAA Executive Director Steve Johnson learned the 2010 U.S. Women’s Open was scheduled to go on hiatus, he decided to do something about it.

“To me, the U.S. Open is the best of the best in a sport and I couldn’t let that go away,” he said. So he contacted new Ebonite Chief Executive Officer Randy Schickert.

“Ebonite has a true passion for women’s bowling,” Schickert said. “When we were approached by BPAA, we jumped in. It was the right thing to do.”

So with all the talk about the sport, recreation and business of bowling all being good, where does the industry go from here? At Strike Zone at Sunset Station in Henderson, Nev., it’s a little bit of everything. “Our property is so big we can do both the sport and recreation of bowling,” said Jim Welch, general manager of the 72-lane facility. “We can have a birthday party on one end and a tournament on the other. Sometimes we’ve done the ultimate multitasking. We’ll have five different events going at the same time.”

That’s a good mix according to retired USBC Chief Executive Officer and author Roger Dalkin who said he noticed a subtle move toward more entertainment-based exhibitors at the Bowl Expo Trade Show.

“The industry has to be careful that it doesn’t go too much entertainment because then you are dealing with people who go on a whim,” Dalkin said. “Look at the Main Event places in Texas. They never had a league when they opened and now they are starting to look for leagues.”

As Disney’s Mike Reardon said in the Disney Institute’s Approach to Business Excellence seminar, people no longer are coming to bowling centers just to bowl.

“Walt Disney told us, and it’s still true today that recreation and entertainment are not luxuries in this society or people will go nuts,” Reardon said. “Look for ways to expand what you already do and who you are.”

By that definition, centers that combine the sport, recreation and business of bowling should be able succeed quite well.

National Deaf Bowling News

Malucci Finishes Two Red Rock Leagues With 243 and 242 Averages

LAS VEGAS — Early last June the magnificent hearing-impaired lefthander Carl Malucci e-mailed this write that he has interesting news for me to write. Malucci, who is currently bowling in a Summer League at Red Rock Lanes, had finished his Tuesday and Wednesday Fall Leagues at Red Rock with 242.4 and 243.8 averages, respectively, each for 84 games. That is a great feat for two leagues.

As we mentioned here last year that Malucci had set a deaf and/hearing-impaired bowler record 246-plus average in his Wednesday League at Red Rock Lanes in Las Vegas. That 246 earned him the 2008-2009 season high average honors in the Southern Nevada Bowling Association; that was the first such honor for a deaf male bowler. So along with this 246, that makes Malucci the first deaf bowler to accomplish consecutive seasons of 240-plus averages.

At this time, Malucci does not know where his 243.8 average ranks in the SNBA books for the 2009-2010 season. But he has interesting facts about his pair of 240 average leagues. If those two were put together, it would be at 243.1 for 168 games. All the series were above 600 for the 56 weeks combined for both leagues. 45 weeks out of 56 had been 700 or higher series, which is impressive.

Impressive yeah, but not compared with last year’s 246, in which Malucci made 17 consecutive 700-plus series that put his name at the top of the USBC record book for most consecutive 700s bowled. The best Malucci did in recent season was 12 consecutive 700s.

Nevertheless, bowling two seasons of 240-plus leagues in a row is a great accomplishments for a deaf bowler. Malucci’s friendly hearing-impaired competitor, Kenneth DeGroff who has the distinction of being the first deaf bowler with a 240 average made in a Reading, PA league in the 2004-05 season, is first to admit that it is a very hard task to do. Righthanded DeGroff, now a Sunland, CA resident finally finished his recent season with a 240 average in a league at Mission Hills Bowl is proud that Carl had done it.

Both DeGroff and Malucci wanted me to write a story about being the best deaf righthanded and lefthanded bowlers in the world. That would be great but along came another up and coming deaf righthander, DJ Powell who also finished his Indianapolis league with a 240 average.

Reno To Host USBC Open & Women's Championship in 2013-2014

ARLINGTON — For the first time in history, the United States Bowling Congress will bring the USBC Open and Women's Championships to the same city simultaneously when Reno, Nev., hosts both events in 2013 and 2014.

Plans call for the Open Championships to be held in the National Bowling Stadium, while the Women's Championships will take place in a custom-built arena inside the Reno-Sparks Convention Center. USBC will install dozens of lanes and the largest indoor mobile scoreboard in the world at the convention center continuing the spectacular feel bowlers expect. The convention-center setting first was introduced to the Women's Championships at the 2010 event in El Paso, Texas.

"Hosting USBC's two largest championships in the same city will create great new opportunities and experiences for our bowlers," USBC Executive Director Stu Upson said. "We want families to have the option of traveling to the national tournaments together, but we also respect the need to preserve the tradition of separate tournaments."

USBC plans to develop additional events that will coincide with the two main tournaments in Reno. These new events will potentially involve mixed teams and youth entry options. The lanes of the Women's Championships arena will remain in the Reno-Sparks Convention Center between the 2013 and 2014 tournaments, saving construction resources and allowing for greater flexibility in scheduling new events.

USBC received bids from several cities interested in hosting the Open and Women's Championships. The 2013 Open Championships already was scheduled to be at the National Bowling Stadium, allowing Reno to provide a natural fit for bringing both events to the same city by offering two arena settings for a multi-year agreement. Now there will be greater opportunities for couples who might only be able to afford one bowling trip a year to travel together and both have events to enjoy.

"Reno is a fantastic family destination and our aim is to develop a reason for every type of bowler to visit there in 2013 and 2014," Upson said. "Our partners in Reno have a great track record of creating a first-class experience for bowlers and they have done it again by committing to a second championship venue."

Historically, Reno has proven to be a popular destination for tournament bowlers. The Open Championships has averaged more than 80,000 bowlers, while the Women's Championships has averaged more than 60,000 bowlers in Reno host years since 1995.

"We're just tickled to have these two prestigious bowling tournaments in the biggest little city," Reno Mayor Bob Cashell said. "I just know they'll love visiting Reno and competing at the National Bowling Stadium—it's the only facility of its kind in the world."

Looking ahead to 2013, USBC plans to investigate new ideas for the Open and Women's Championships, including potential adjustments of incentive programs, lane conditions, squad schedules, price structure and entry process. Hosting two major events in one city should allow for improved staffing and better customer service. The focus will be on providing the best possible experience for bowlers in Reno and attracting more participants to USBC's national tournaments.


