"Beast" Battiest Makes **JAT "Grand Exit"**

WESTMINSTER- Our JAT members have been traveling the country from Las Vegas to Indianapolis to compete in great scratch junior bowling events all over the country. For the first time in a month JAT tournament action was alive and well at Westminster Lanes. Though some of the bowlers were recuperating from their jet lag, a strong field of 32 bowlers took the lanes in Open Division competition

Walking up to the check-in table bowlers shared stories about their trips for team tournaments in Las Vegas and tough lane conditions in Indianapolis. Long-time JAT member Marcus Battiest announced that it was his last tournament in his junior career as he is "aged-out" at 22 years old. He noted on his recap that today was the last stop on the "Marcus Farewell Tour '05". Little did we know then what a day it would be for him!

After 5 games of qualifying, Chris Fritsch led the field by almost 100 pins at +211. Cut for the top-14 bowlers was Sam Hitchcock at +25, while qualifying high game went to lefty Jeff Spiesman at 268. Battiest bowled well enough to sit in 8th after qualifying but was ready to roll for match play.

Going into match-play the lanes started to open up and scoring started to rise. Chris Fritsch led most of the way swapping spots with Brian Leseberg after Leseberg's 729 out of the gate. After starting with a 209, Marcus Battiest took over the tournament lead on games of 256-229-229-256 with a 5-0 match-play record landing him at +392. Close on his heels was Brian Leseberg at +360, third-seed Chris Fritsch at +302 and fourth-seed Jeff Spiesman who snapped off alternate Kevin Valmonte by just 4 sticks at +267. In his many years of bowling JAT, here in his last event it was the first time that Marcus Battiest was top-seed going into the finals!

In the finals, lefty Jeff Spiesman took on the recently red-hot Chris Fritsch. Fritch and Spiesman duked it out and Fritch forced Spiesman to strike in the 10th to win the match. Jeff made a decent shot that came up high but the 6-7 tripped forward and carried him to a 231-221 win. Jeff then moved on to meet second-seed Brian Leseberg. In a battle of 9-counts, Spiesman looked to be set to advance, then a flagged 7-pin in the $10^{\rm th}$ frame opened up the door for Leseberg. Brian took advantage, flushing the first two strikes and taking a 195-193 win. This set up a final between Leseberg and Marcus Battiest. The match started slow but Marcus seemed determined to go out with a bang. In the 10^{th} frame following a string, Leseberg went 9-count-spare and gave Marcus a chance to mark for his first title. Marcus stepped up like a seasoned veteran and buried the first two in the tenth for a 233-213 victory. It was Marcus' first JAT title after several years of JAT participation and a great way for him to finish off his JAT career. Congratulations Marcus "Beast" Battiest!

To all of you who may be teetering on the line between staying junior or turning adult at the end of the summer, as I spoke on at the awards banquet I strongly encourage you to fully enjoy your junior eligibility. In our game, which allows you to build fantastic camaraderie and also earn college scholarships funds, it is truly an once-in-a-lifetime experience to participate in scratch junior bowling in Southern California. Many alumni who I speak to tell me that their JAT and All-Stars years were the best years of bowling in their lives and several regret giving up their final few years with their friends on the lanes. Through our game can you have all made friends from all over Southern California who you will have a great time with and share stories about your JAT days for the rest of your lives! We hope to have you all back in the fall for both JAT and Greater L.A. Junior All-Star action!

The JAT is back in action this Sunday at AMF Rocket Lanes in Chatsworth. Due to \$2.50 lineage, this tournament will be \$35 entry fee so bring that extra Lincoln to the tournament! We will also be trying out a new "double-cut" format in the Open Division also so you better bring your "A" game! See you all on Sunday!

National Deaf Bowling News by Connie Marchione

INDIANAPOLIS... USBC sent me the day to day results of its recently held 2005 Junior Gold Bowling Championships in Indianapolis from July 11 to 15. This is the 7th annual tournament in which youth bowlers (from 10 to 21 years old) compete for scholarship prizes and places on the Junior Team USA. USBC sends its Junior Team USA to International Youth Bowling Tournaments,

There were a record 1,476 teenagers and adult kids (1,026 males and 450 females) entered in this Junior Gold tournament vying for \$55,000 in scholarship prizes. Most are from their state youth tournaments and Pepsi Youth tournaments.

With that many bowlers, USBC used three large bowling centers in Indianapolis and each bowler had to bowl on challenging Sport Bowling lane conditions in each center. The 3 days first qualifying round consisted of 18 games, 6 games per day in each center. Then in the semi-finals the field was cut top 146 males and 64 females for additional 12 qualifying games in one center, Woodland Bowl. After that top 16 buys and 16 girls with 30 games total pinfall went in 16 one game round robin match play with 10 points going to the winner of the matches. At the end, the top six boys and six girls are on the 2006 Junior Team USA and two additional bowlers were selected from each match play to fill the teams.

Hearing impaired Lindsey Coulles, Centerville, OH had bowled in the 2003 and 2004 Junior Gold tournaments and made the girls 2004 and 2005 Junior Team USA. She entered in this one but found

the lanes too tough and failed to repeat for 2006 Junior Team USA. For her first 6 games Coulles, 21 and a Junior at Morehead University had a good 1153 for 20th place but faltered to 1050 and 1091 in her next two 6 games for 3294 to qualify in 53rd place for the semi-finals additional 12 games. In the semi-finals first 6 games she moved up to 45th with 1097 for 4391 but finished with 5386, way out of qualifying for match play.

Looking for a familiar name in the 1026 male bowlers and wishing that the 16 years old Deaf Team USA member from Rhode Island, Rai Doblmeier had entered, found his name resting in 183rd place with 1123 for first 6 games. Like Coulles, Doblmeier, Warwick, RI found the Sport Bowling conditions tough as he trailed down to 1096 and 986 in his next two 6 games and finished in 323rd place with 3206. Also looking for the hearing impaired PWBA's Laura Lee Daniel's two deaf sons Larry and Bryan's names among the male entries and disappointed to find them not there. They and other deaf young bowlers should have try to bowl in the Junior Gold tournaments to get the tournament experience before they bowl in any deaf tournaments. Look at Coulles, as a member of Junior Team USA for two years she had bowled for USA in International Youth tournaments. The last one being in Miami where she won two gold and a silver medals. While Coulles may be over age for next year's Junior Gold tournament, she might enter in the

National Amateur Championships like she did last year to try for the Team USA. For young Doblmeier, he should keep on trying to qualify through his state Junior Gold tournament or in another state's. Some of the older youths in this Junior Gold tournament are experienced because they had bowled in six or seven of them.

The eventual girls winner, Stephanie Nation, 21, FL who won her third straight title, had competed for 7th time. The boys winner, Chris Bolasan, 20, VA struck gold for first time after 5 tries. Both like the others who made the Junior Team USA bowled like they were experienced this kind of competition with that many games. I honestly do not know what happened to Lindsey

TENPIN SLANTS

You could've fooled me. I didn't realize the Mini Eliminator megabuck tournament could be so exciting. The 2005 edition of the annual July 4th Mini Eliminator, which was staged from July 2-10 at The Orleans Bowling Center in Las Vegas, had just about everything.

There was enough excitement—and surprises—to please everyone, including the many relatives, friends and spectators who crowded the concourse. More than 1,000 entrants took their best shots for a piece of the rich Mini Eliminator prize fund. Counting the many re-entries that were permitted, the estimated total number of bowlers was about 2,500.

The biggest surprise was the winner of the Mini Eliminator itself, Ted Staikoff, the Senior Division's top qualifier from Black Hawk, S.D. Staikoff pocketed \$30,000 after shooting a 214 game in the four-man finals. He was the only bowler to roll a clean game, and that was enough to edge his three rivals in a close finals shootout.

Staikoff's victory, it turned out, was not such a big surprise. after all, since he was the third consecutive senior to capture the Mini Eliminator and the fifth in the last 12 years.

The Mini Eliminator was like a three-ring circus, with the MoRich Match Play Championship, a new \$100,000 event, and the Dynarooz Mini Eliminator Mixed Doubles, another new attraction, also highlighting the virtually nonstop action.

The MoRich Match Play Championship was the opening act of the tenpin circus on the weekend of July 2-3, and taking the \$20,000 first-place prize was Minnesota's Chad Nelson. Nelson easily defeated Michigan's Tom Smallwood, 235-191, in the final match. Smallwood was consoled by his \$10,000 runner-up check.

The Dynarooz Mixed Doubles was held on the night of Monday, July 4th—and there were plenty of fireworks. The hottest couple were Jen Petrick of Minnesota and Alex Cavagnaro of New York, who combined for a six-game doubles score of 1386 and divided

Forty-five teams entered the Dynarooz Mixed Doubles and nine of them collected checks. Low to cash was 1310, worth \$600. Dynarooz also awarded 12 pairs of their \$200 top-of-the-line bowling shoes to the individual high-game shooters.

The crowd favorites in the Mixed Doubles were Southern Californians Missy Bellinder and Scott Norton, but they failed to cash.

Don't feel sorry for Norton, though, as the talented 23-year-old lefthander from Cypress earned more than \$5,000 for the week. Norton won the Wednesday night Turbo 2-N-1 Sweeper, good for \$2,400, and he got \$2,500 after qualifying for the Mini Eliminator's match-play segment. He also collected several checks in other nightly sweepers and the brackets.

In winning the Wednesday night sweeper, Norton fired games of 278 and 268 for a spiffy 546 total. Perhaps he bowled so well because his mother, WIBC Hall of Famer Virginia Norton, was present all week and offered her support and encouragement on every shot.

There was still another big-money event, the \$100,000 Brunswick Shootout. Bagging the \$10,000 top prize was Las Vegas¹ own John Cocchi, a Super Senior Division entrant. Brunswick staffer and Hall of Famer Johnny Petraglia was on hand to reward Cocchi with his check and championship trophy.

The 12th annual Mini Eliminator was a typical Steve Sanders' promotion—lots of bowlers and plenty of guaranteed prizes paid out. Sanders, president of Pinacle Events, distributed well over \$1 million to the deserving bowlers at The Orleans.

Eyeball these staggering payout figures: In addition to the \$30,000 won by Ted Staikoff (Mini Eliminator) and the \$20,000 won by Chad Nelson (MoRich Match Play Championship), at least 10 other bowlers received \$10,000 checks, a total of 16 bowlers earned \$5,000 checks, and at least 80 bowlers cashed for a minimum of \$2,000—all in guaranteed payoffs by Pinacle Events. Posi-

MINI NOTES: Bowlers from 15 foreign countries took part in the 2005 Mini Eliminator. The reason? The tournament is now a North American Zone Ranking Event for the World Tenpin Bowling Assn. That means bowlers in North America can earn points toward the prestigious WTBA Ranking Masters Tournament, to be held in Kuwait next year...

International megabuck star Tim Mack used the July 4th holiday weekend to marry his longtime steady, PWBA champion Brenda Norman...It was reported that Hall of Famer Barry Asher was one of those who were invited to attend the ceremony. Asher was a guest on a houseboat at Lake Mead when he decided to take an impromptu dip. The only problem was that Asher had forgotten he had a wad of loose bills in his pocket. The bills floated out of his pocket when he hit the water, and he retrieved what he could but still lost a couple of hundred dollars. It was just another way to lose

money in Las Vegas...As a footnote, Asher observed his 59th birthday on July 14. Coincidentally, that's the same natal day for Hall of Famers Mort Luby Jr. and Pam Buckner. It's also Bastille Day, or France's Fourth of July..

Kim Bolleby, an amazing 13-year-old southpaw from Sweden, made it all the way to the Mini Eliminator's Round of 16. He lost to a 65-year-old senior, Randolph Salmon, 219-204. Bolleby, who resembles a lefthanded George Howard, received a check for \$5,000. According to his proud father, Ulf Bolleby, 41, his son's goal is to join the PBA Tour, but he has to wait five years before he is eligible. That's a lifetime for him, said the senior Bolleby, who once tried the PBA Tour "for about 12 tournaments. He competed in the 1985 SoCal Open that was won by his good friend, Mats Karlsson, at the Bowling Center of Riverside...

For the record, it was George Lambert who eliminated Scott Norton, 217=206, in the first round of match play in the Mini Eliminator. Norton had the match well in hand until he left the Greek Church (4-6-7-8-10) in the ninth frame. I don't think I deserved to get the Greek Church on that shot, said a deiected Norton...

Las Vegas senior Terry Leong paired with Sharon Aronson of Turlock, Calif., also a senior, in the Dynarooz Mixed Doubles. I think we ought to get some handicap, Leong joked, "as our combine age is over 100 years". Someone pointed out that the total age of Missy Bellinder and Scott Norton, both 23-year-olds who were bowling on an adjacent pair, was just 46, or less than half that of Aronson and Leong. Aronson, by the way, is a So Cal Hall of Famer, having lived in Chino Hills before moving to Turlock, in central California.

FINAL ITEM: Mike Taylor, a former touring pro, bowled with Char Hammel in the Dynarooz Mixed Doubles. They placed fourth with 1328 for \$1,200. Hammel, who once lived in Whittier, now makes her home in Henderson, Nev. When she wasn't bowling at The Orleans, Hammel was working as a dealer at the World Series of Poker at the Rio Hotel and Casino. Taylor, of course, is the son of So Cal Hall of Famer Lee Taylor...

Riccilli News Good


LAKEWOOD-Jim Burke called The Bowling News to report that Fred Riccilli made his first public appearance at Cal Bowl last week.
