DAN KNOWLTON WINS SECOND CAREER TITLE AT 2024 PBA50 MORGANTOWN CLASSIC

MORGANTOWN, W. Va. – As Dan Knowlton watched urethane equipment go down the lanes in the first two matches in the stepladder finals at the 2024 PBA50 Morgantown Classic, he felt his game plan was solid. All week he followed the same progress using just two balls, one urethane and the other reactive. He waited for the lanes to tell him when it was time and once that moment came, he was ready to make the change and capitalize.

Yet, when it came to his semifinal match, Knowlton had a little bit of self-doubt in the back of his mind.

"I thought about using something different. I have gotten stuck too many times using the ball that I used all week and losing in the stepladder, and I didn't want to do that," he admitted. "But this one just looked too good."

With the urethane hold evident, Knowlton was able to throw reactive resin and almost hook the entire lane against No. 5 seed John Janawicz. Knowlton was relaxed and confident as he rolled five straight strikes to gain a 23-pin lead. He followed that up with four straight spares. Janawicz started with three strikes, but after



three straight spares he made a ball change in the seventh, responding with three strikes in

a row. Knowlton, who was the higher seed and decided to finish first, doubled and watched

his final shot go Brooklyn for another strike and a score of 245. With ball in hand Janawicz stepped

up and rocketed a stone 9-pin followed by a strike to come up just short continued on page 5

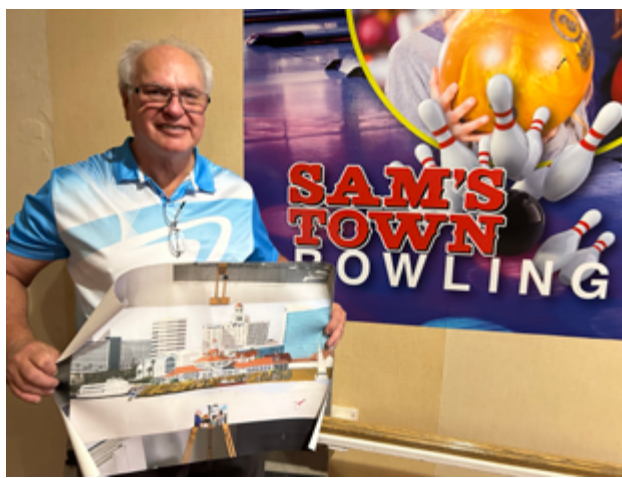

BOOKER, CURTIS RETURN AFTER DOUBLES WIN AT USBC OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

LAS VEGAS – It takes a lot to try and defend a title at the United States Bowling Congress Open Championships, and recently, the 2023 Regular Doubles champions returned to the event to try just that.

DeeRonn Booker of Albuquerque, New Mexico, and Mark Curtis Jr. of Chattanooga, Tennessee, were able to claim the lead and earn the doubles title last year at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nevada, with a score of 1,482. It marked the first victory for both at the event.

Booker, the 2024 USBC Masters champion, had games of 213, 289 and 258 during the set in Reno for a 760 series, while Curtis bounced back after a 168 start to finish the set with 274 and 280 for a 722 series.

They took the lead late at the 2023 event, posting their score July 22. The event concluded July 24. When they got the call to confirm the win and their spot in the tournament's record book just a couple days after taking the lead, Curtis said, "I got goosebumps when I got the call – it truly was an incredible moment."

Coming back to the tournament this year and seeing their names in lights after the win, Booker said, "I'm still trying to believe it."

Working together is something that comes with ease for them. They have been friends for a long time, and the friendship always comes first.

"We work well together, because bowling is just secondary," Booker said. They communicate well with each other on the lanes, too, which helps in their success.

"If I am struggling, he has the ability to help me get back and help me throw the next shot as well as I can, and it's the same thing for him," Curtis said.

They put those traits to the test this year at the South Point Bowling Plaza in their title defense. Competing this year may have held a little extra weight to it after their trophy presentation on the lanes and getting to see their championship banner, but they still were able to come out strong and showcase their ability to work together.



"There's always pressure trying to defend something, and with our recent successes this past year, it is making it a little tough to try and stay sharp physically and mentally," Booker said.

Booker led their doubles effort in 2024, rolling games of 215, 222 and 279 for a 716 series. Curtis added 246, 216 and 221 for a set of 683, which gave them a doubles score of 1,399. That performance currently places the pair in the top 50 of Regular Doubles at the 2024 USBC Open Championships.

Shawn Evans and Nicholas Fisher of Palm Bay, Florida, lead this year at South Point with 1,531.

For Booker, he added set scores of 677 for his team event to help Bay Area Pro Shop 1 to a 3,062 total, and in his singles event, he finished off the appearance with 776, giving him an all-events score of 2,169.

He's currently 13th in Regular All-Events and 14th in Regular Singles at the 2024 event. His 2,169 total also is his highest showing at the Open Championships to date through 10 appearances.

Curtis also had a strong showing coming back to the tournament. In his team event, he was able to bowl a 634 series to assist Bay Area Pro Shop 1, and he finished off the year with 651 in his singles event for an all-events score of 1,968. It marked the second highest all-events total in his nine years at the tournament, finishing only one pin behind last year's score.

Life has been moving fast this year for Booker, who started the year by taking the early lead at the USBC Team USA Trials in January. He went on to win the Masters in March to claim his first Professional Bowlers Association Tour title and major championship, going undefeated in the tournament's double-elimination bracket to earn the top seed. He secured the victory with a 217-177 win over Patrick Dombrowski in the title match.

Through all of this success, Booker talks highly of his support system.

"As things keep getting better, you have to keep making sure you keep yourself well enough to do so," Booker said. "I appreciate their support and the continued support for everything for USBCs, PBA, etc. Thank you. This year has been a wild ride, but I still have some unfinished business to do."

The 2024 Open Championships got underway Feb. 23 and will run through July 29 at the South Point Bowling Plaza. The tournament is scheduled to feature more than 11,000 teams and 55,000 bowlers making their way to compete in Las Vegas.

A Look Back In Time — Matchbook Collections

One of the more enjoyable categories in Dr. Jake’s Bowling History Blog is the Matchbook category. It’s a look back in time to uncover bowling centers from the past and to perhaps shed some light on exactly why a particular location decided to give up the good fight and shutter their doors.

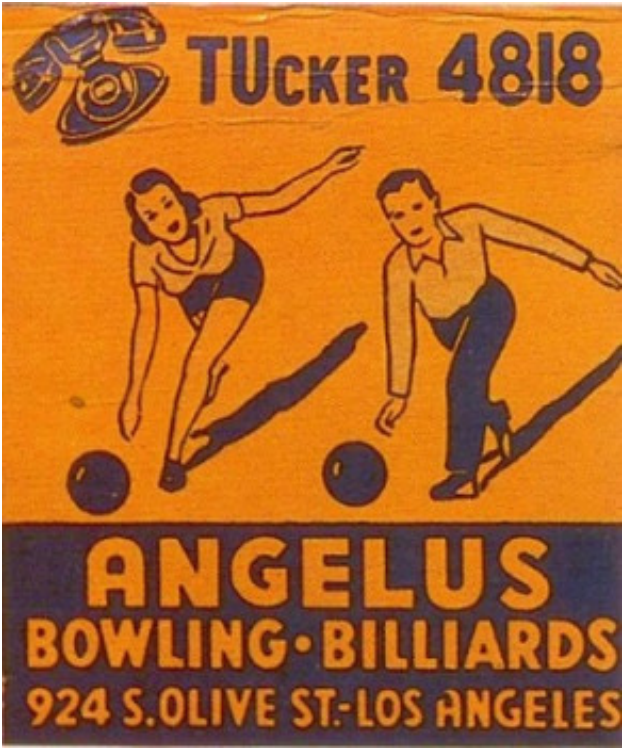
There are quite a few new additions since our last look at J.R. Schmidt’s matchbook collection, which included locations such as Rancho Bowl in Santa Maria, Calif., Rocket Bowl in Chatsworth, Calif., and Futurama Bowl in San Jose. Let’s begin with yet another location from San Jose...



Downtown Bowl, San Jose, Calif. - Located at 275 W. Santa Clara Street, Downtown Bowl was literally in the heart of downtown San Jose. I wonder if this location was originally built by the Golobic family, owners of Downtown Bowl in San Francisco? The location was most likely sold as the value of the property continued to rise and became more valuable than the business. Today the land is part of the Arena Green Park, where the Los Gatos Creek meets the Guadalupe River. The cocktail lounge, known as the Zodiac Room, was a popular night spot, according to online posts.



Broadway Bowl, Oakland, Calif. - I can remember bowling here as a youngster. One of our youth directors at Continental Lanes in Santa Rosa, Jim Anderson, was originally from Oakland, where he bowled with Ed Bourdase and other top notch keglers. Jim and his wife Pearl would get all of us kids together in their Volkswagen mini-van, and we would be off to bowl tournaments at Broadway Bowl, Up-town Bowl, Hi Score Lanes, and other neighborhood bowling locations in Oakland and the East Bay Area. Broadway opened in 1941 and reportedly closed in 1976. The site will soon become a part of Oakland’s tallest residential proposal, the 46-story Town Tower.



Angelus Bowling and Billiards, Los Angeles, Calif. - I couldn’t find much information about Angelus, except from a write up at m00nshot.com: “The Angelus was an old school bowling and billiards center located at 924 South Olive Street in Los Angeles. Their design (same as on the matchbook) is part of our retro bowling alley collection featuring locations of yesteryear.” Today the site is a seven story mixed use building (retail on the first floor and apartments above). If anyone has any information about Angelus (years of operation, reason for closing, etc.), please let us know.

Windsor Bowl, Los Angeles, Calif. - Even less is known about this bowling center. The property is now home to a CVS Pharmacy and a church. Windsor Bowl was located on Slauson Avenue. That rings a bell - “Take the Slauson cutoff, until you come to the fork in the road,” from Johnny Carson and the Tonight Show (Tea Time Movie host Art Fern... remember that?). If anyone has more information about Windsor Bowl, let us know and we will include in an upcoming column.



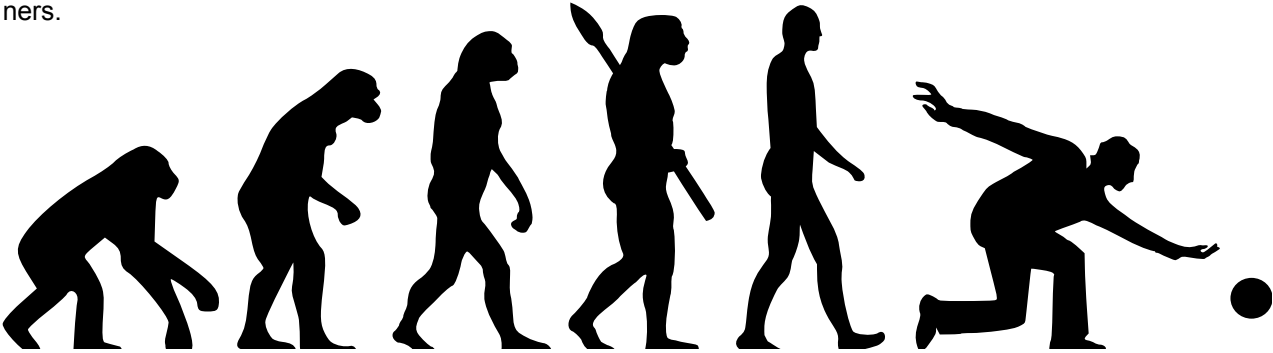
Morningside Recreation Center, Inglewood, Calif. - There’s an interesting post originating at bowlingheritage.com that states: “Morningside Recreation in the Inglewood neighborhood of Los Angeles, California, was not just a bowling center. It also offered a soda fountain and coffee shop in addition to other recreation activities.” The center was believed to have opened in 1940. The location is now home to Lucas Health Partners.



Victory Bowling Center, Van Nuys, Calif. - This 24 lane center was one of the favorite hangouts of professional bowler Jay Robinson as a youngster. The bowling center was converted into an office furniture showroom for many years, and is now home to Magnum Motorsports, a motorcycle dealer. A post from Barry Asher at Dr. Jake’s Bowling History Blog, states: “Where Ron Winger and I started bowling. Won my first tournament at 10 with the trophy presented by Buzz Fazio.” Wow, that’s a lot of history and star power for one small center in the San Fernando Valley.

It’s interesting that of all of the latest bowling centers listed that have closed from among Dr. Jake’s Bowling History Blog Matchbook Collection, there are none from either Arizona or Texas, which remain the growth markets for bowling, along with Florida. The list is dominated by Illinois (7) and California (6), followed by Wisconsin (2), Missouri, New York and Ohio. Within the Illinois listing, five of the 7 are from the city of Chicago.

with 235.

In the championship match, Knowlton maintained his loose arm swing and rode his confidence level quickly to the finish line against No. 1 seed Jason Couch. Knowlton had the front-11 before he took a rerack. With a bonus check for a perfect game on the line, Knowlton pulled his shot left leaving the 6-pin standing for 299.

Couch struggled from the start opening the match with three straight spares before a strike and two more spares. He struck on five of his final six shots for 234. The win marks Knowlton’s second career PBA50 title.

“I feel like now I belong. Getting that first win (2023 PBA50 Ballard Championship) really validated whether I was any good and felt like I could belong out here,” he said. “So, I thought let’s go for broke this year. Come in here, bowl a little bit more confidently, and let’s see what happens. I feel like I have bowled really well this year.”

His confidence level is also high because he was recently selected for Senior Team USA, and he will be competing next month in Reno at the 2024 PANAM Bowling Senior Men’s Championships. “I have always looked at anything Team USA and felt that has to be an incredible experience. To be such a select few that get the honor to do that and wear our country’s colors gives me goosebumps. If I can somehow manage to get a medal and put that in the trophy case, that would probably be cherished above these titles.”

This summer, Knowlton worked a lot on adding versatility to his game, which was on display in the championship match. He wanted to be able to increase his axis rotation, so he could play further in creating a bit more angle up front. He admits that was something that really wasn’t in his game before.

“I knew that was my weakness when I was getting on the longer, high-volume patterns. I really couldn’t move in and throw the ball away from me,” he said. “I was really moving in and keeping it still somewhat in front of me and that just really wasn’t working for me.”

He started practicing as much as he could and specifically sought out tournaments with that oil pattern to work on it. That extra work and dedication to wanting to get better is paying off.

In the opening match, Janawicz faced No. 4 seed John Burkett. Both players started off with doubles. Burkett missed a 10-pin and spared before rolling another double. Janawicz converted a 6-pin and rolled three straight strikes before getting another spare. Burkett made three more single-pin spares and struck out for 214, while Janawicz struck three out of his final five shots for 237.

In the next match, Janawicz took on Mark Sullivan, who was making his first-ever PBA50 stepladder finals appearance.

Sullivan had three spares and two strikes across his first five frames, while Janawicz rolled three strikes and two spares holding a 10-pin lead. After the midway point, Janawicz rolled his second double followed by three straight single-pin spares and a strike for 216. Sullivan managed to only strike one more time and a 4-6-7 split in the ninth frame ended his run. He finished with a 184.

certified bowler.

The common thread that unites these two multitalented men is ART. Both Picasso and Russ Simmons are accomplished oil painters, artiste! James Russell Simmons, known as JARUSI (JA for James, RU for Russell and SI for Simmons) to the art world, is a painter of realistic scenes. His precise strokes, color tones and attention to detail makes his work recognizable and desirable to a wide variety of art audiences. Russ has been painting since 1970 and his MASTERPIECE, “Parker Lighthouse at Long Beach” is my favorite work and is Museum material.

Russ Simmons is as American as apple pie. His family tree can be traced to the Mayflower and its Pilgrim passengers who dropped anchor in Cape Cod harbor on November 21, 1620. Russ is 68 years of age and has earned a living as a truck driver for over forty years. Since 1992 driving tractor trailers in Southern California for ABF Freight. What is more American than that.

I love truck drivers. My dad drove tractor trailers on the east coast prior to serving in the Navy during World War II. He was a patriot and I see Russ in the same mold. American bred and American made.

Russ is a man for all seasons. I respect him for his thoughtfulness, his intellectual curiosity, his knowledge of history, science and the social sciences. My conversations with Russ make me confident he could easily be successful as a public speaker, diplomat, teacher, psychologist, researcher, engineer and more. It would be more appropriate to call Russ “DaVinci on the Lanes” because of his multi-talents and interests.

By the way another of his talents includes cooking. Russ is an accomplished Chef! It’s rumored that some of his specialties include colcannon potatoes, Irish spiced beef, Scottish oatmeal rolls, almond tea bread, English rhubarb crumble, crispy fish and chips and German potato salad to name a few.

There are several exotic dishes Russ told me you can try preparing at home with a little effort and a few ingredients that are available at your local market. PAD THAI is a popular Thai dish that can be made at home with rice noodles, tofu or shrimp, bean sprouts, peanuts and a flavorful sauce made from tamarind, fish sauce and other ingredients. RATATOUILLE is a French Provençal stewed vegetable dish that can be a great vegetarian option. It typically includes eggplant, zucchini, bell peppers, tomatoes, onions, and herbs like thyme and basil.

I have a couple of favorites that Russ highly recommended. MOUSSAKA a wonderful Greek dish

with layers of eggplant, minced meat (usually lamb or beef), tomatoes and a creamy bechamel sauce. It’s a hearty and flavorful dish. I love it. Then there is BIRYANI a fragrant and flavorful Indian rice dish made with basmati rice, spices, and meat (chicken, lamb or goat) or vegetables. It’s a bit time consuming to make but well worth the effort.

As a bowler Russ is one of the top senior bowlers in Southern California. He is a PBA member who easily averages 220 in local competition and regularly gives bowling lessons for free. I would describe his approach to our sport as ambiphysical. The application of a combination of physical skills to the sport of bowling.



Over the past several years I have observed Russ compete at the USBC Senior Masters Championship at Sam’s Town. Every year he competes at a high level, bowling on difficult lane conditions. This spring Russ rolled a perfect 300 game in the PBA Super Senior Classic at Sam’s Town. He will be receiving a Super Senior Tournament Ring for his accomplishment.

Who knows what the future holds for Russ on the lanes and off but you can be sure Russ will be competitive with a chance to win any tournament he enters. He will always be friendly and cooperative with his competitors and the fans. Simply put Russ is a talented bowler, a great guy and a unique personality.

Russ is another example of the many multitalented people bowling in Southern California. His accomplishments on the lanes are impressive and prove again that “CALIFORNIA BOWLERS ARE THE BEST BOWLERS IN THE WORLD”.
